FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;

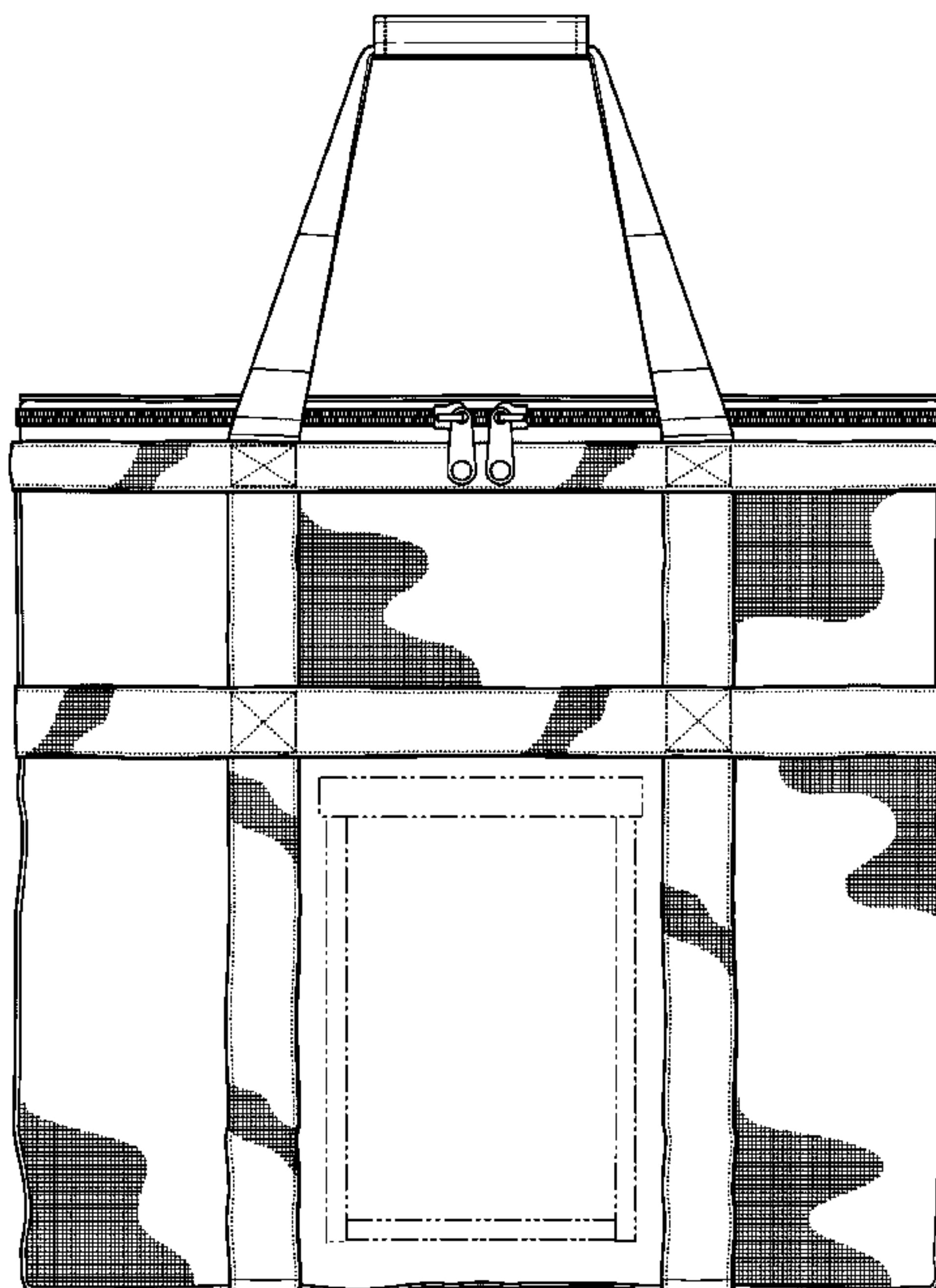
