device.

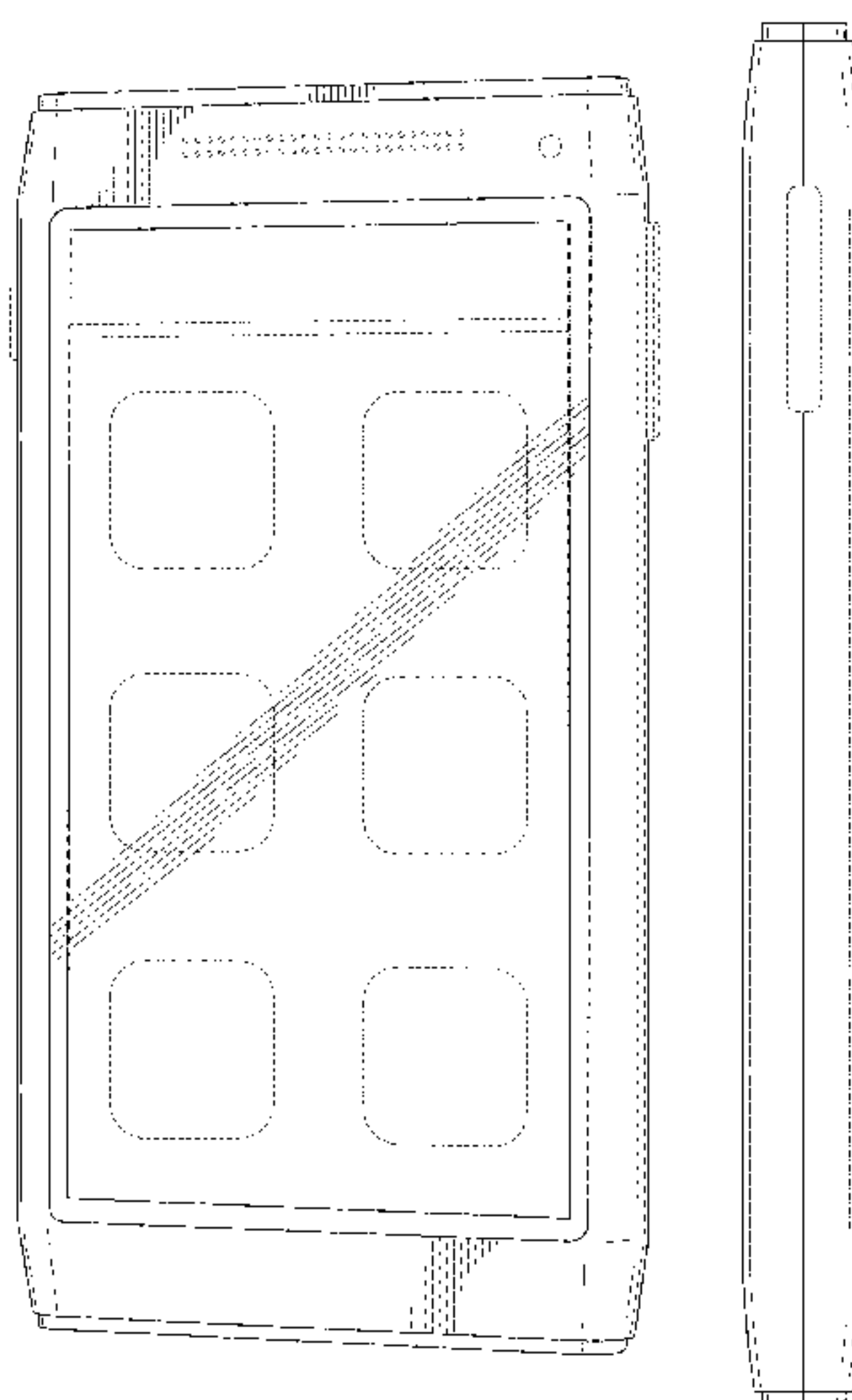
FIG. 7 is a right