FIG. 3 is a second side view thereof;

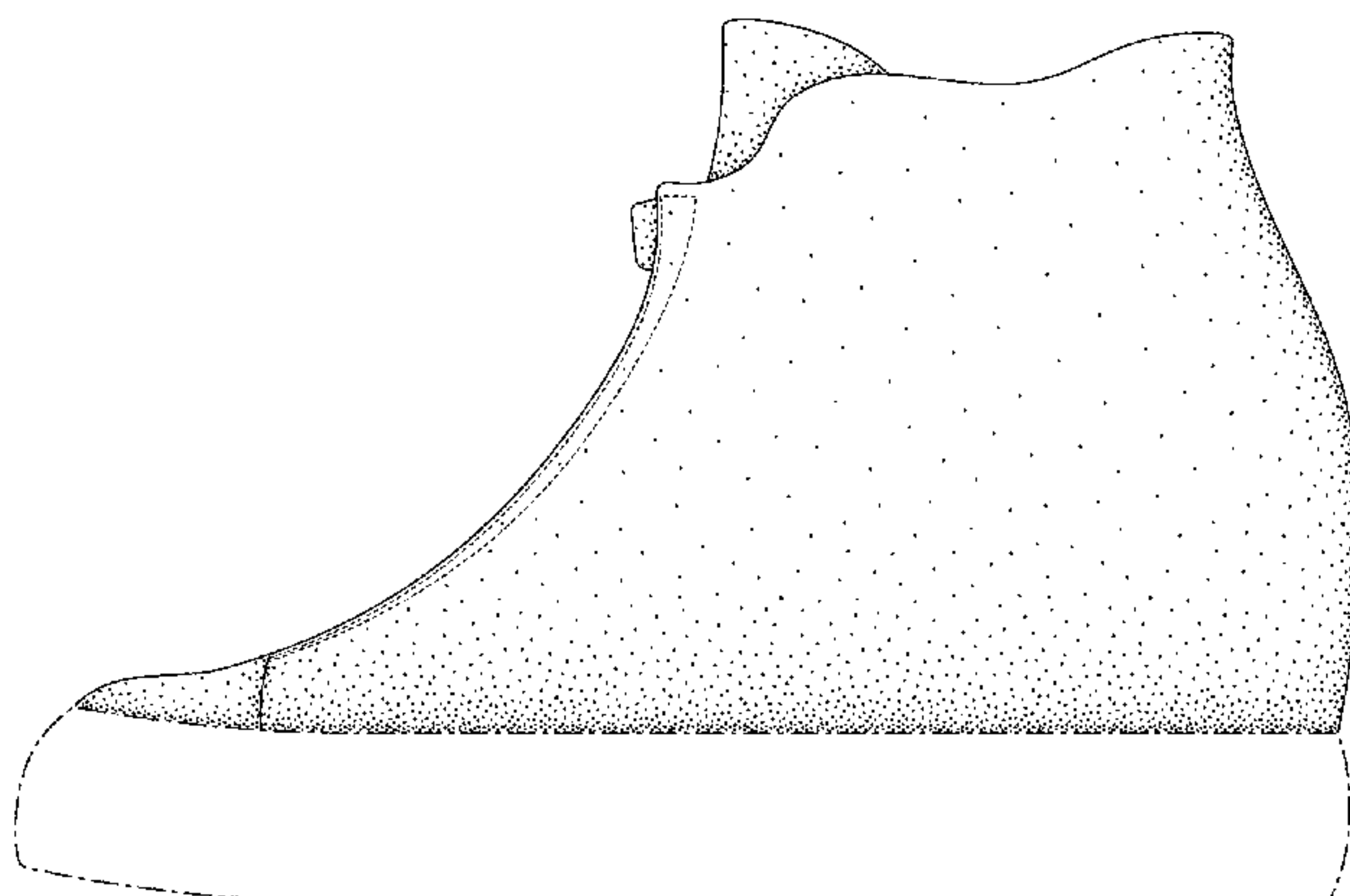
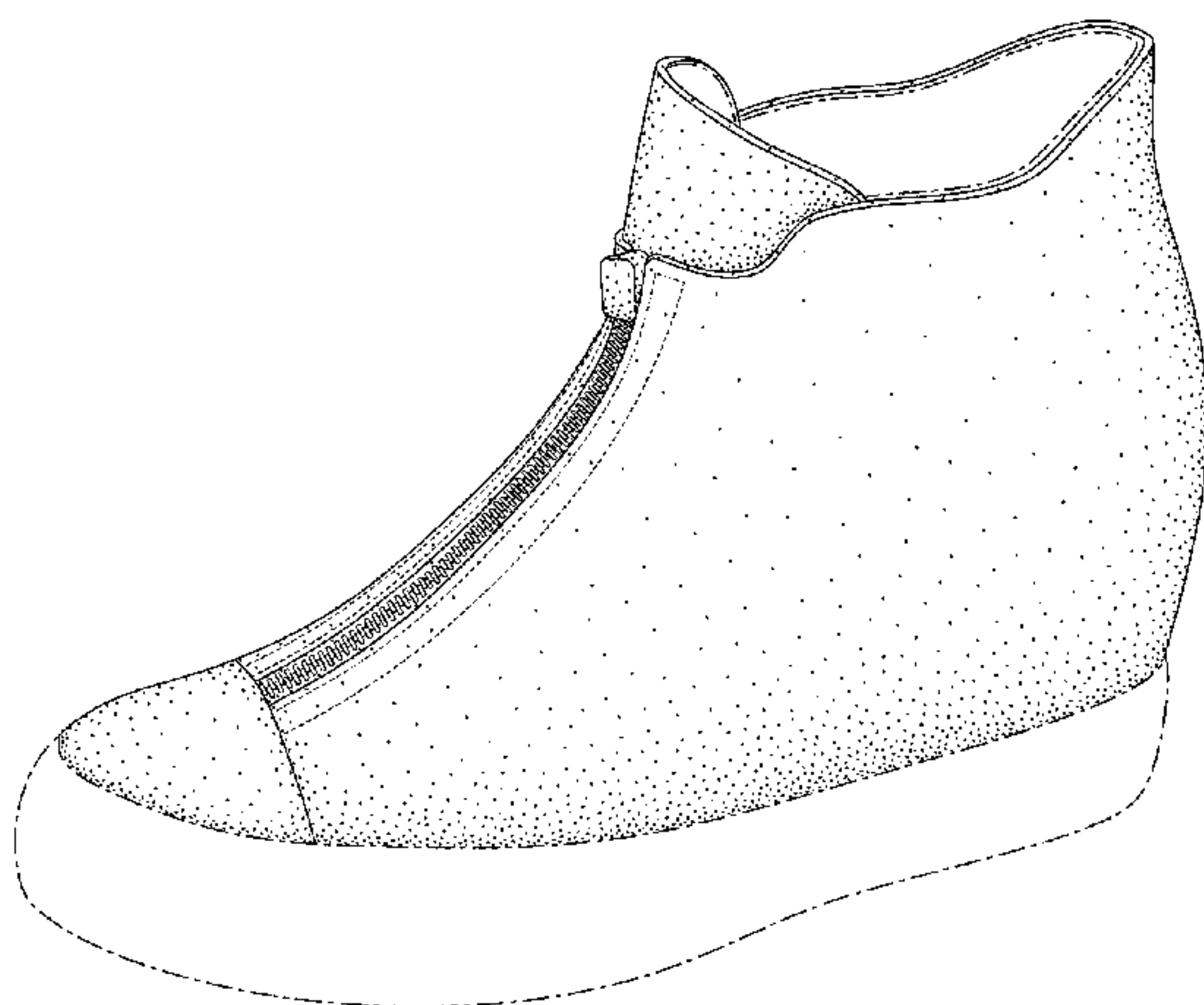