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof;

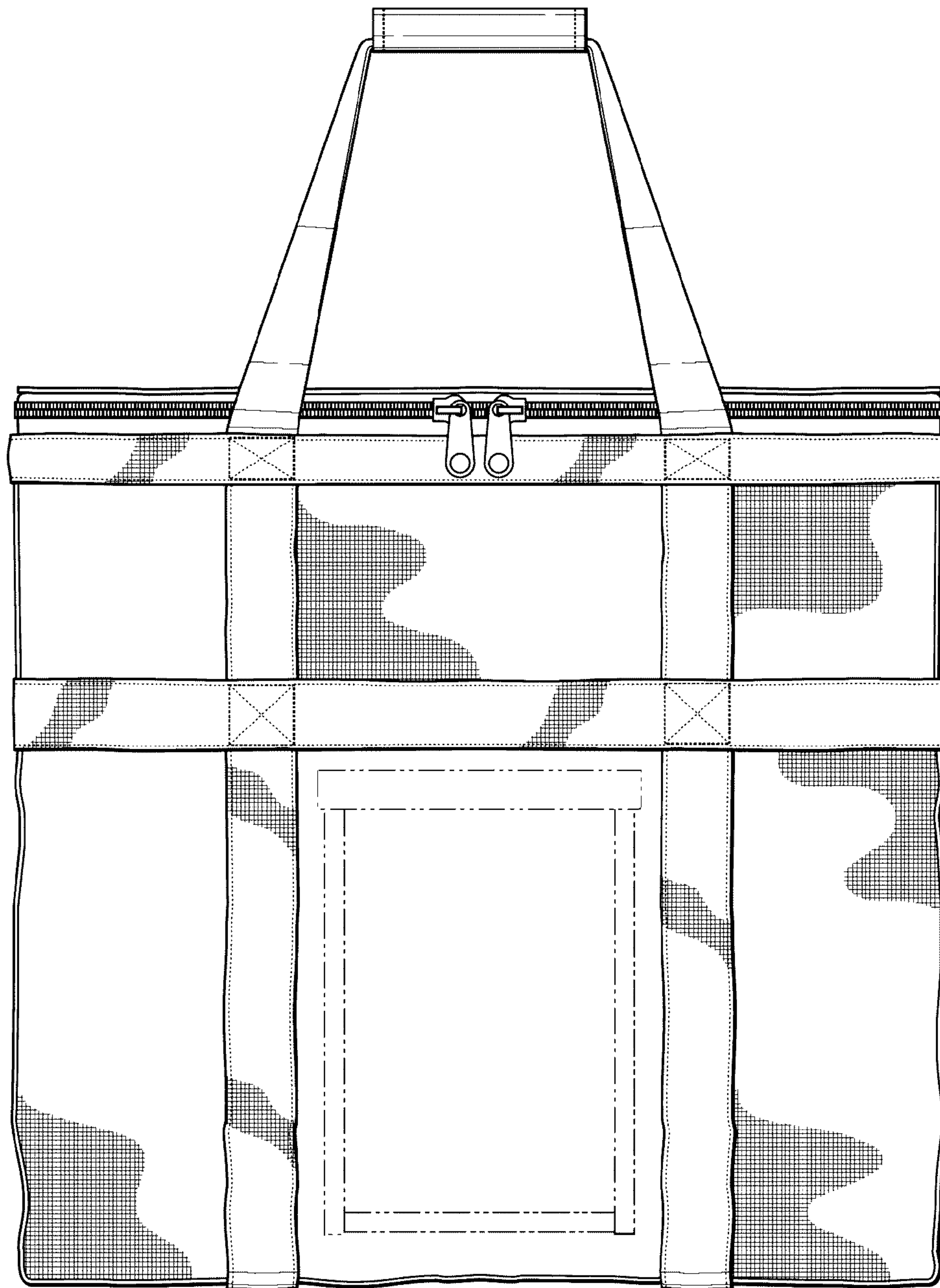

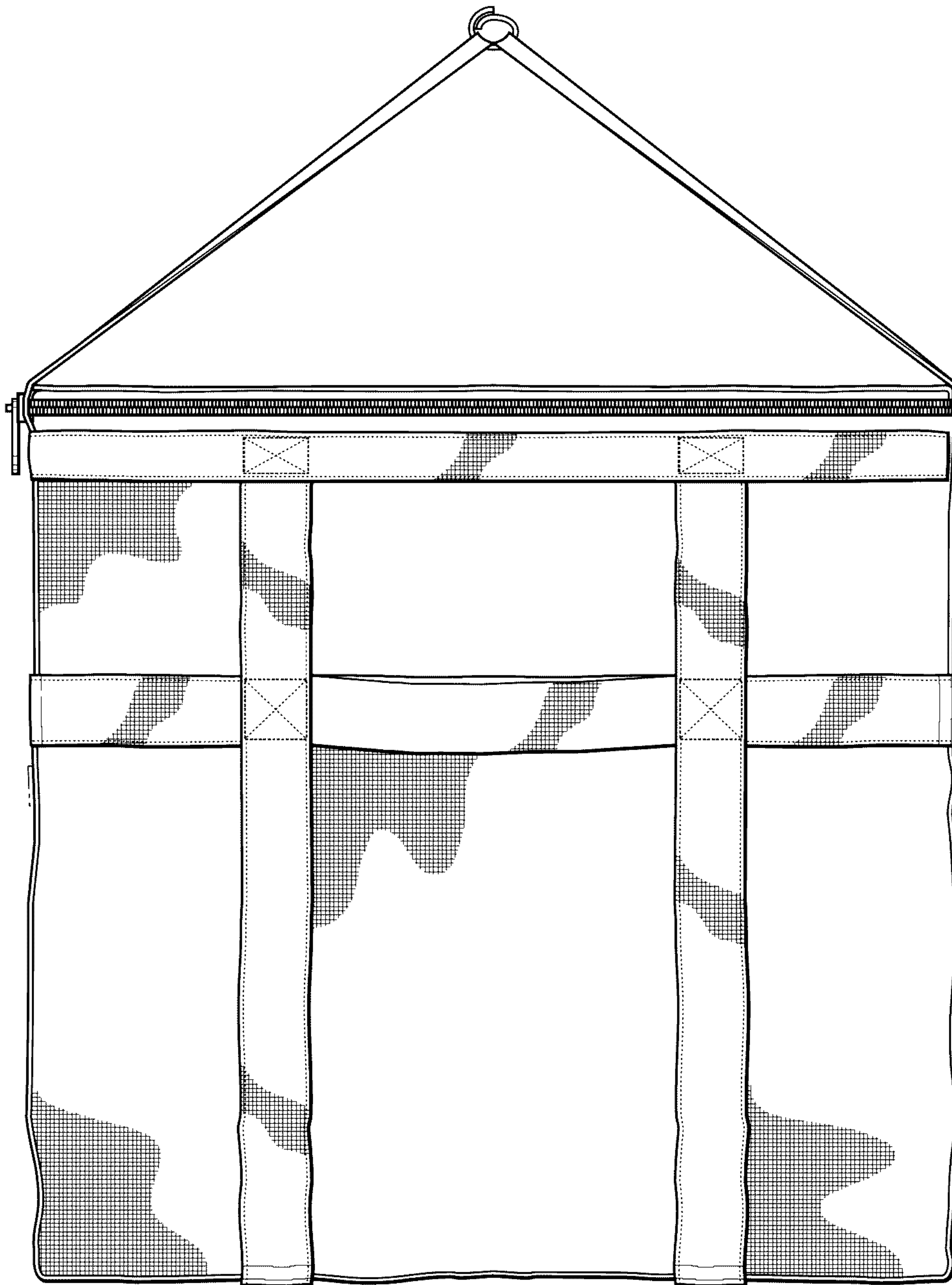

