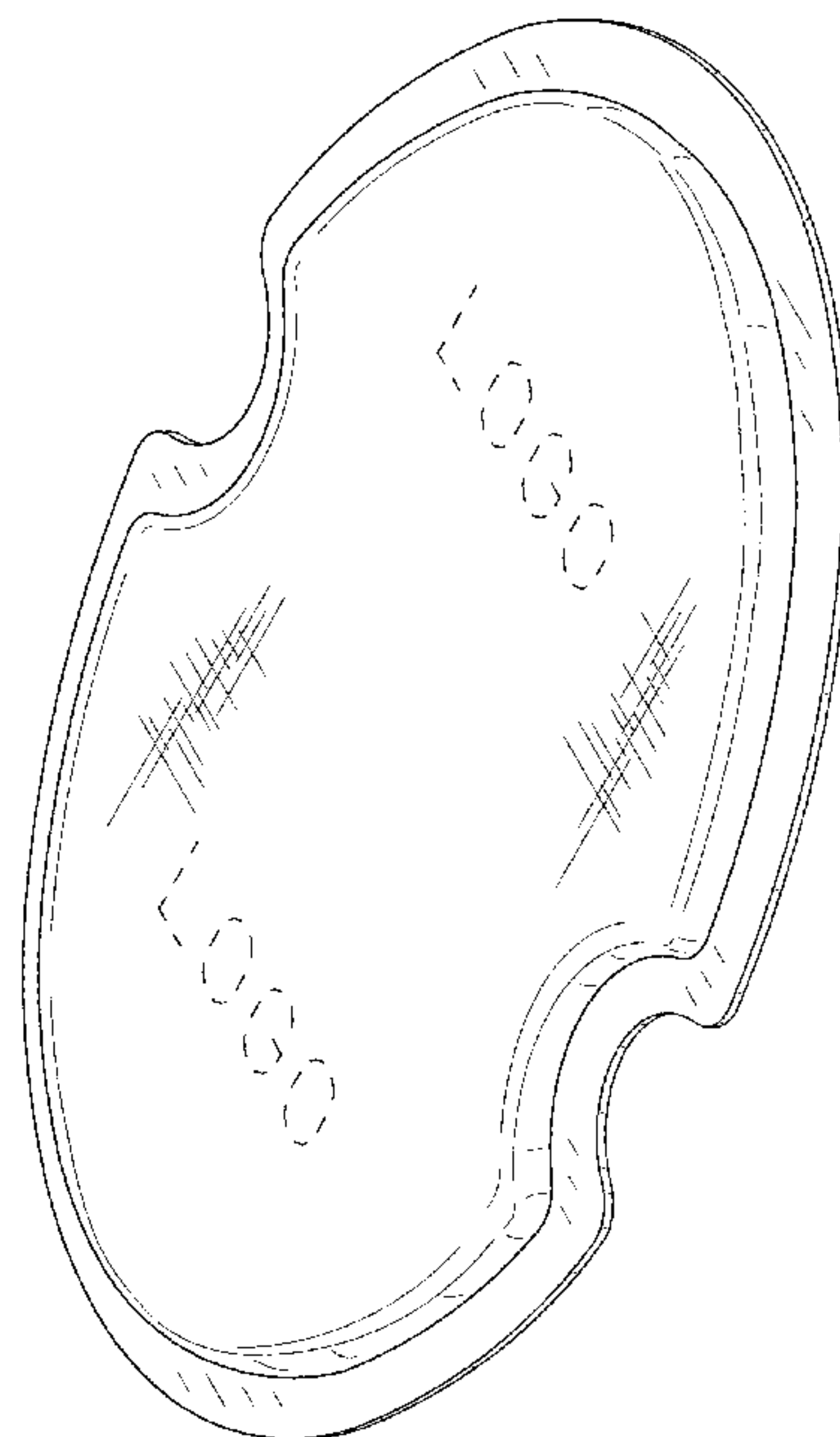
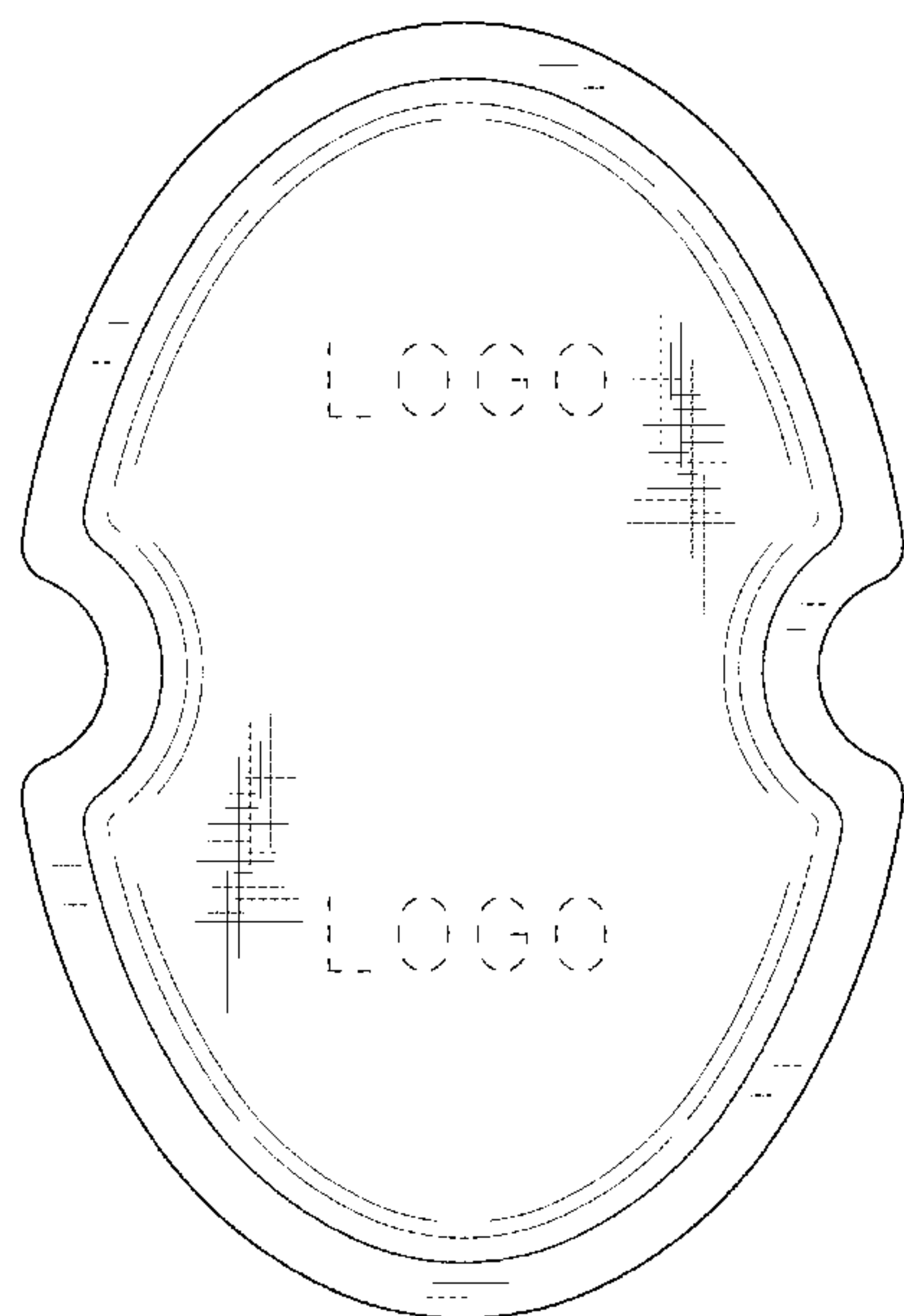
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for an underarm garment shield insert, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevation view of an underarm garment shield insert showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a rear elevation view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a right side elevation view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image of the shown;
FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image of the shown;
FIG. 5 is an isometric view thereof; and,
FIG. 6 is an in-use isometric view thereof.

