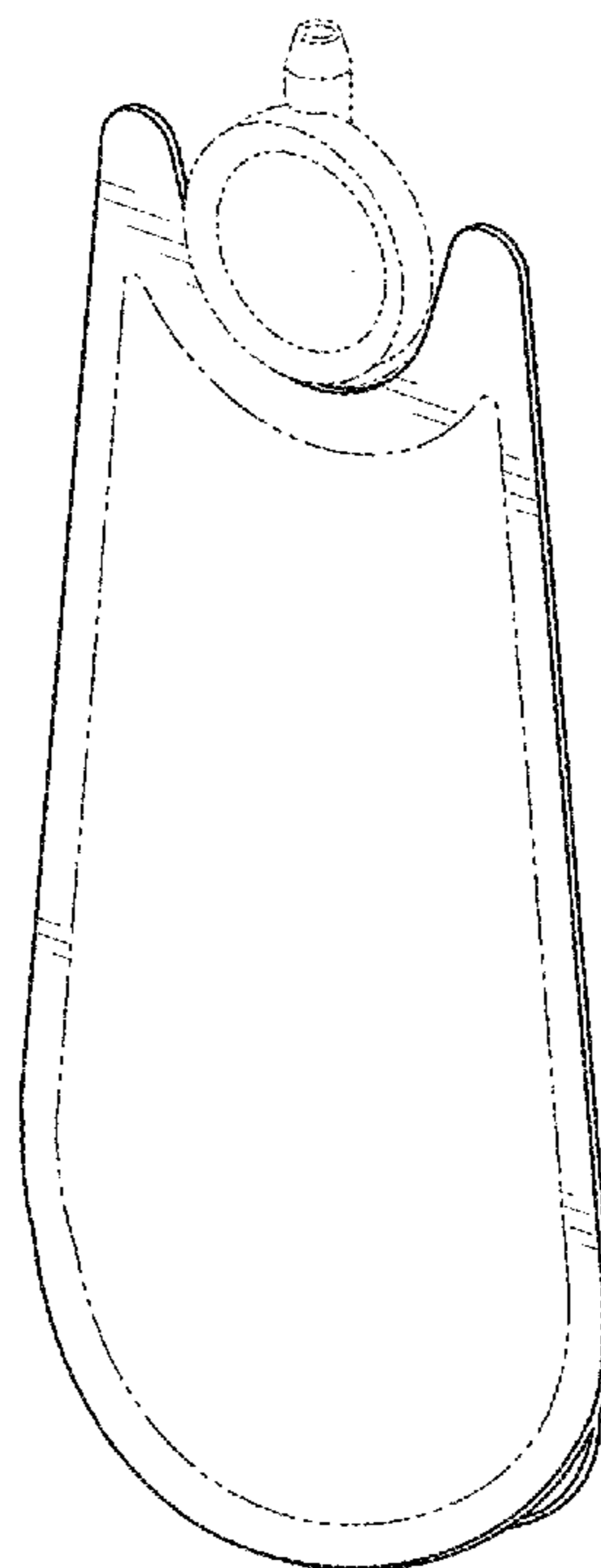

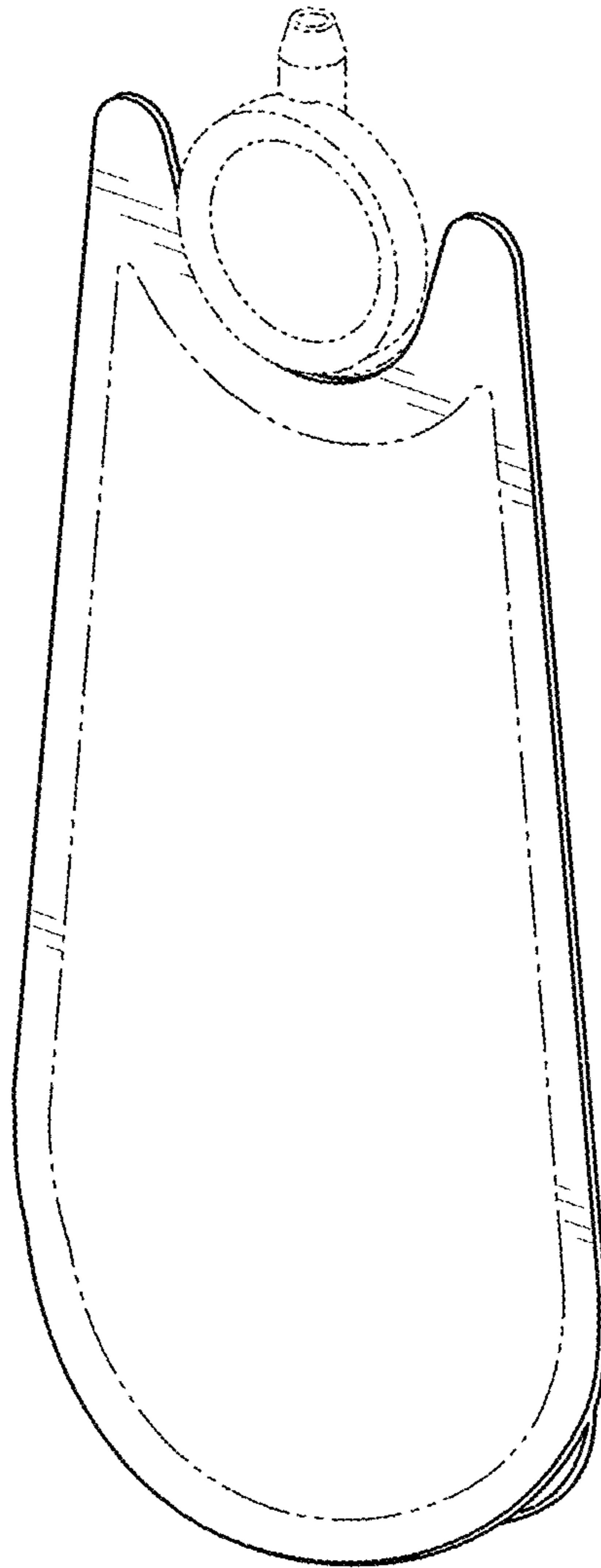
The ornamental design for a tapered pouch for pump with