FIG. 4 is a front view thereof;

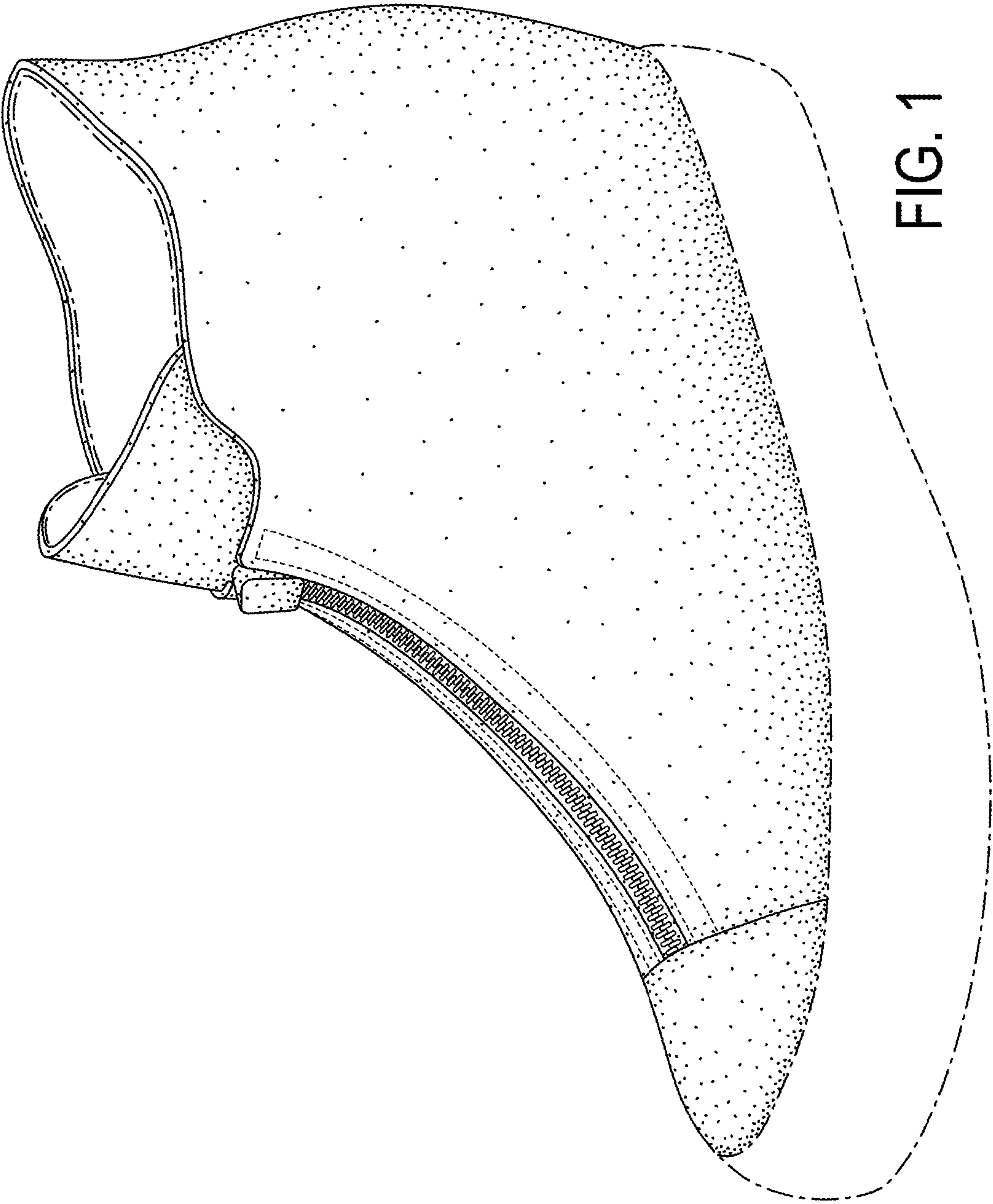

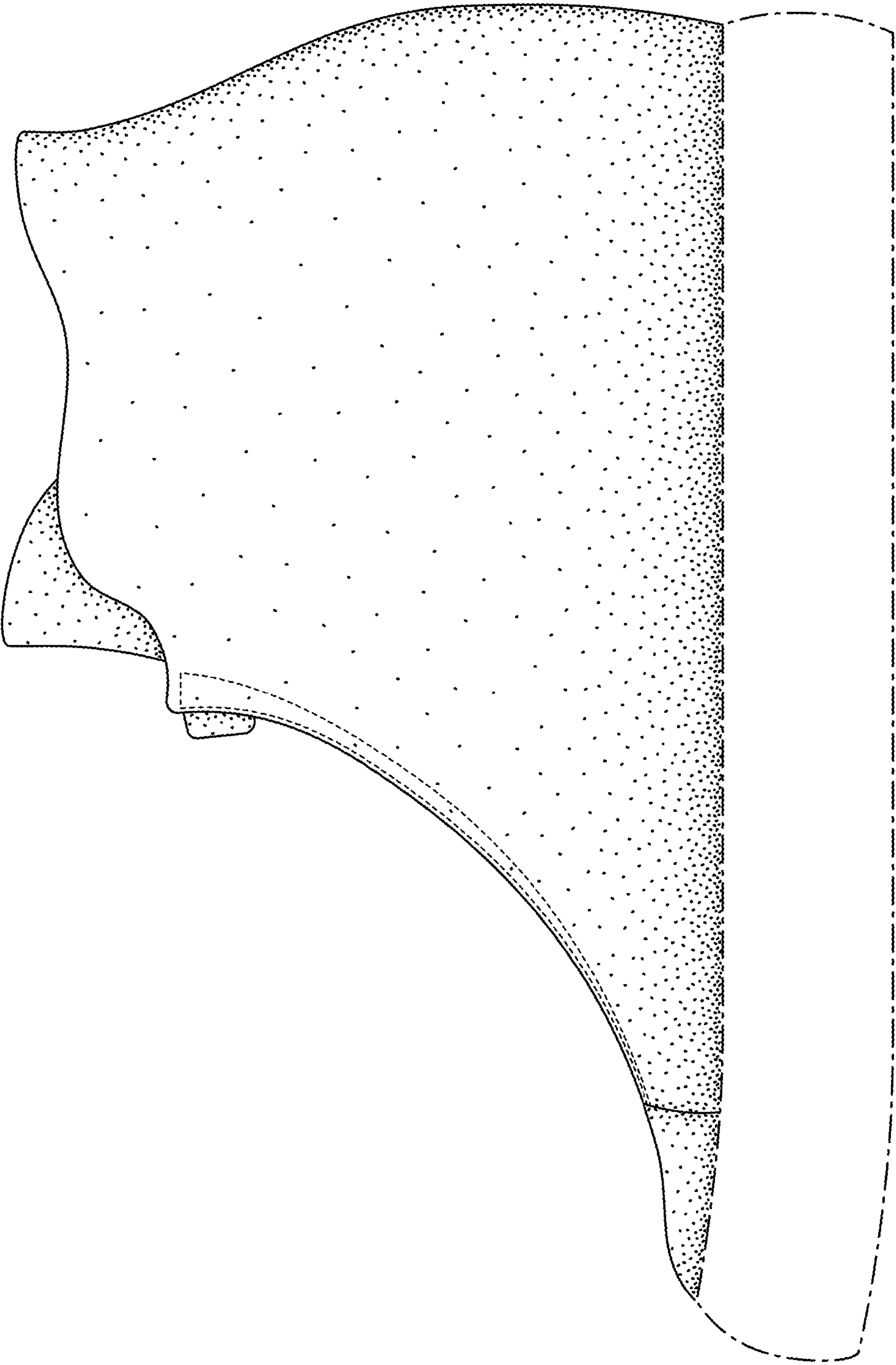

