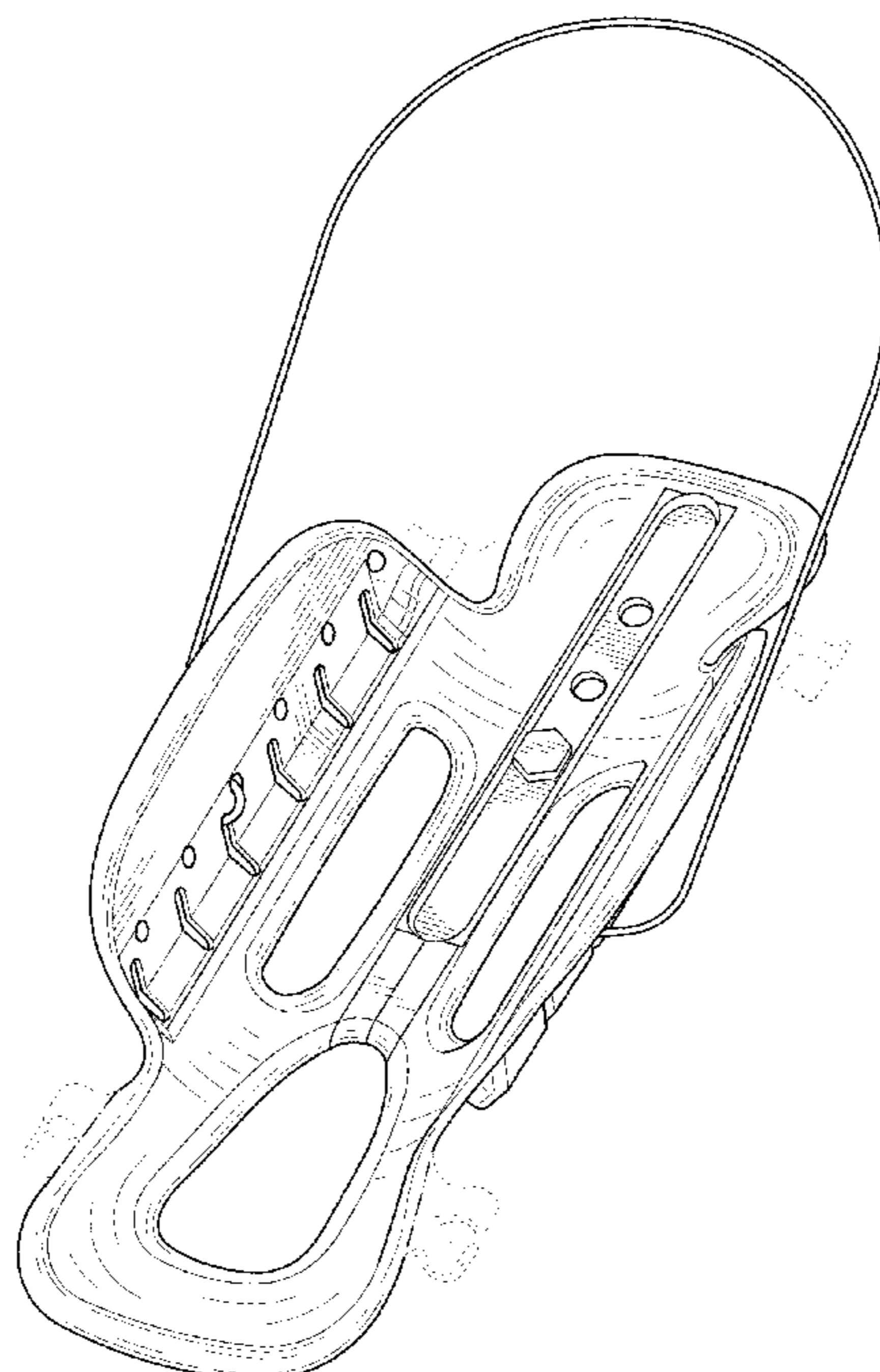
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for an arm rest apparatus, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front view of an arm rest apparatus;
 FIG. 2 is a rear view thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a bottom view thereof, the top view being a mirror-image;
 FIG. 4 is a right-side view thereof;
 FIG. 5 is a left-side view thereof;
 FIG. 6 is a perspective view thereof;
 FIG. 7 is a referential view showing the arm rest apparatus with respect to a user; and,
 FIG. 8 is another referential view showing the arm rest apparatus with respect to a user's arm.

