(57) **CLAIM**

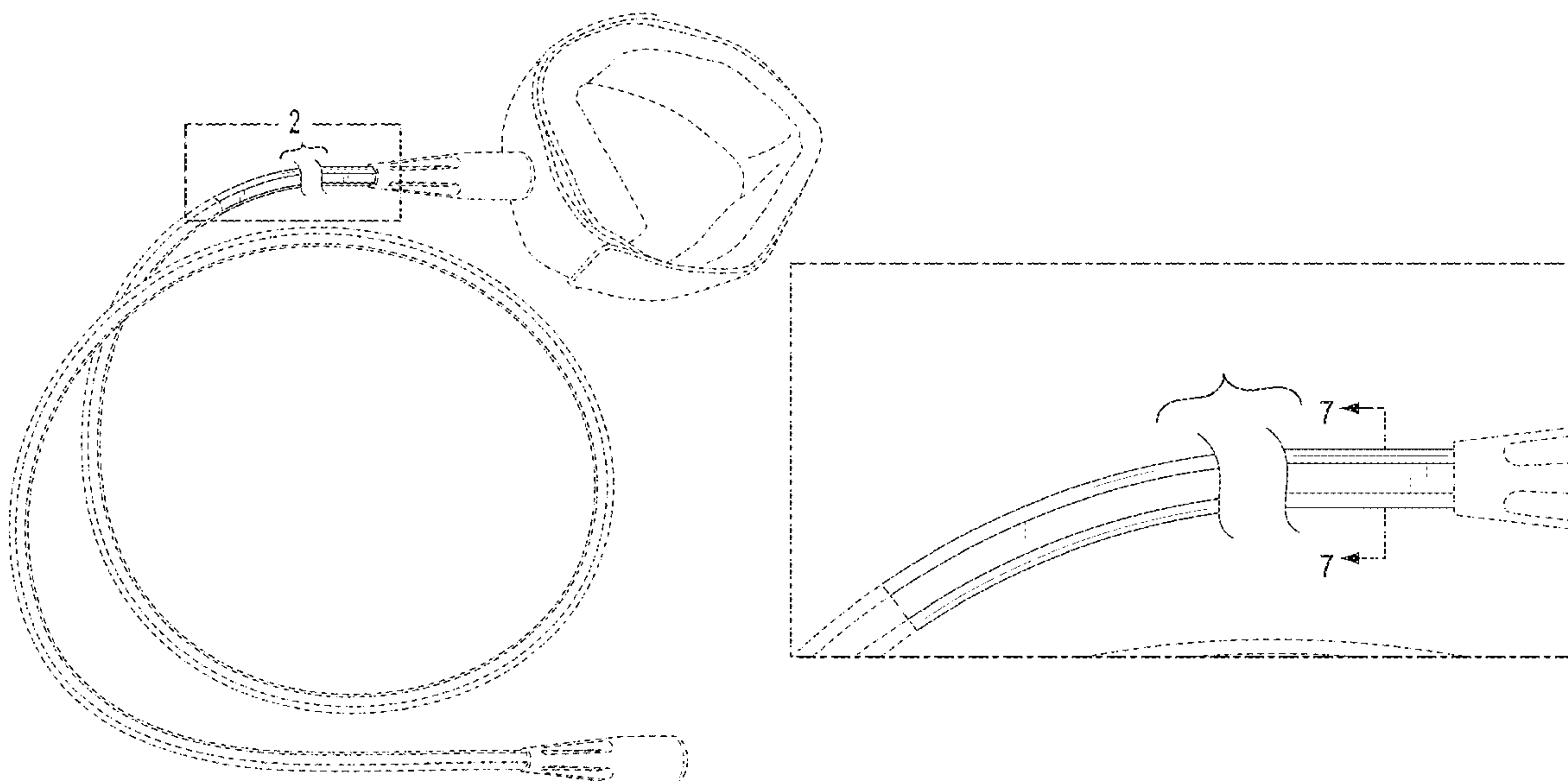
The ornamental design for a surfboard leash, as shown and
described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top, front, left perspective view of a surfboard leash
showing the new design;
FIG. 2 is an enlarged detail view of a portion of FIG. 1;
FIG. 3 is a top view thereof;
FIG. 4 is an enlarged detail view of a portion of FIG. 3;
FIG. 5 is a bottom thereof;
FIG. 6 is an enlarged detail view of a portion of FIG. 5; and,
FIG. 7 is a section view taken along the lines shown in FIG. 3.
