DESCRIPTION

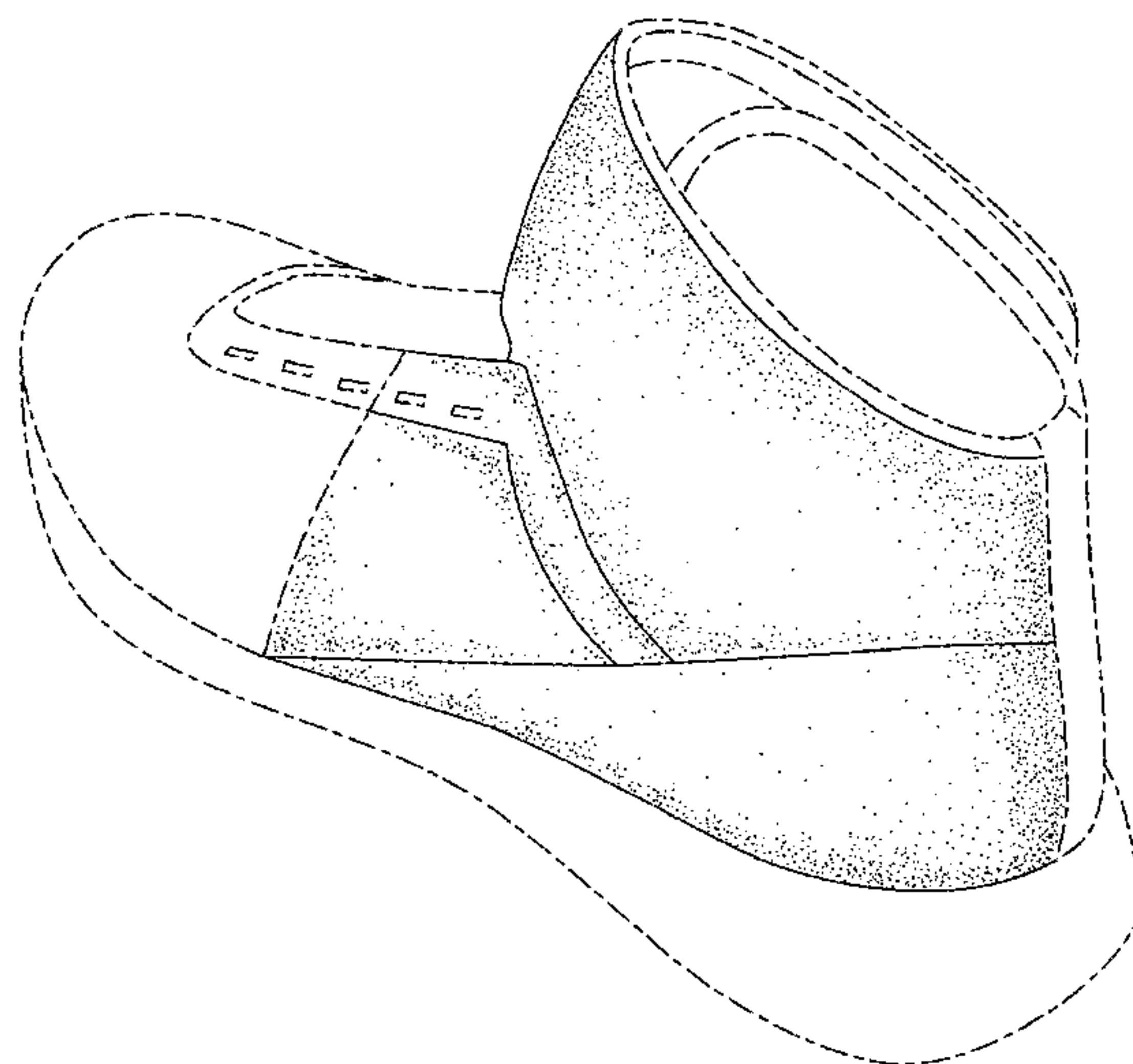
