described.

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FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a building material
showing our new design.

FIG. 2 is a front view thereof.

FIG. 3 is a back view thereof.

FIG. 4 is a left-side view thereof. The right-side view thereof
is a mirror image of the left-side view.

FIG. 5 is a top view thereof; and,

FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof.

The broken away symbols traversing, both vertically and
horizontally, through the building material, indicate that any
portion of the article beyond what is shown forms no part of
the claimed design.

The broken lines illustrate portions of the front and back
surfaces which form no part of the claimed design.

A perspective drawing of a rectangular building material. The top surface features a grid of lines, with some lines being solid and others being dashed or broken, indicating a design that extends beyond the visible boundaries. 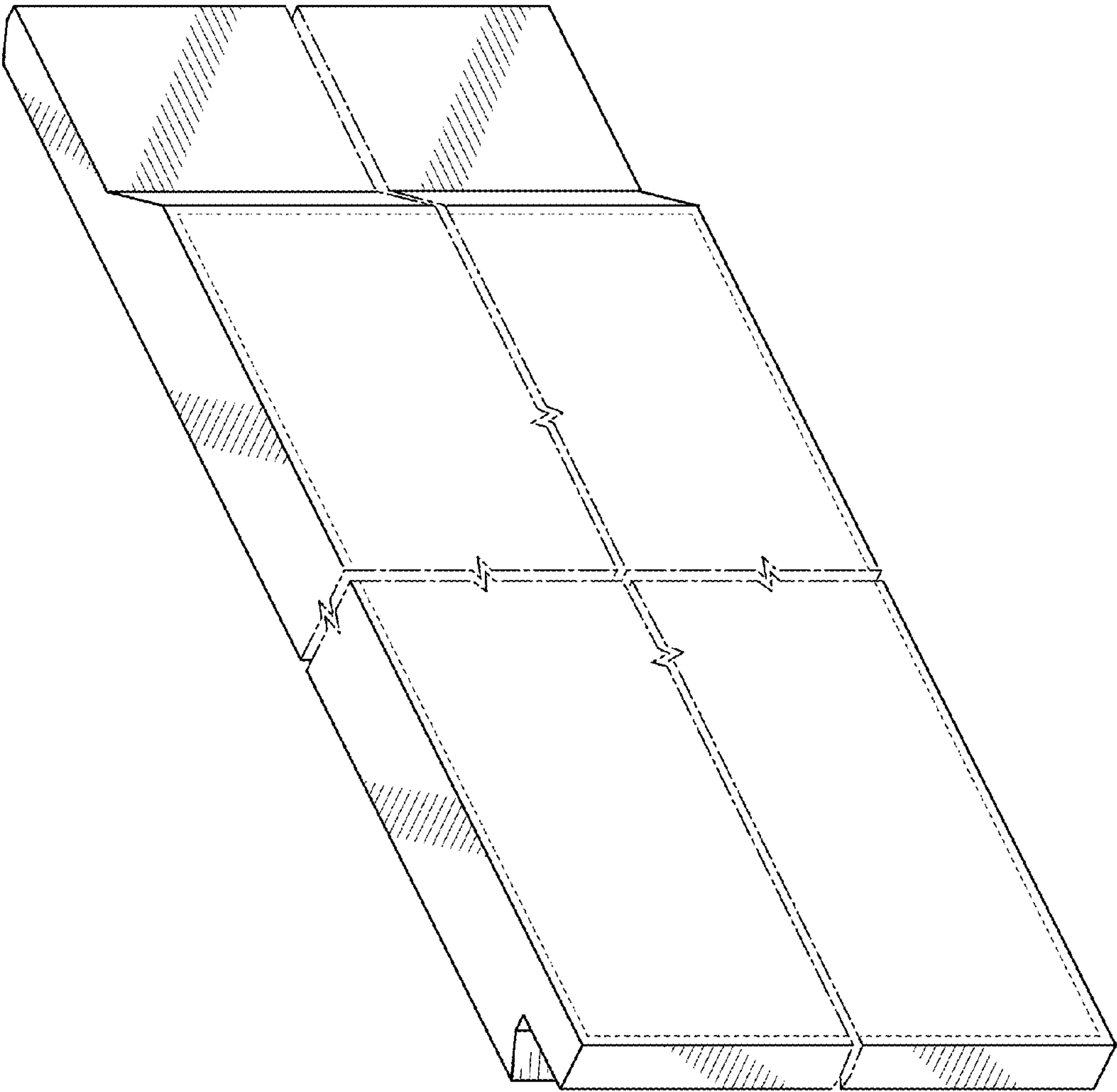

