DESCRIPTION

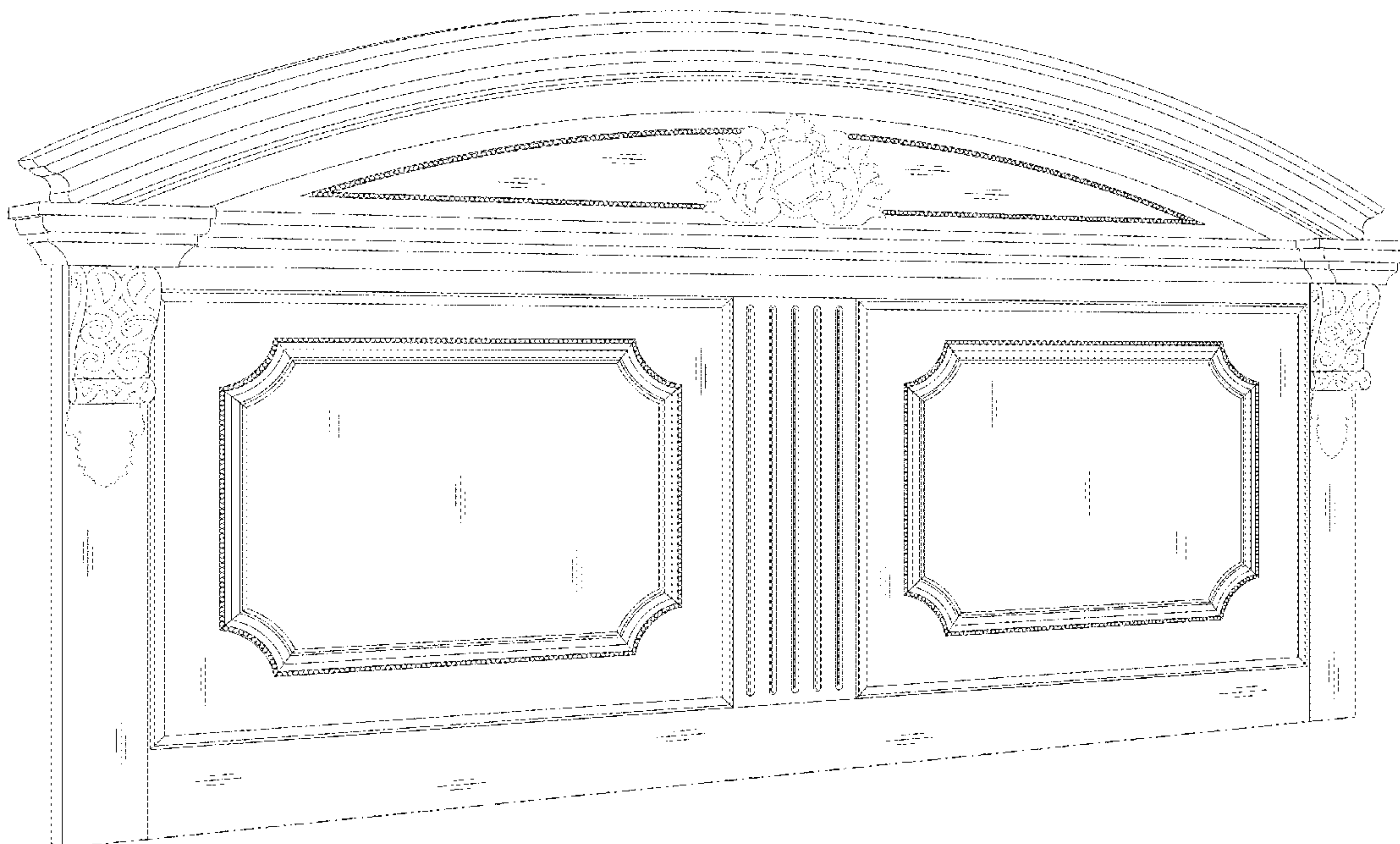
FIG. 1 is a front