(57) **CLAIM**

I claim the ornamental design for a two handle pet leash, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

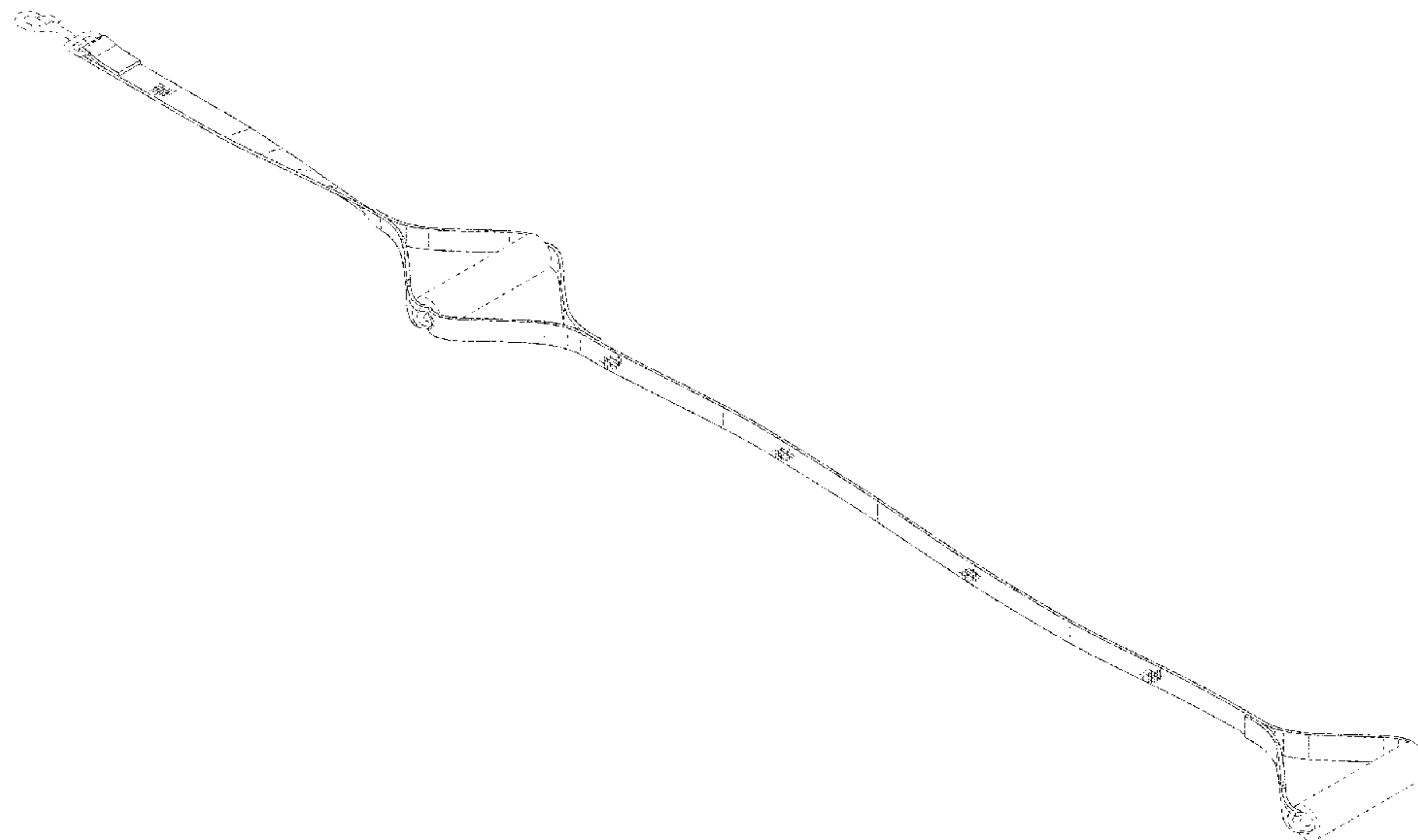
FIG. 1 is a top, right front perspective view of a two handle pet leash showing my new design;
 FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a detail view of the handle portion “3” in FIG. 2;
 FIG. 4 is a detail view of the handle portion “4” in FIG. 2;
 FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 2;
 FIG. 6 is a front elevational of FIG. 2;
 FIG. 7 is a detail view of the handle portion “7” in FIG. 6;
 FIG. 8 is a detail view of the handle portion “8” in FIG. 6;
 FIG. 9 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 2;
 FIG. 10 is a left end elevational view of FIG. 2; and,
 FIG. 11 is a right end elevational view of FIG. 2.
