FIG. 4 is a right side view of the usage monitoring attachment for an inhaler.

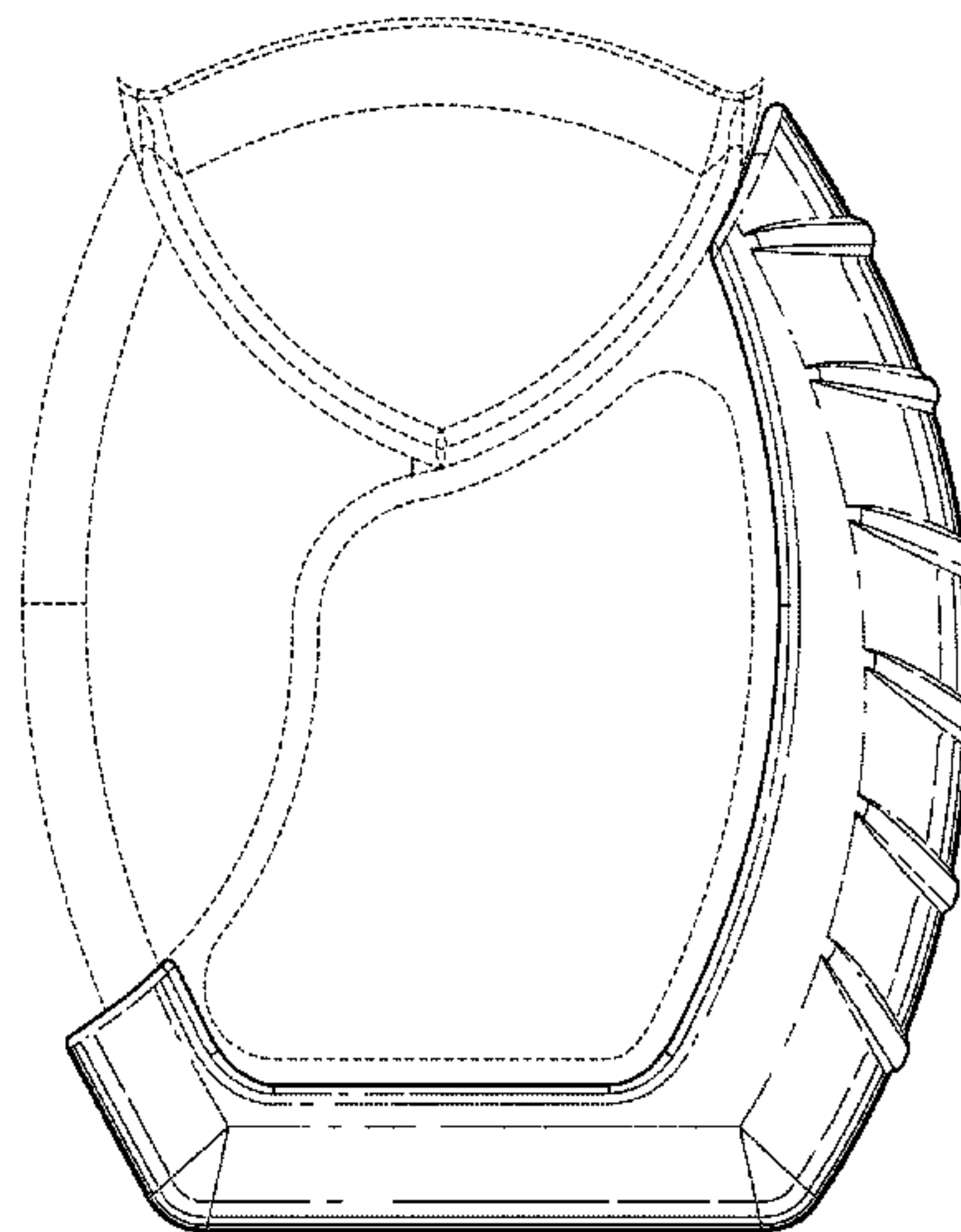