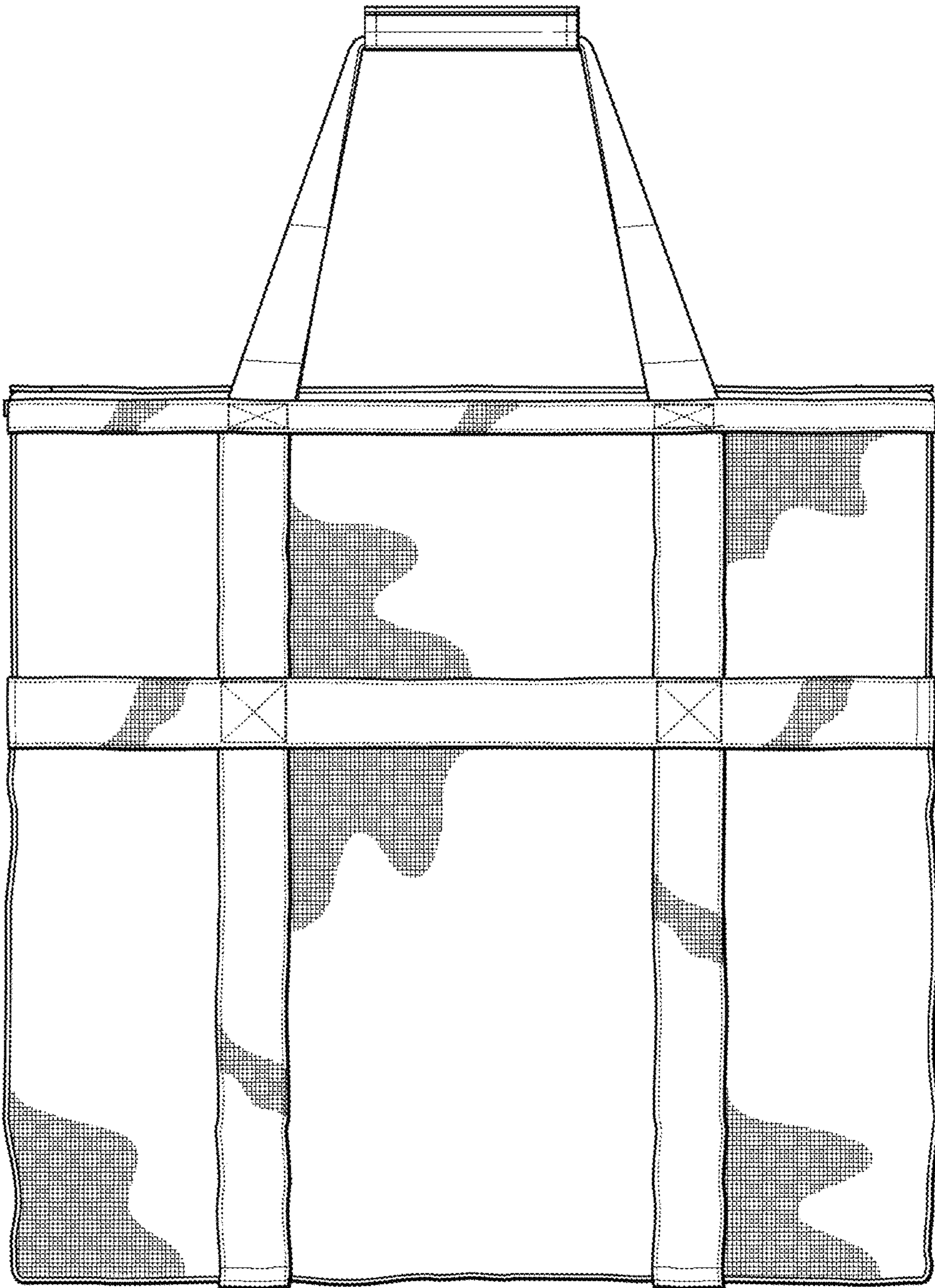