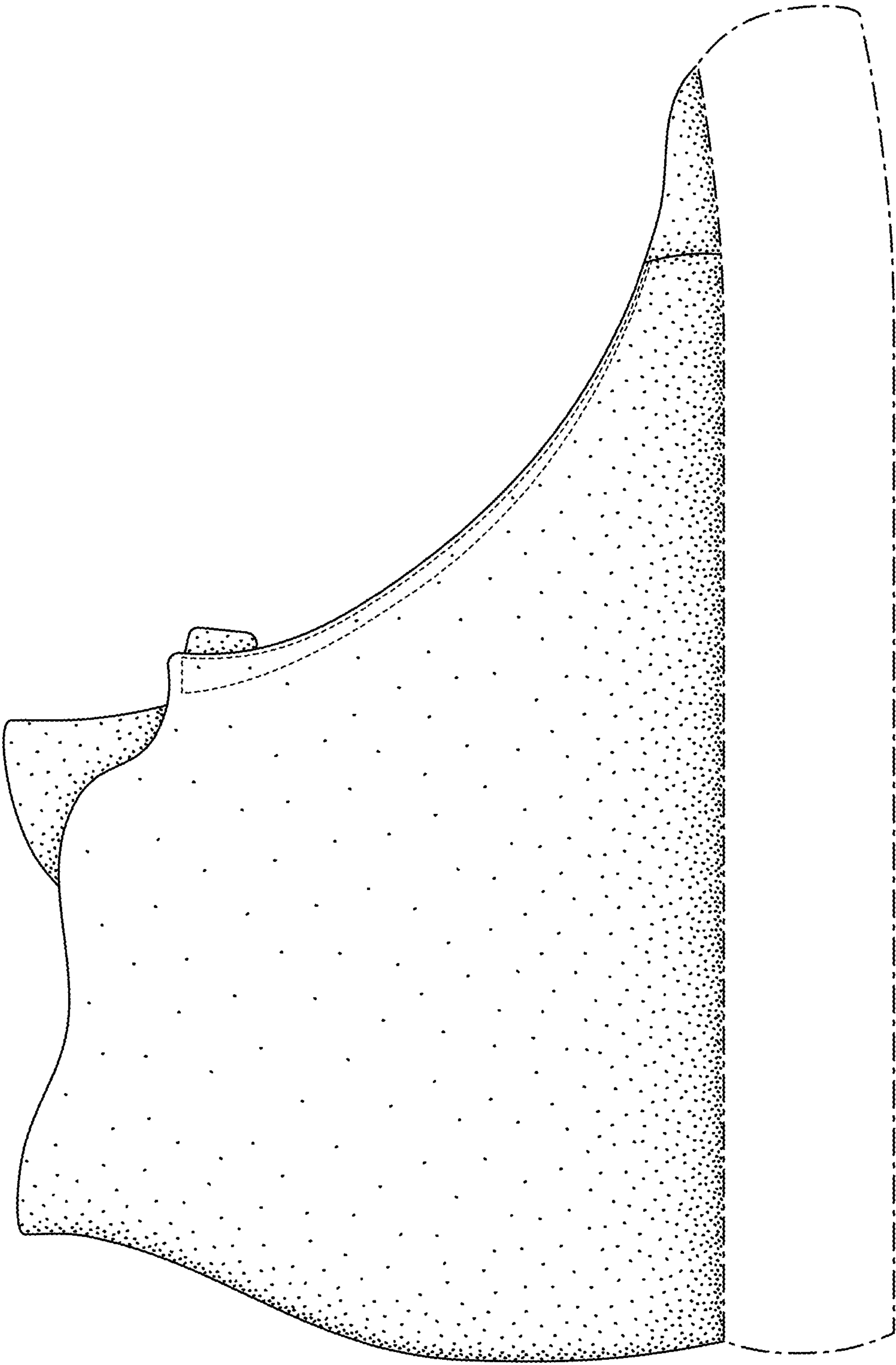

