The ornamental design for a jewelry chain, shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a jewelry chain;
FIG. 2 is an enlarged partial view of the front of the clasp feature shown separately for completeness of illustration;
FIG. 3 is an enlarged partial view of the rear of the clasp feature shown separately for completeness of illustration;
FIG. 4 is an enlarged partial view of the front of the loop feature shown separately for completeness of illustration;
FIG. 5 is an enlarged partial view of the rear of the loop feature shown separately for completeness of illustration;
FIG. 6 is a perspective view illustrating the jewelry chain of FIGS. 1-5 as a bracelet;
FIG. 7 is a rear elevational view of the jewelry chain of FIG. 1 rotated 180° connected in a first form as a necklace;
FIG. 8 is a rear elevational view of the jewelry chain of FIG. 1 rotated 180° connected in a second form as a necklace;
FIG. 9 is a rear elevational view of the jewelry chain of FIG. 1 rotated 180° connected in a third form as a necklace; and,
FIG. 10 is a rear elevational view of the jewelry chain of FIG. 1 rotated 180° connected in a fourth form as a necklace shown broken away for convenience of illustration.

The broken lines shown in the drawings represent portions of the jewelry chain which form no part of the claimed design and the broken line showing of a wrist in FIG. 6 represents environmental matter.

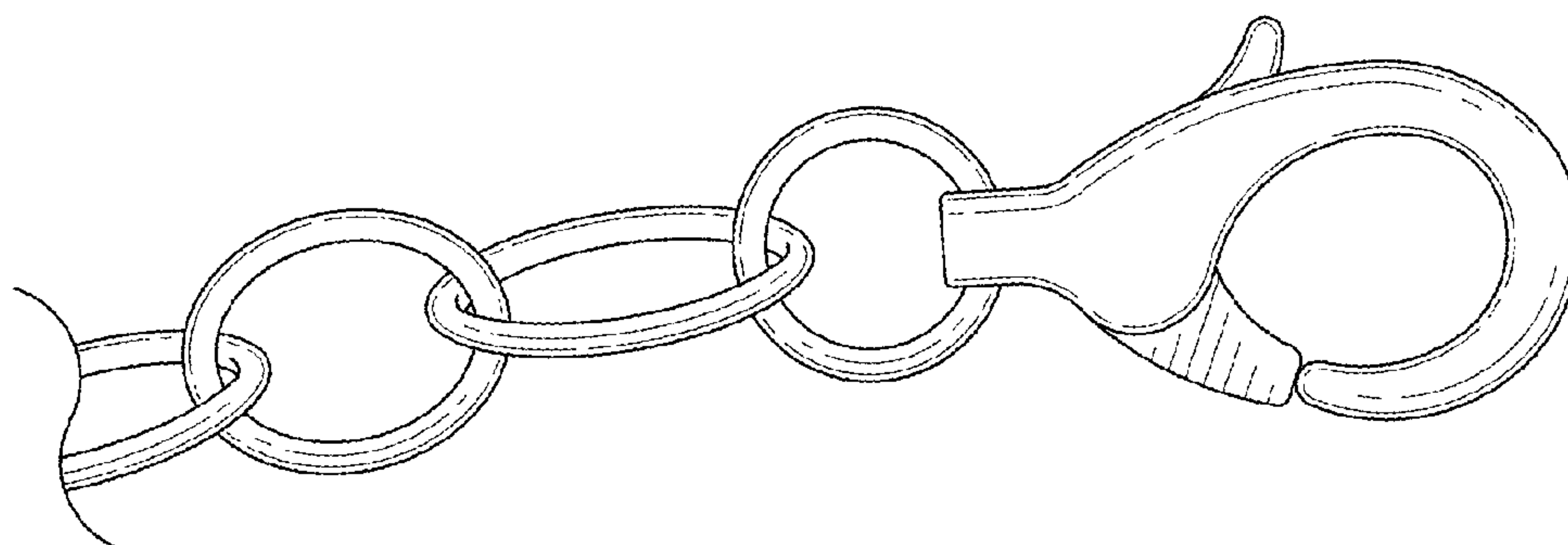

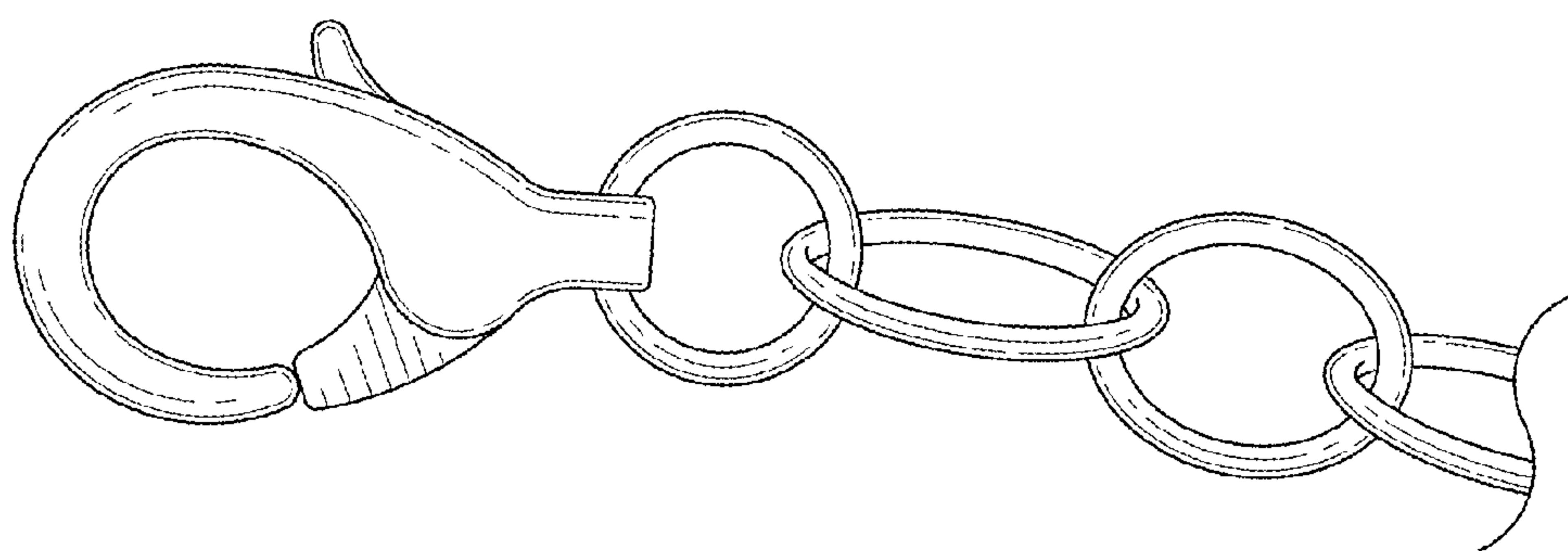

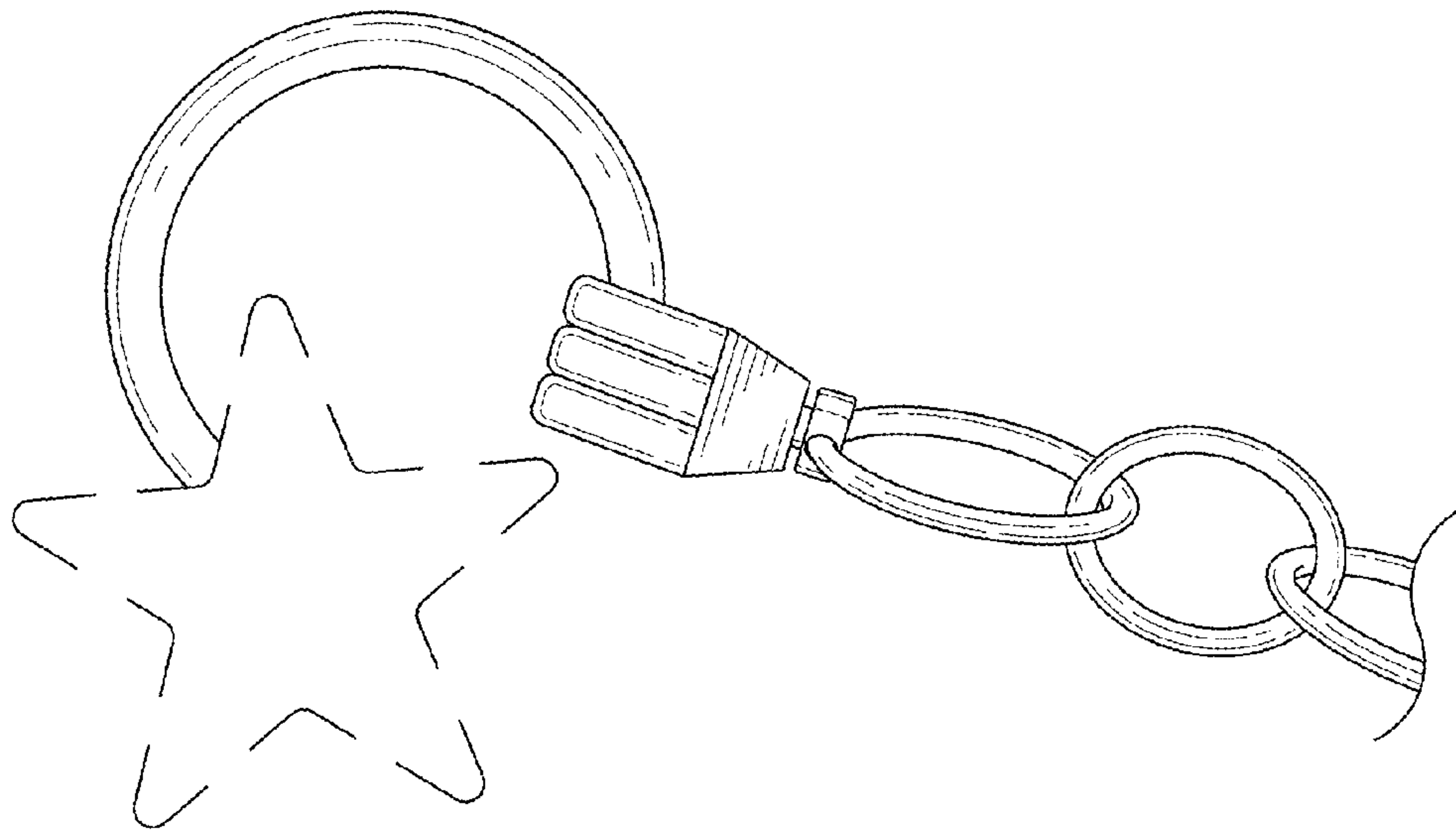

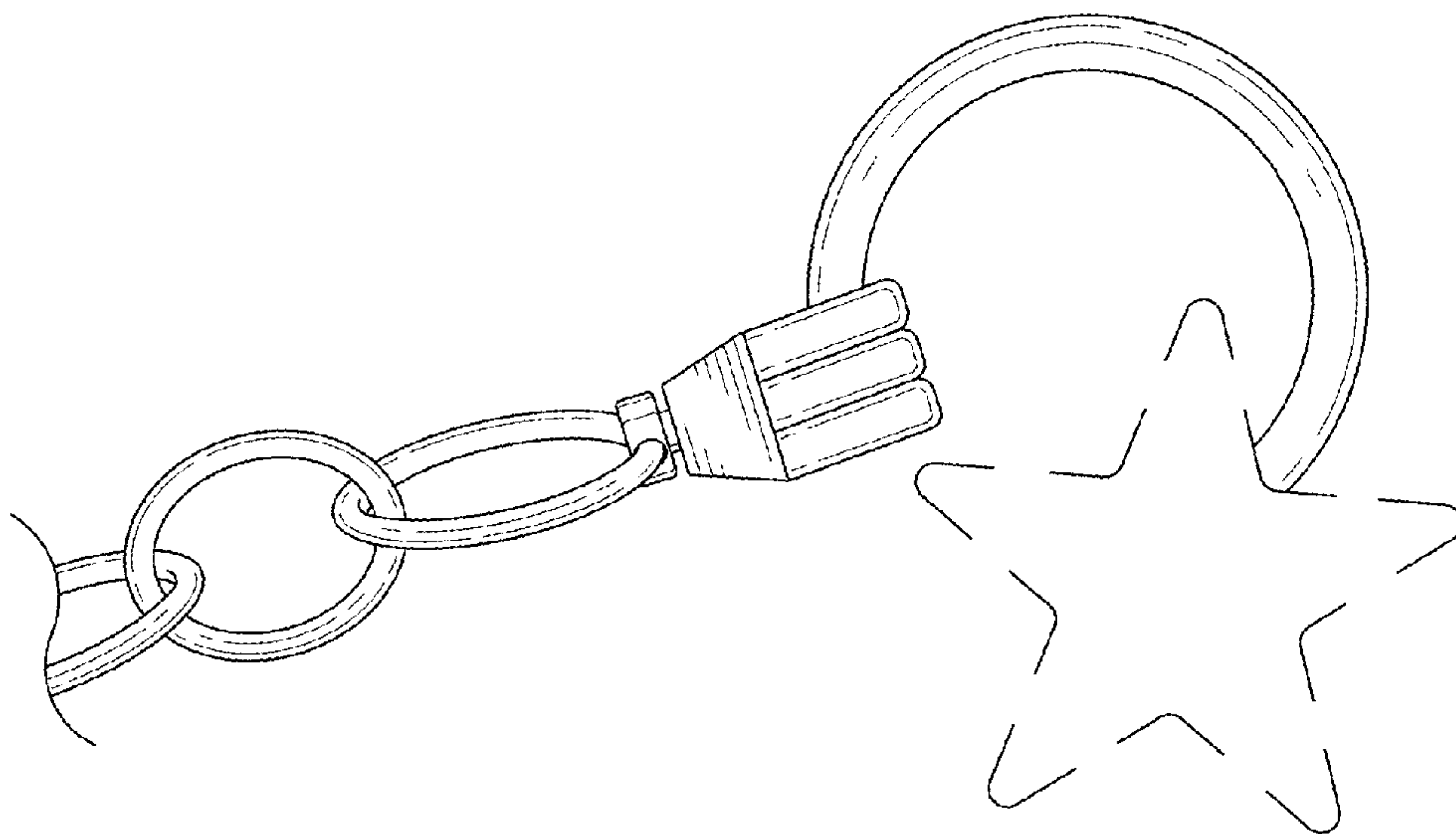

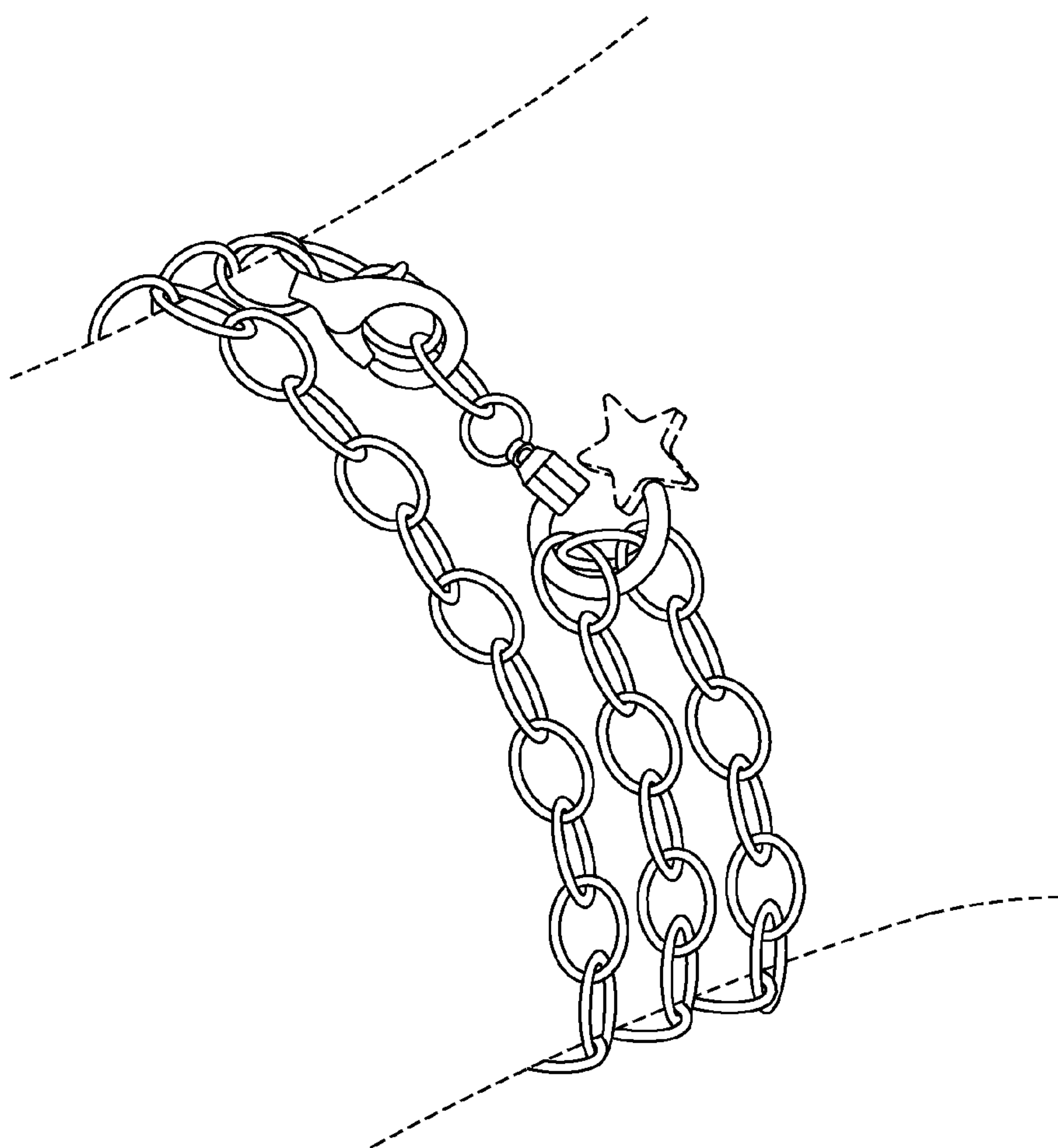

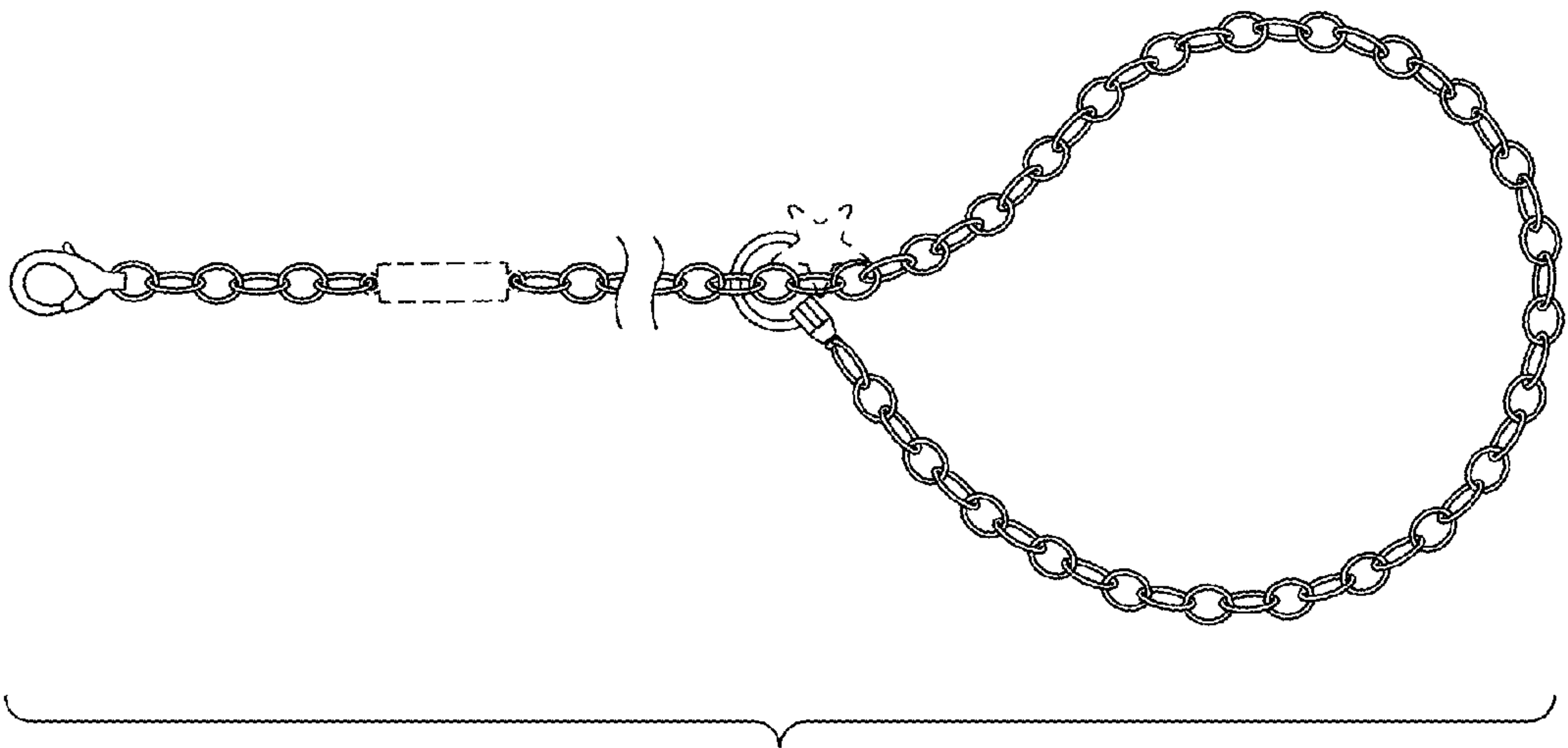