elevation view of my new design;

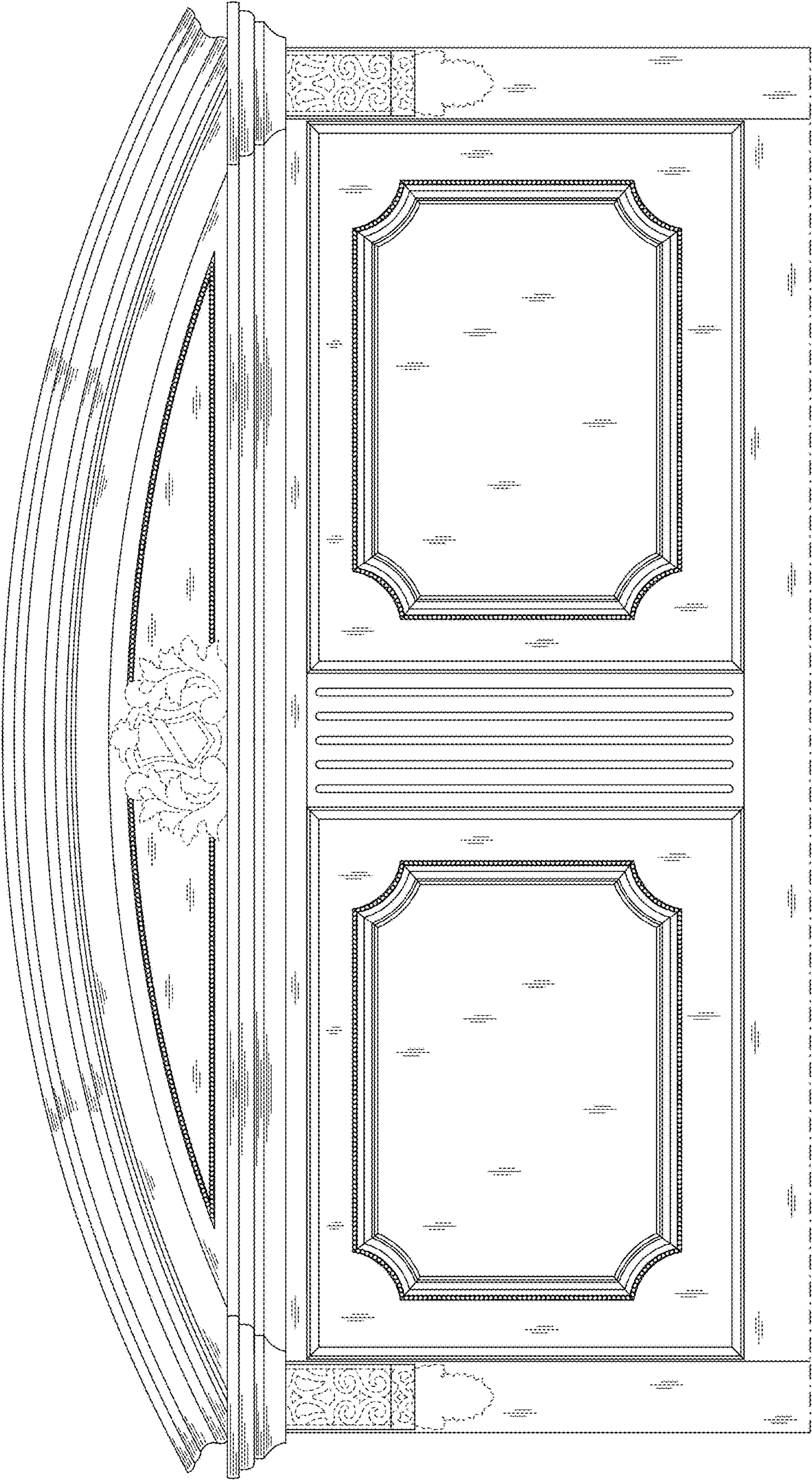