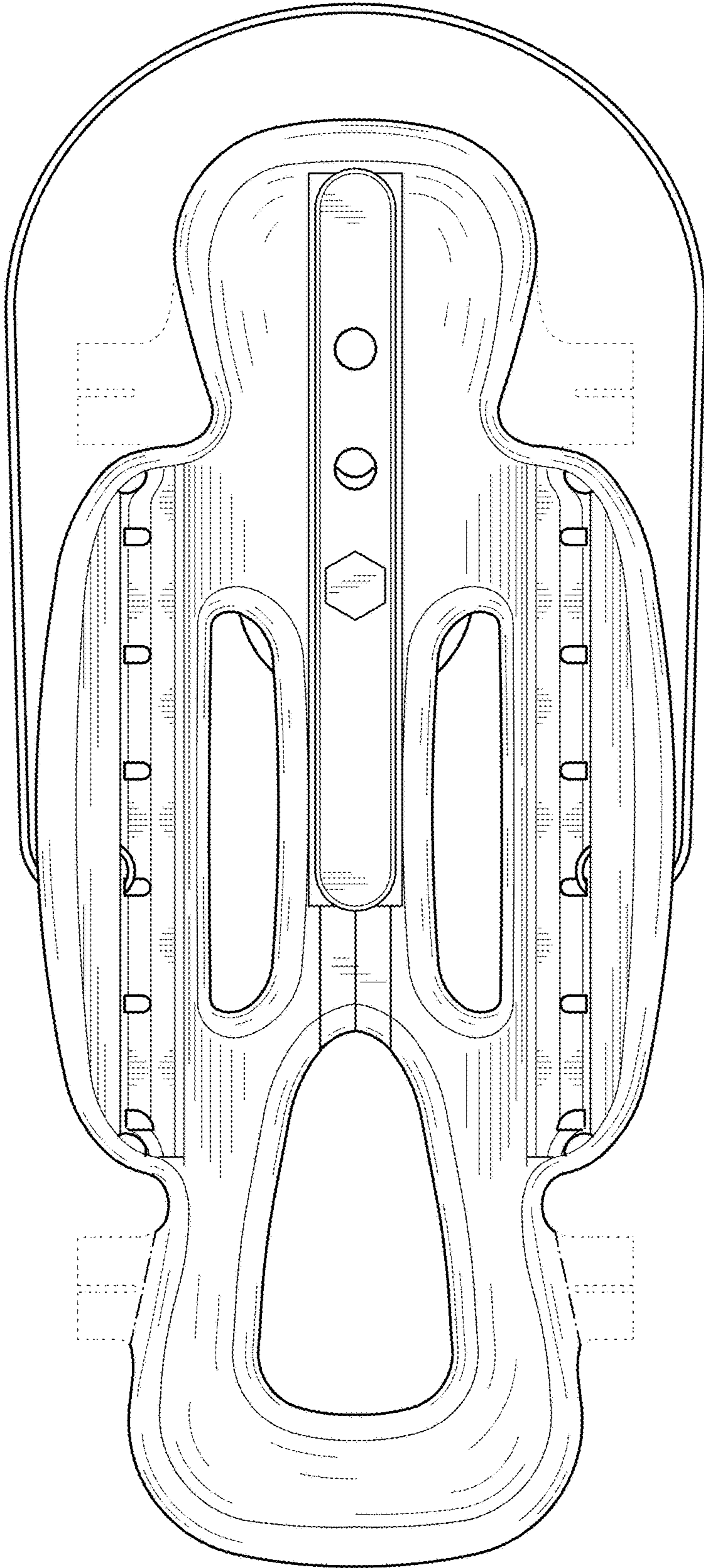