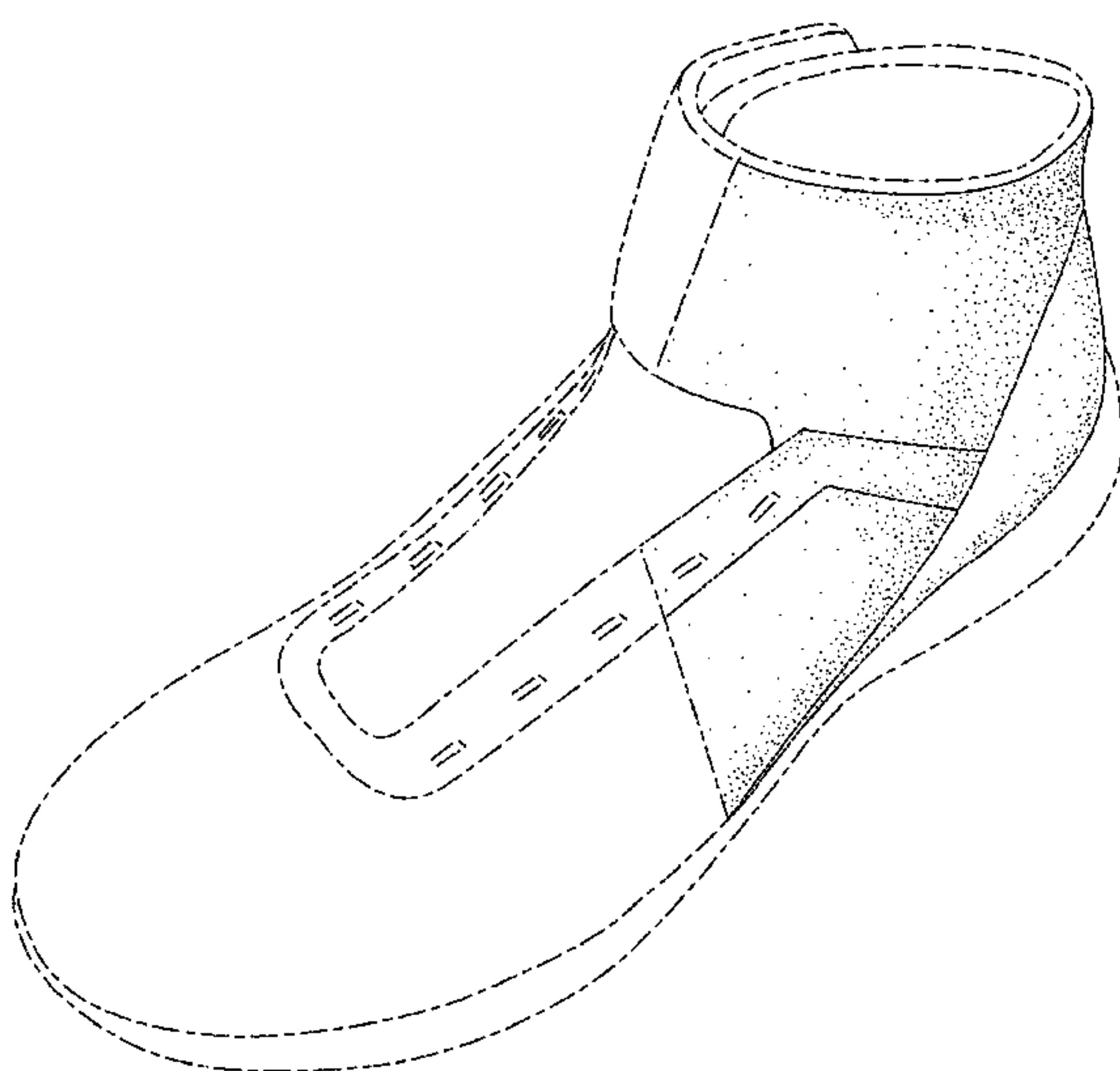
FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