The dashed broken lines shown in the figures illustrate por-
tions of the surfboard leash that form no part of the claimed
design. The dash-dot-dash broken lines shown in FIGS. 1-6
around a circumference of a cord of the surfboard leash define
a boundary of the claimed design and form no part of the
claimed design.

The portion of the surfboard leash shown broken away in
FIGS. 1-6 indicates that the precise length is not claimed.
The cross-sectional shape shown in FIG. 7 is consistent along
the entirety of the claimed portion of the cord of the surfboard
leash.

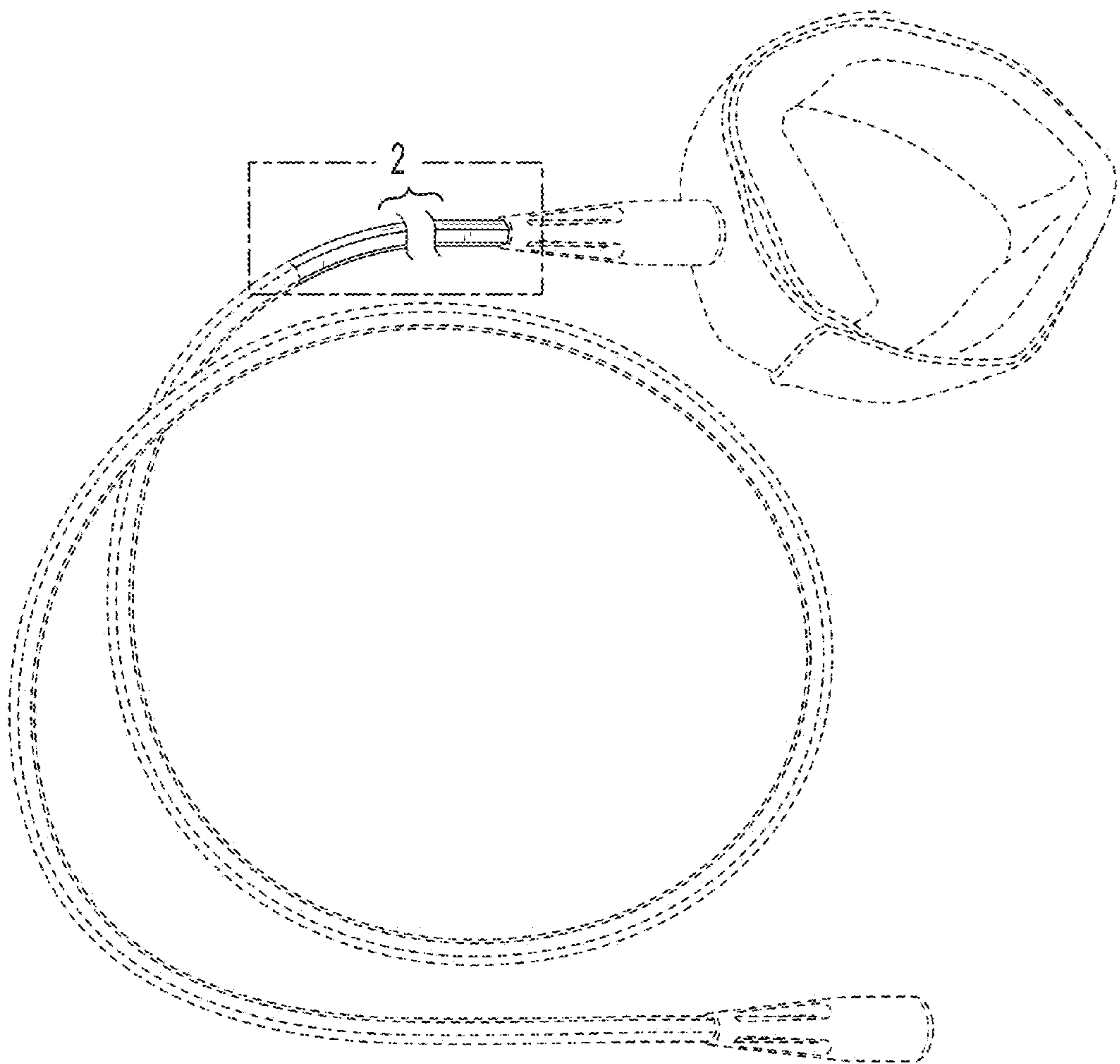

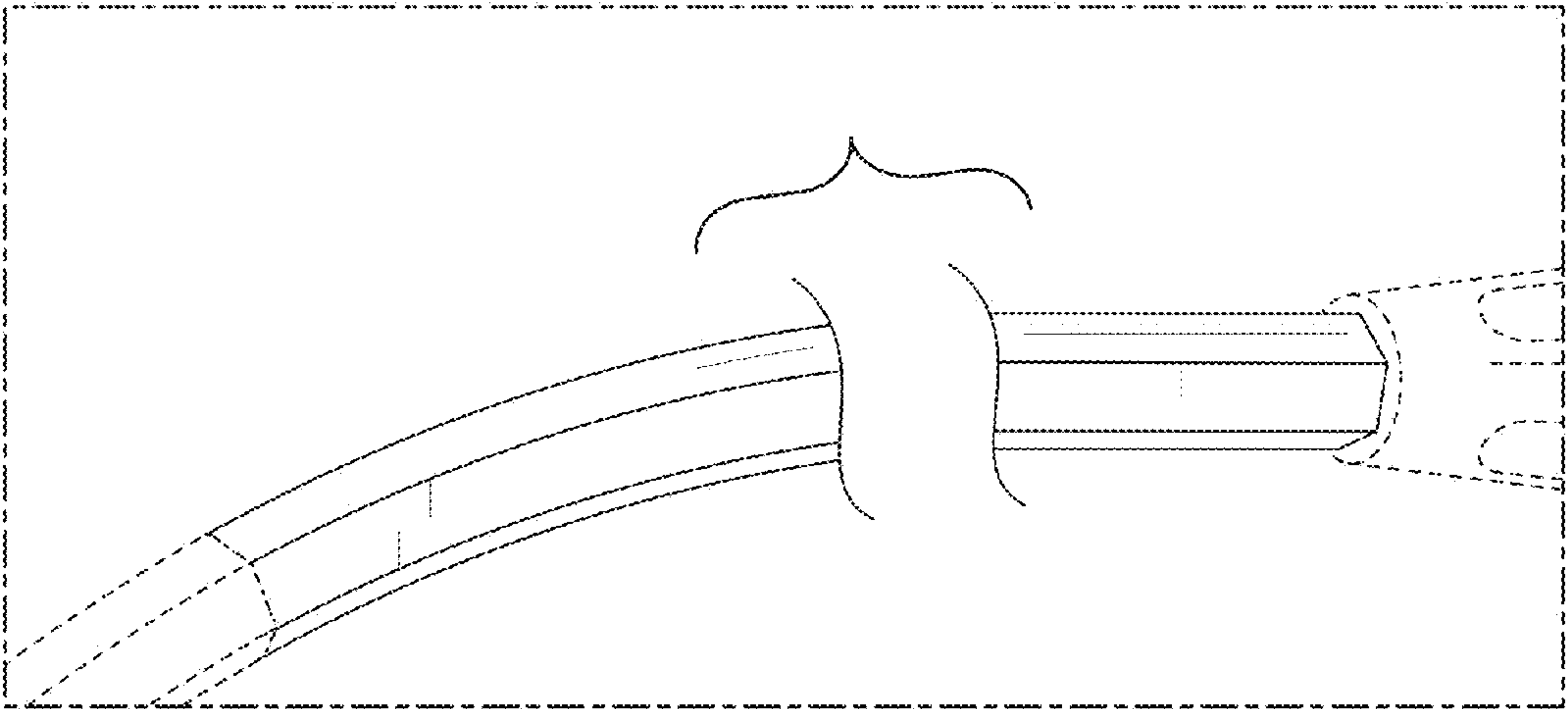

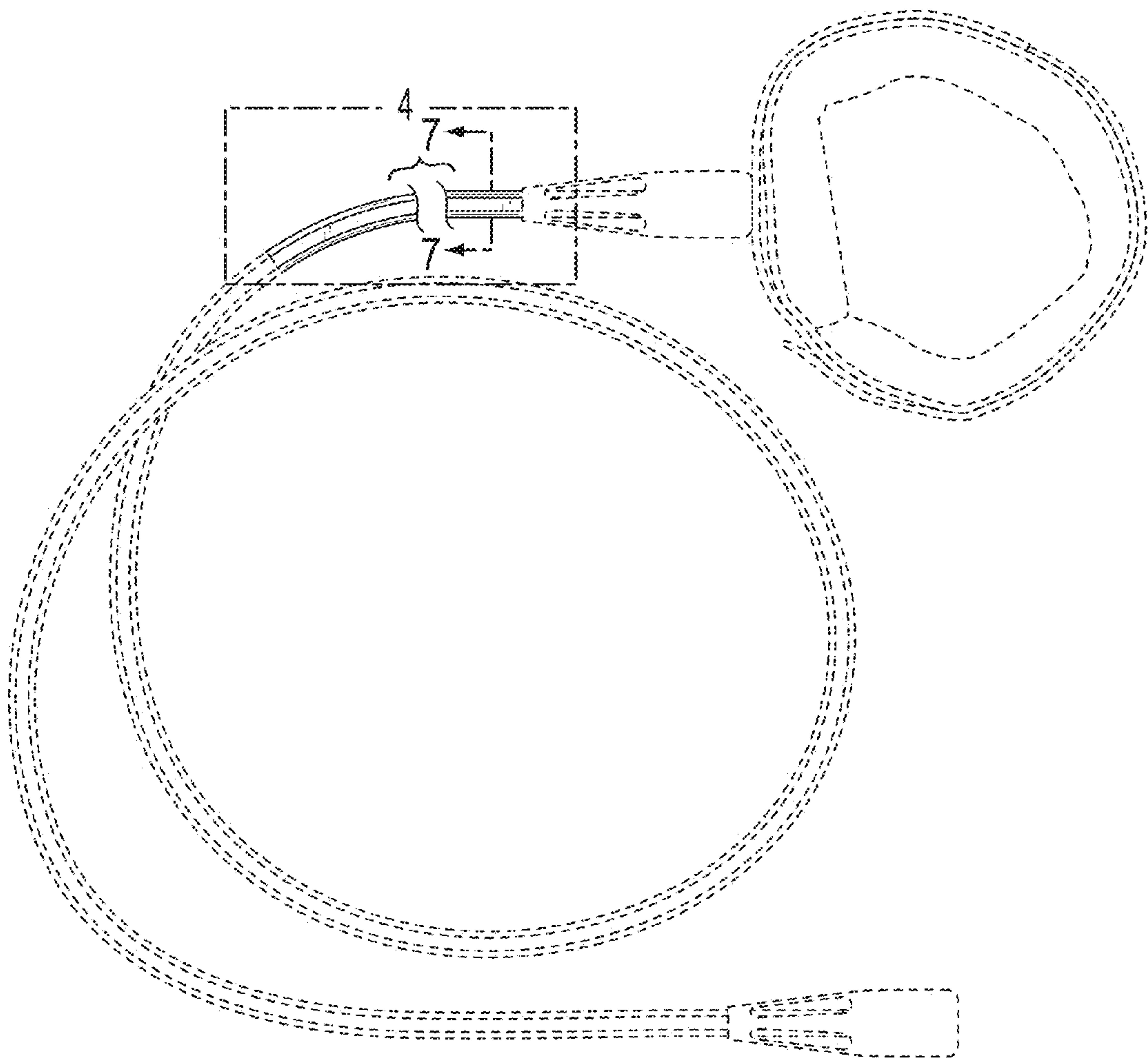

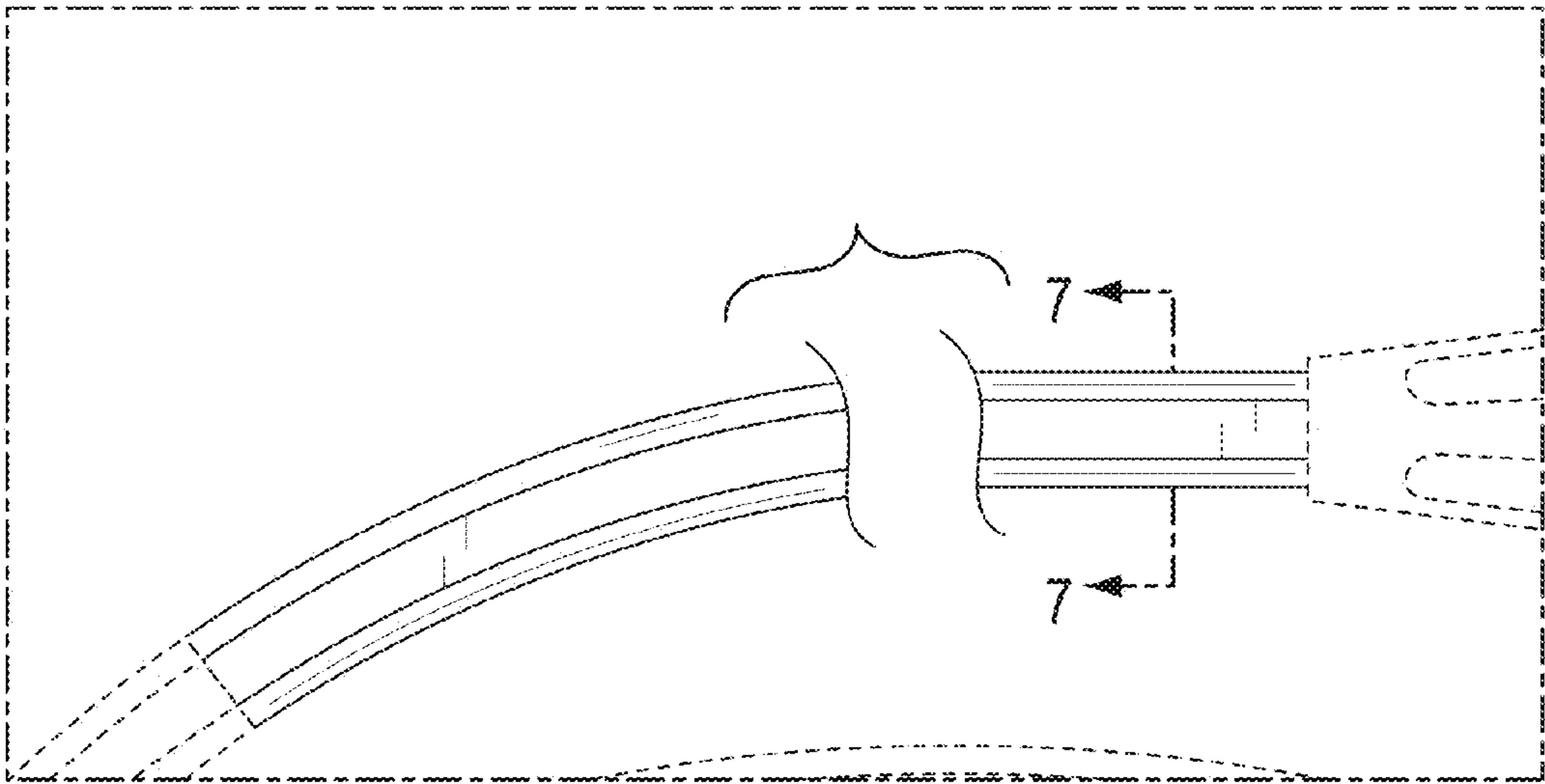