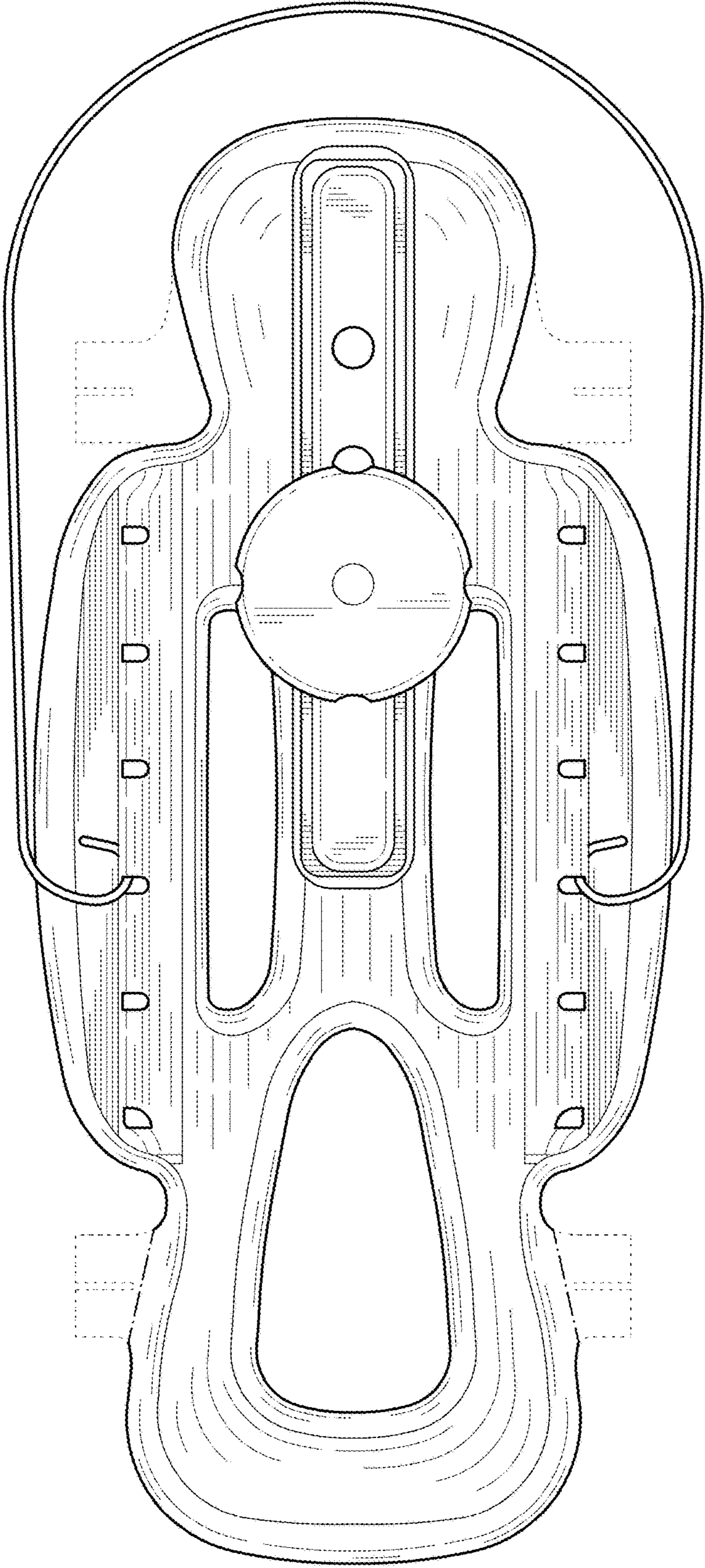

