(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a spatula, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is an isometric view of a front, top, and a first side of a first embodiment of an ornamental design for a spatula; FIG. 2 is a top elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 1; FIG. 3 is an elevational view of the first side of the spatula of FIG. 1, wherein a second, opposite side of the spatula is a mirror image of the first side; FIG. 4 is a front elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 1; FIG. 5 is an isometric view of a front, top, and a first side of a second embodiment of an ornamental design for a spatula;

FIG. 6 is a top elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 5; FIG. 7 is an elevational view of the first side of the spatula of FIG. 5, wherein a second, opposite side of the spatula is a mirror image of the first side;

FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 5; FIG. 9 is an isometric view of a front, top, and a first side of a third embodiment of an ornamental design for a spatula; FIG. 10 is a top elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 9; FIG. 11 is an elevational view of the first side of the spatula of FIG. 9, wherein a second, opposite side of the spatula is a mirror image of the first side;

FIG. 12 is a front elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 9; FIG. 13 is an isometric view of a front, top, and a first side of a fourth embodiment of an ornamental design for a spatula;

FIG. 14 is a top elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 13; FIG. 15 is an elevational view of the first side of the spatula of FIG. 13, wherein a second, opposite side of the spatula is a mirror image of the first side;

FIG. 16 is a front elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 13; FIG. 17 is an isometric view of a front, top, and a first side of a fifth embodiment of an ornamental design for a spatula; FIG. 18 is a top elevational view of the spatula of FIG. 17; FIG. 19 is an elevational view of the first side of the spatula of FIG. 17, wherein a second, opposite side of the spatula is a mirror image of the first side;

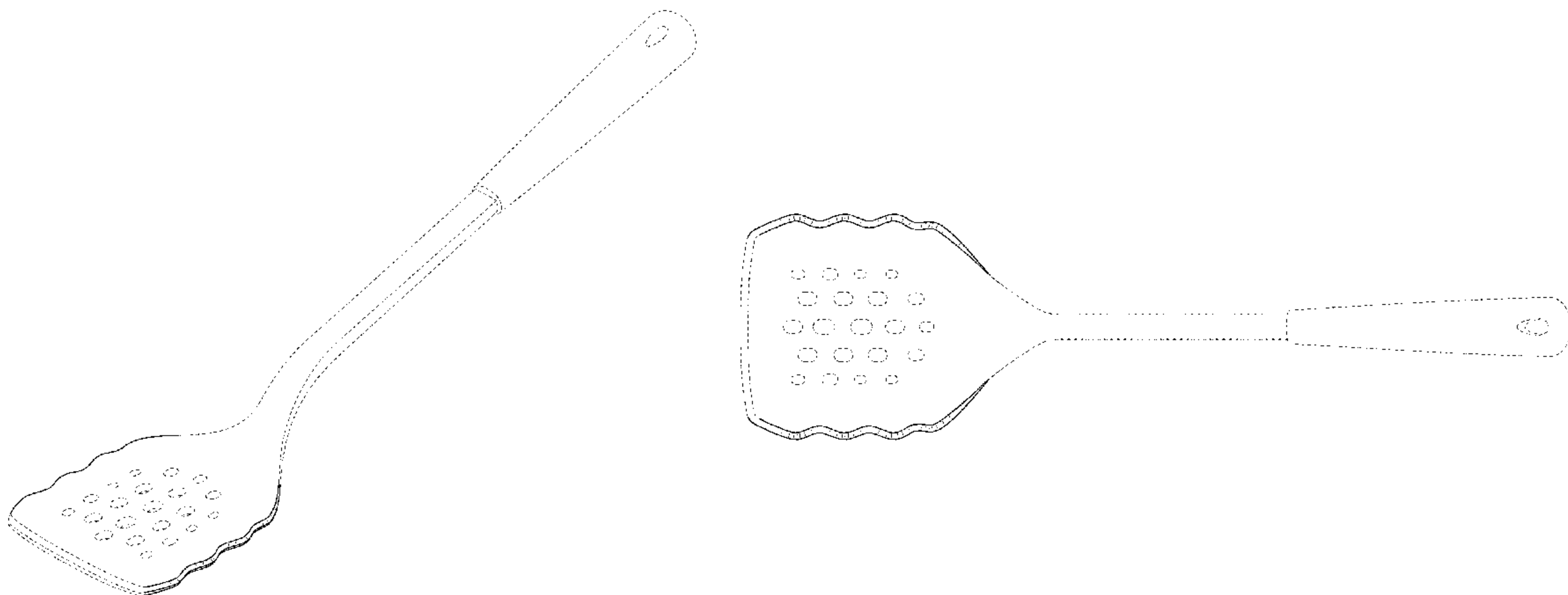

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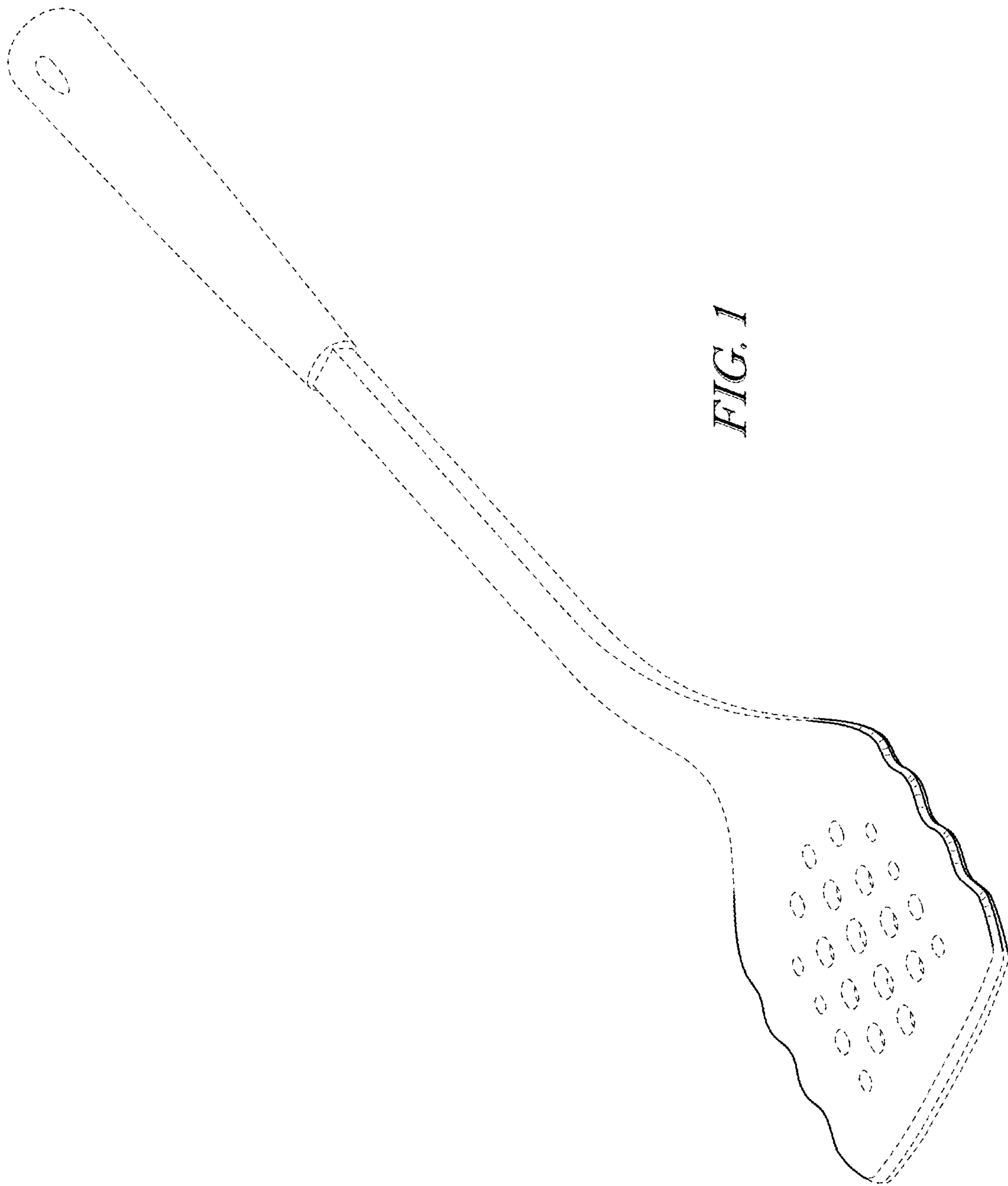

