FIG. 15 is a right-side elevational view of FIG. 11.

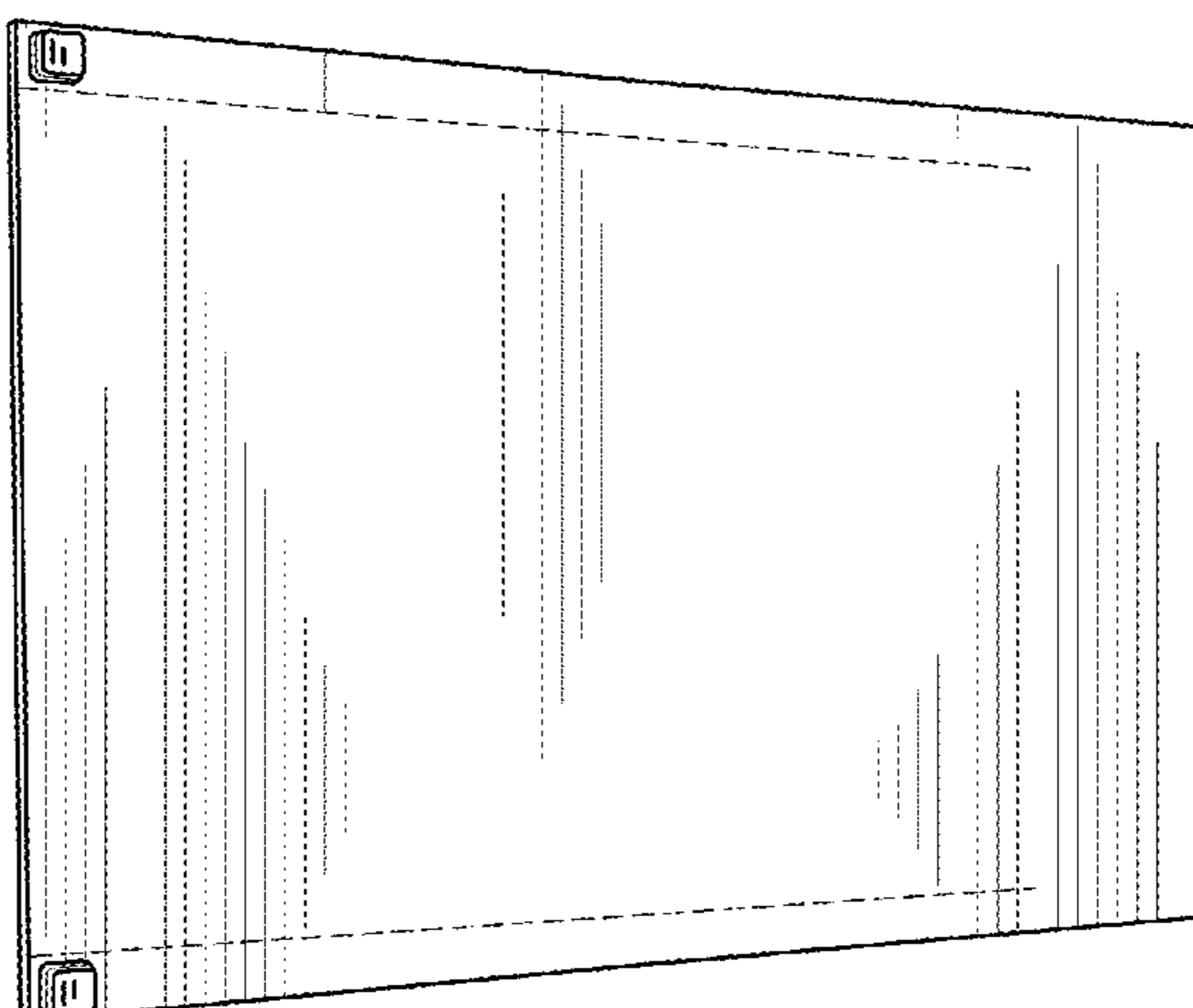