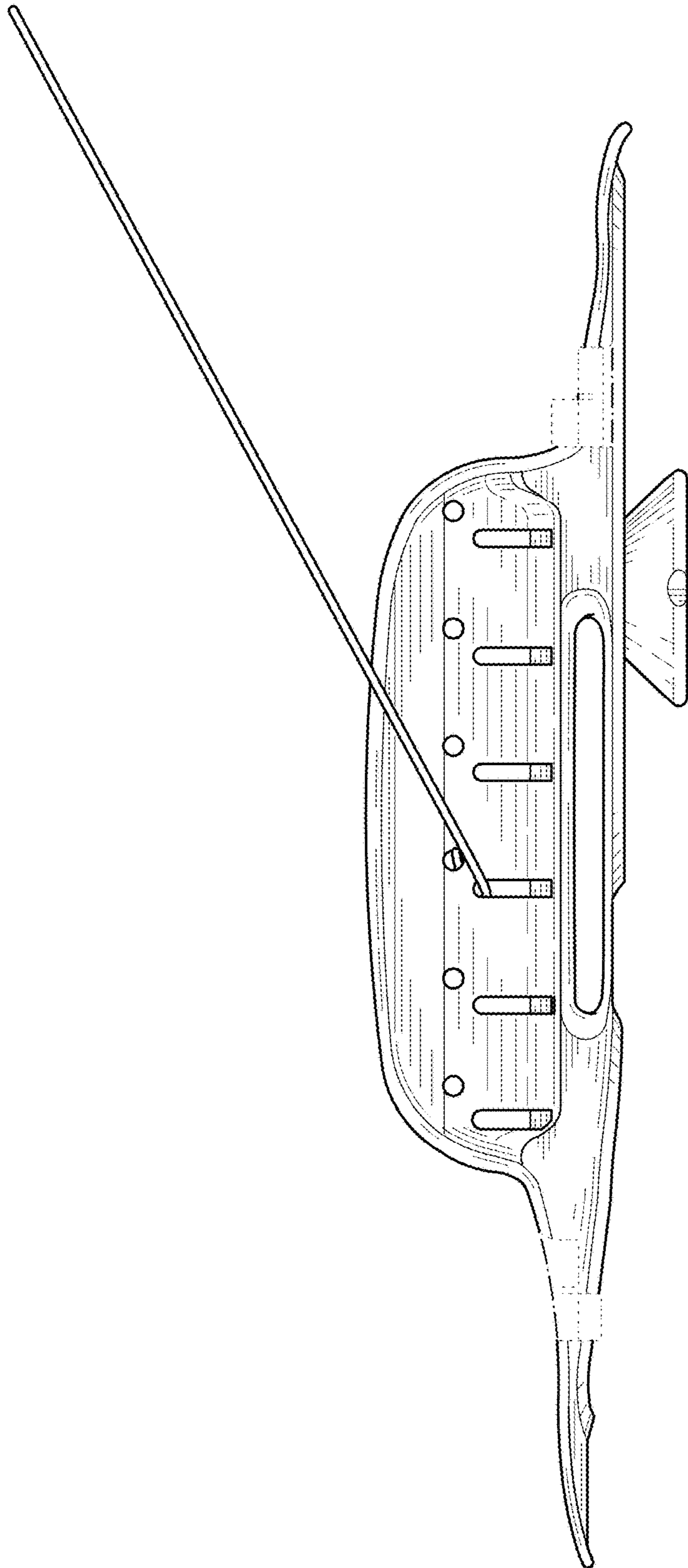