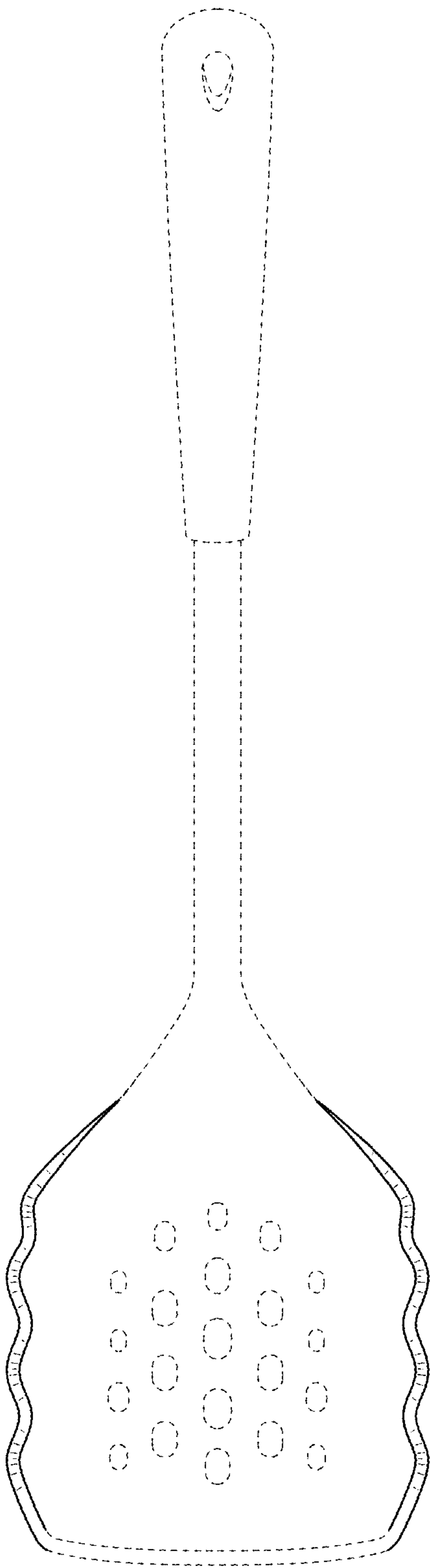

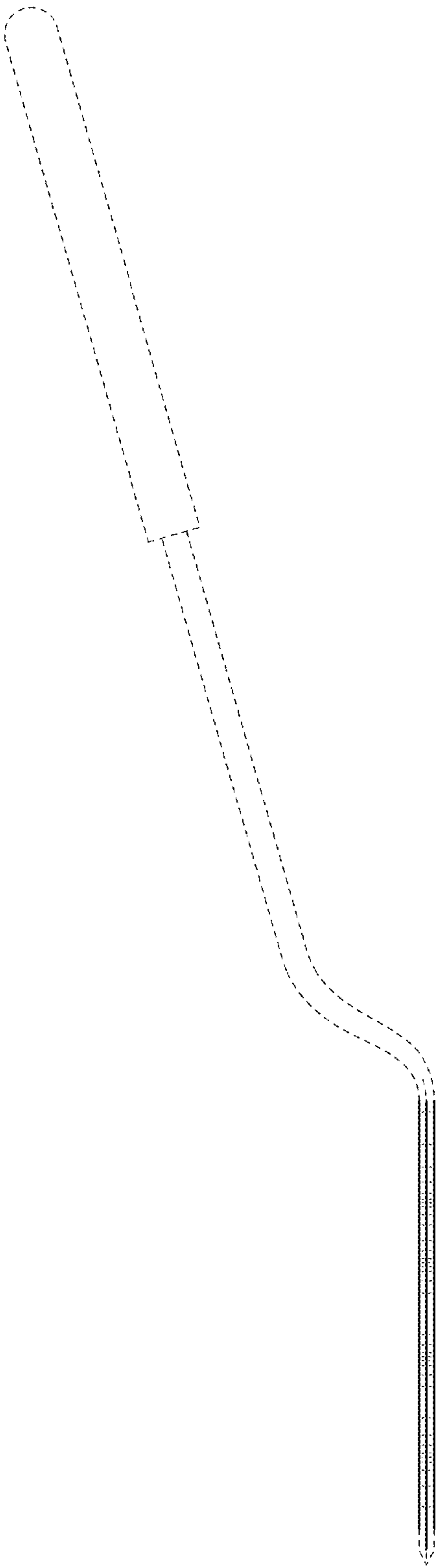

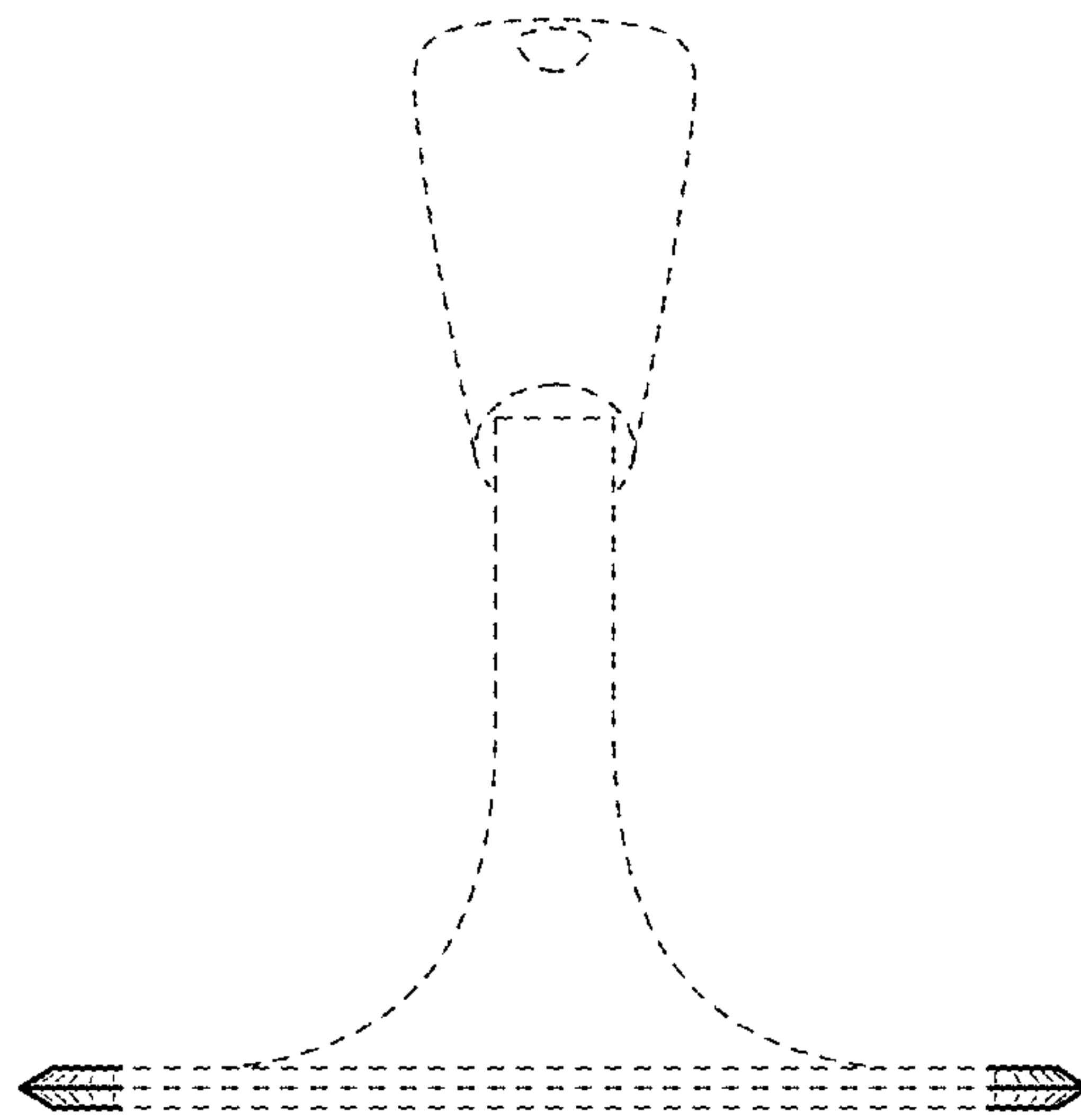

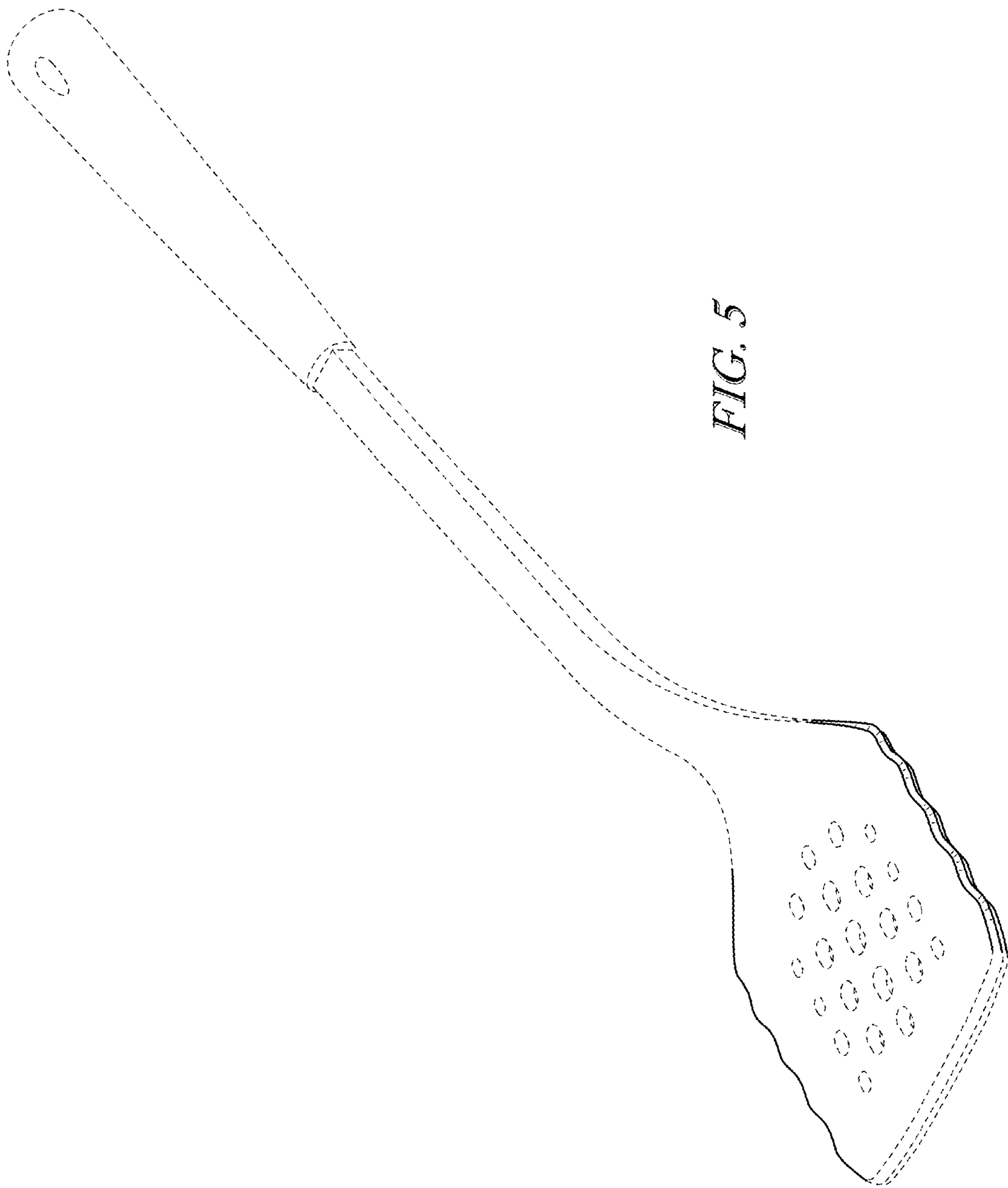