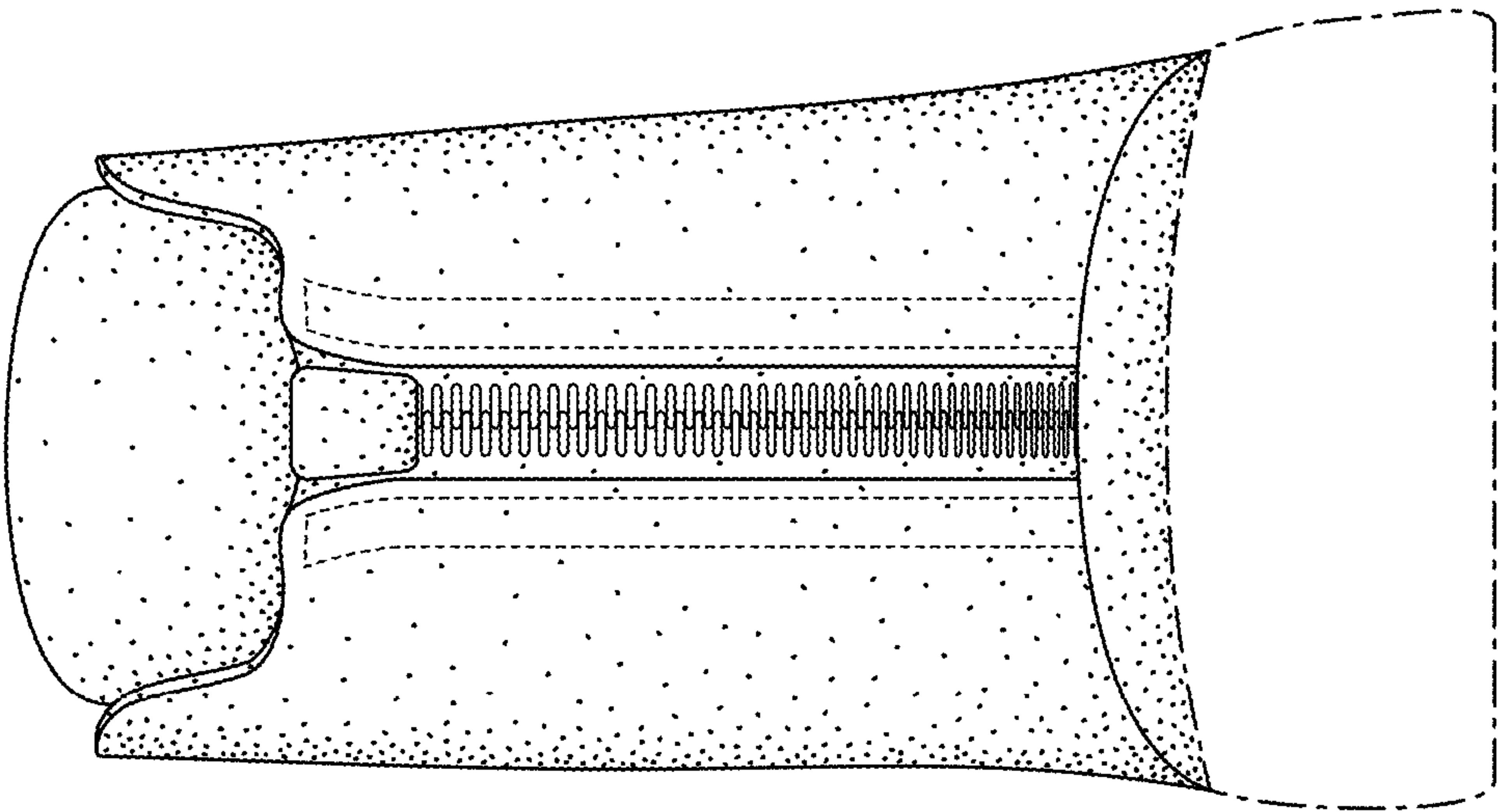

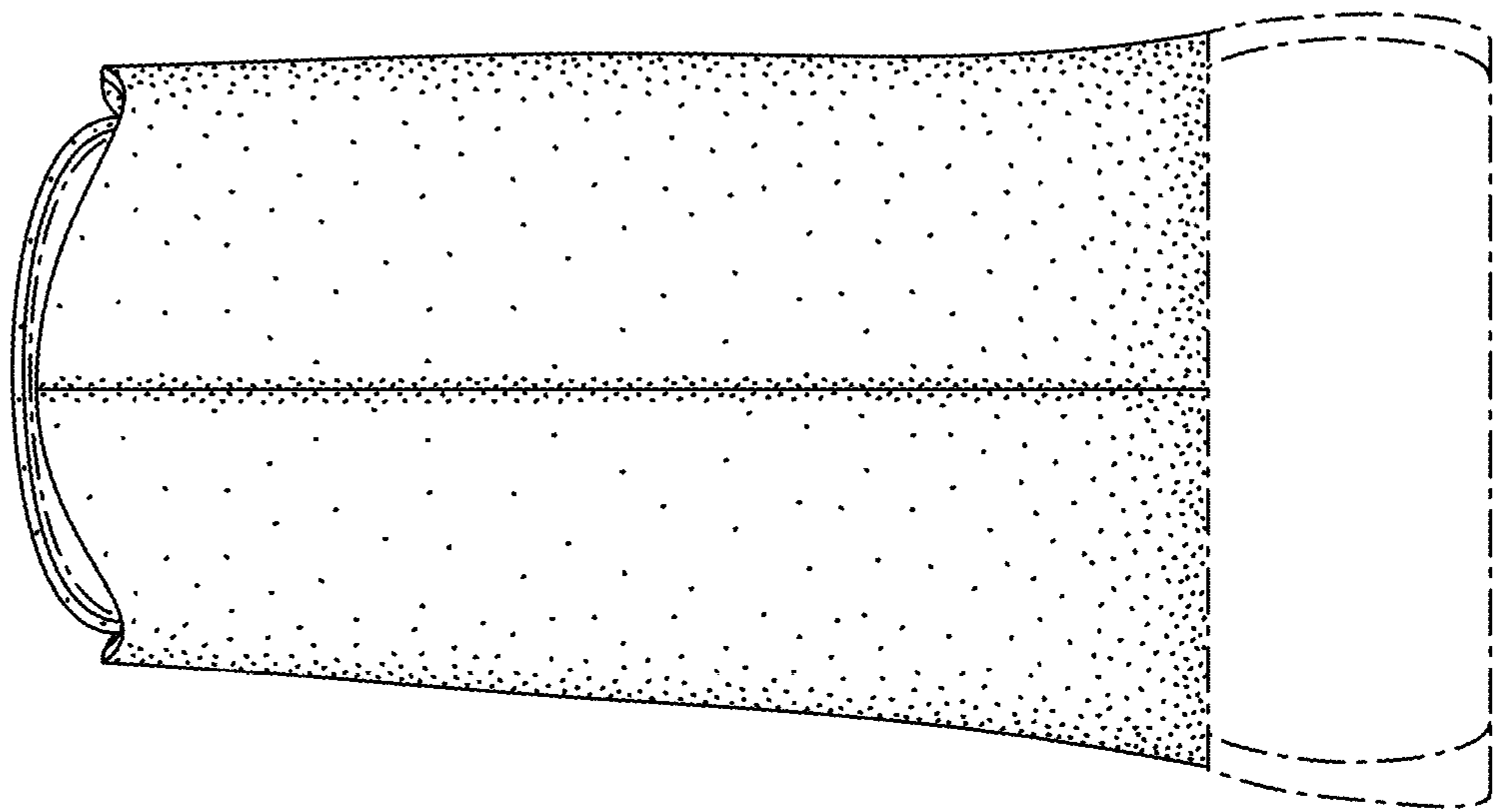