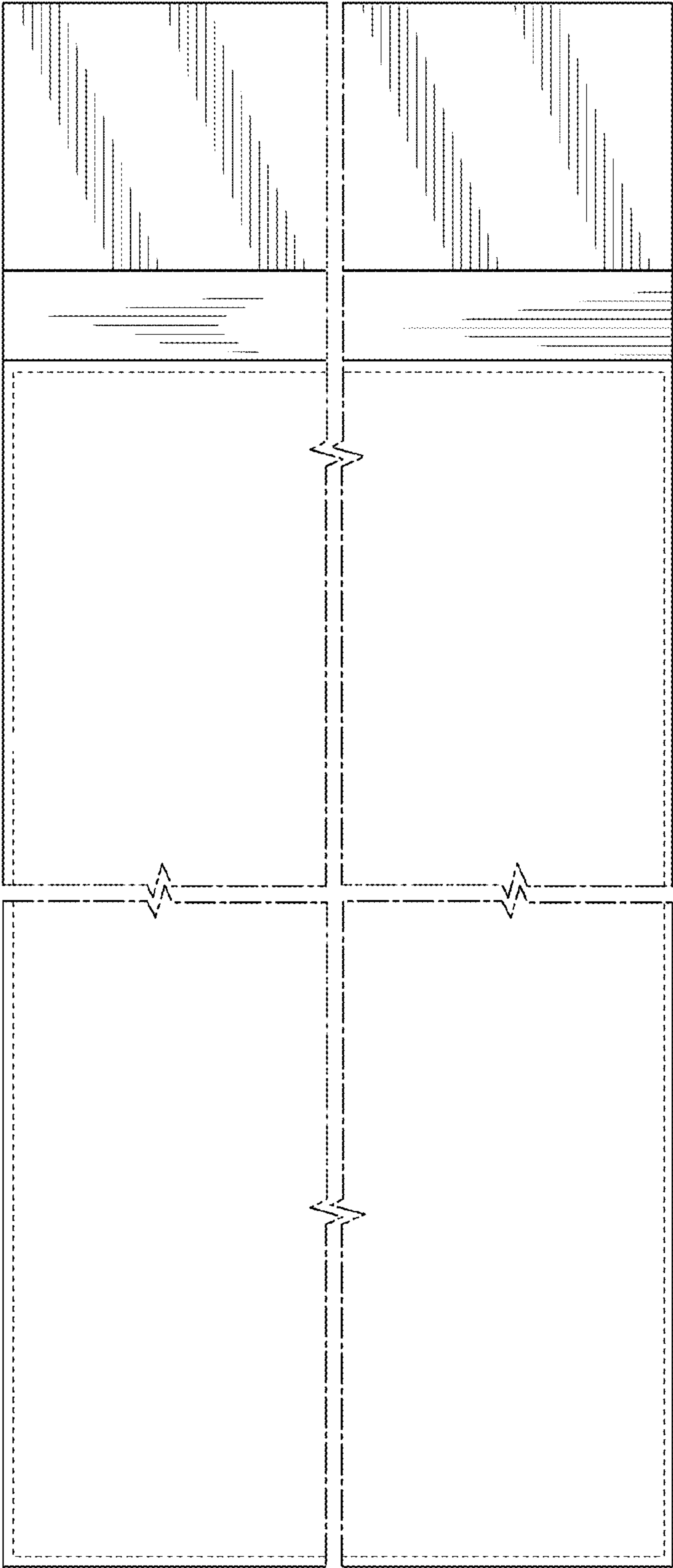

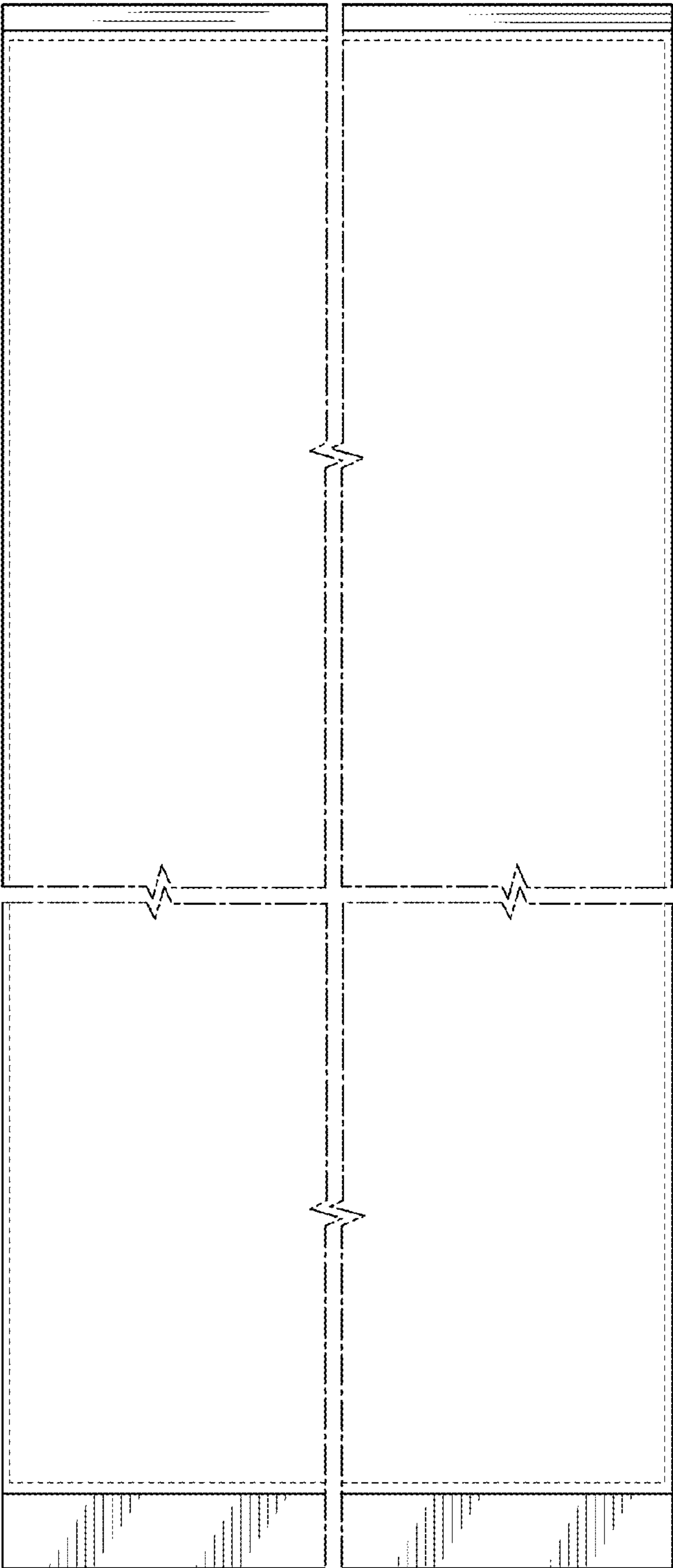