side view of the mobile communication

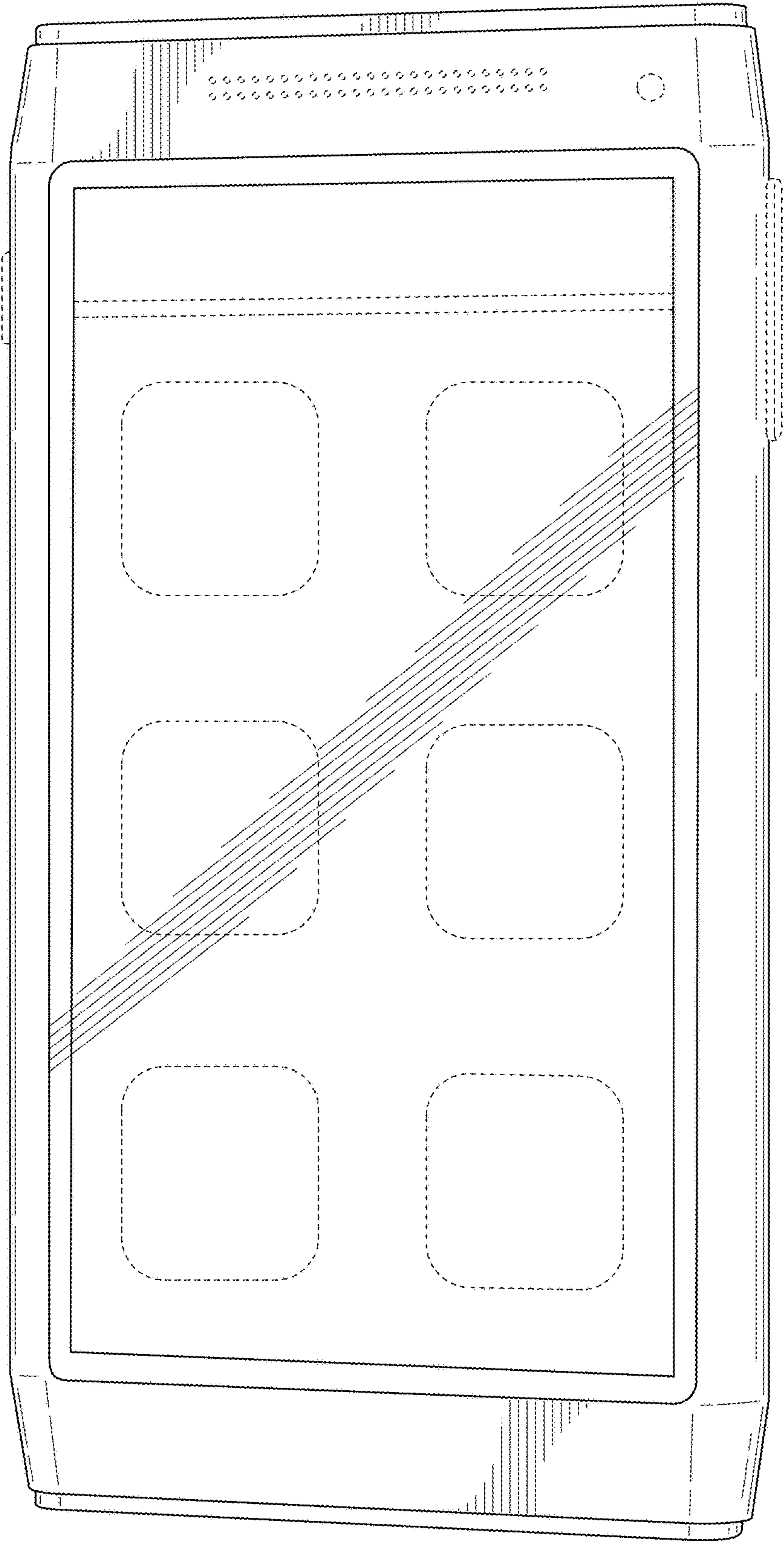