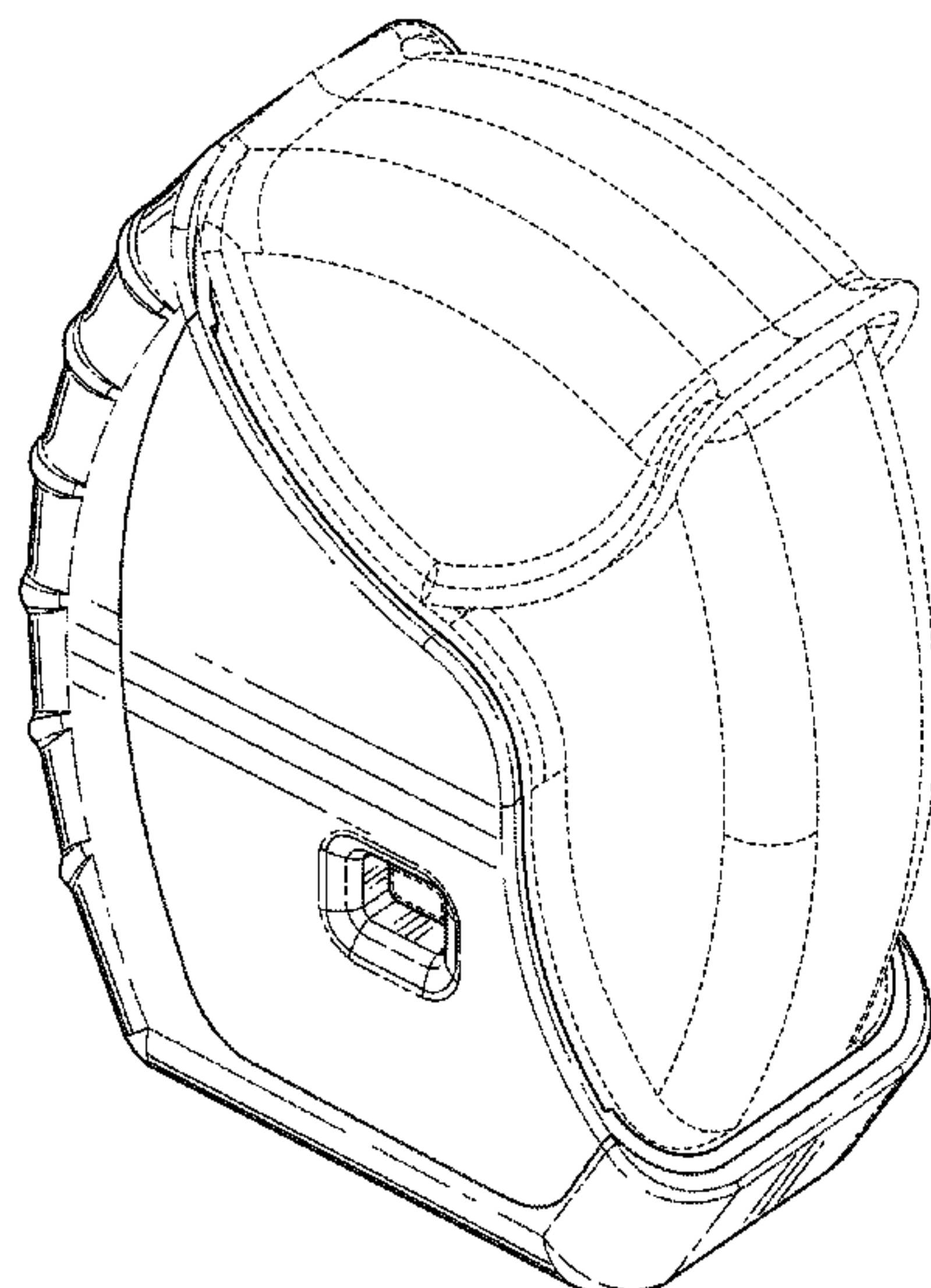
FIG. 5 is a left side view of the usage monitoring attachment for an inhaler.