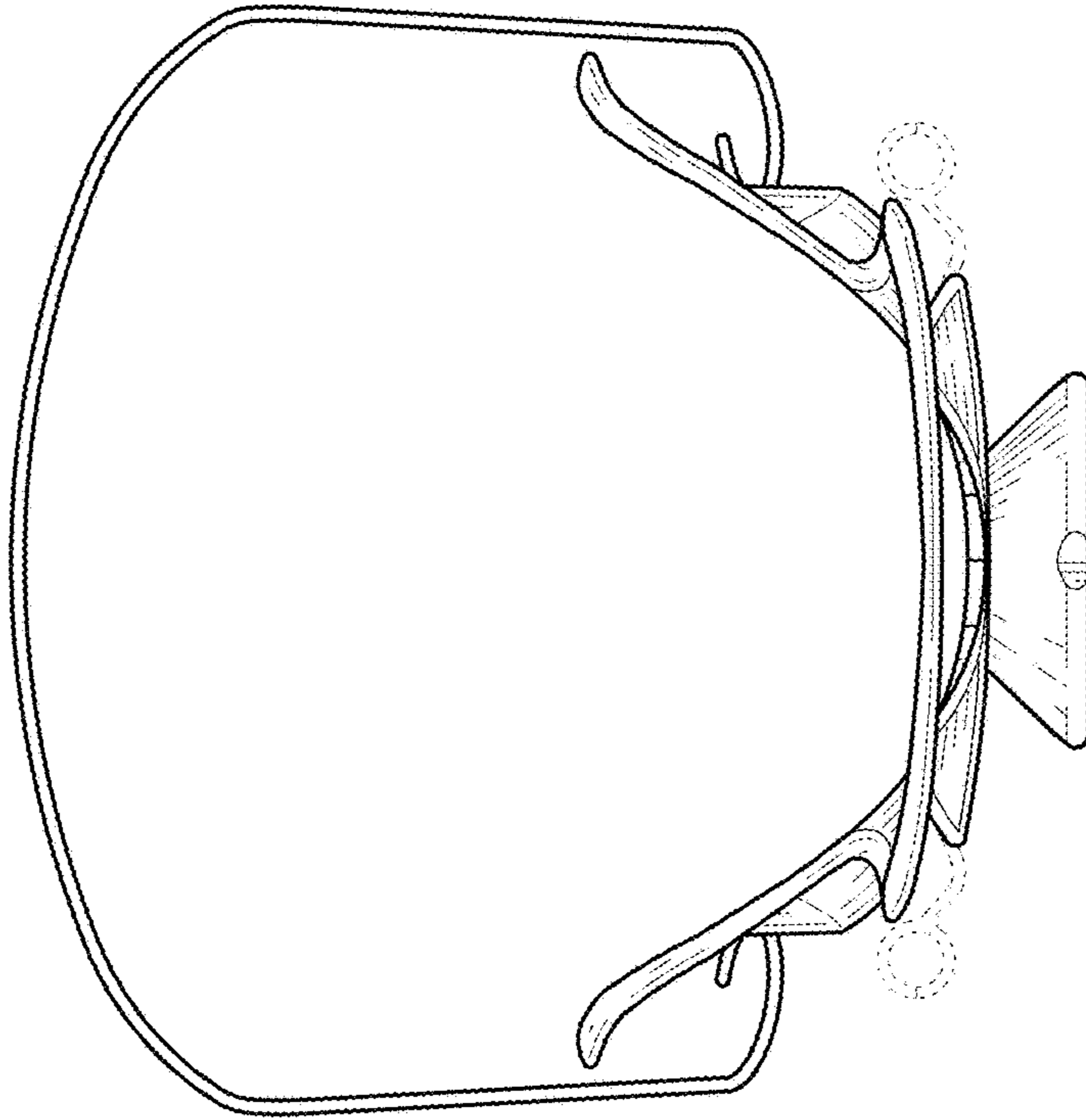

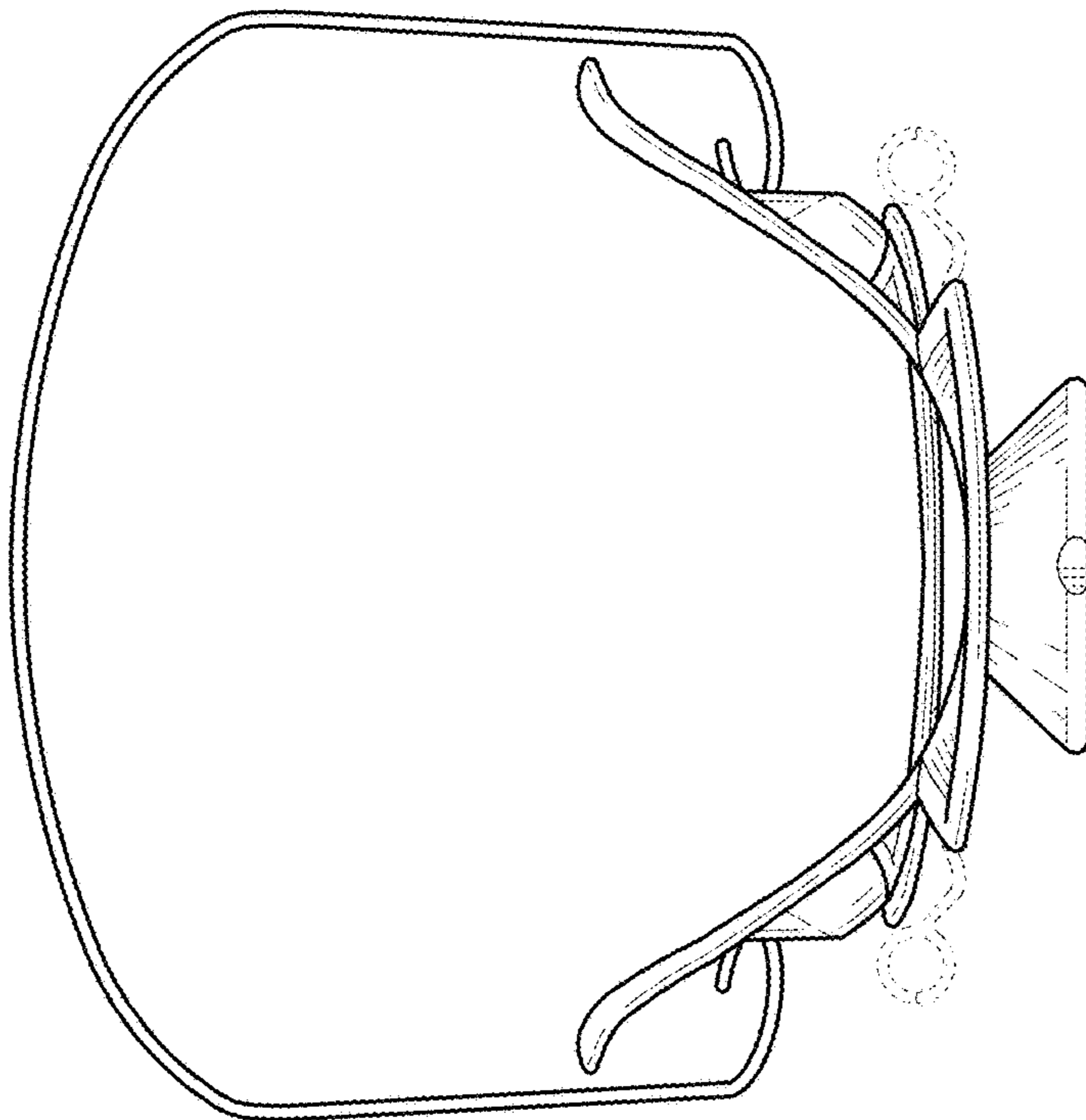