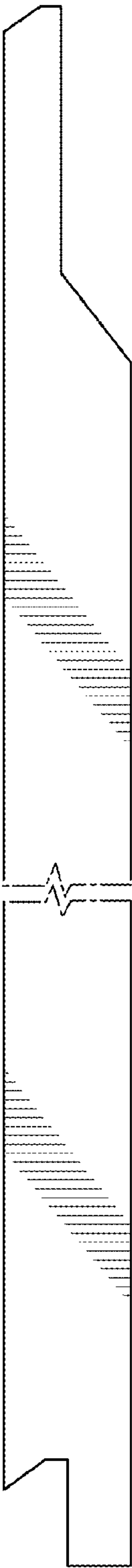

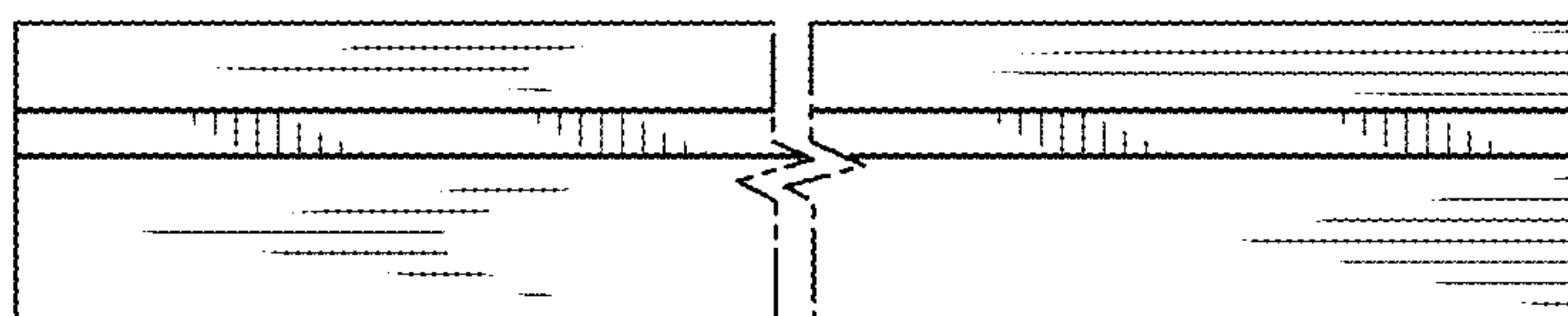

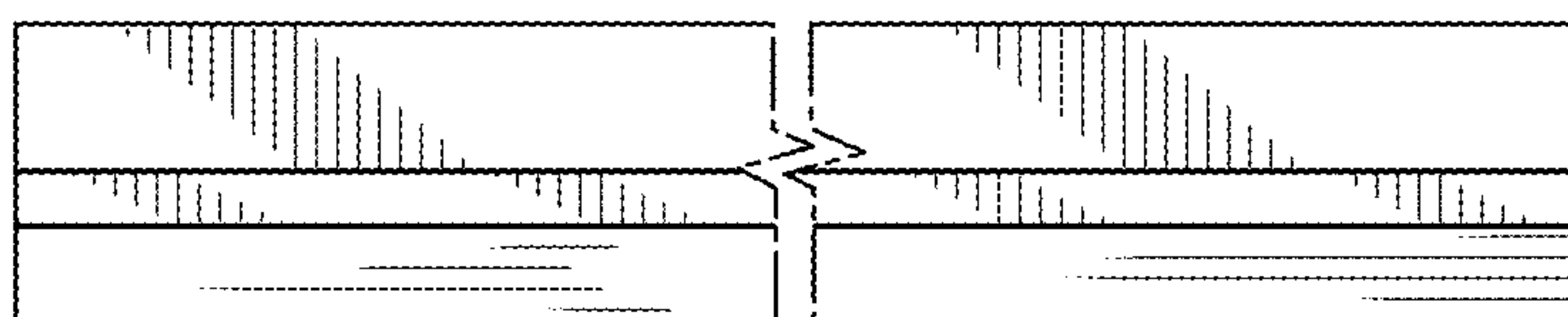