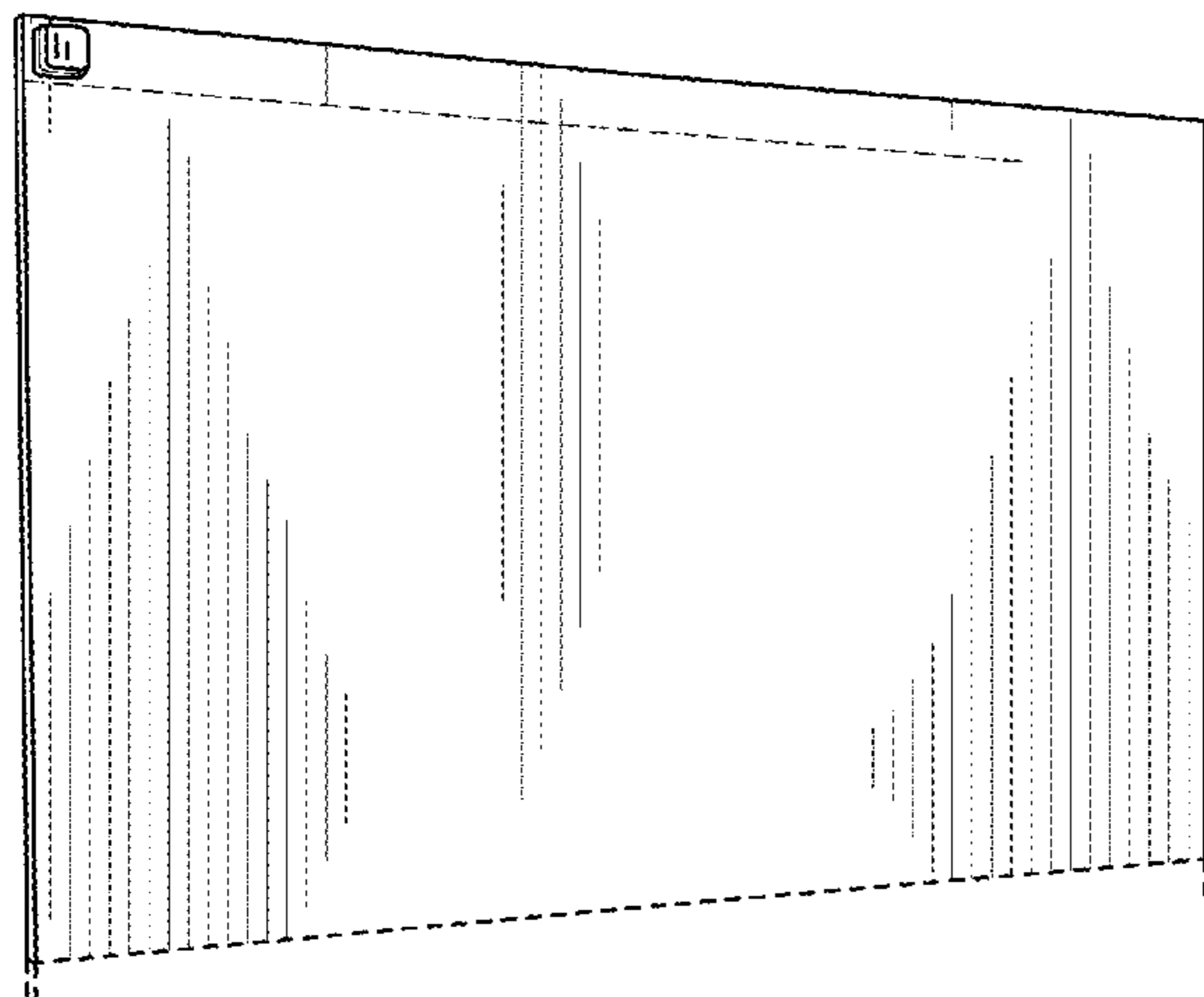