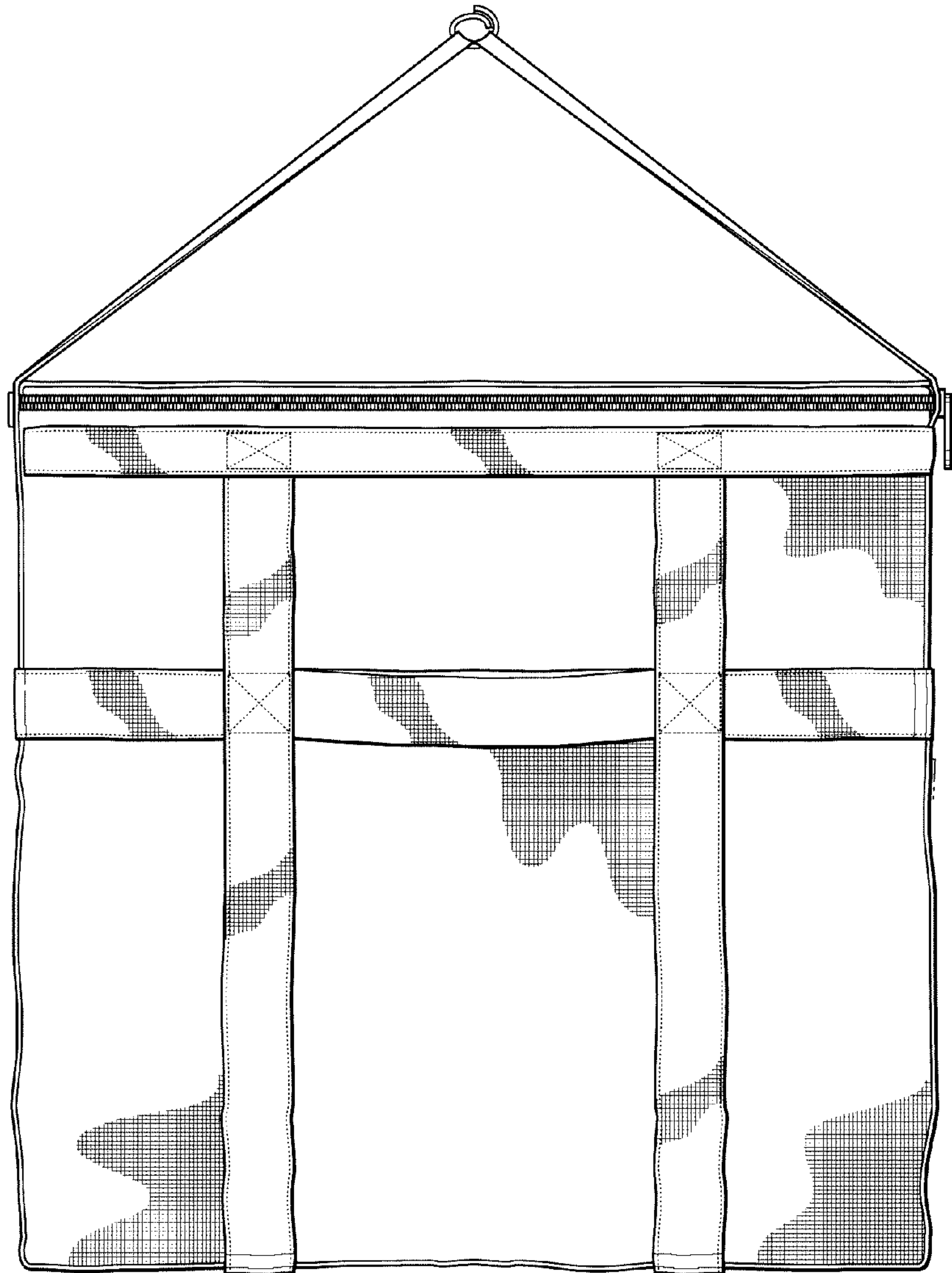

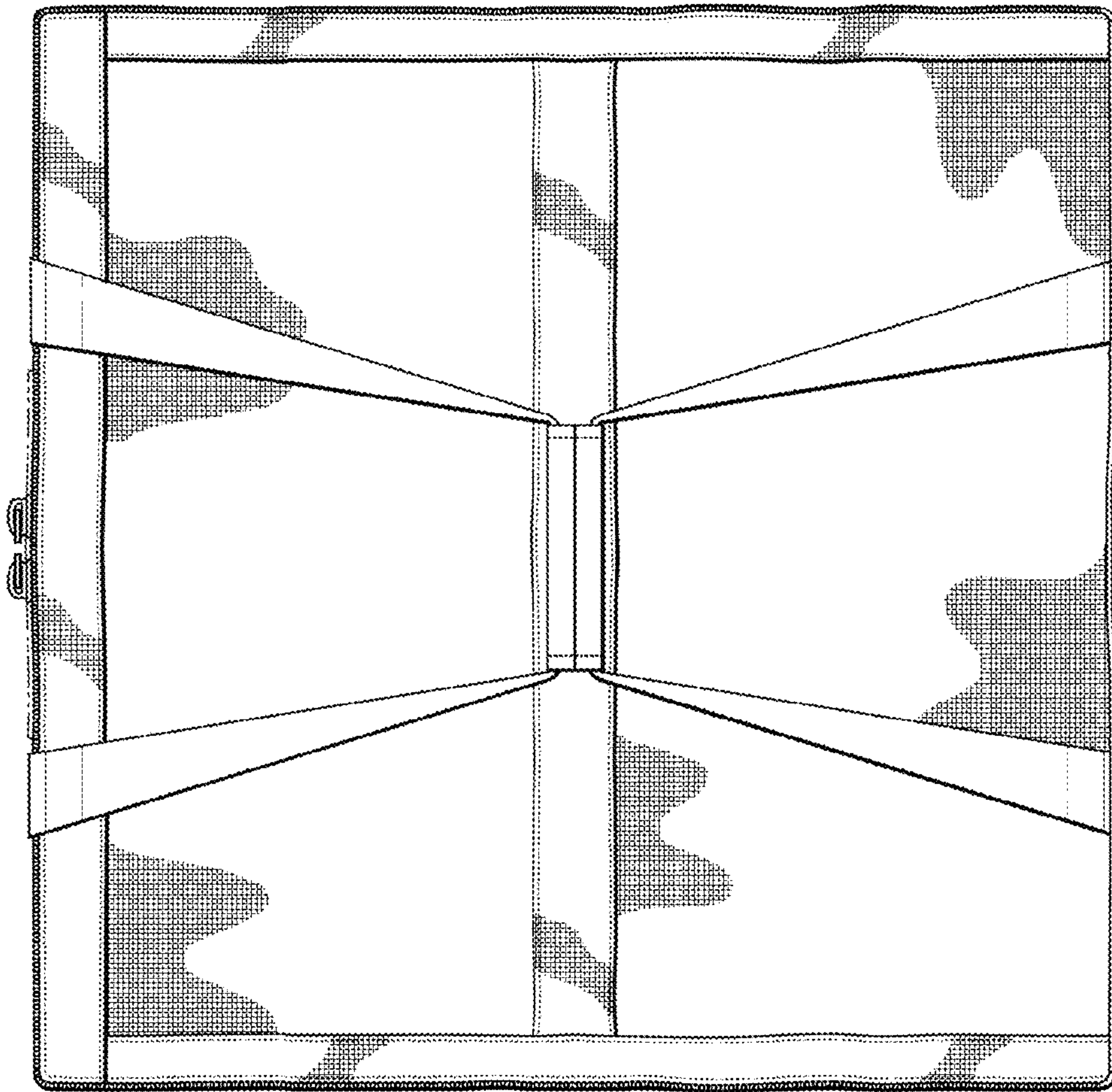