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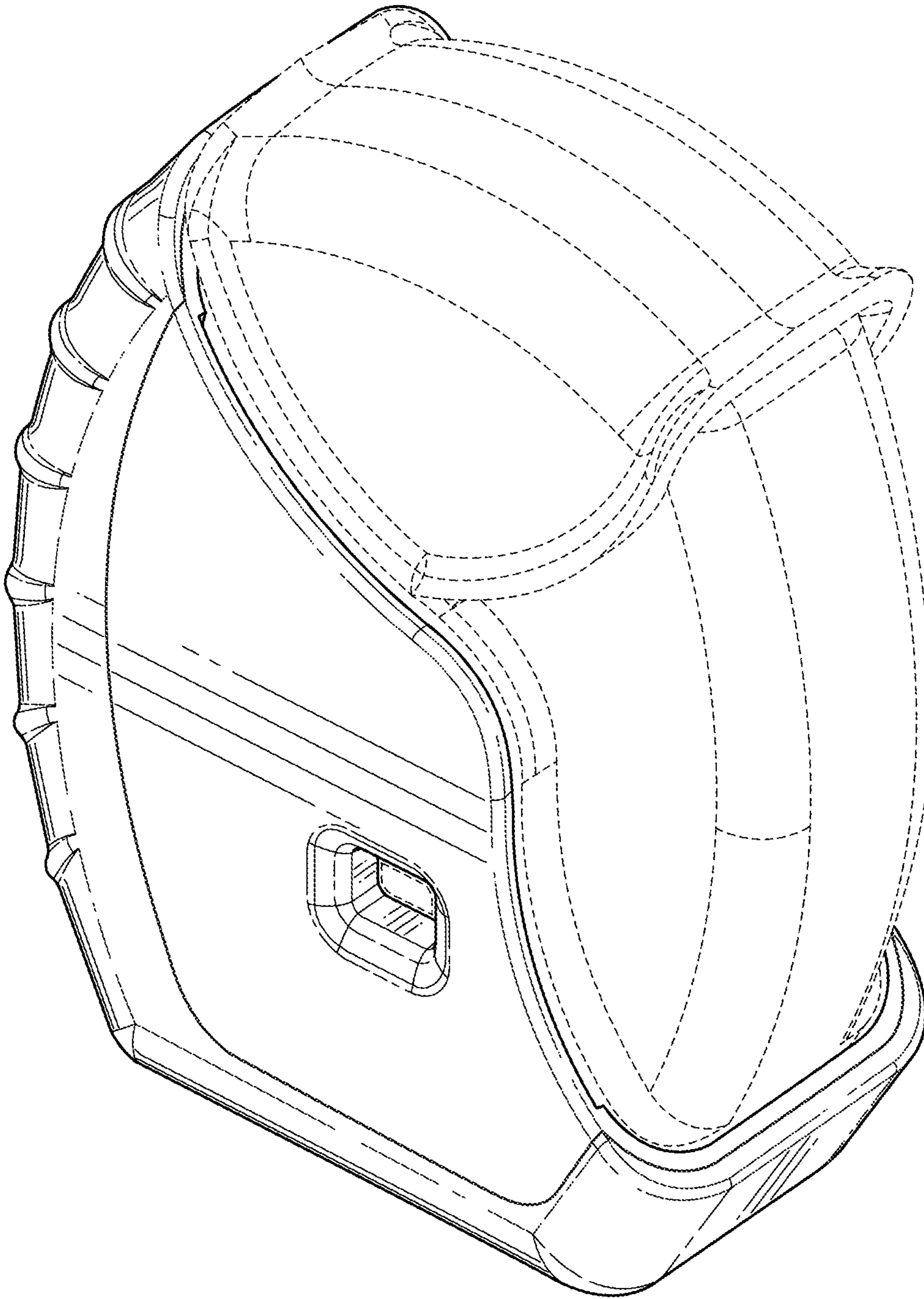