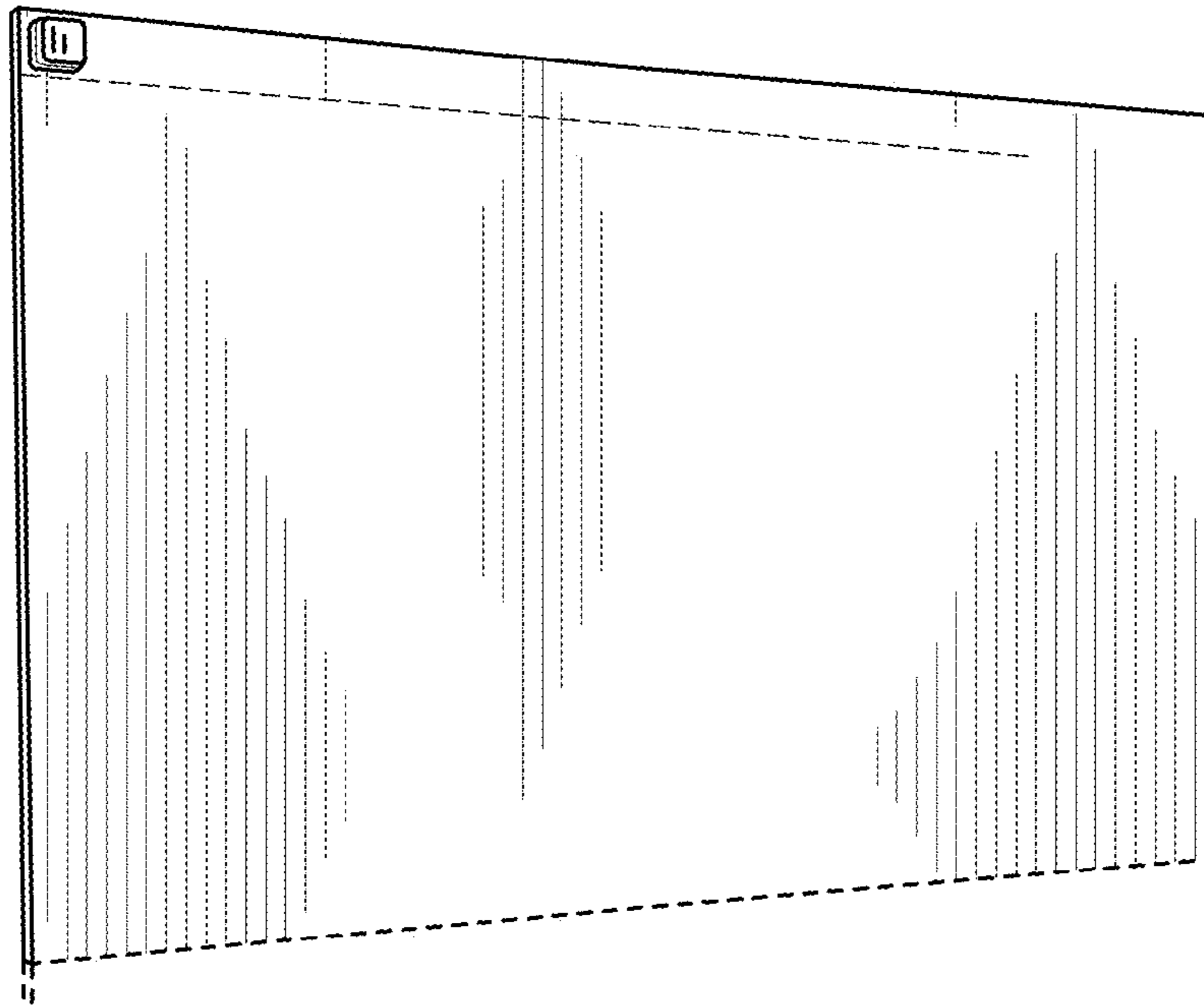

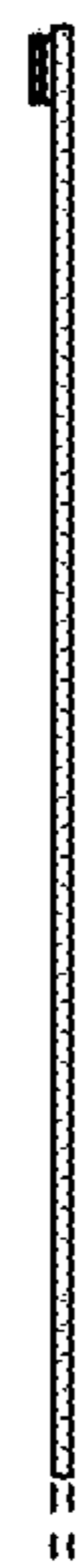