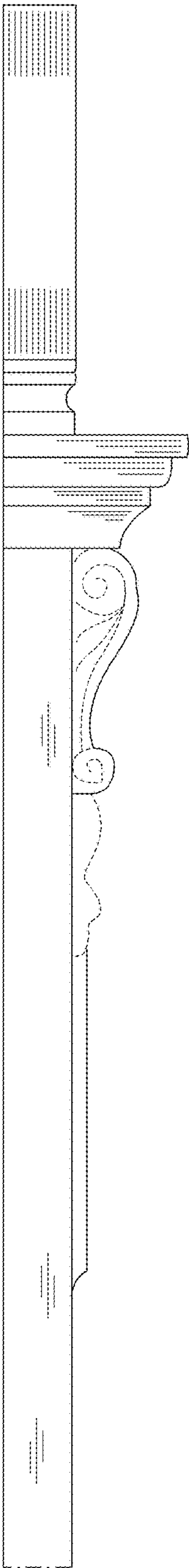

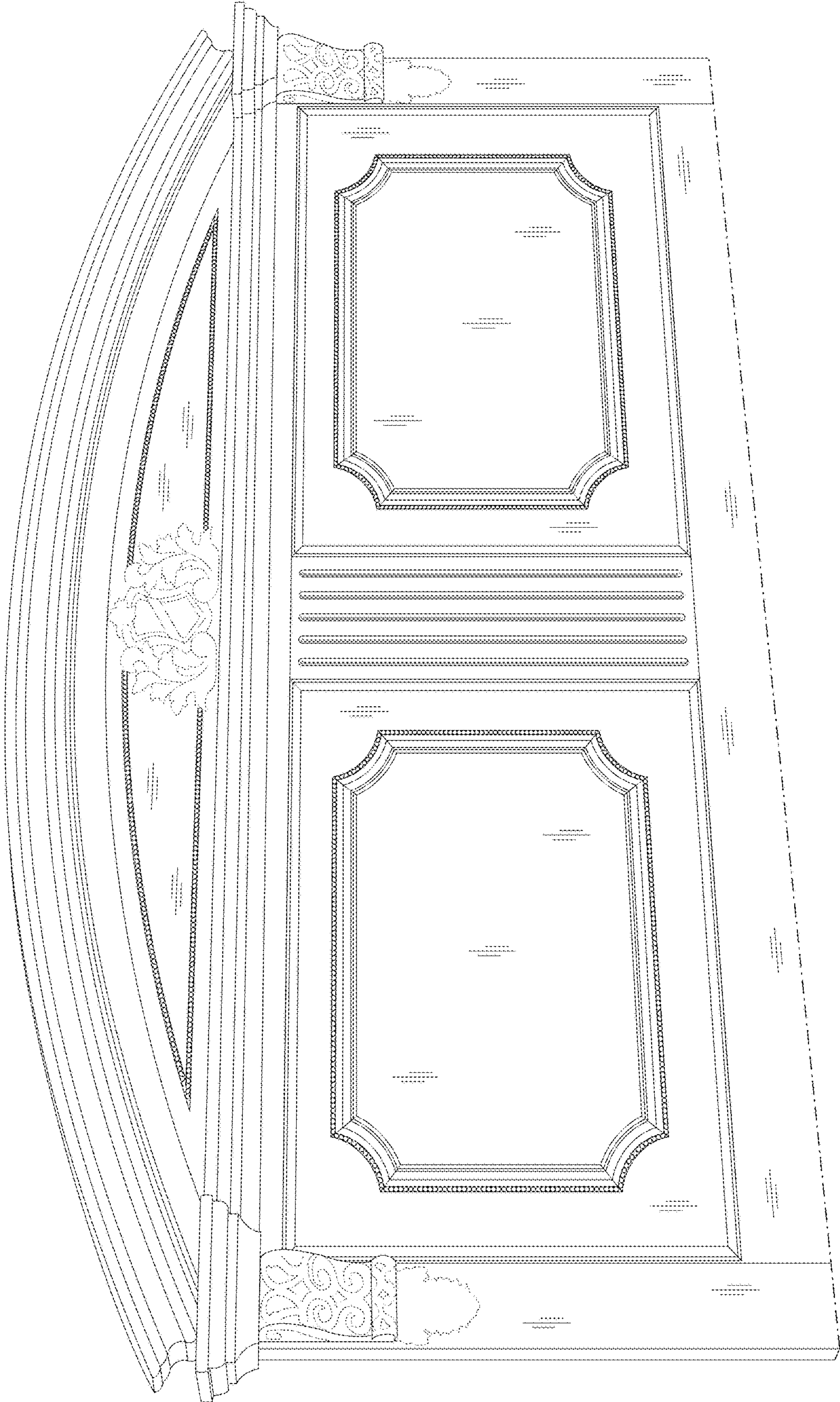