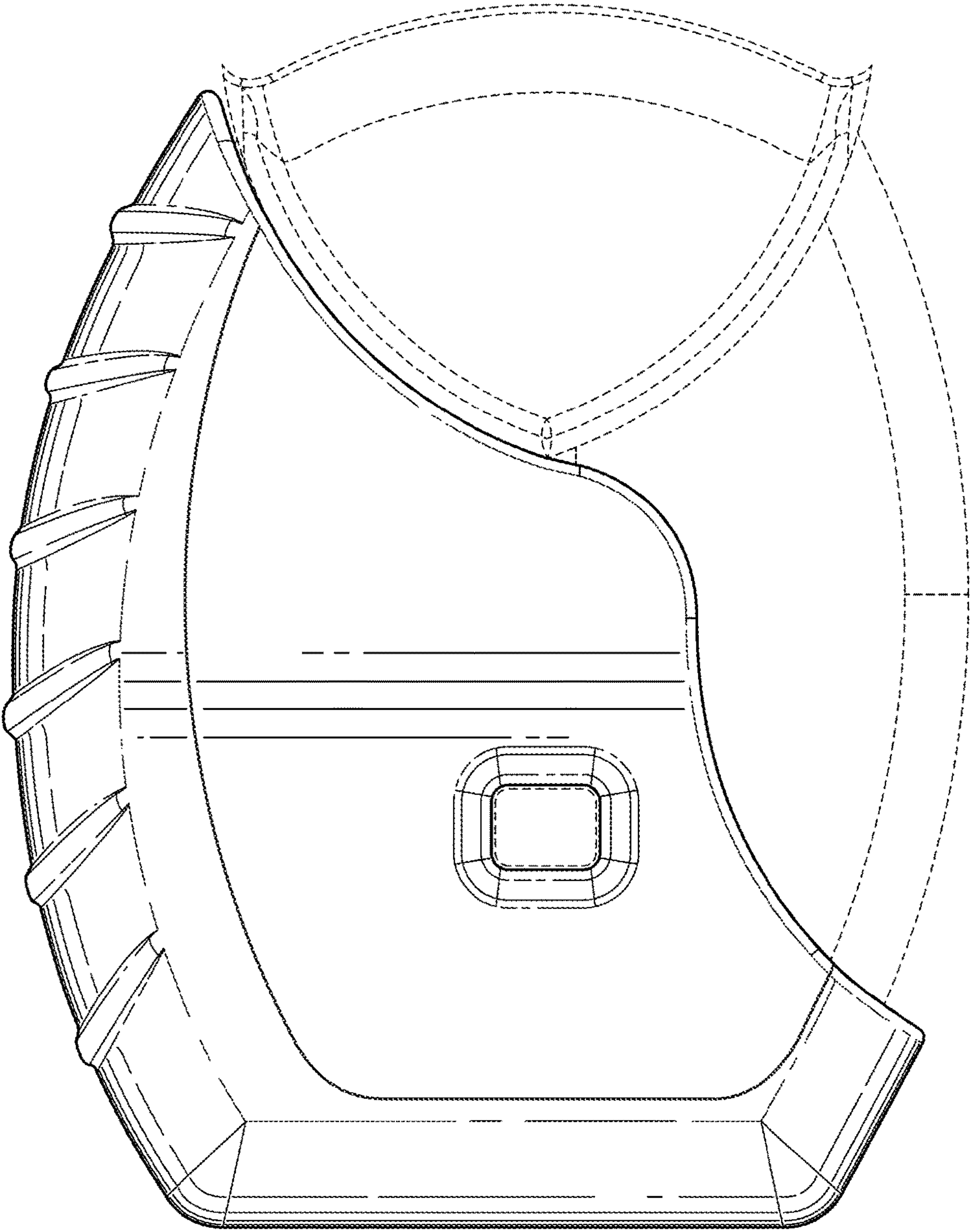

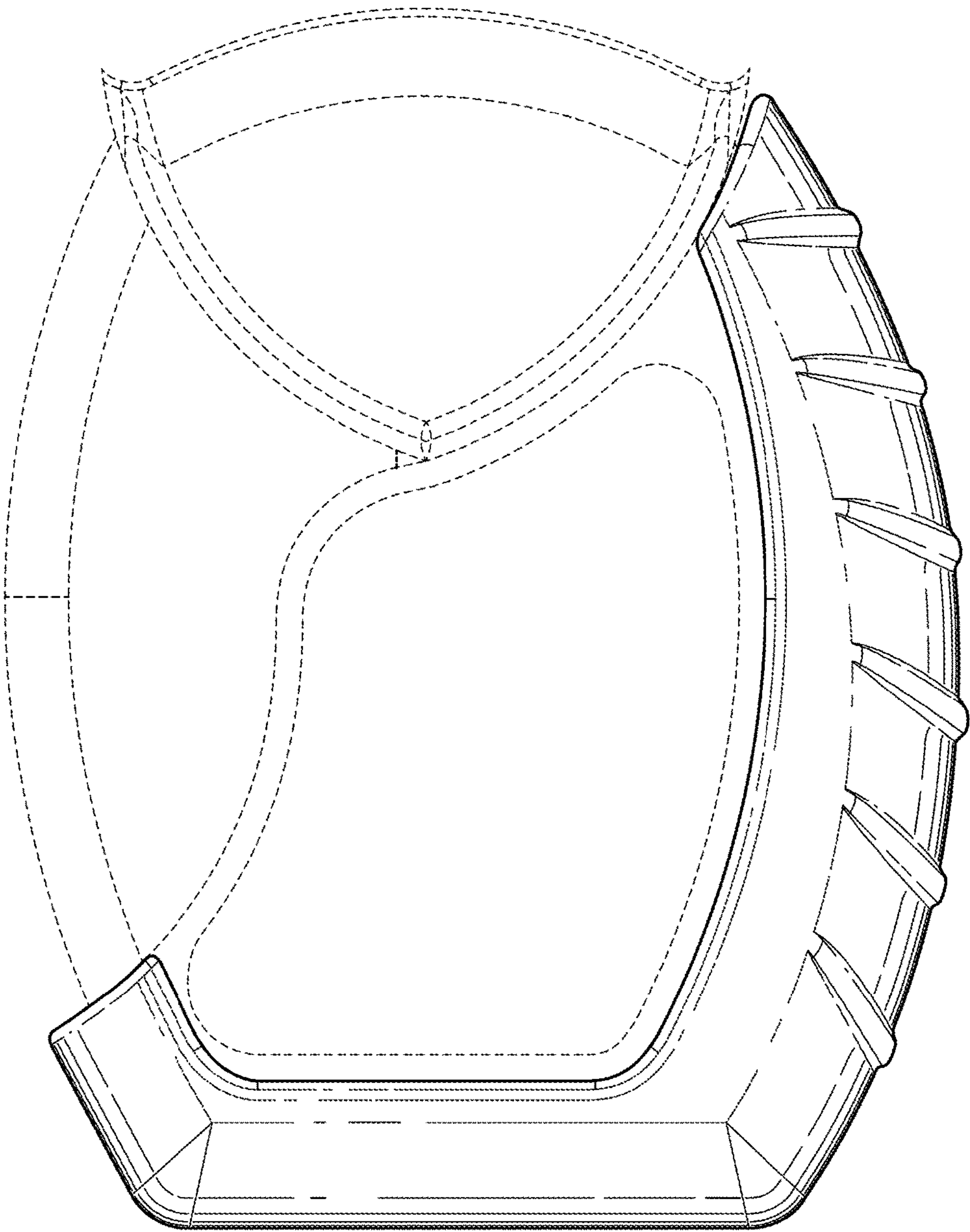