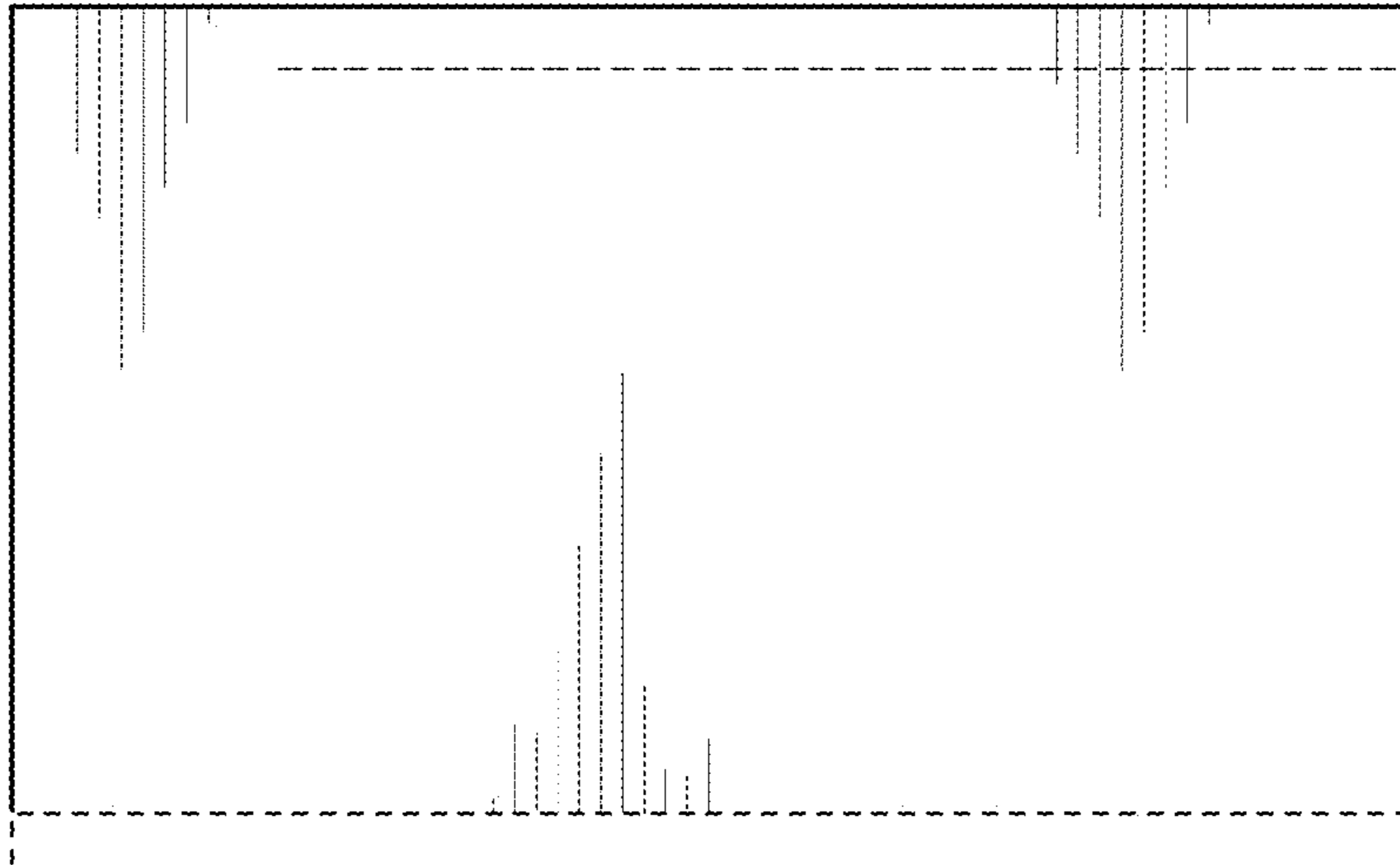

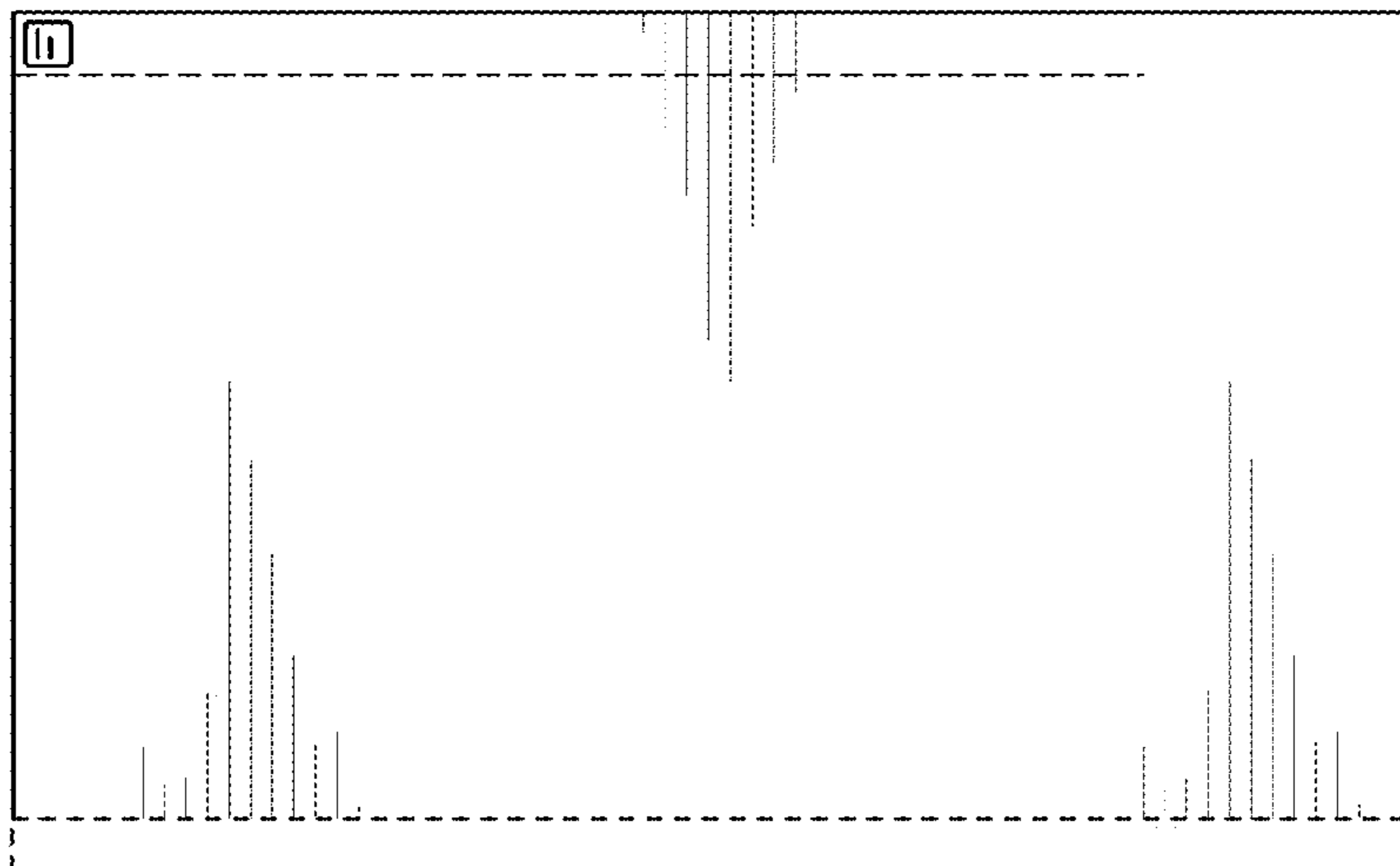