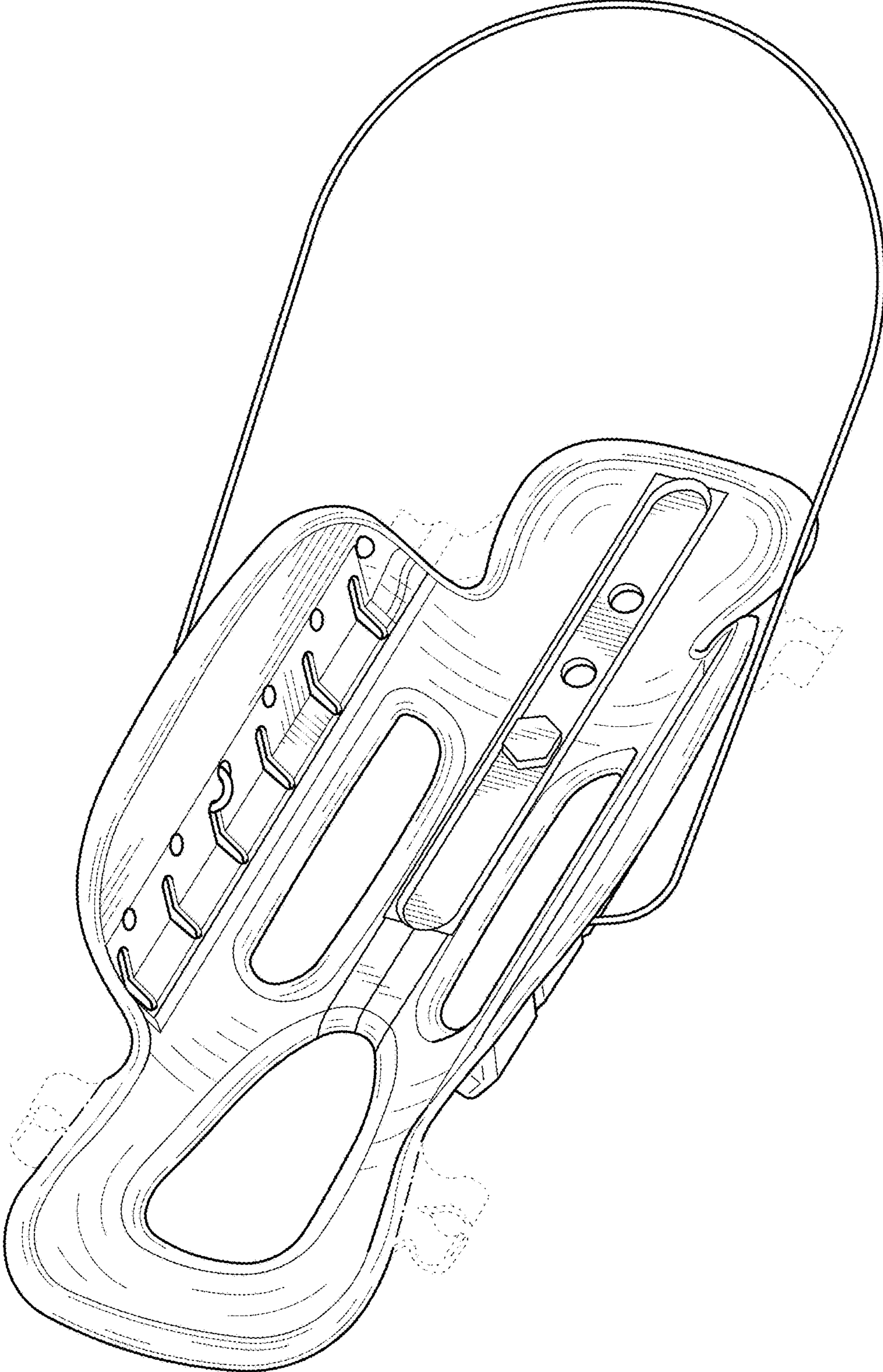