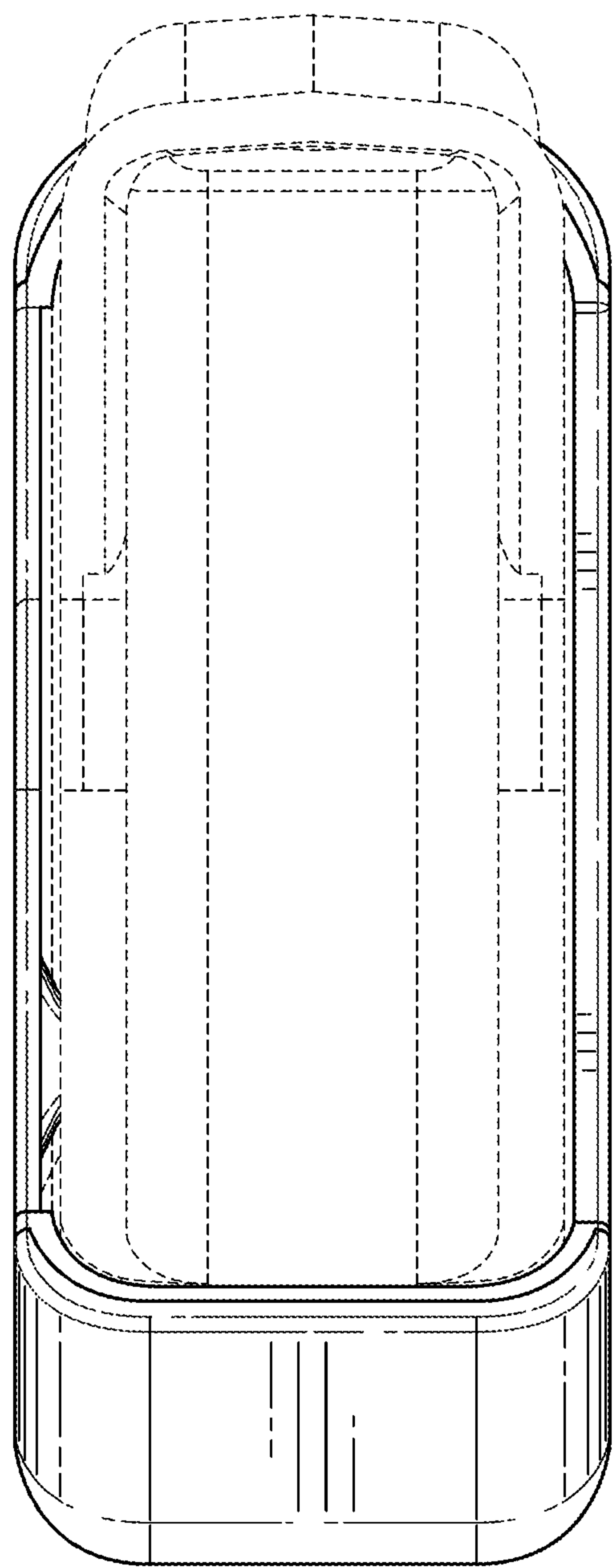