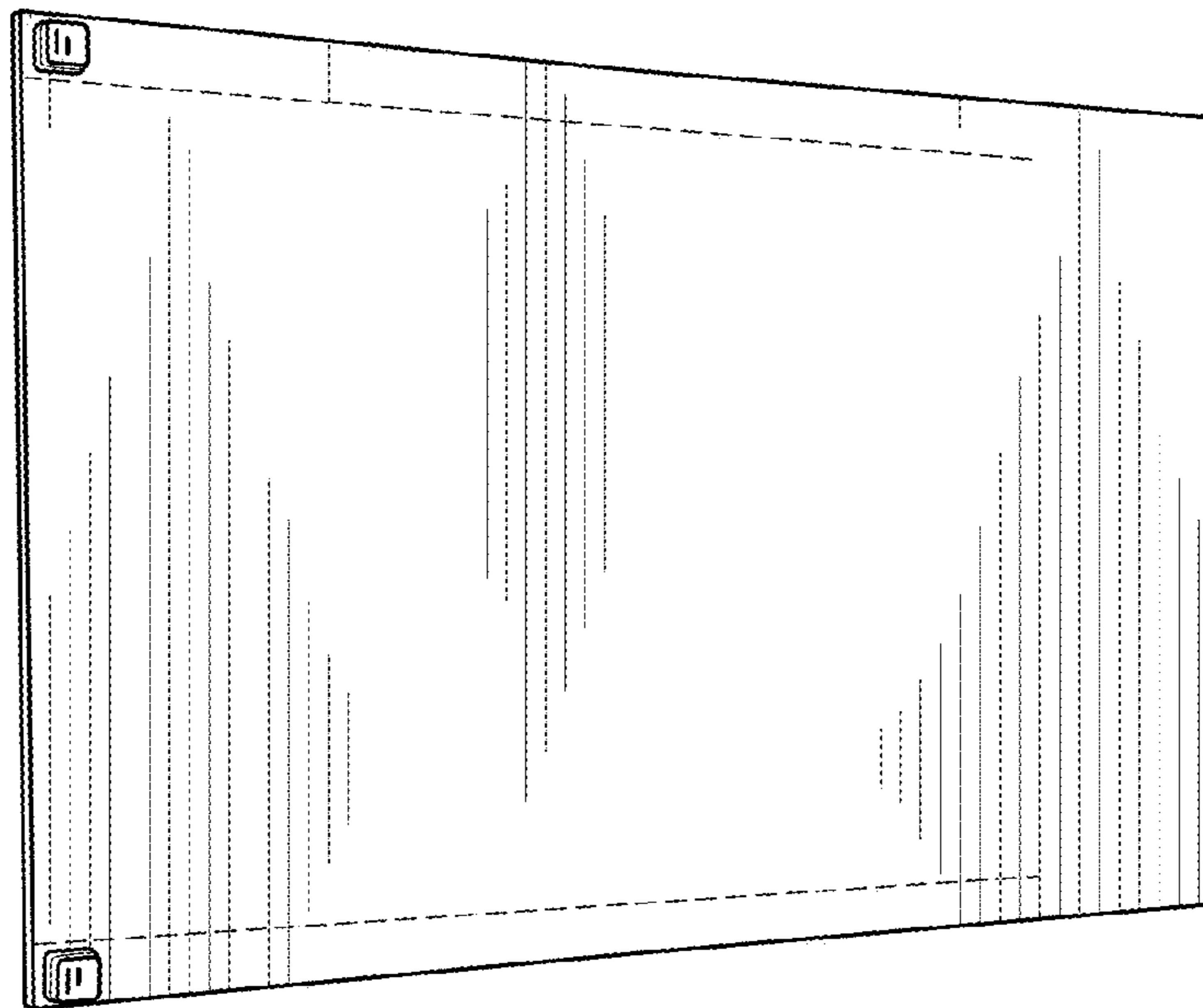

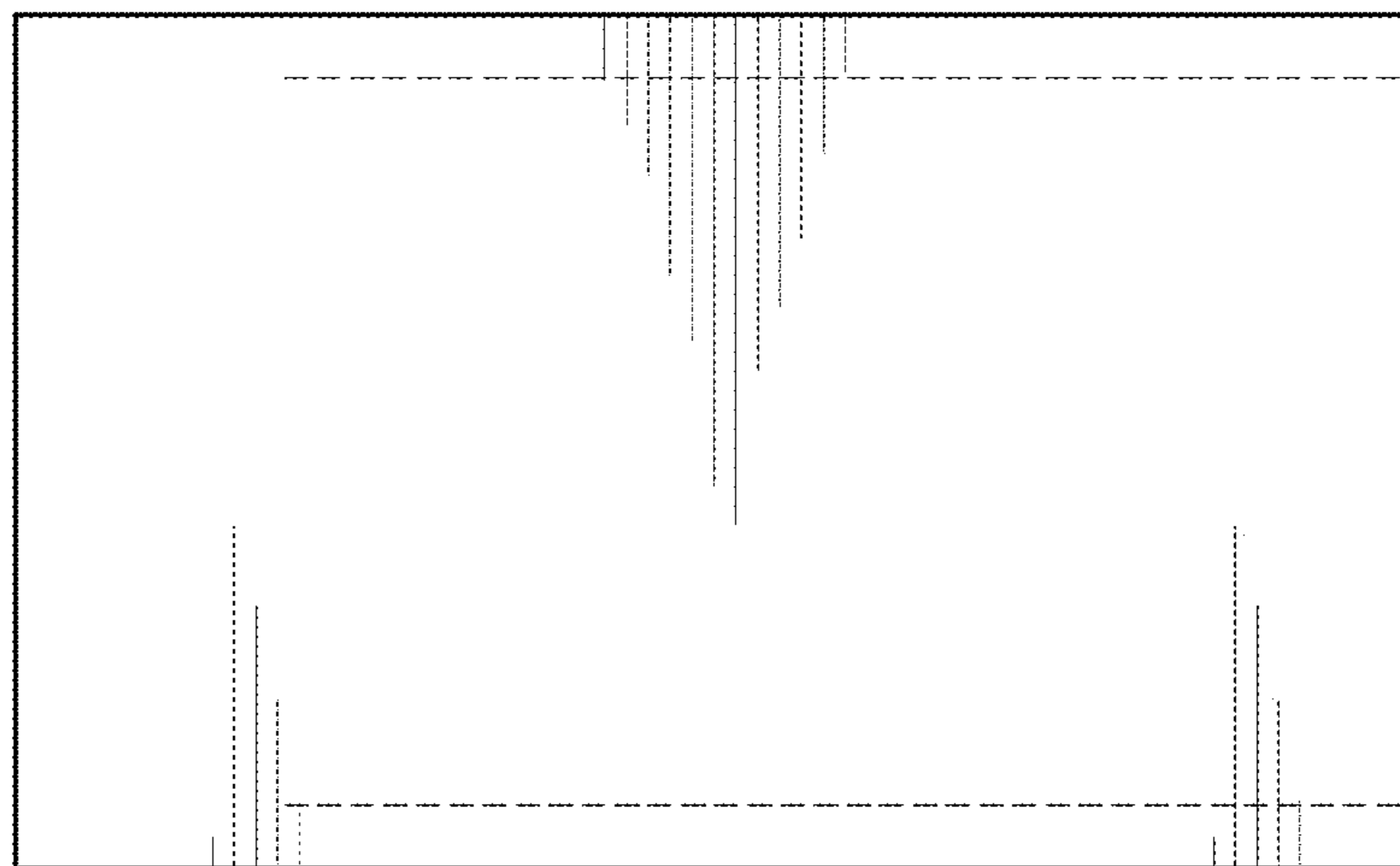