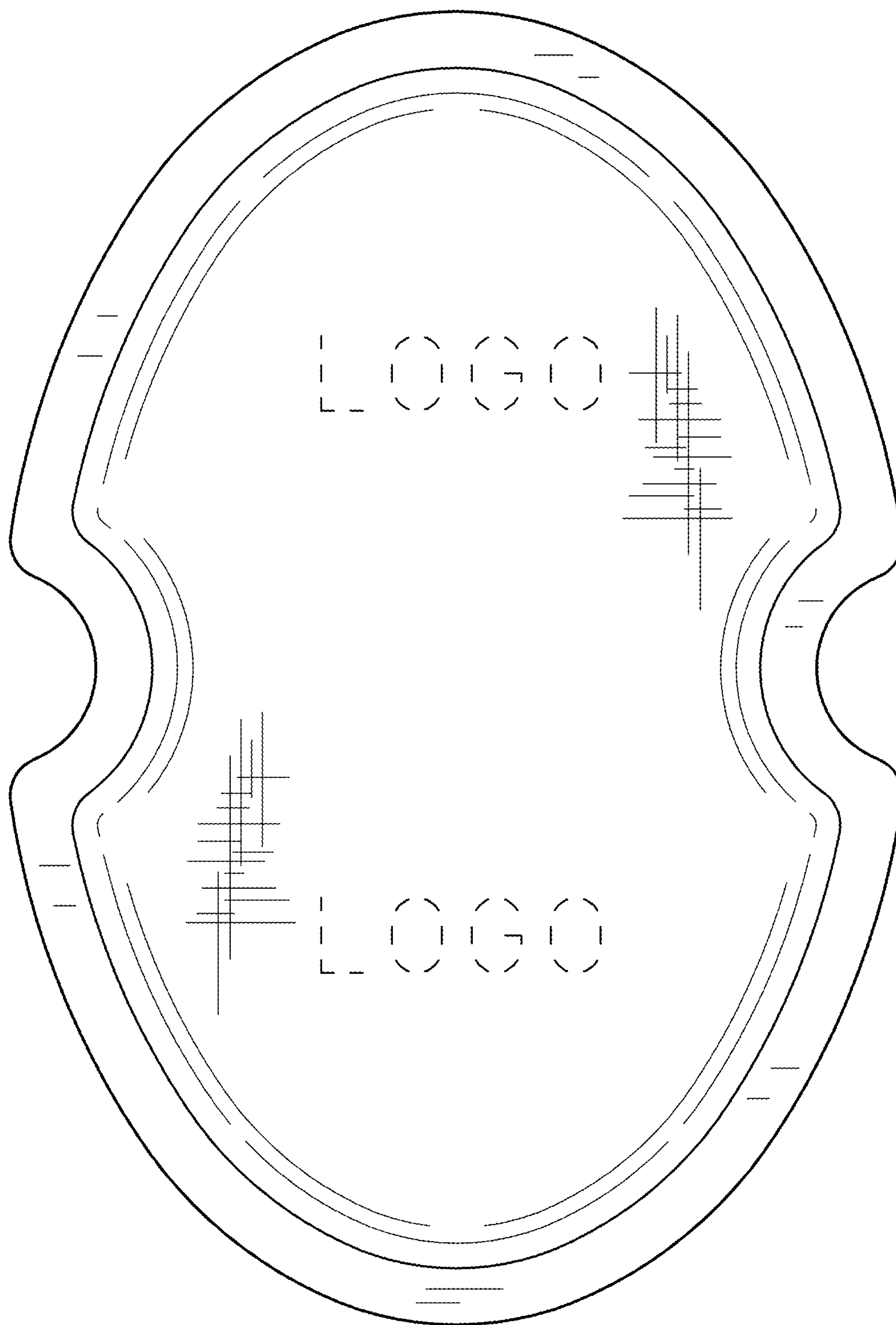