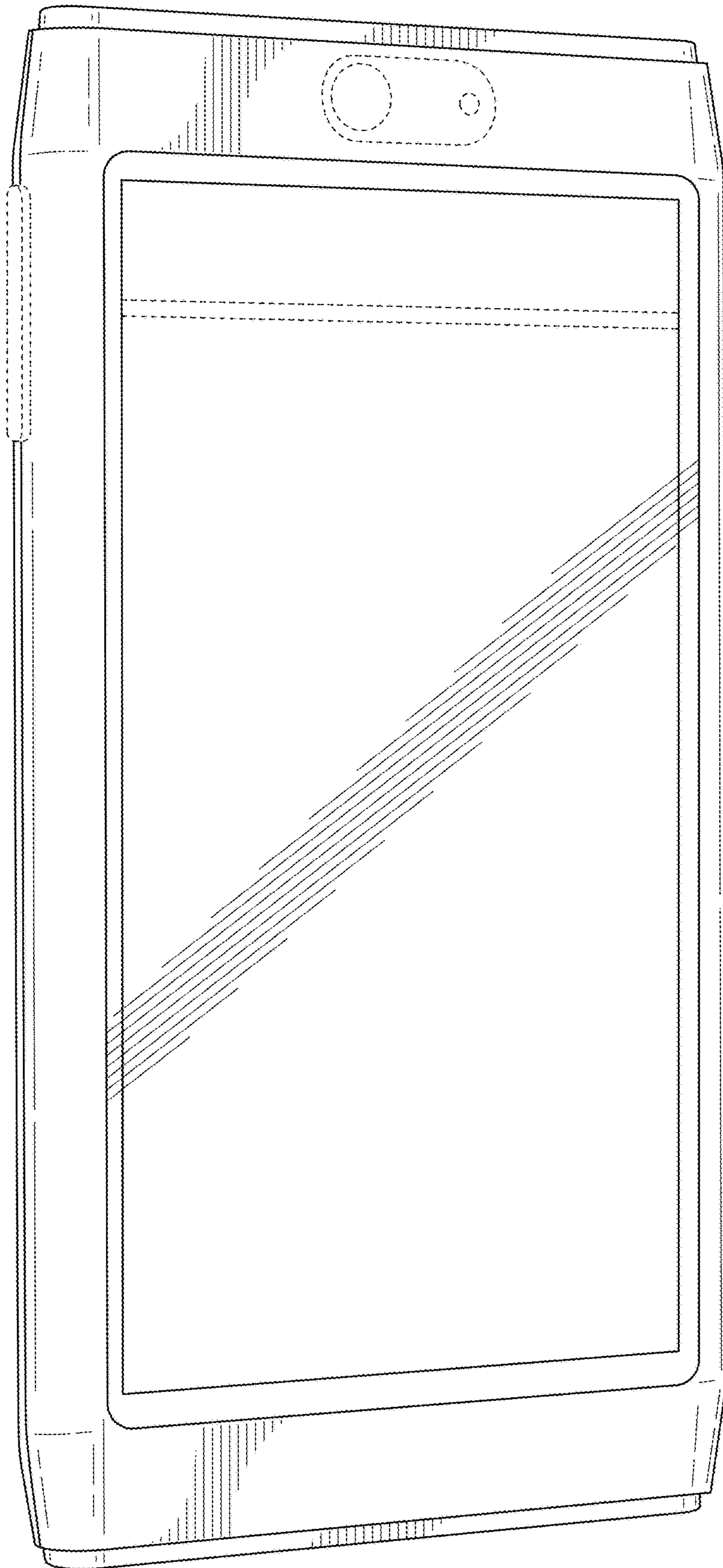