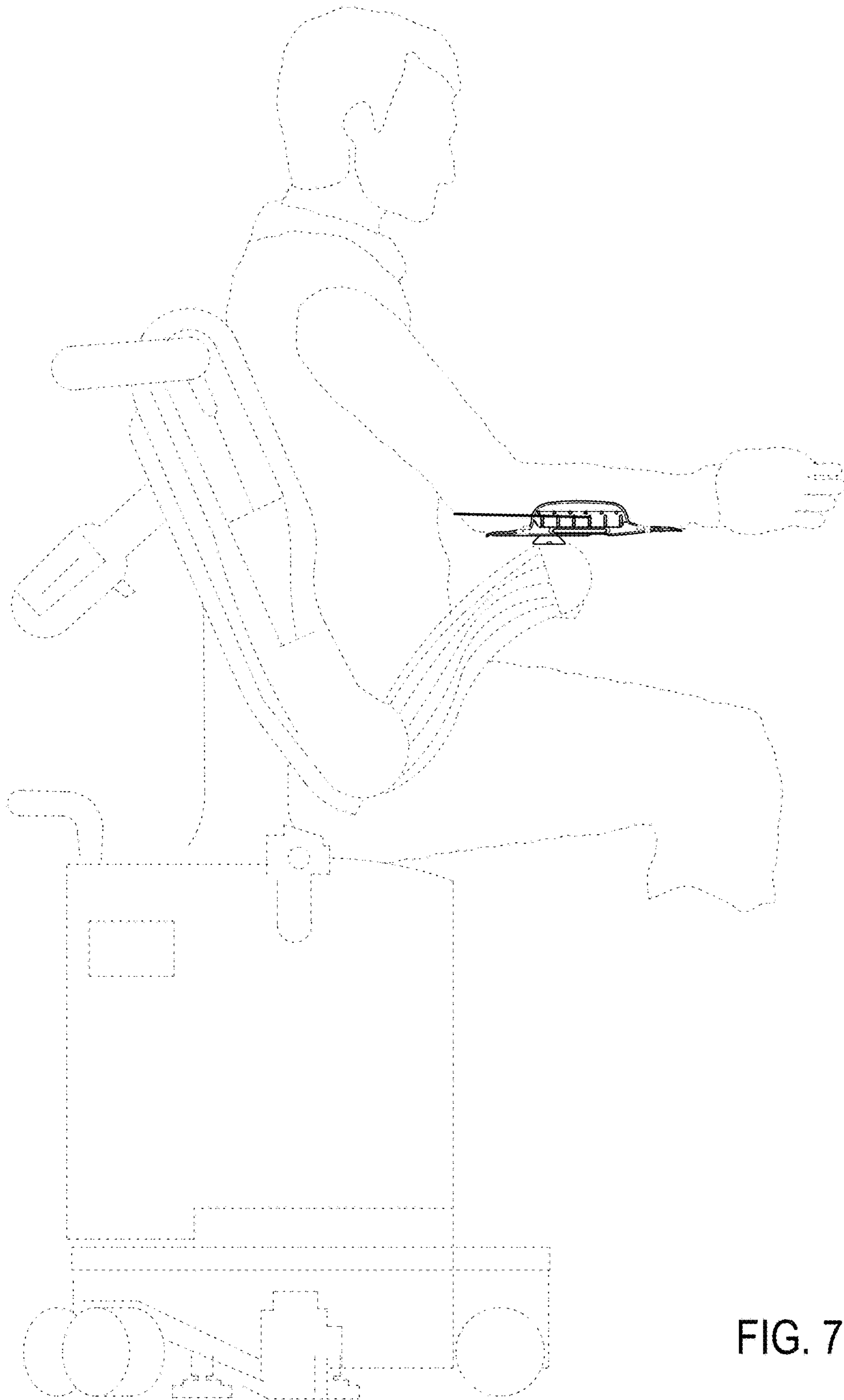