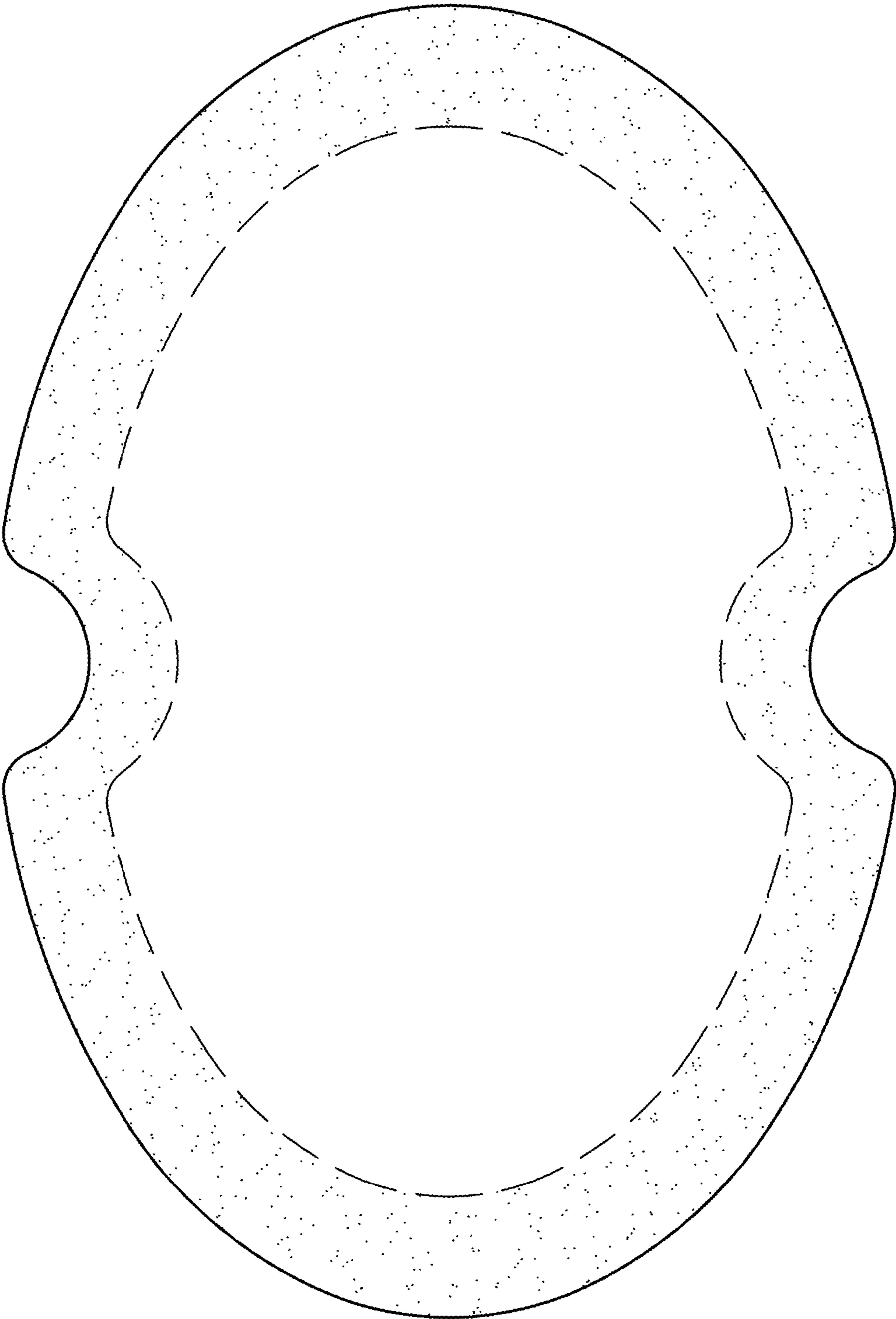