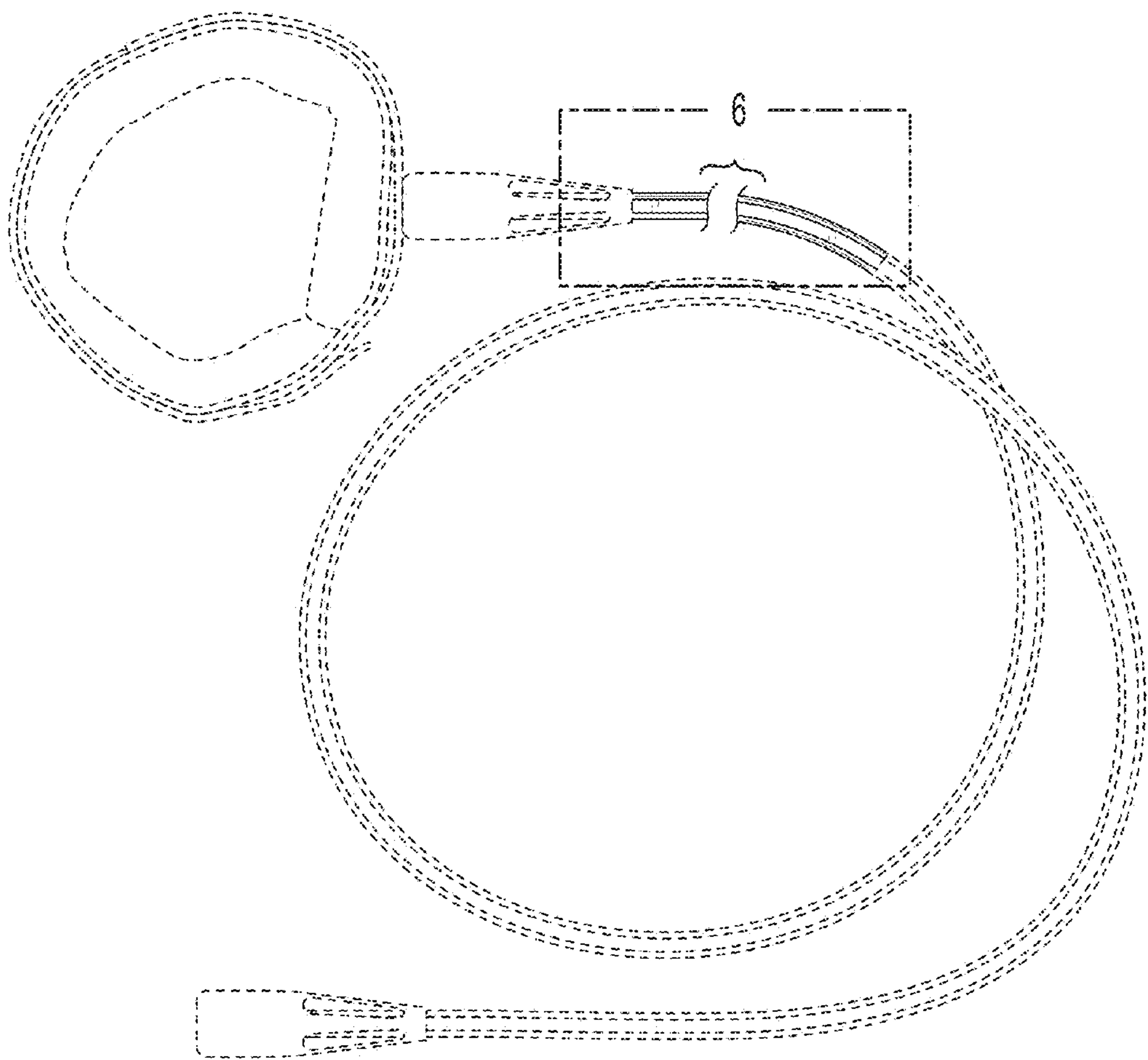

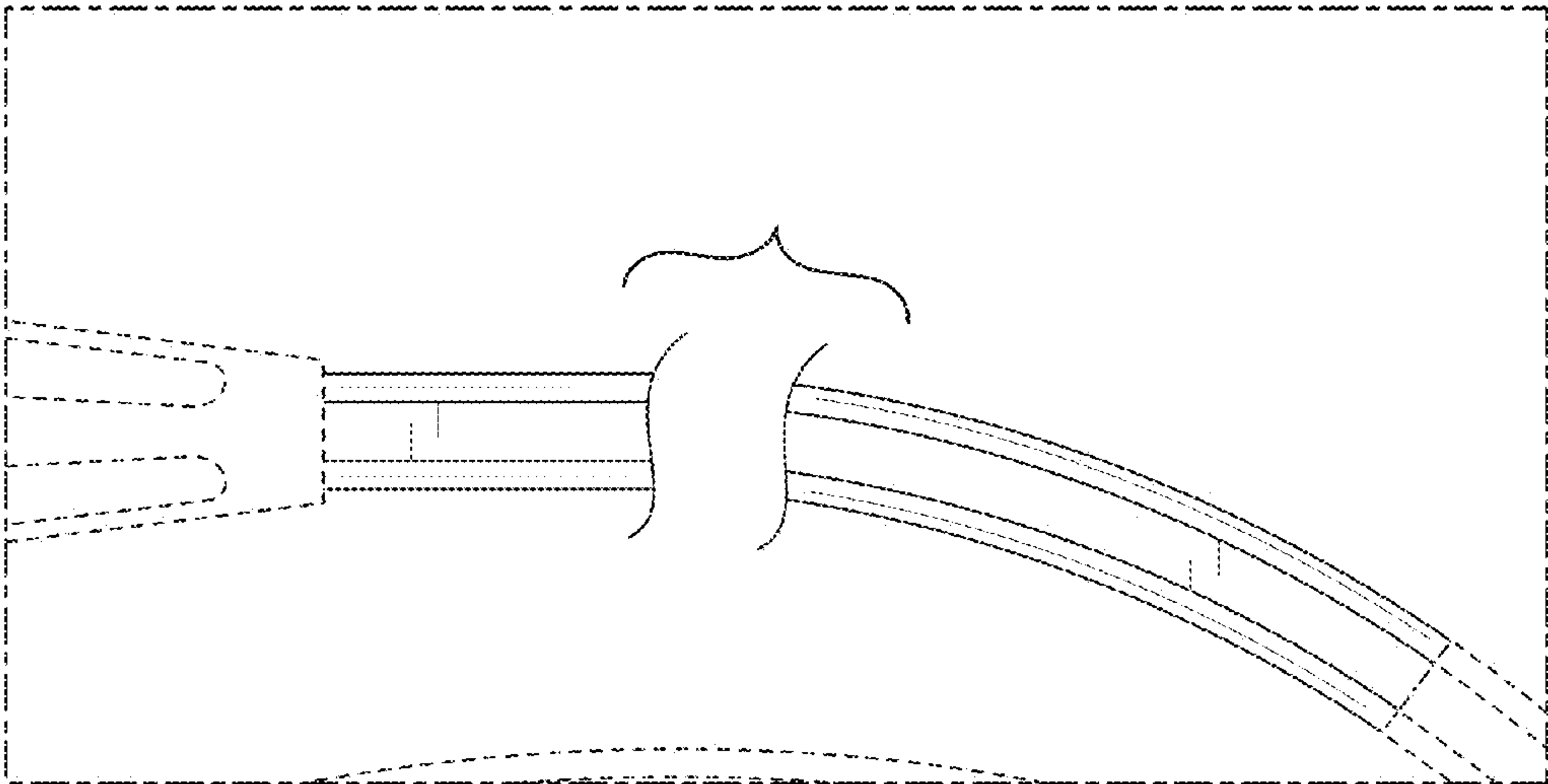

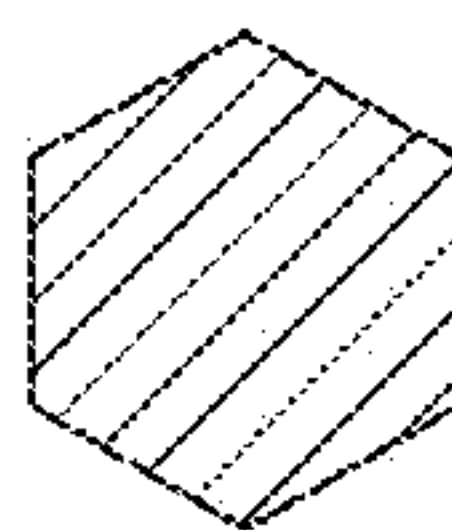