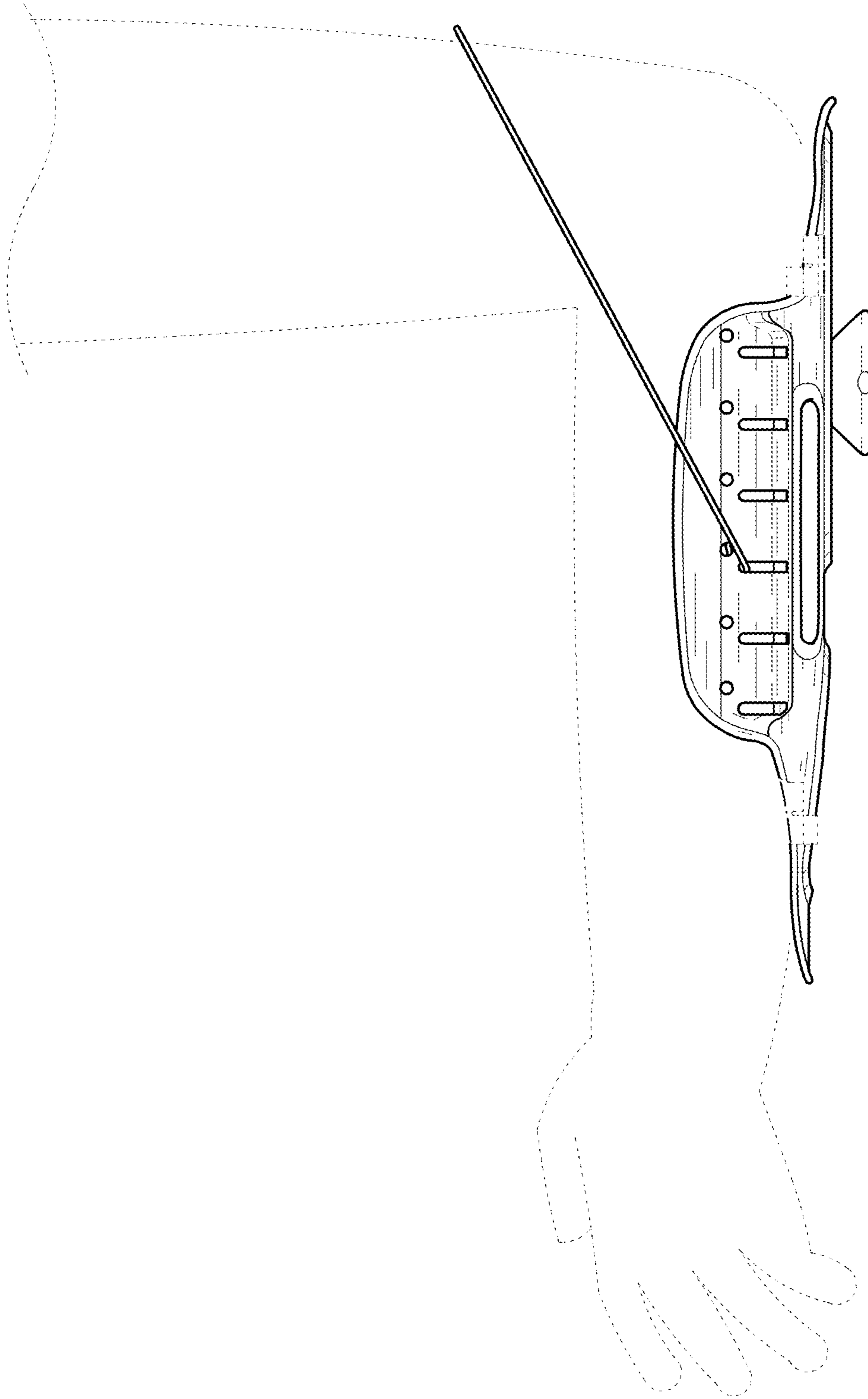