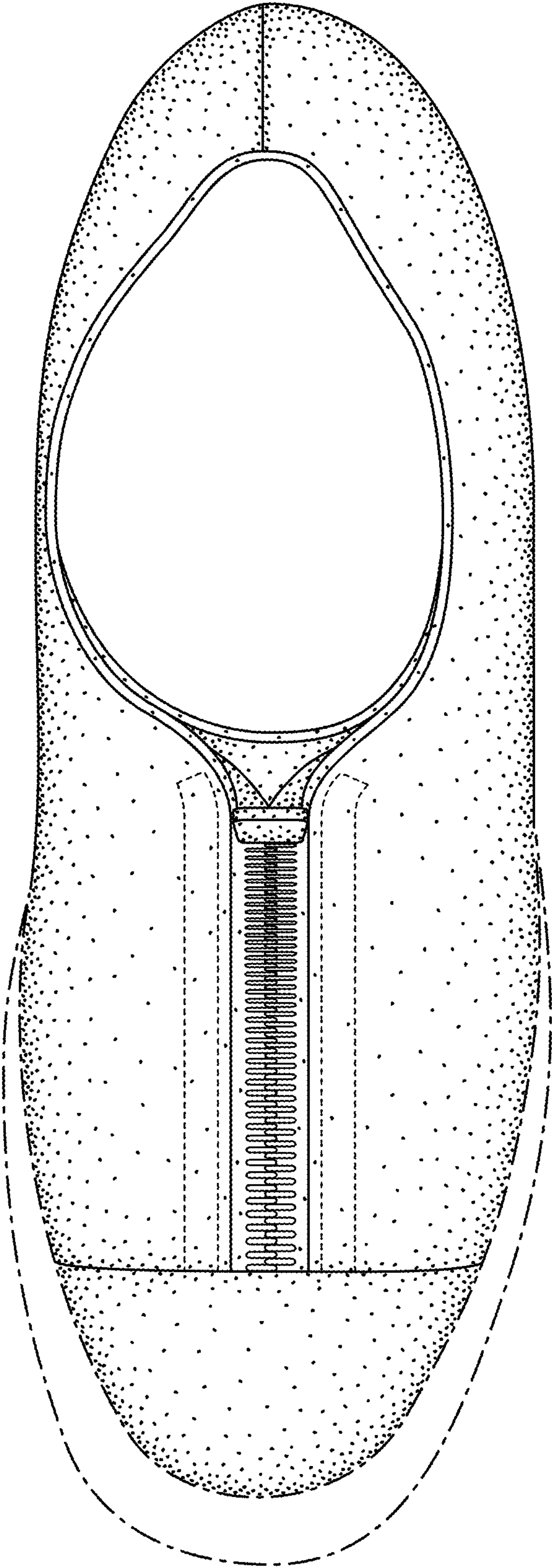