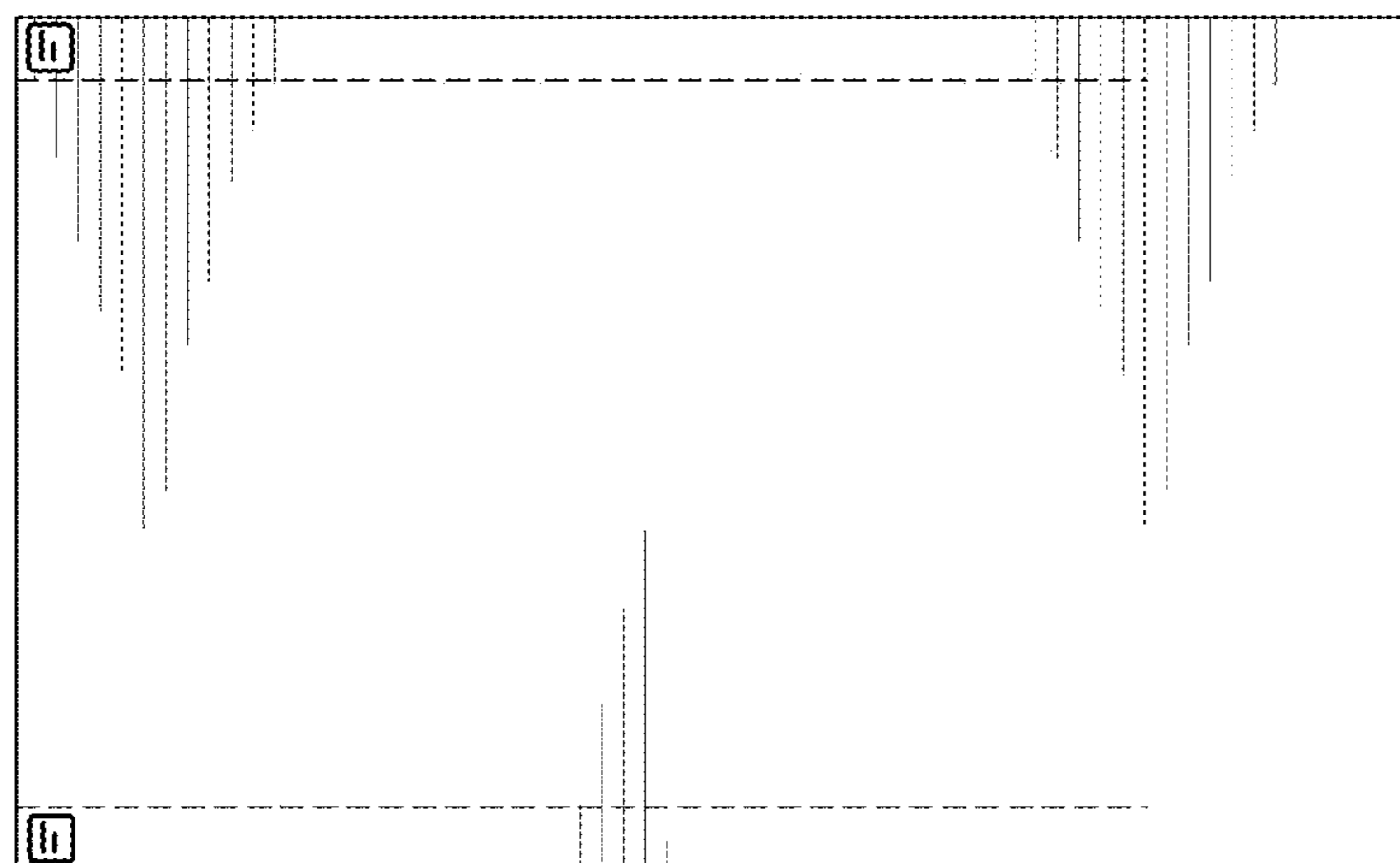