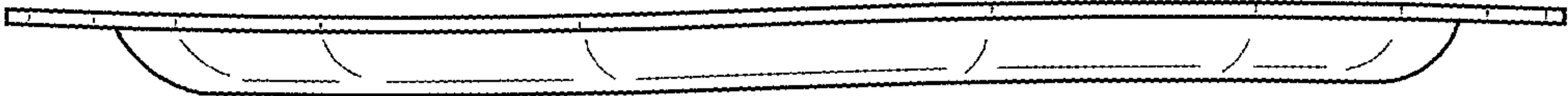

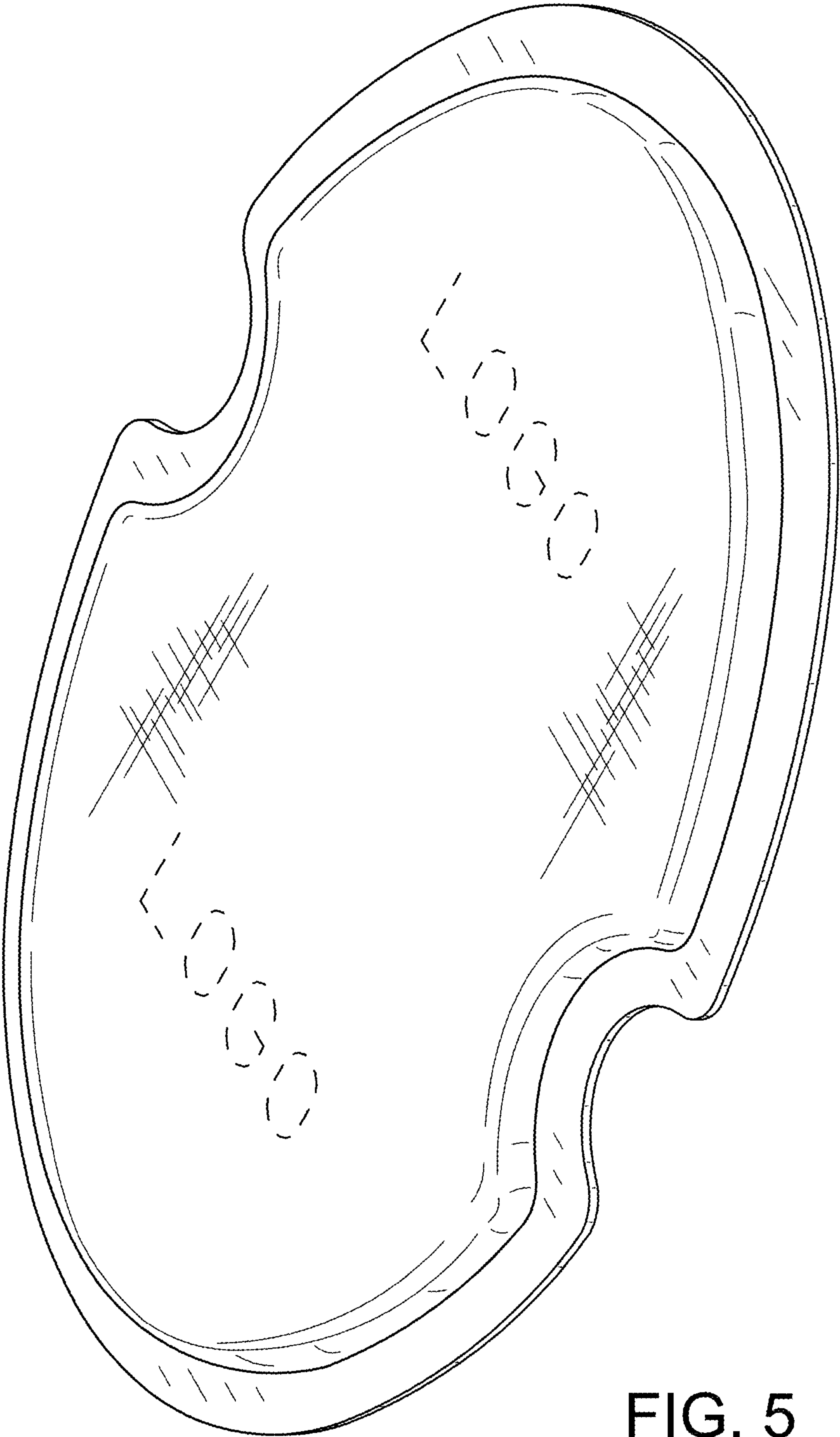