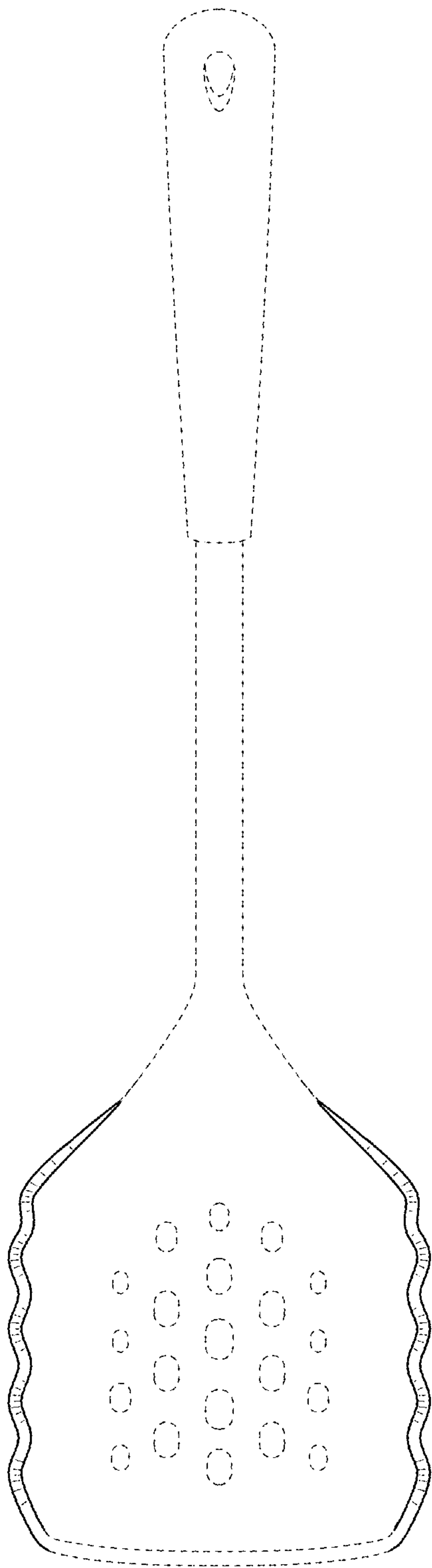

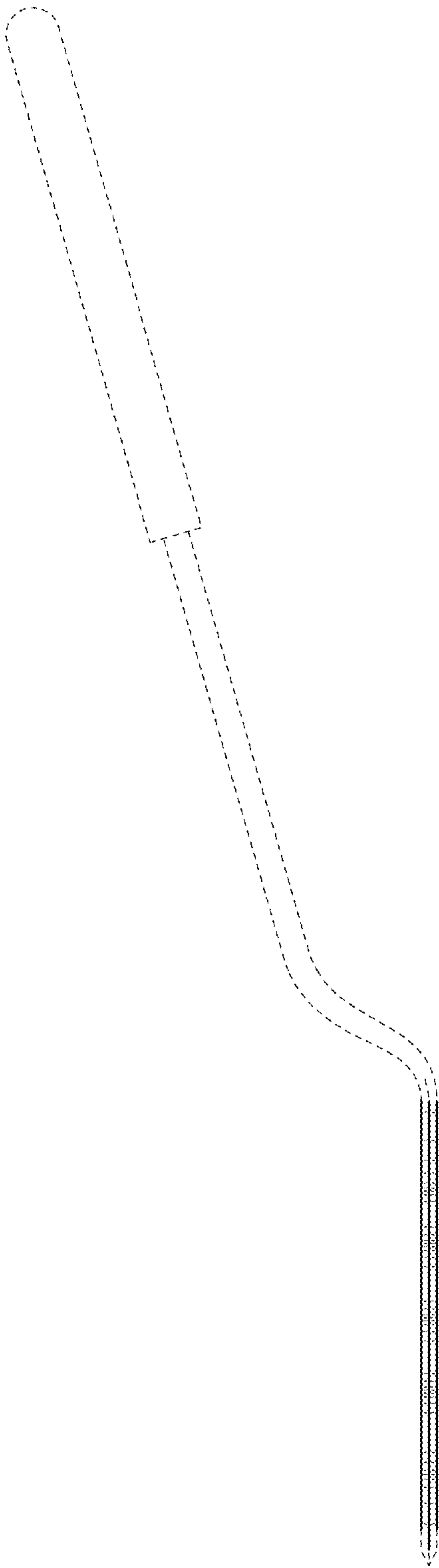

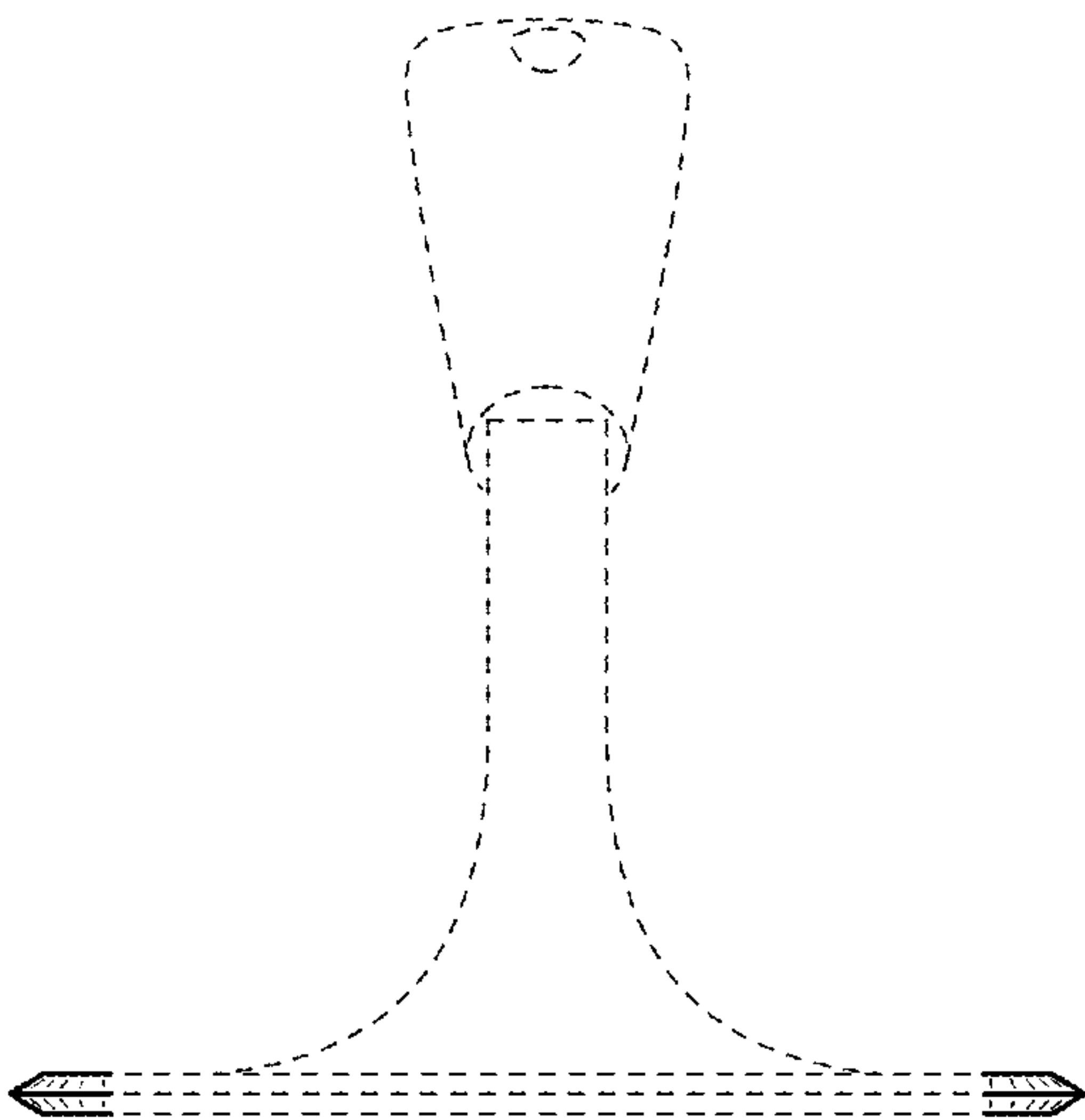

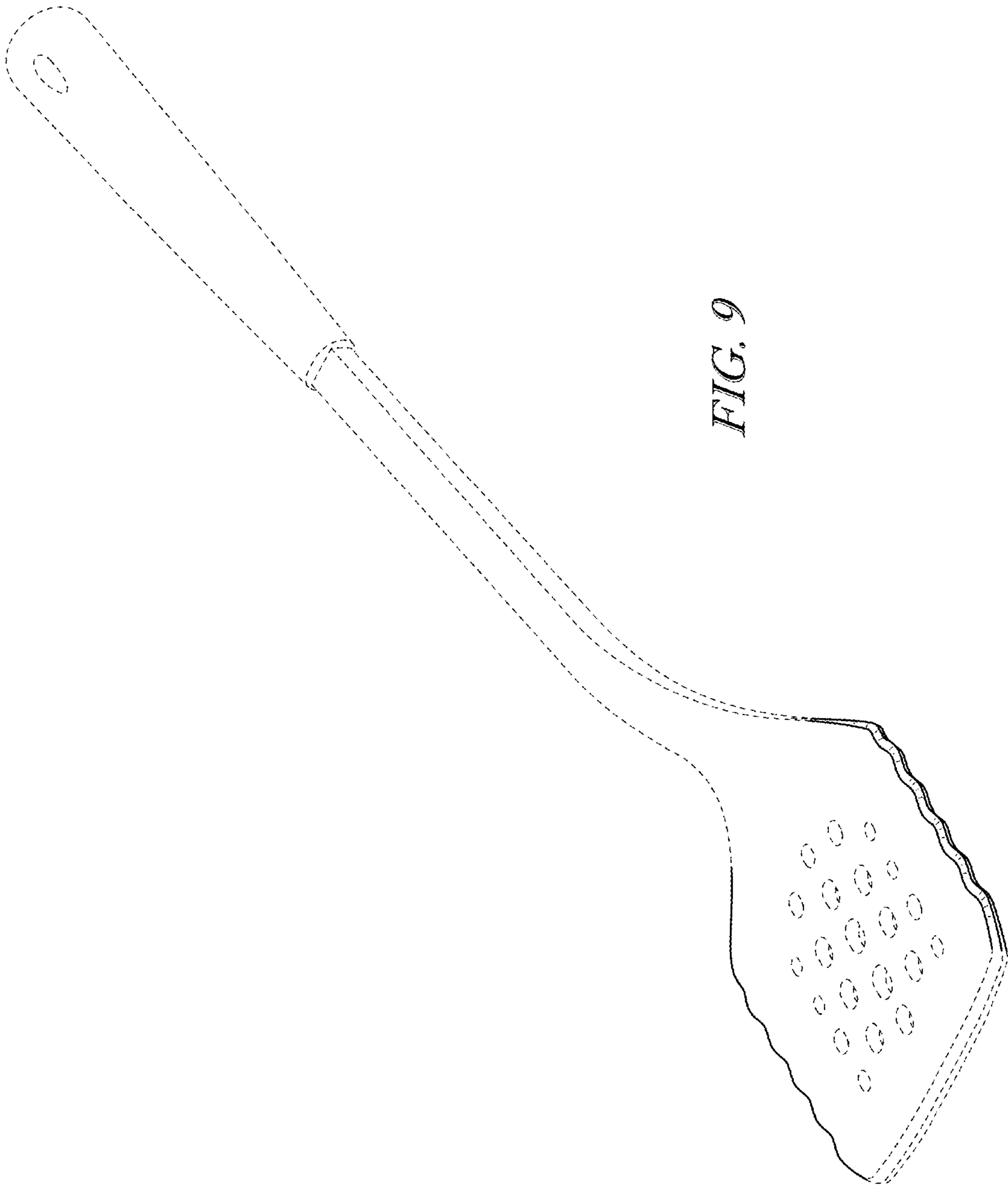