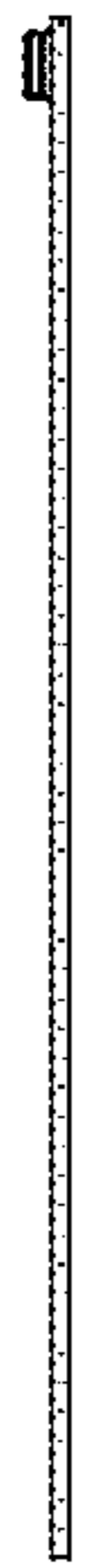
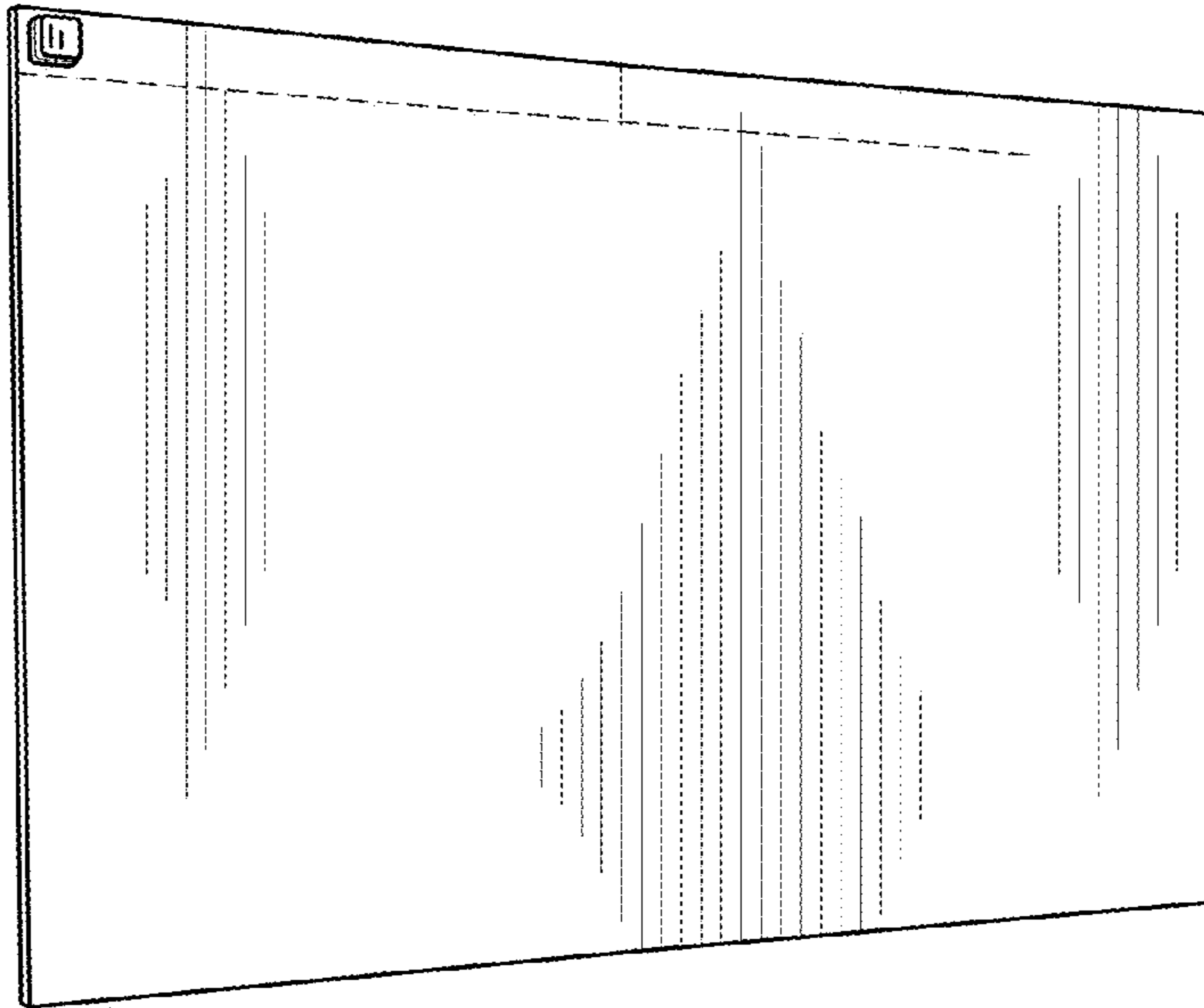