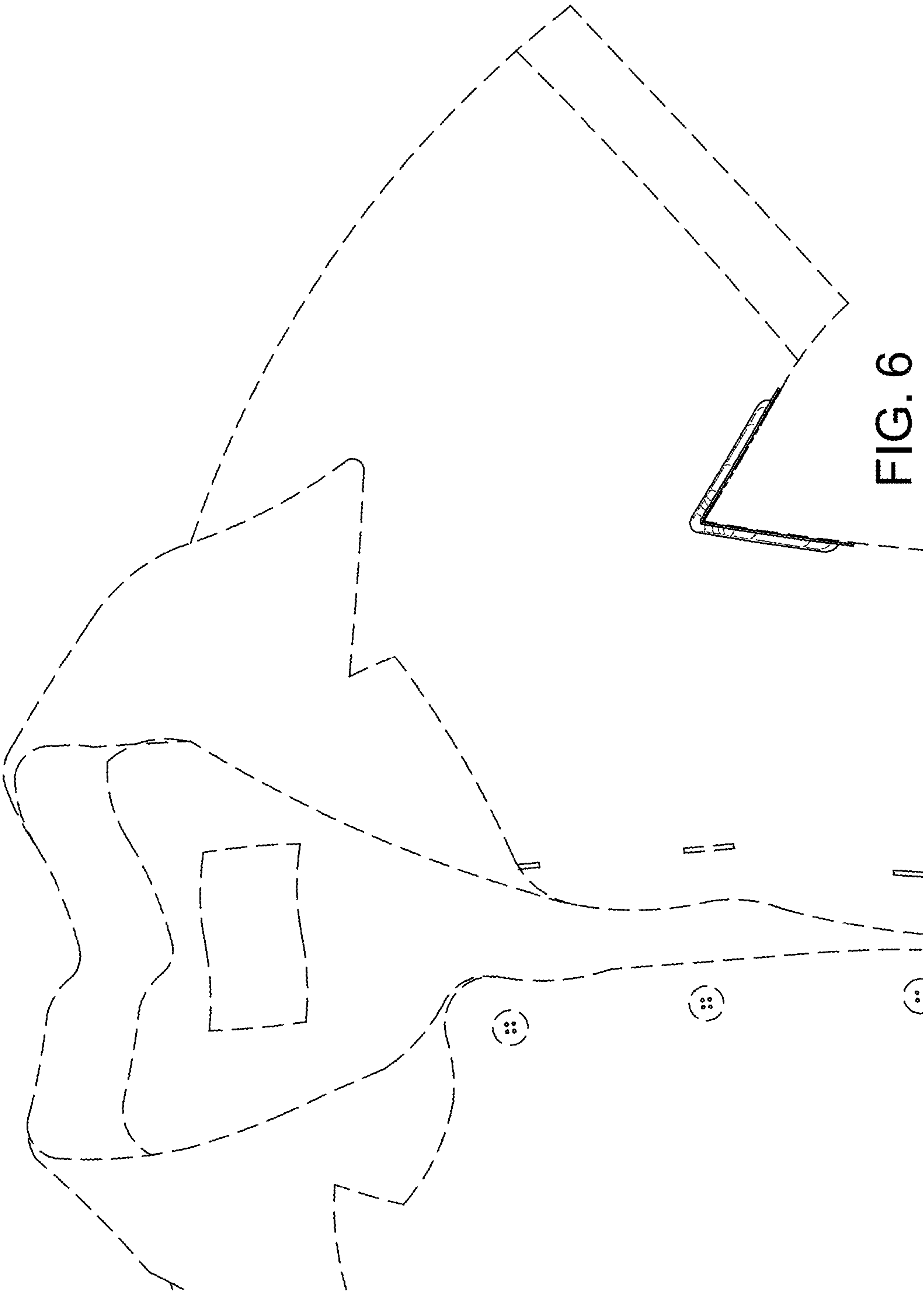