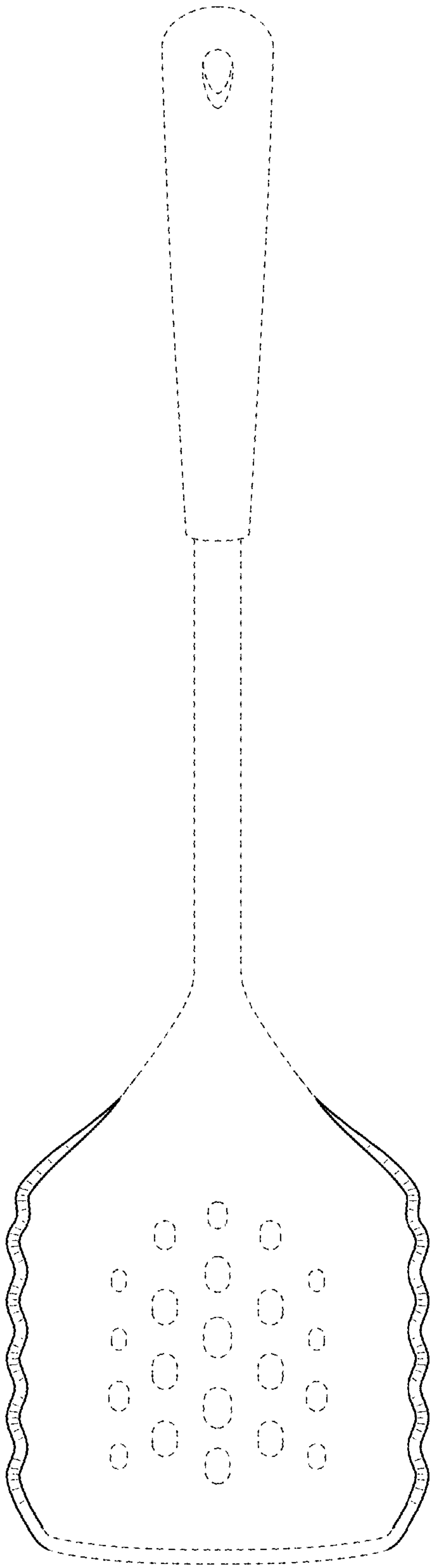

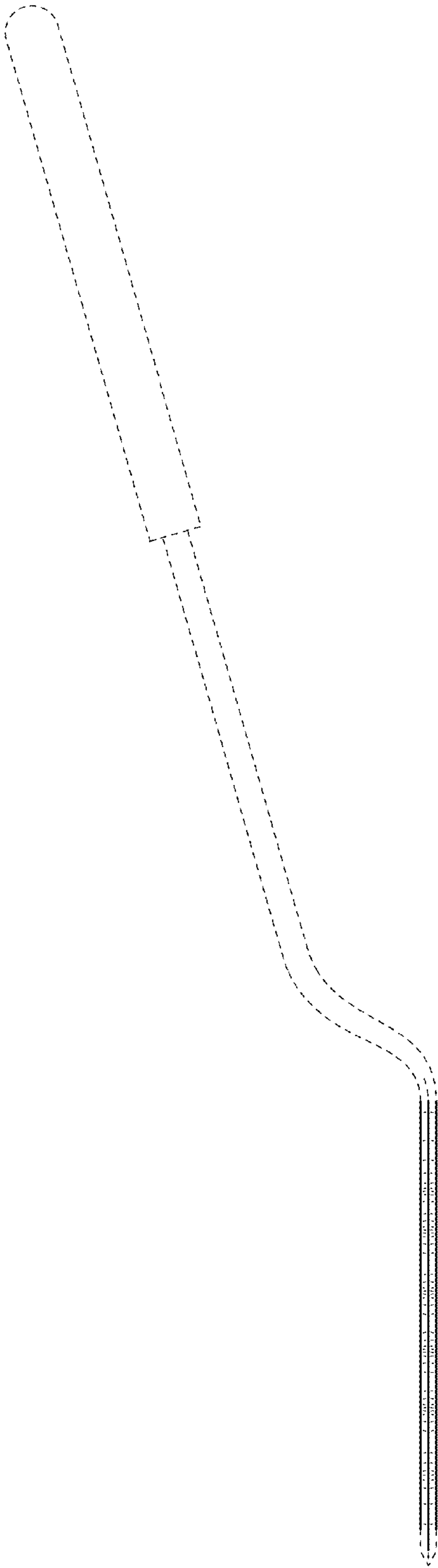

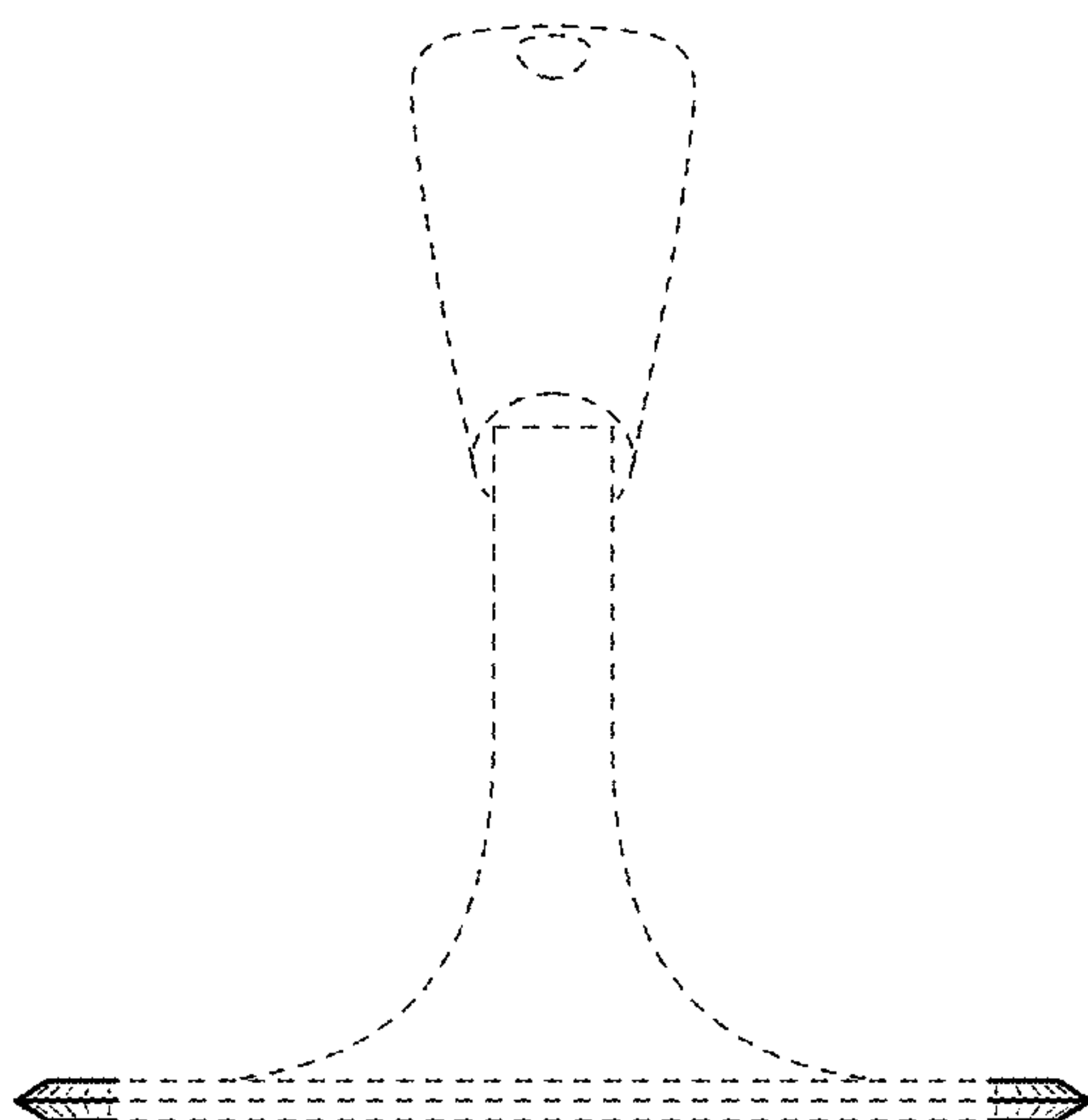

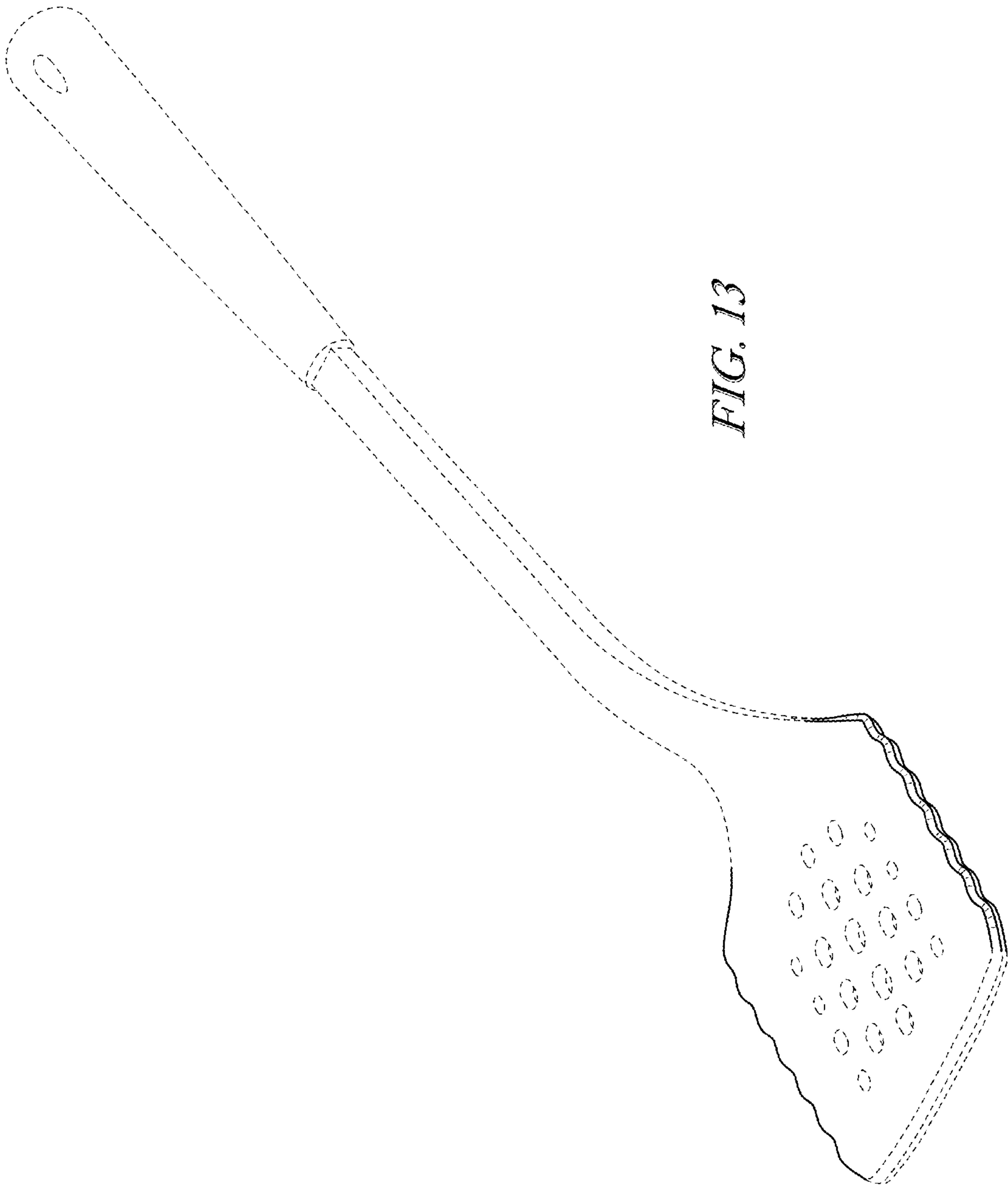