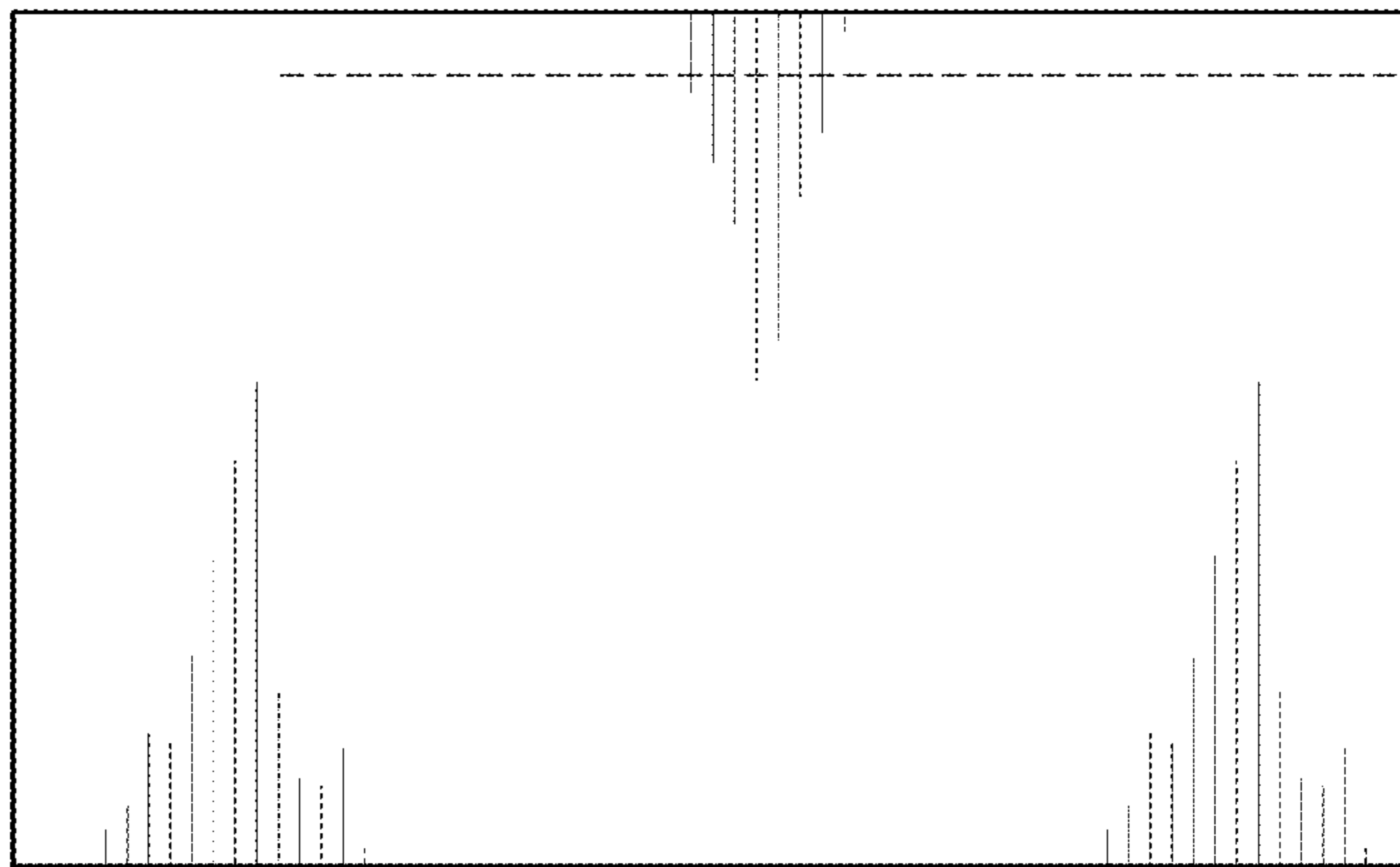

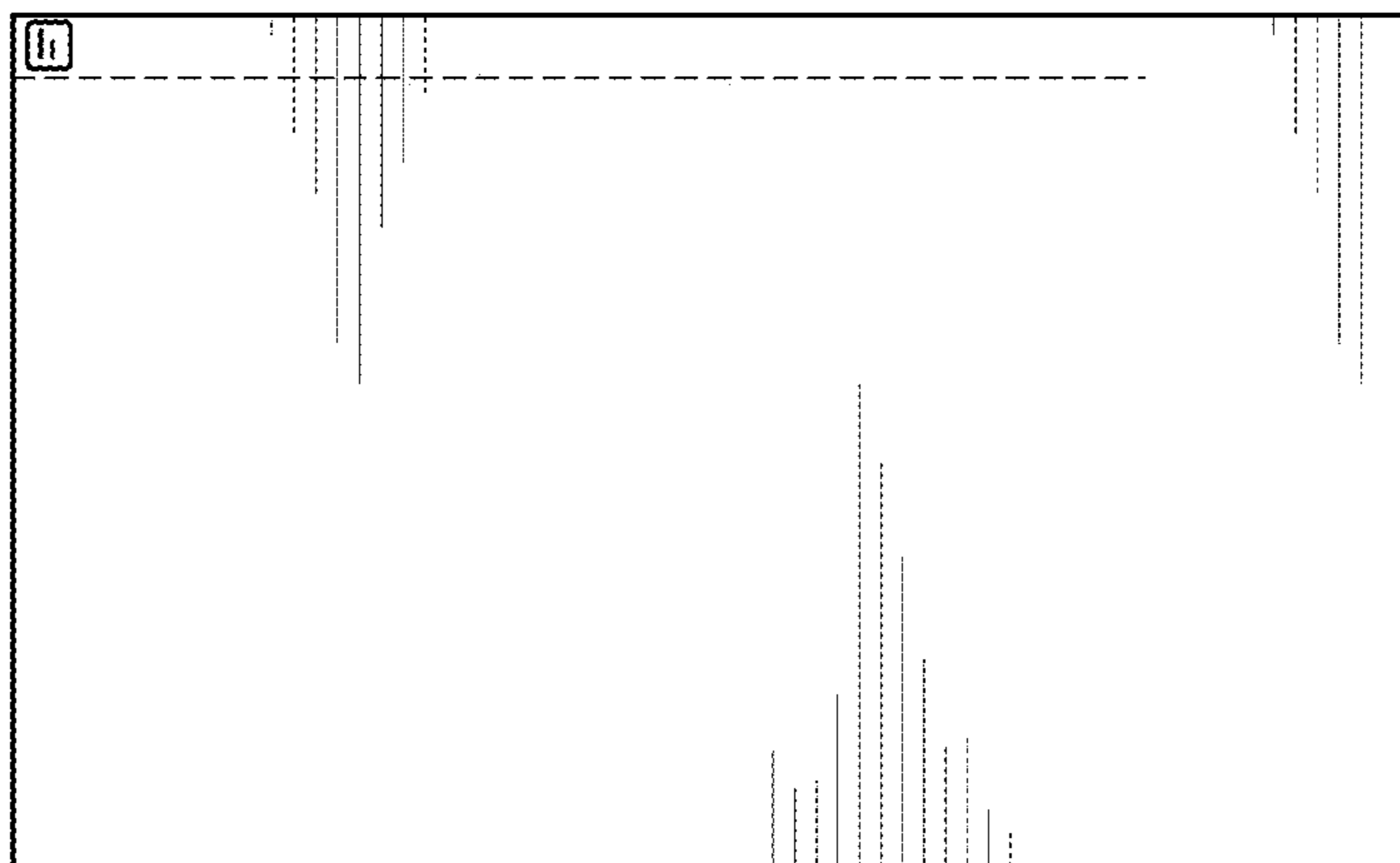