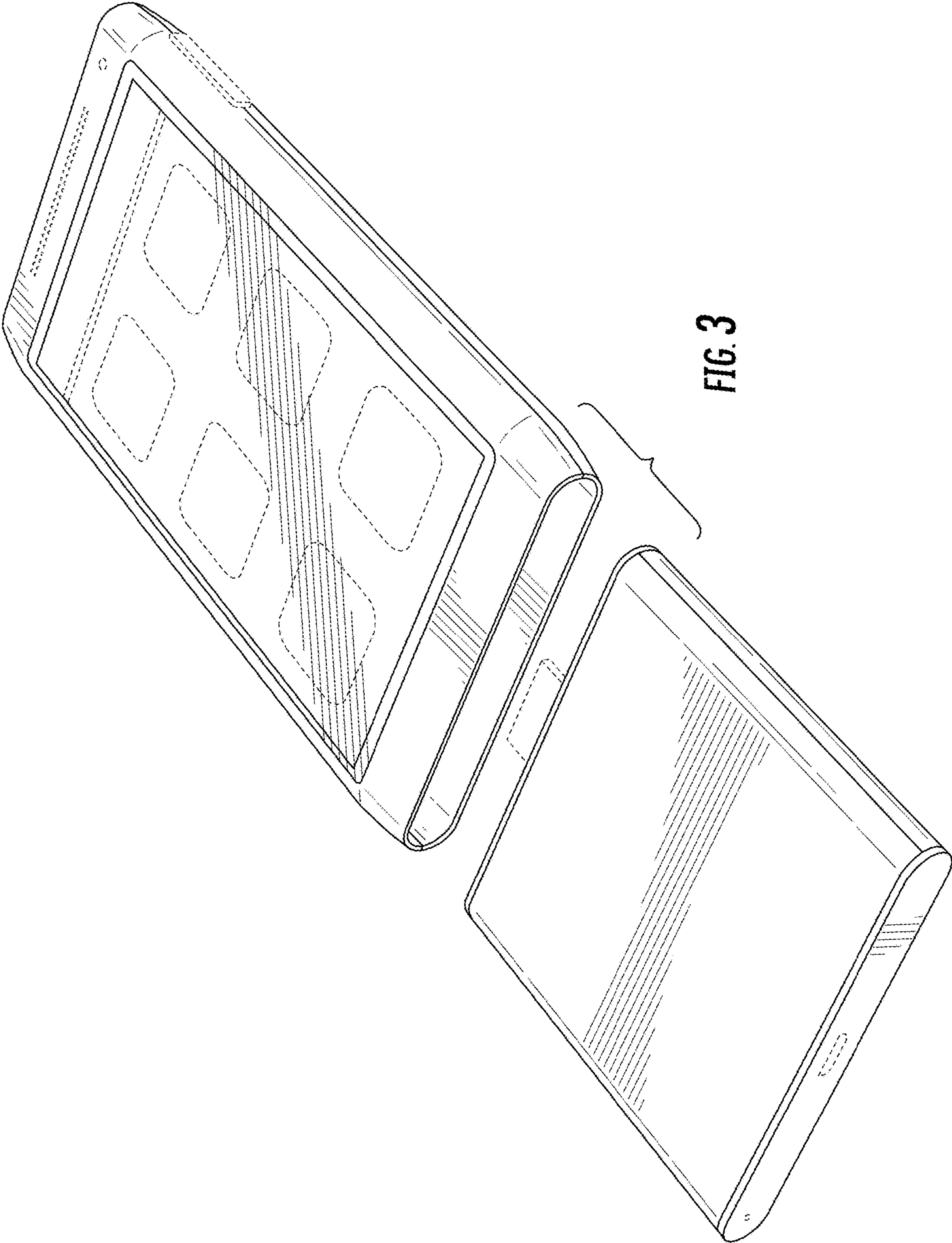

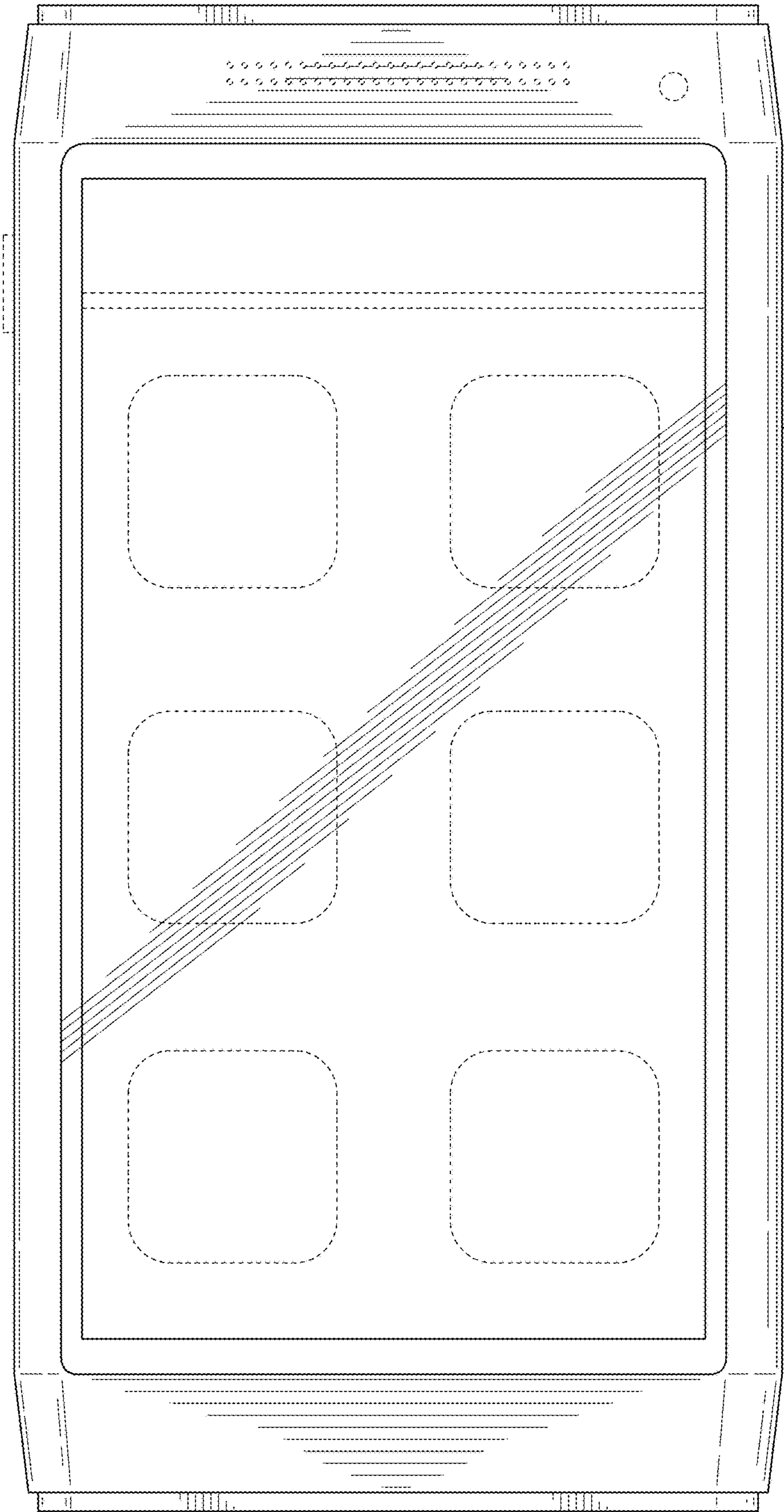