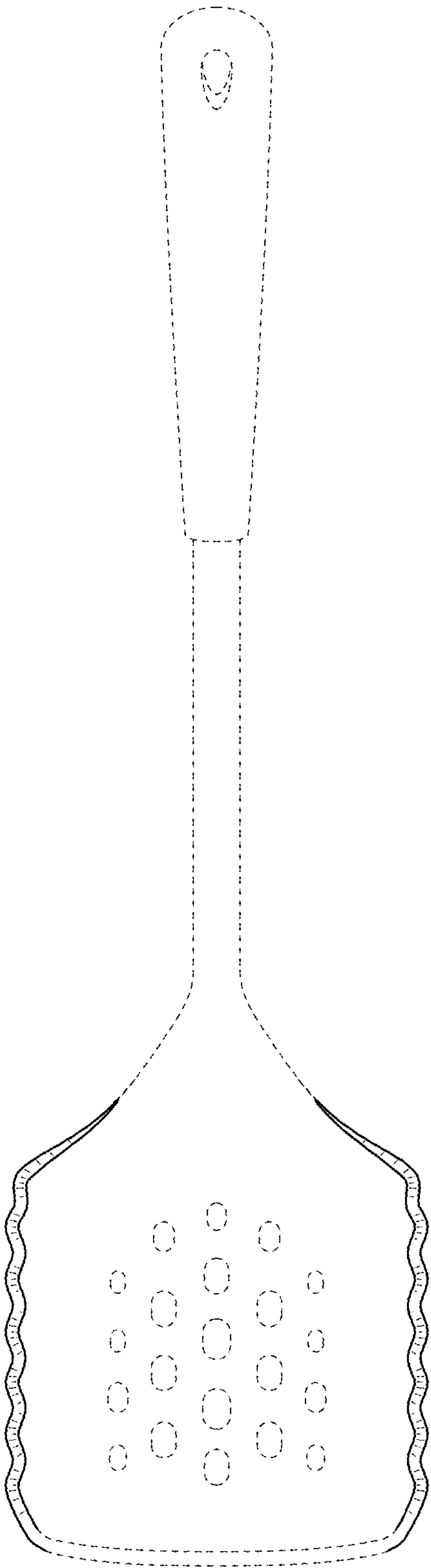

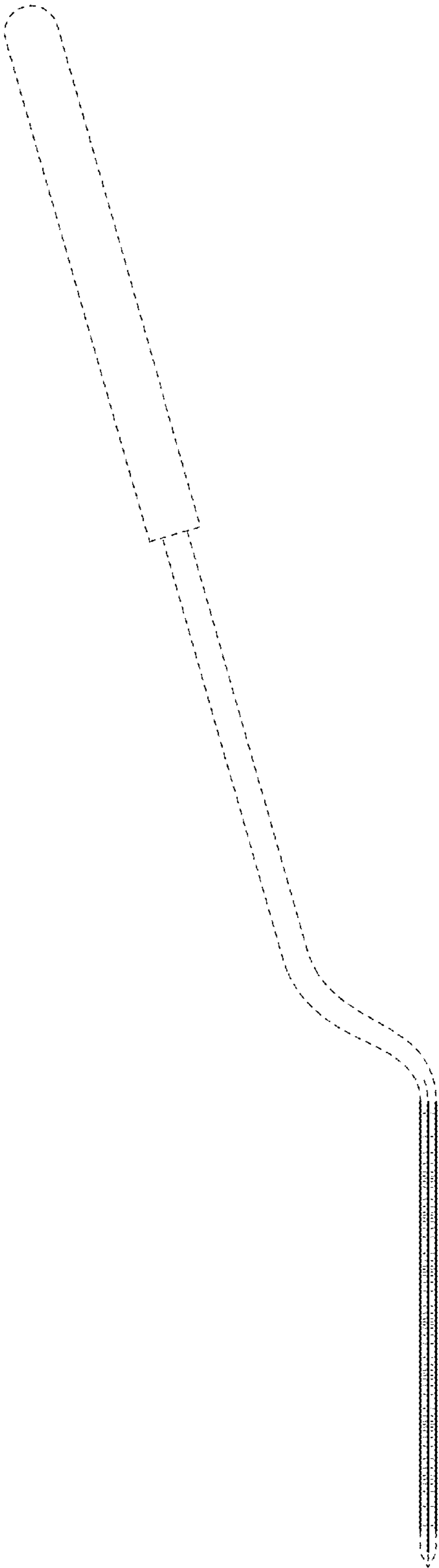

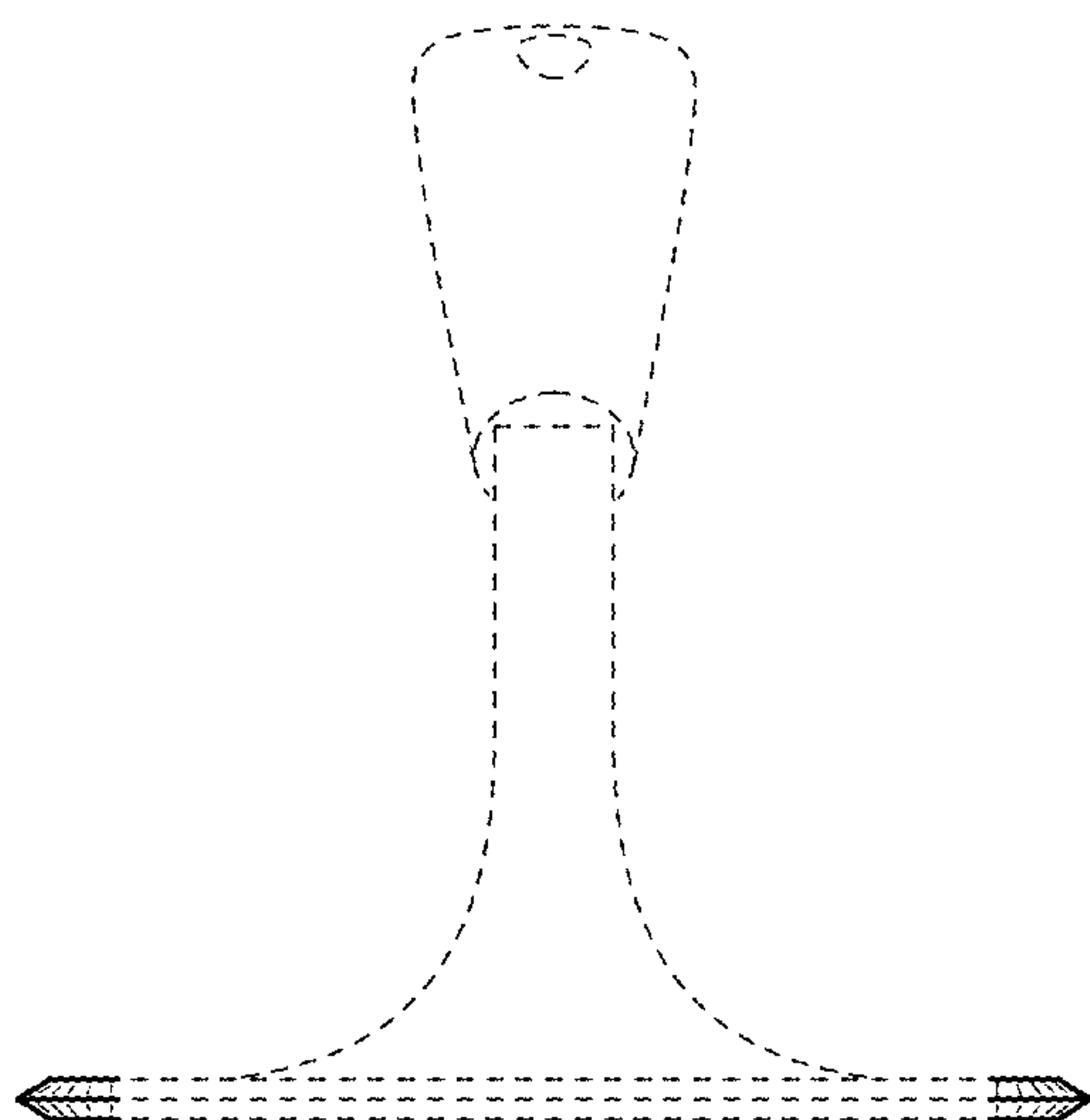

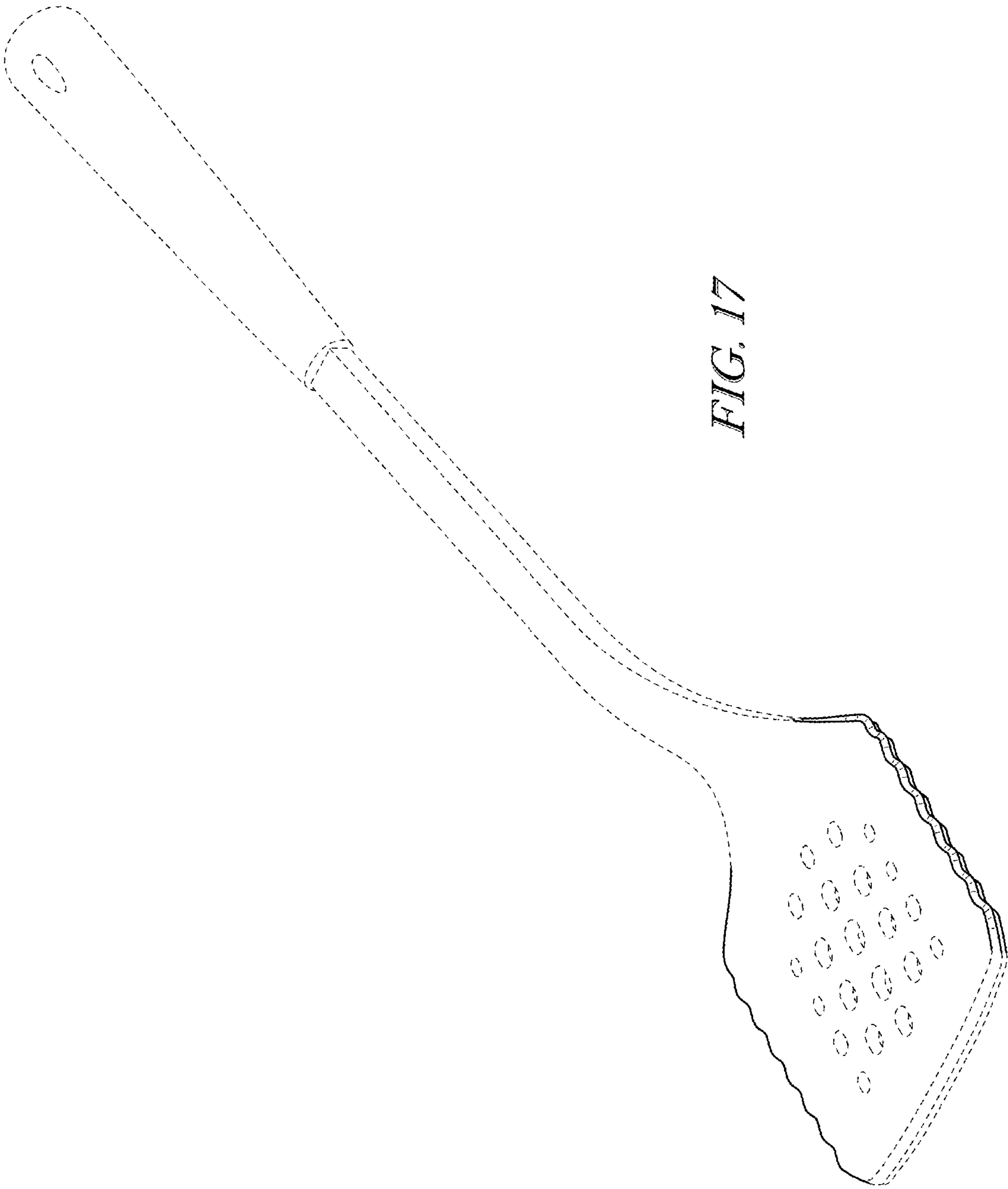