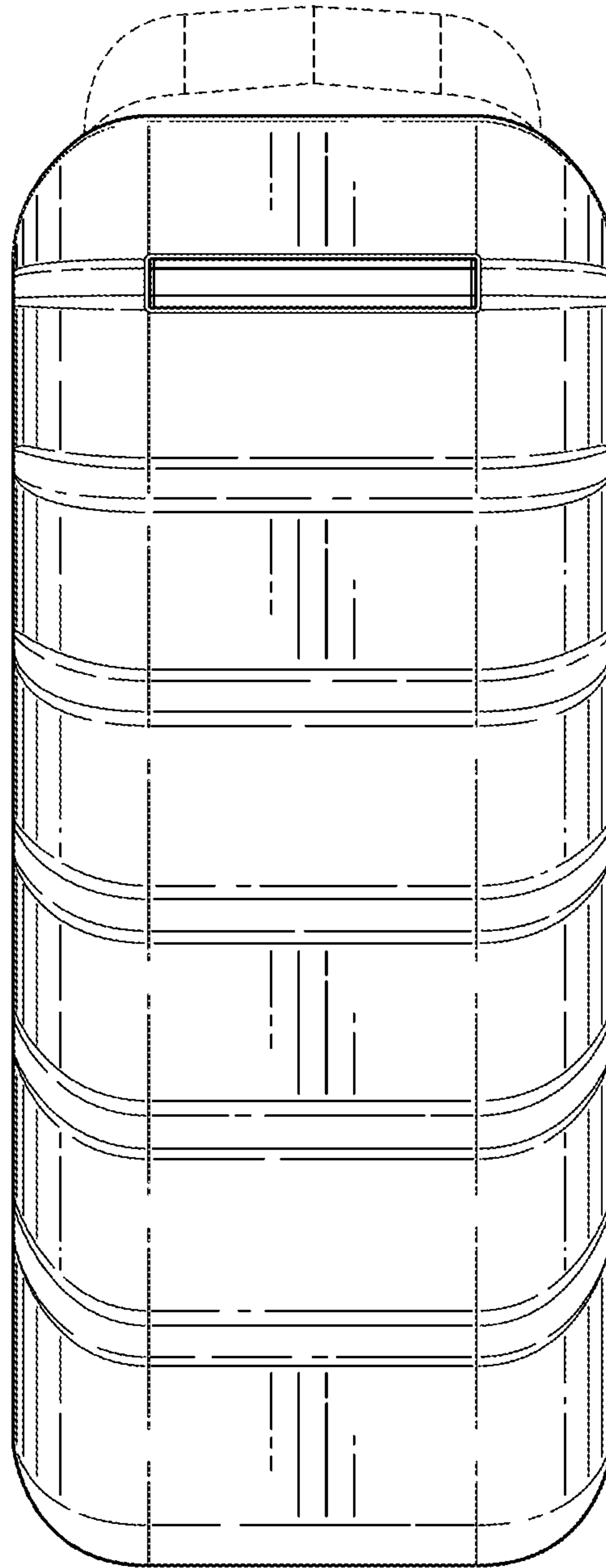

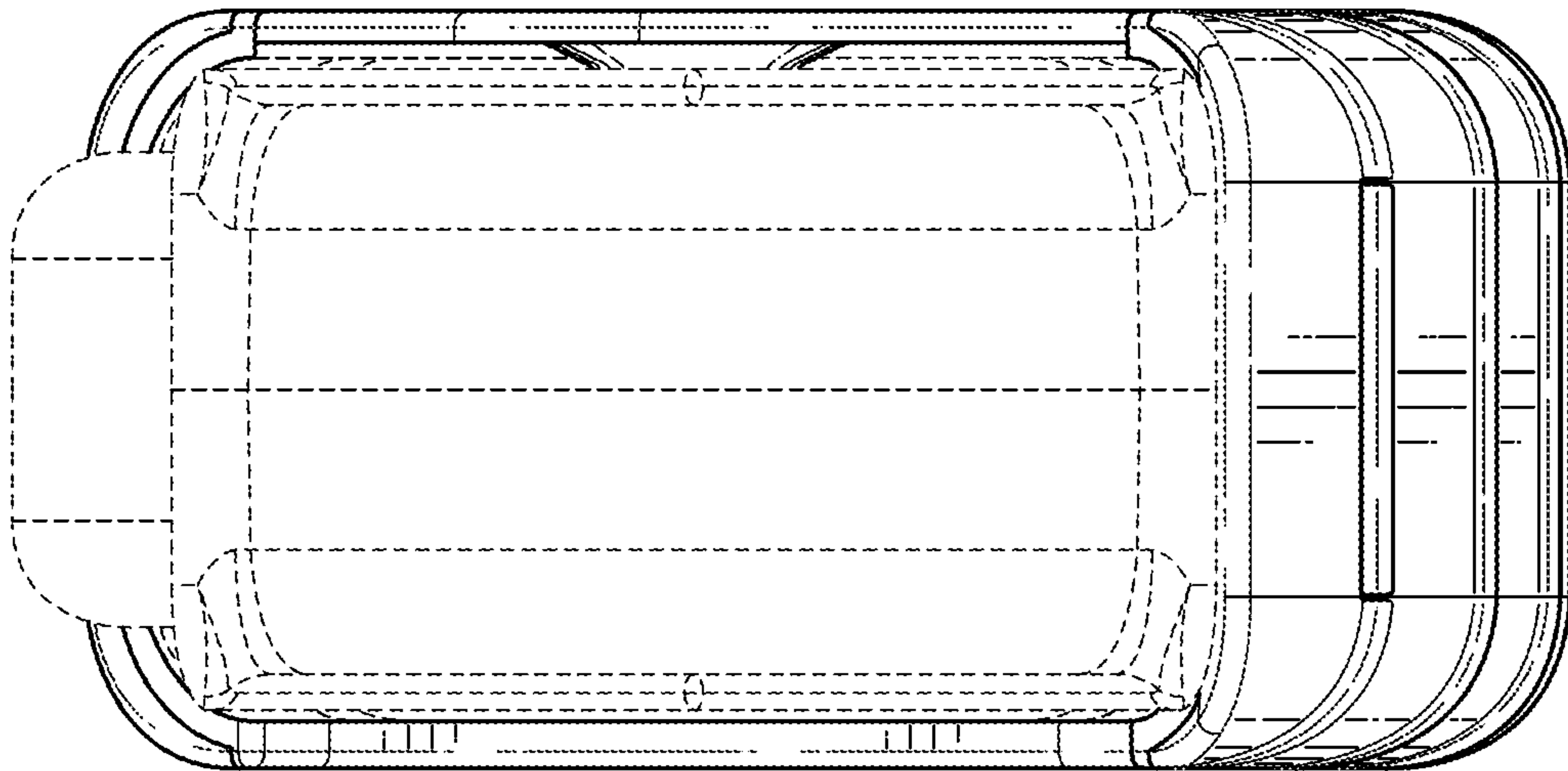