gusset, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

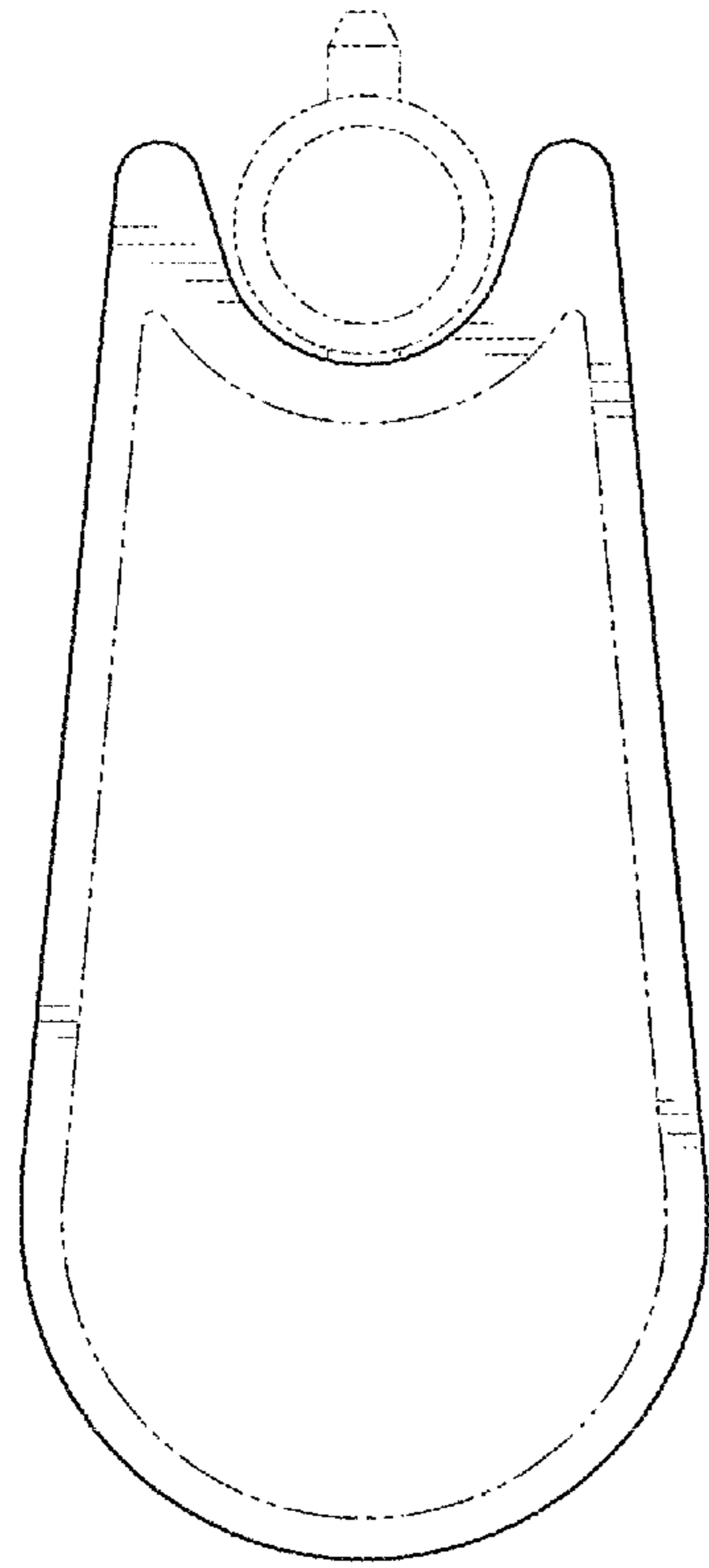
FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a