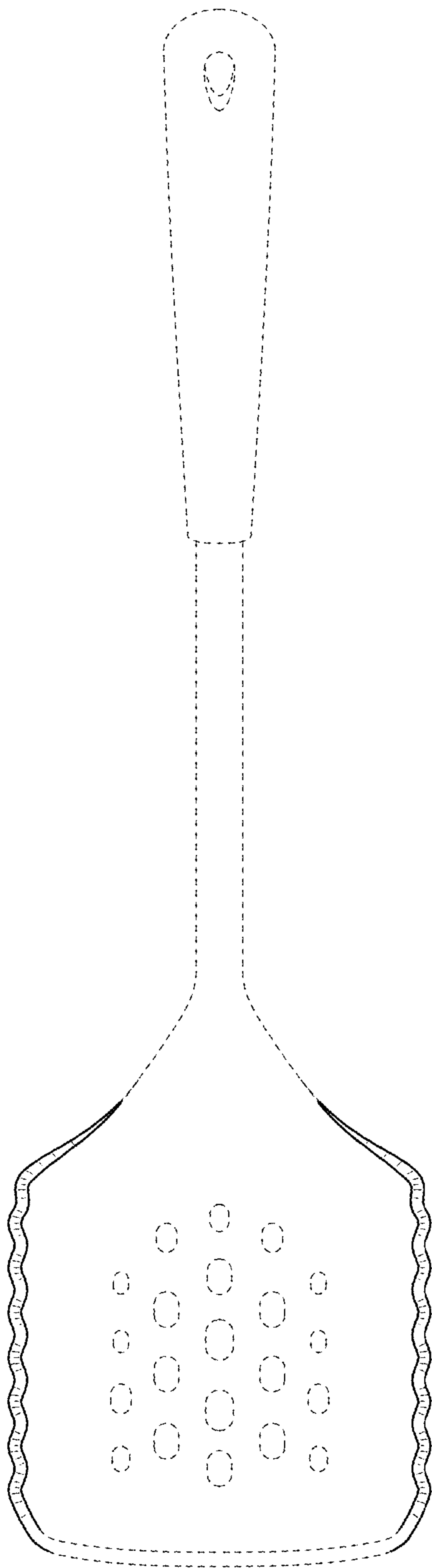

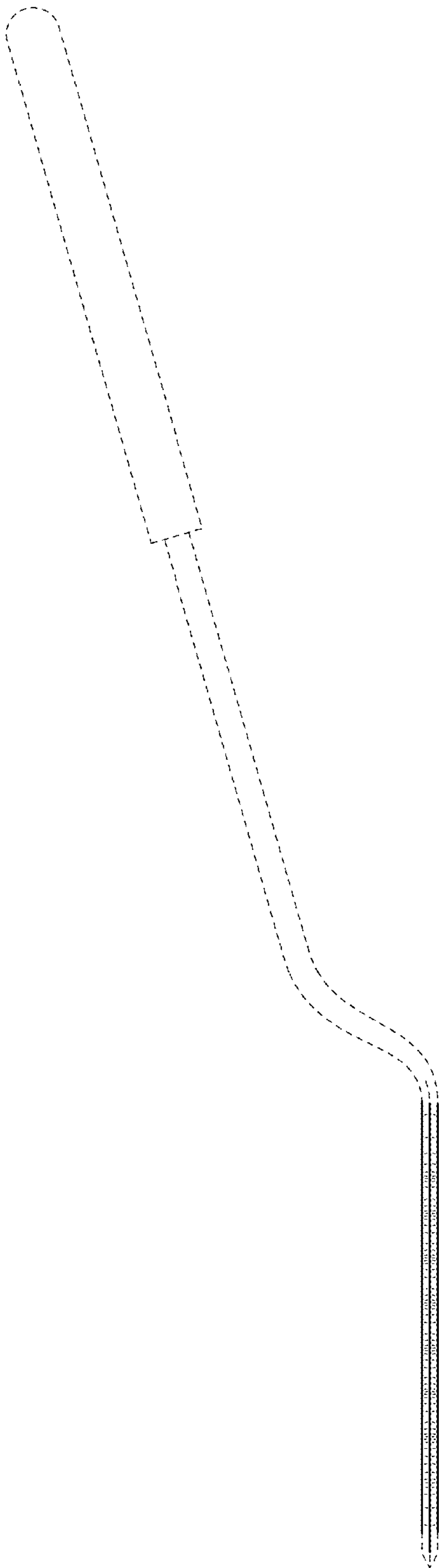

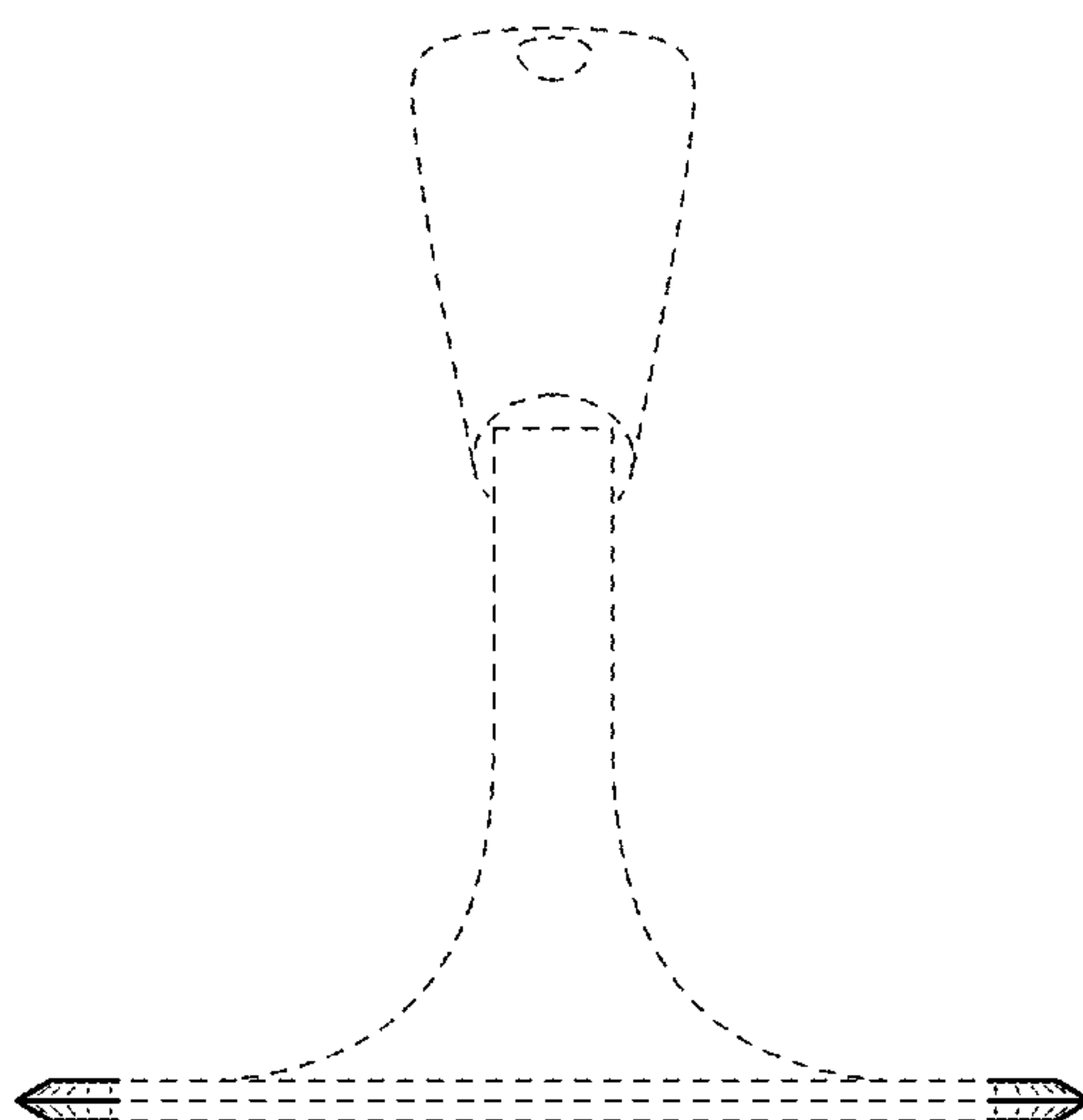
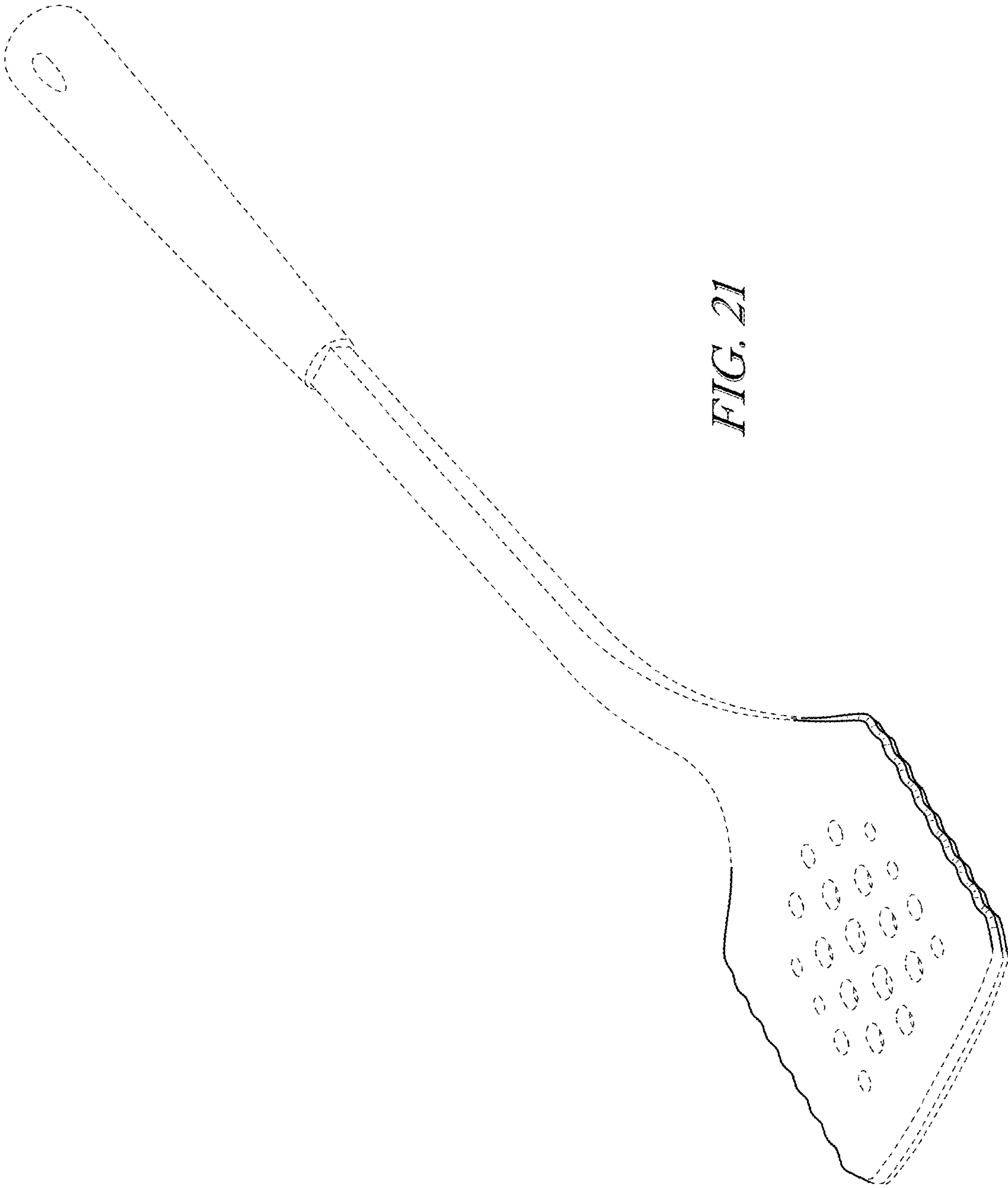