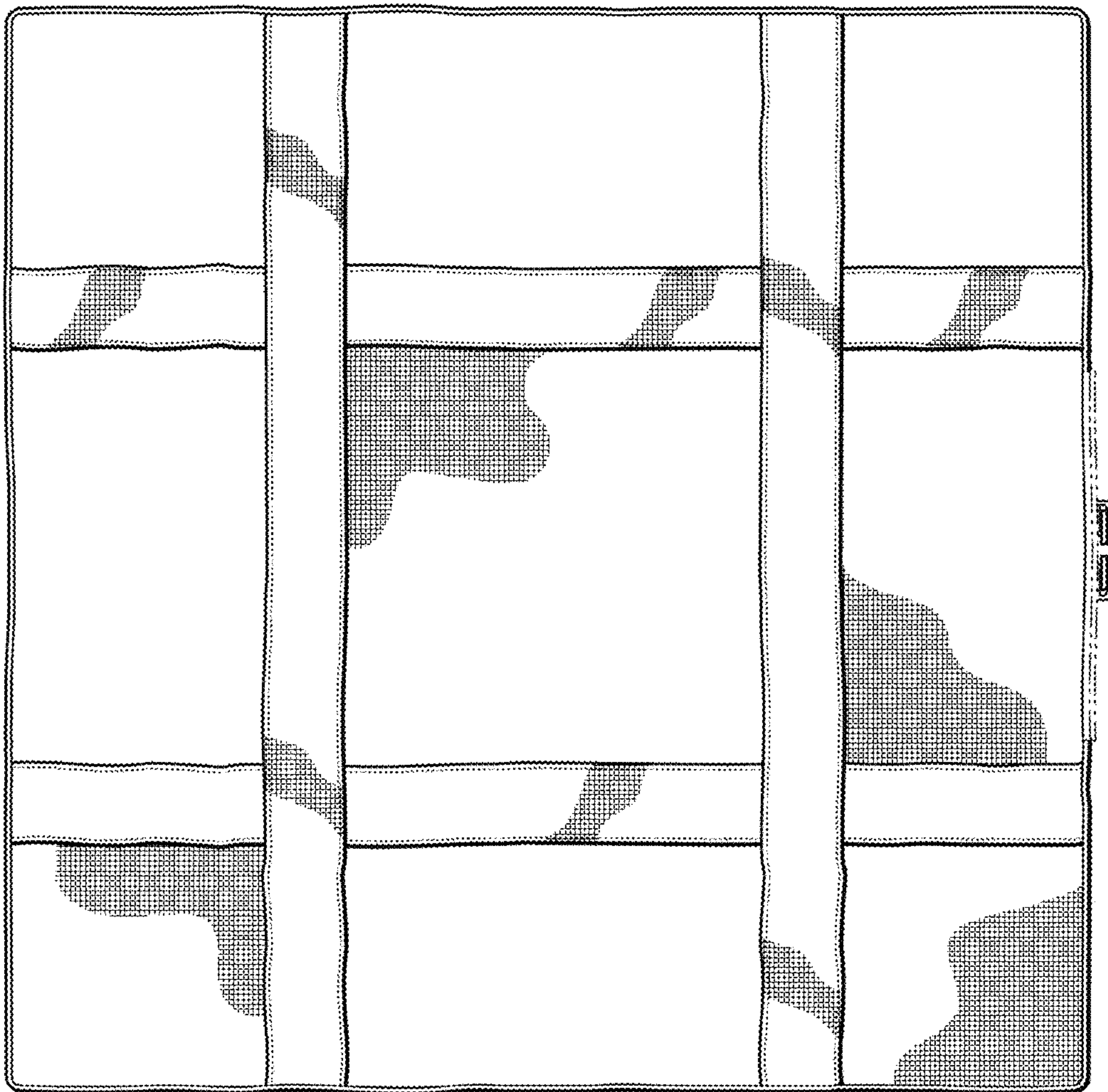