tapered pouch for pump with gusset showing the new design;

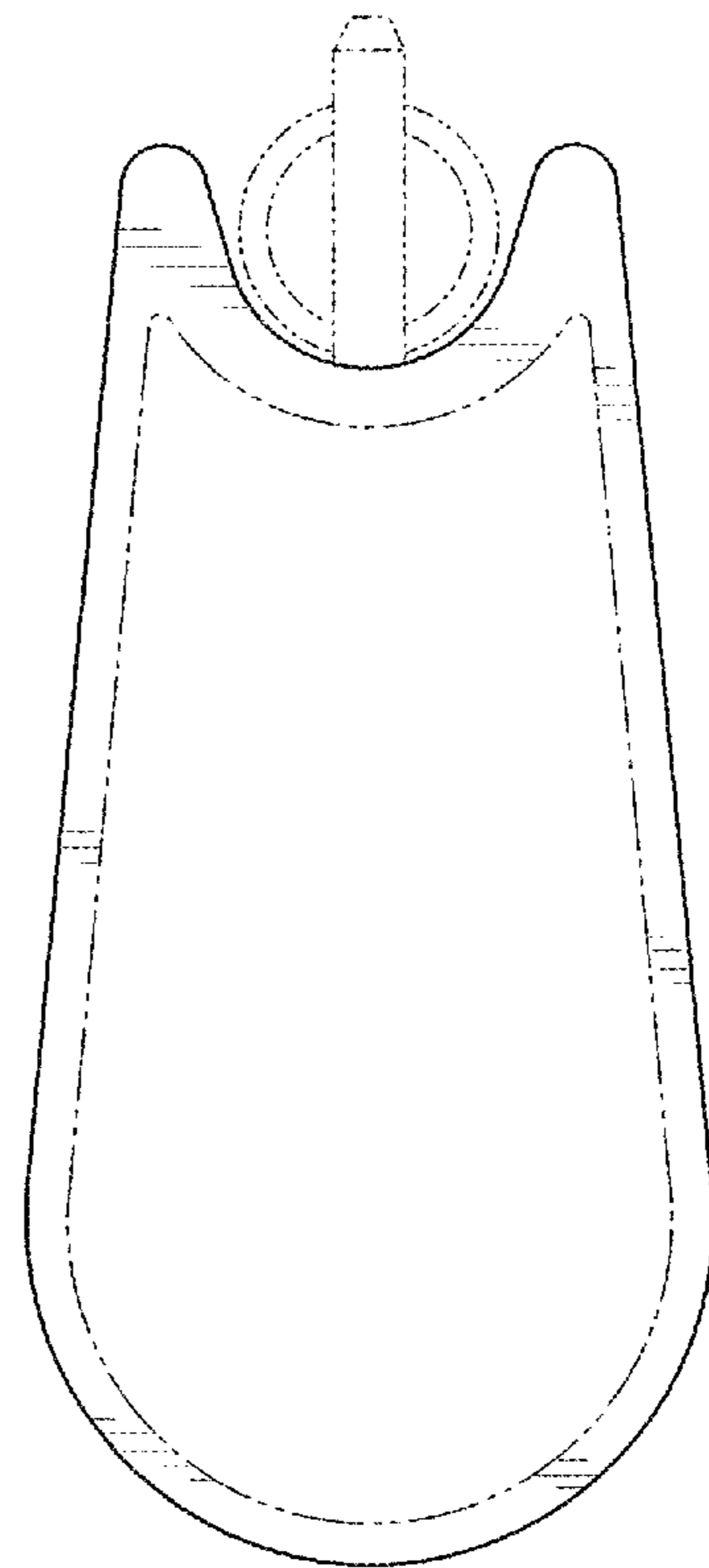




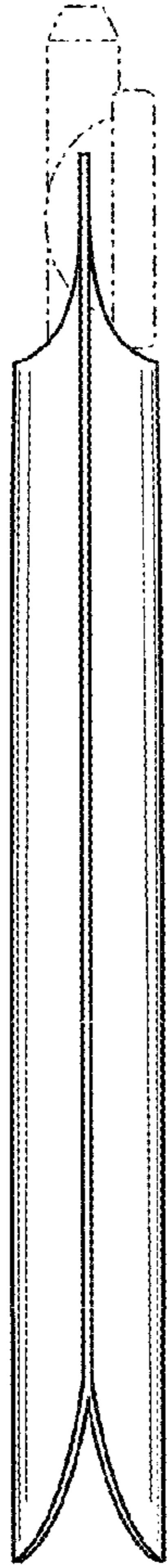