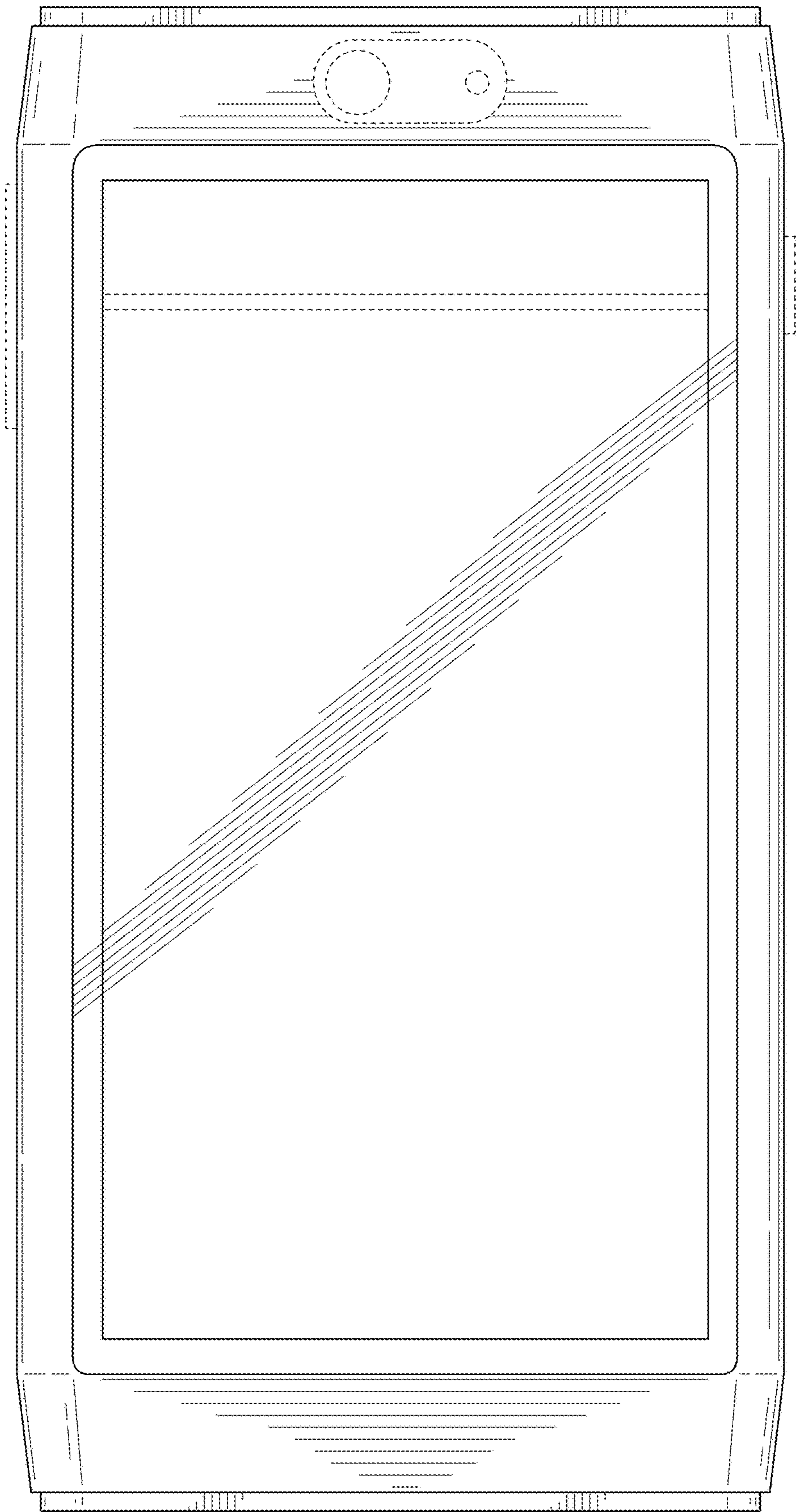

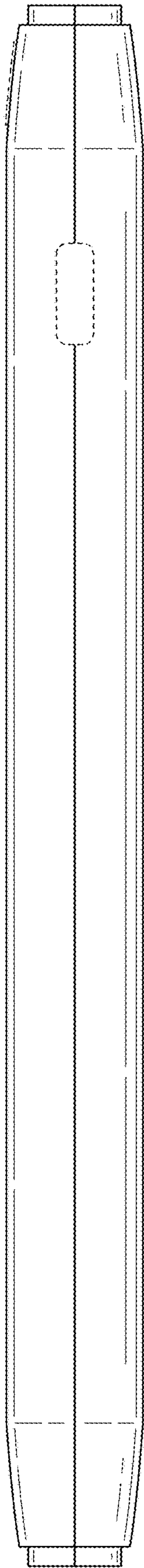