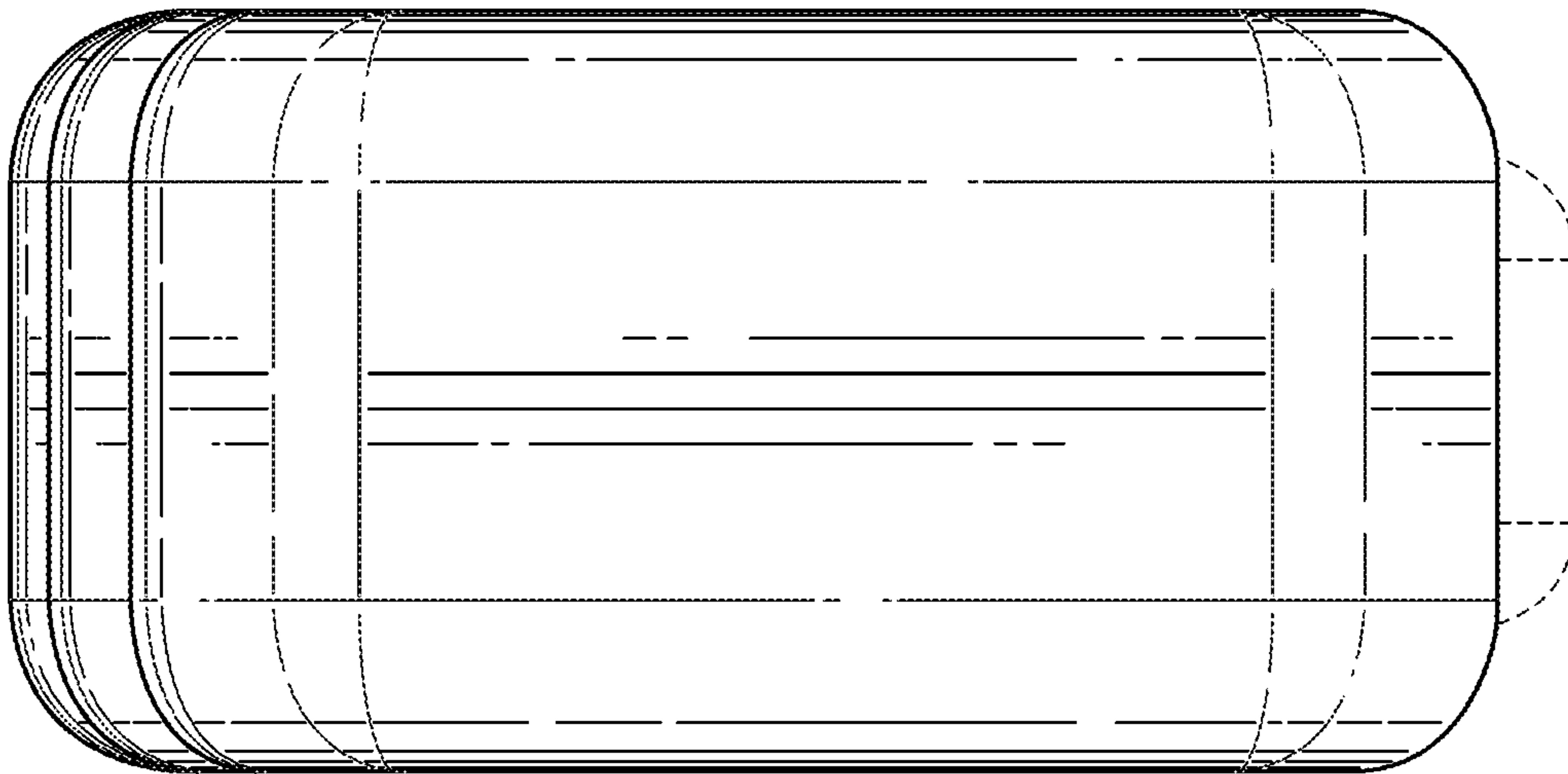