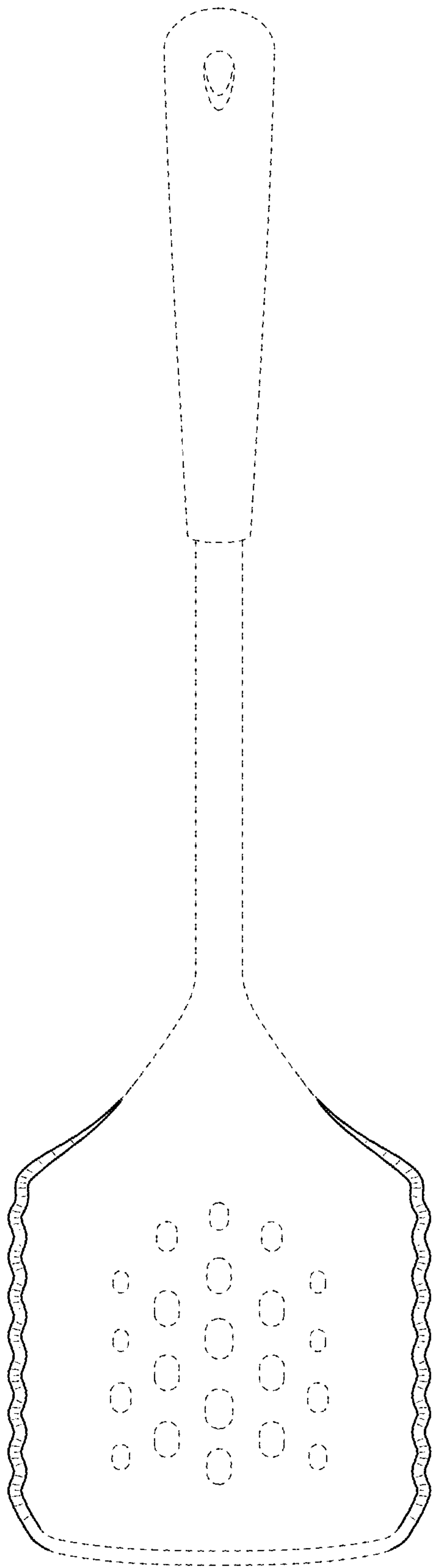

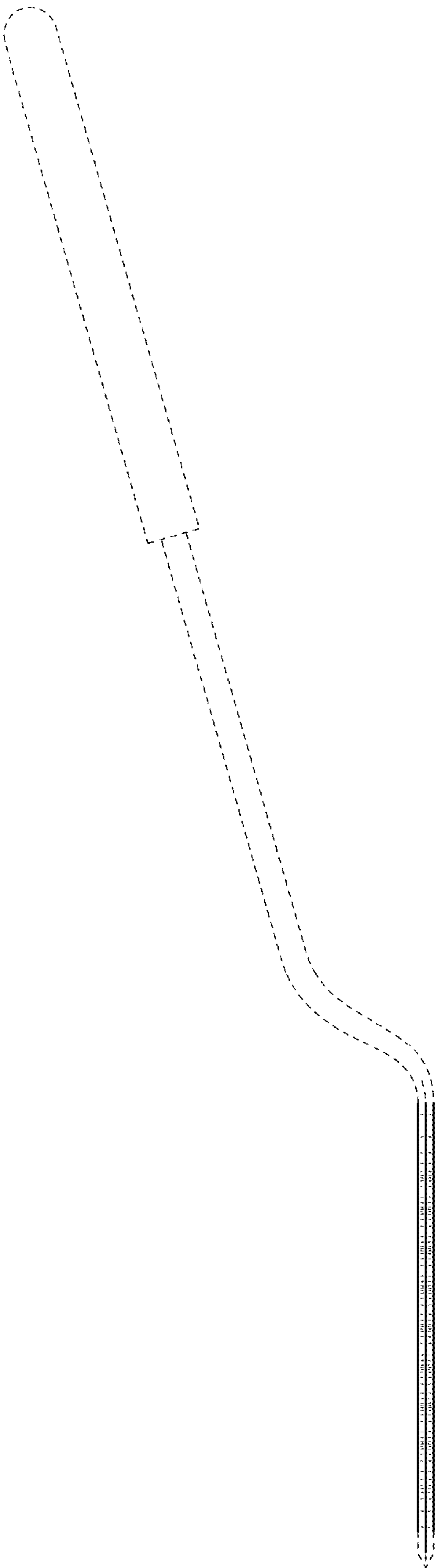

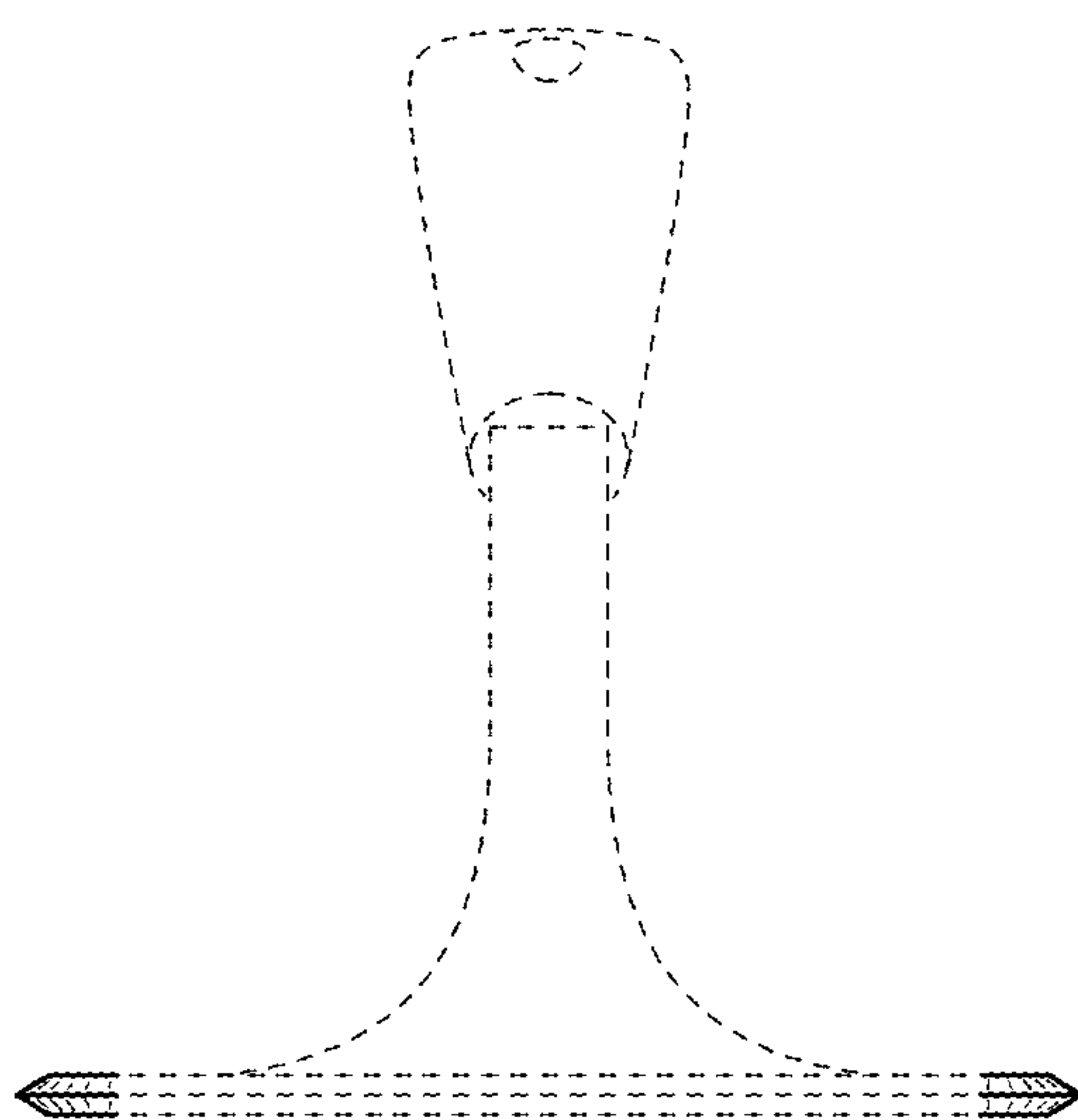