 The structural features depicted by broken lines have been shown for the purpose of illustrating portions of the two handle pet leash that form no part of the claimed design.

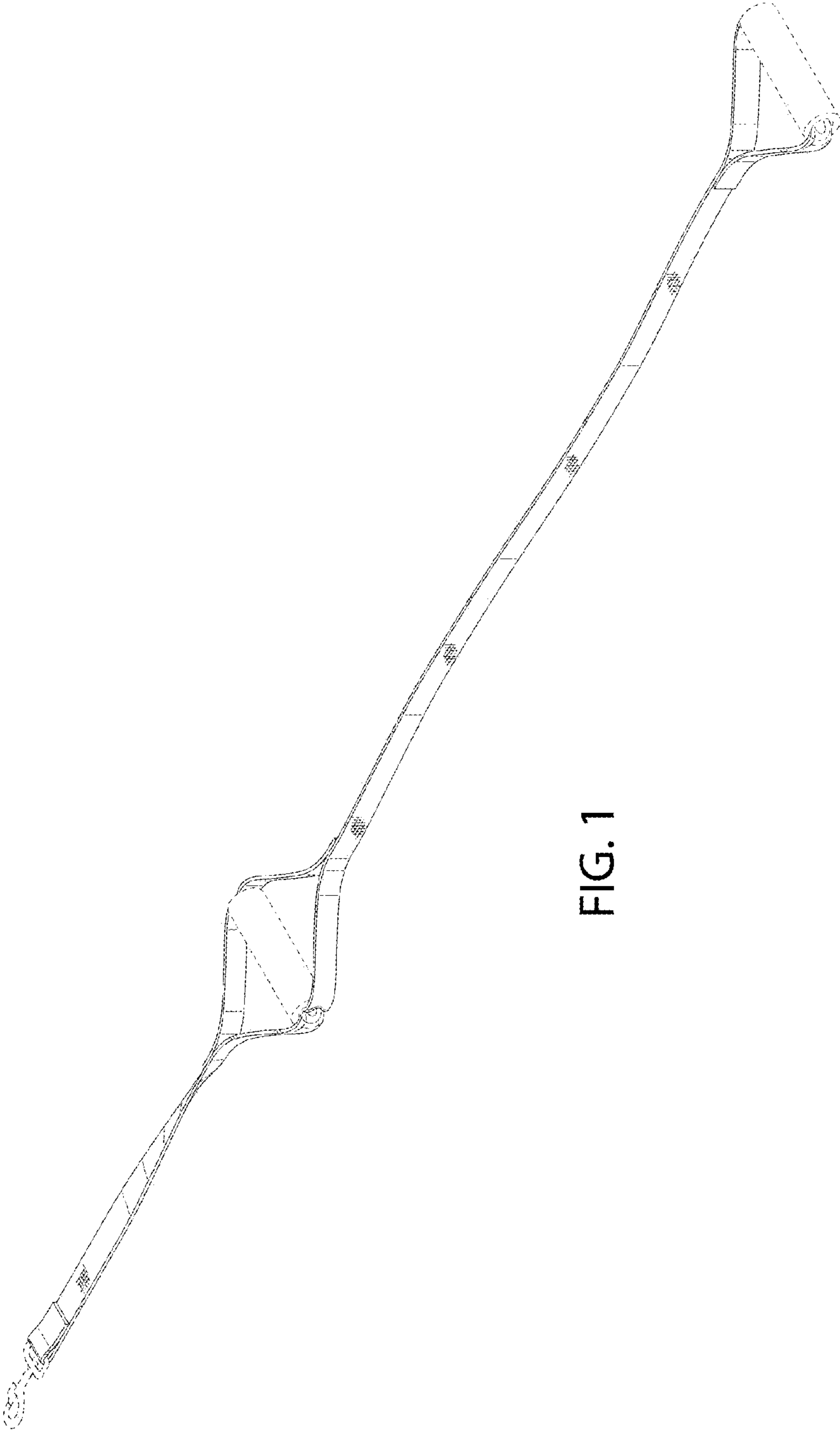

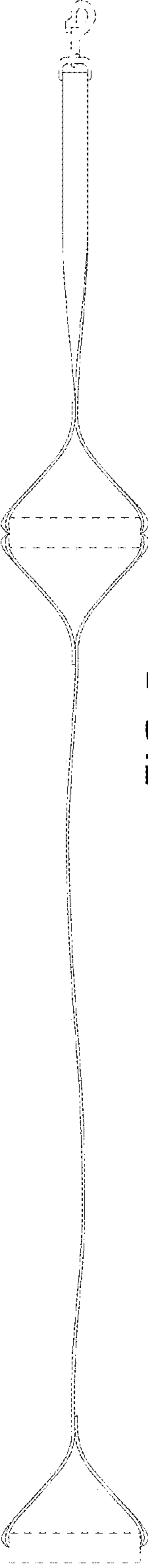
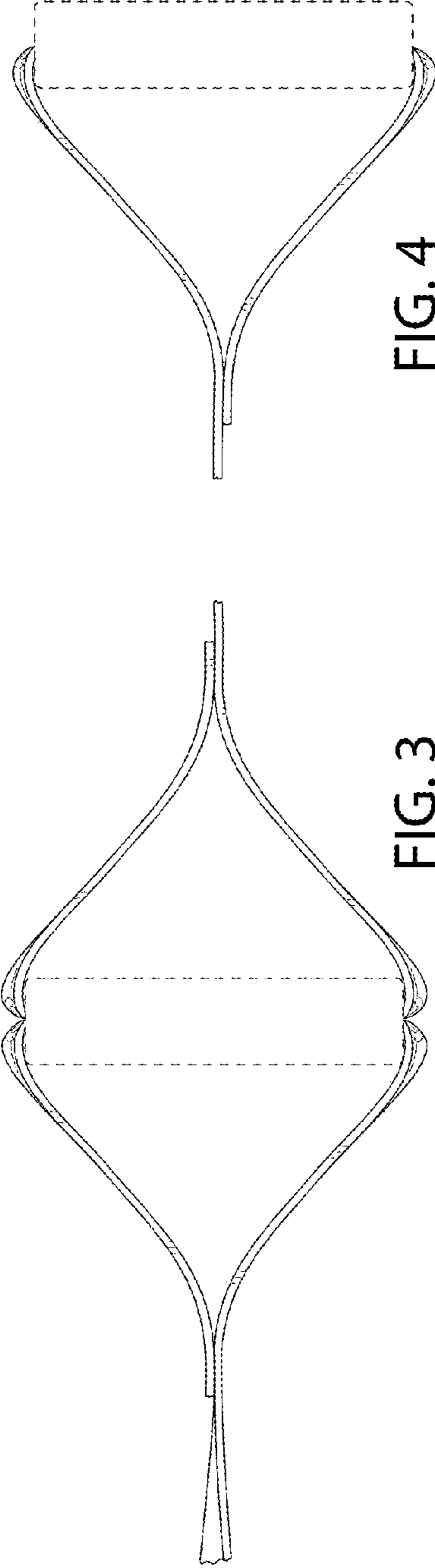
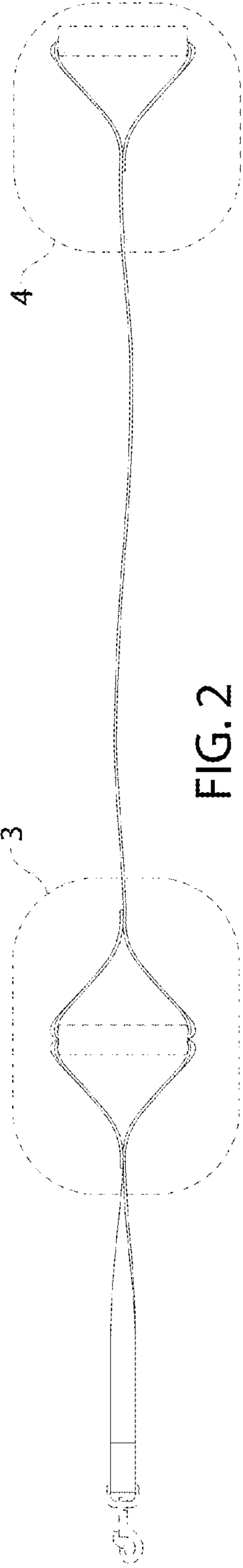