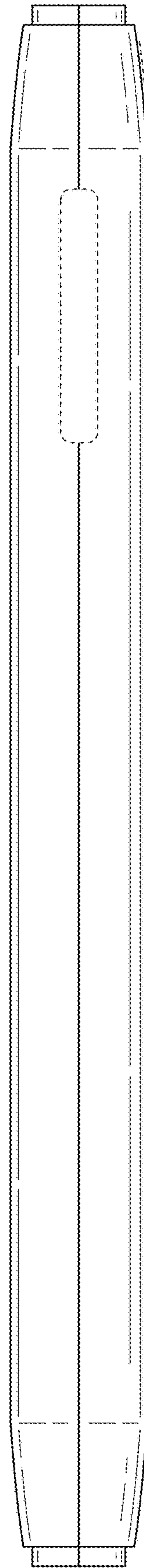

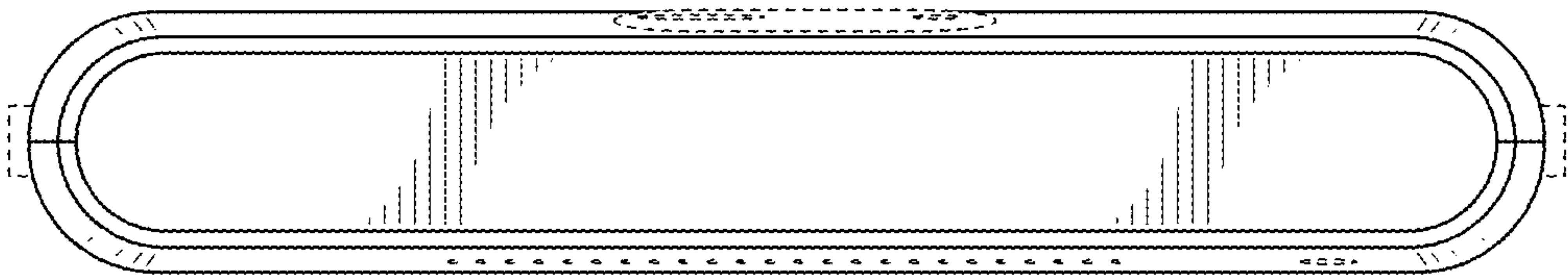

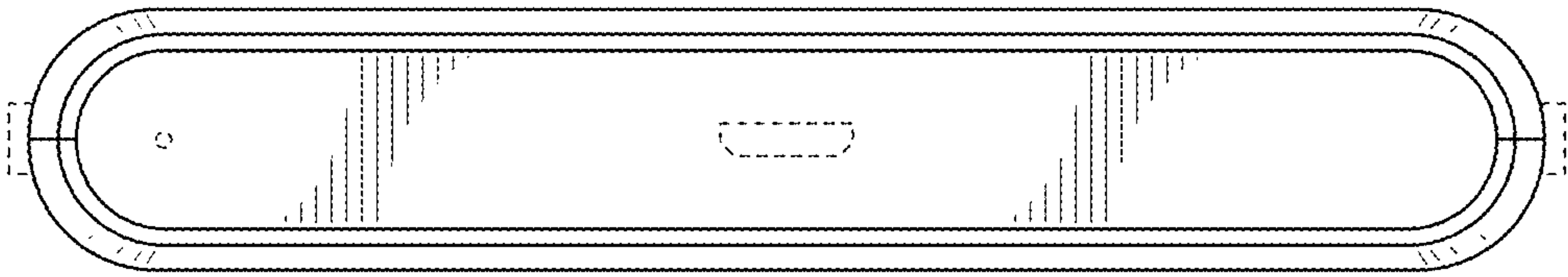