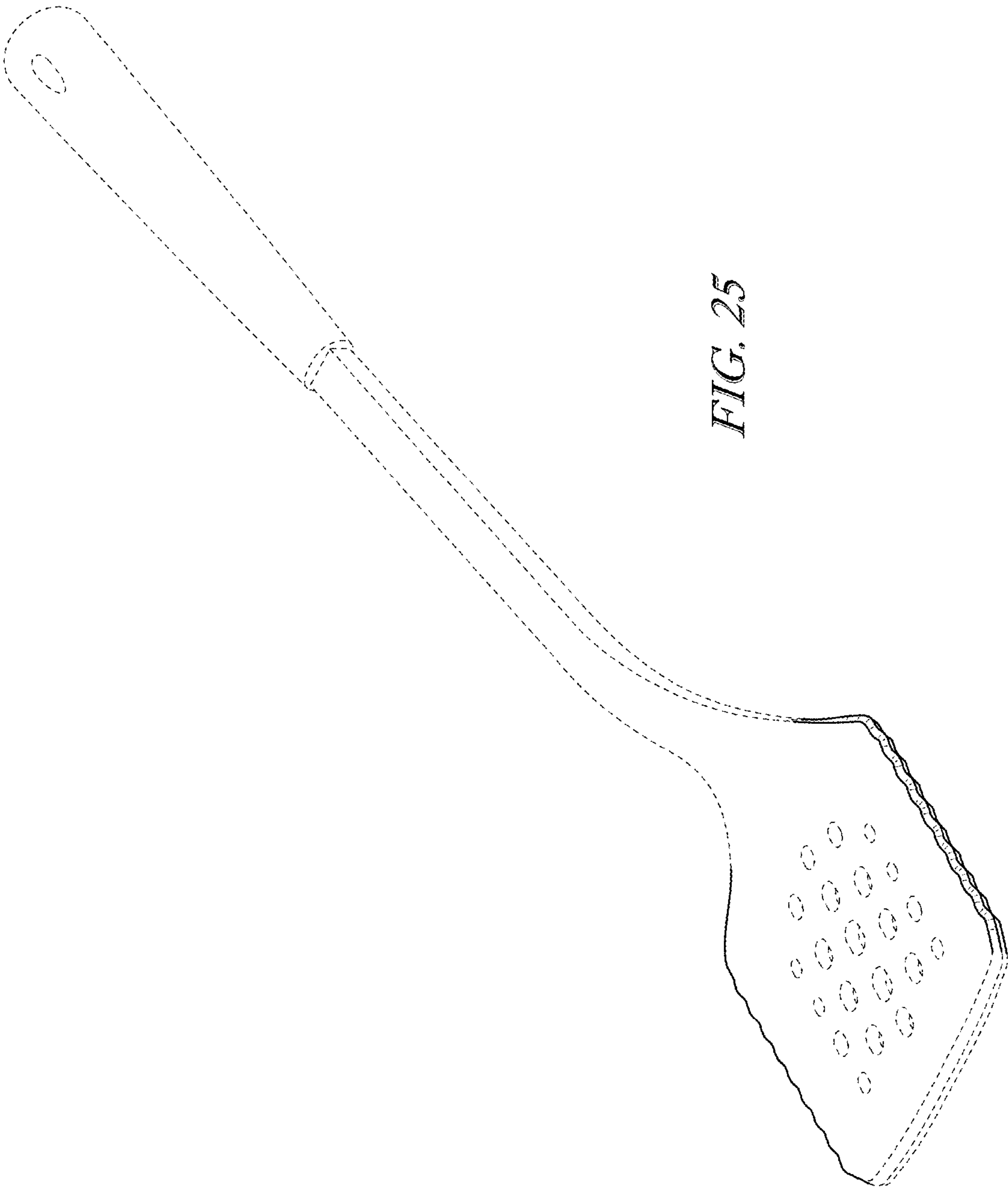

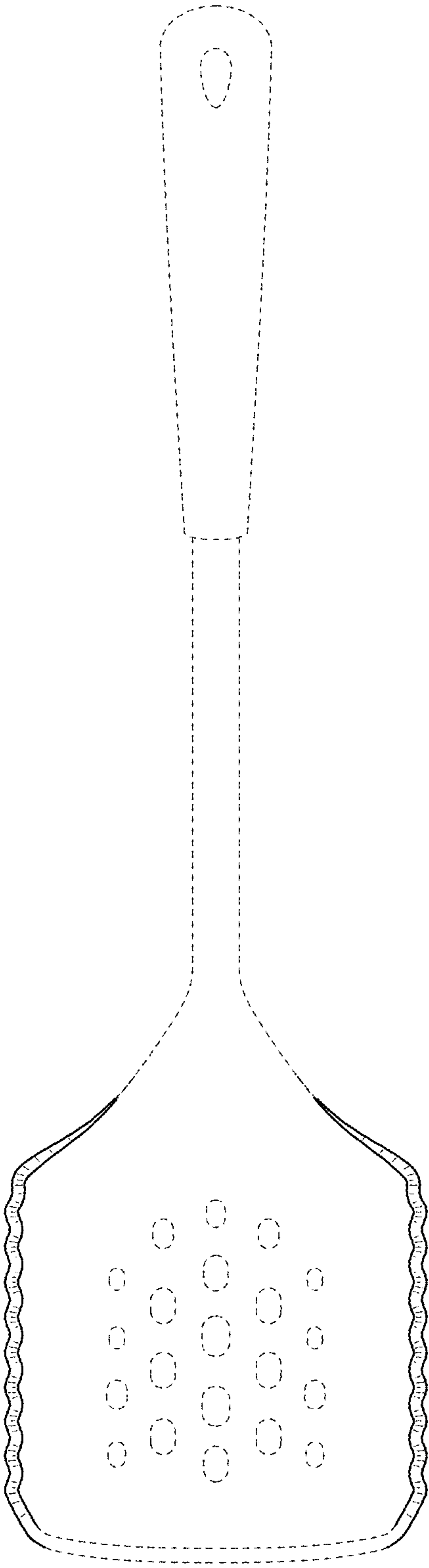

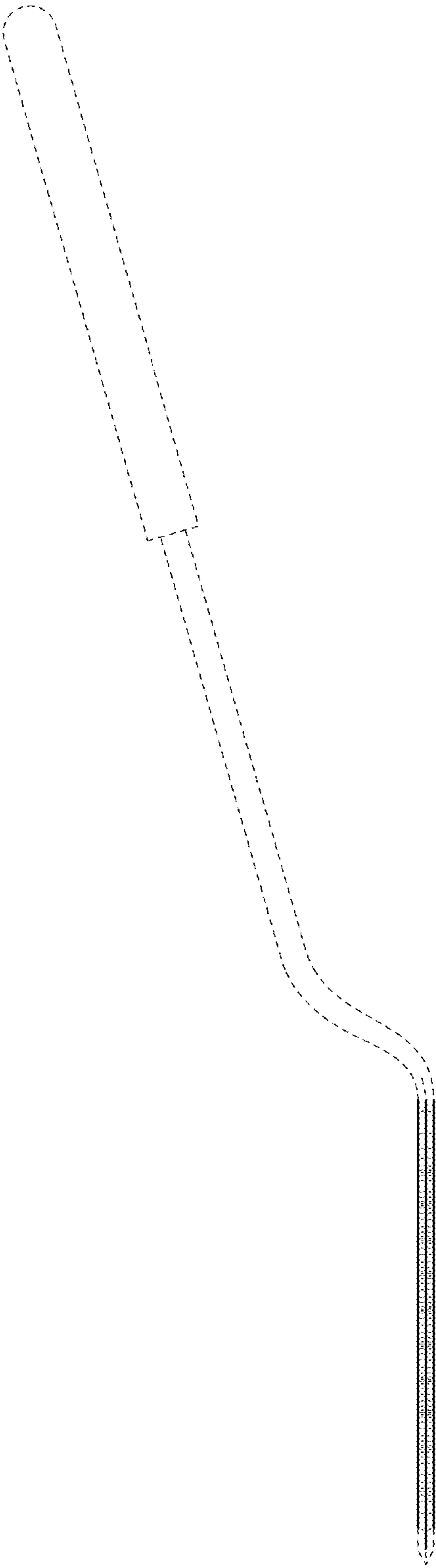

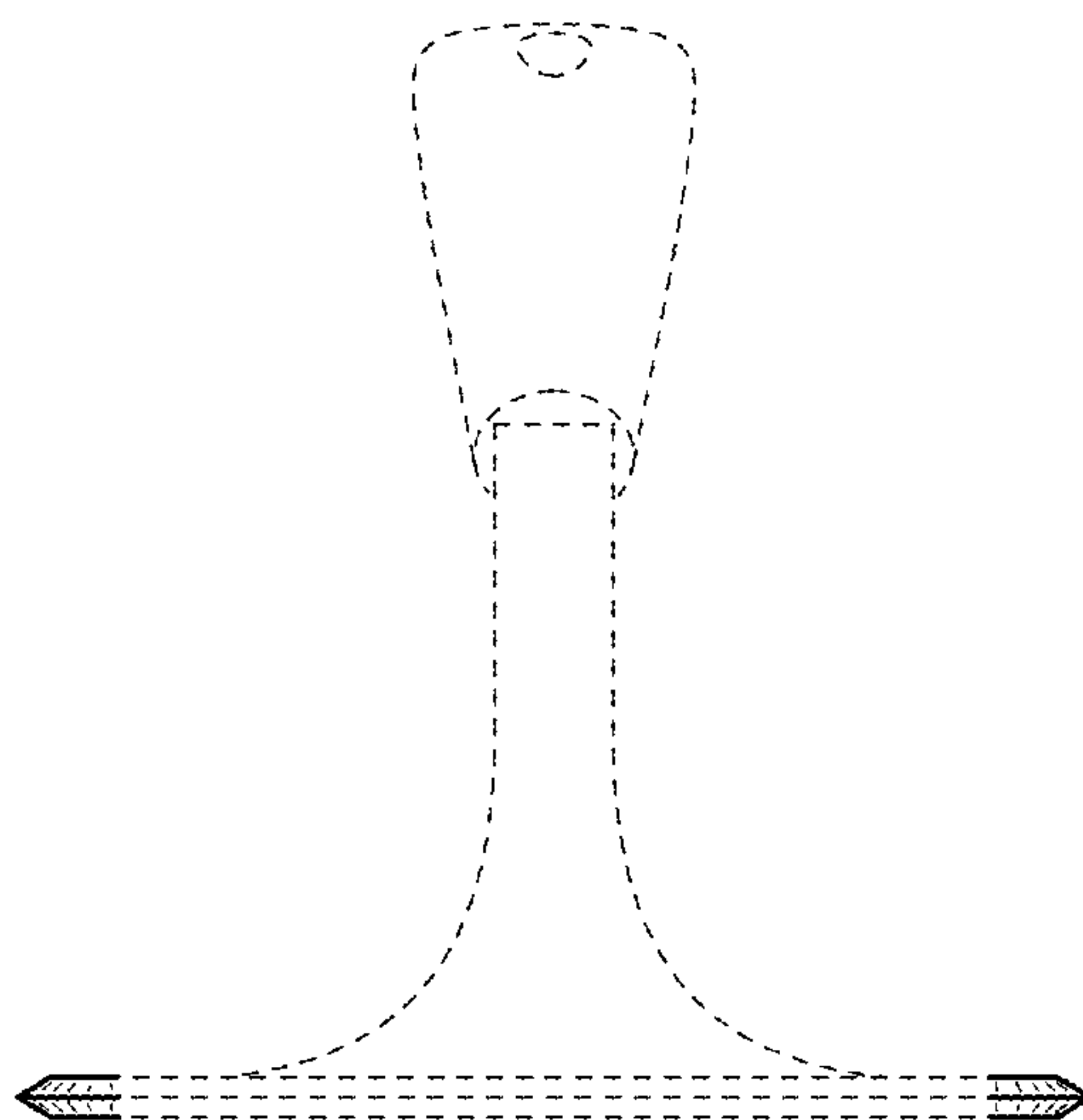