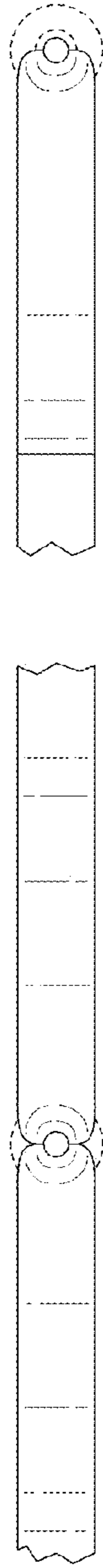
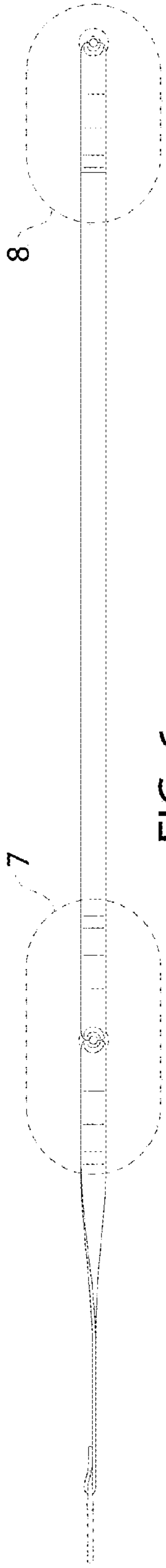

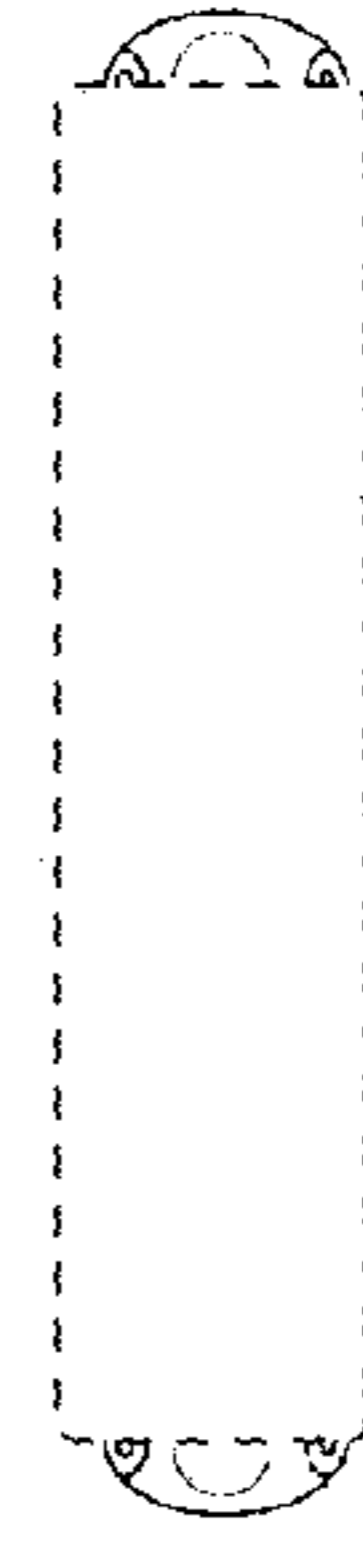
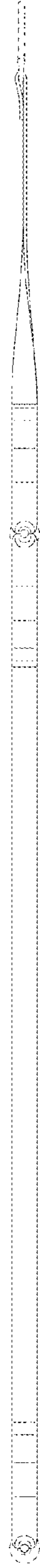