a shoe upper showing my new design;

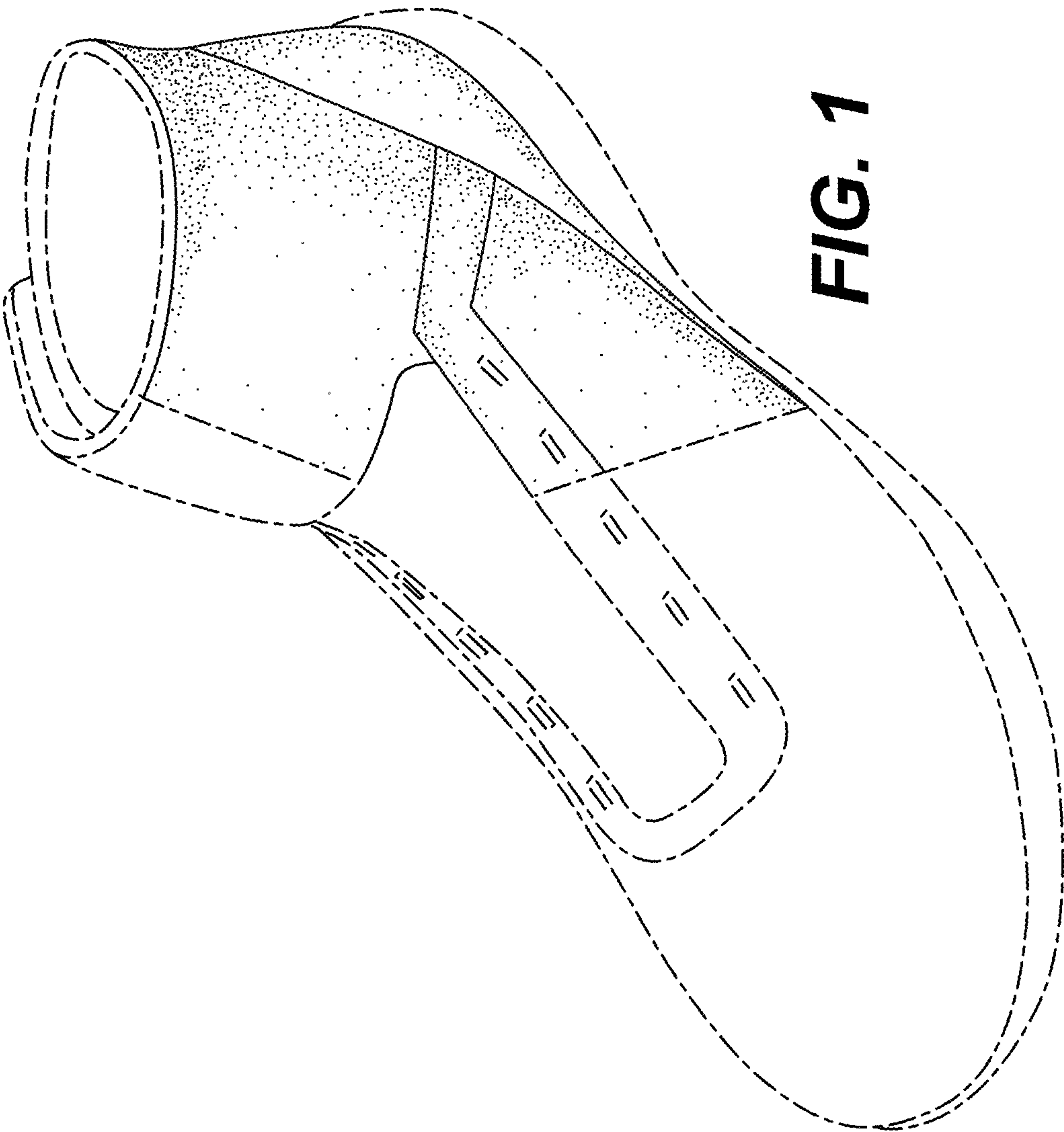

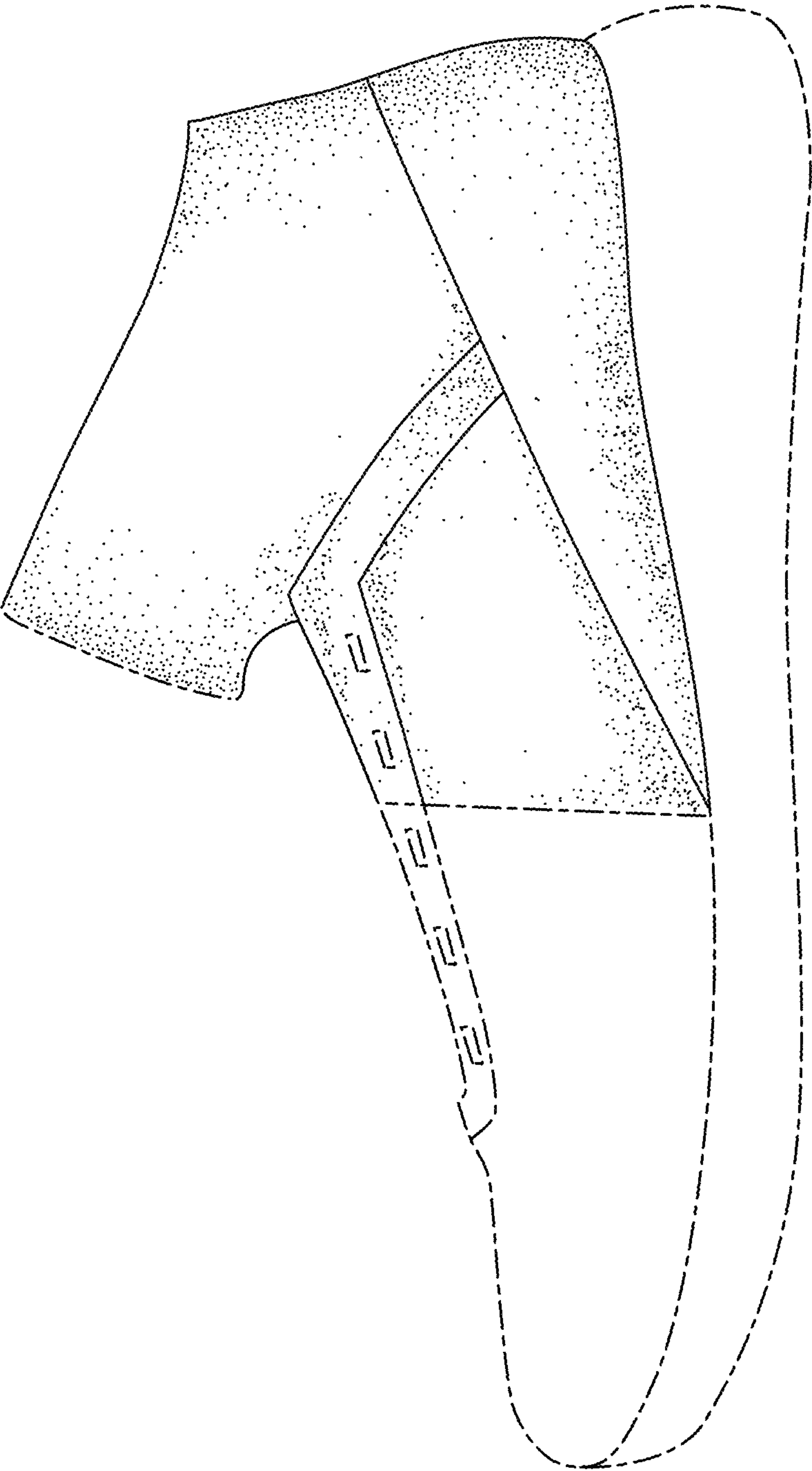

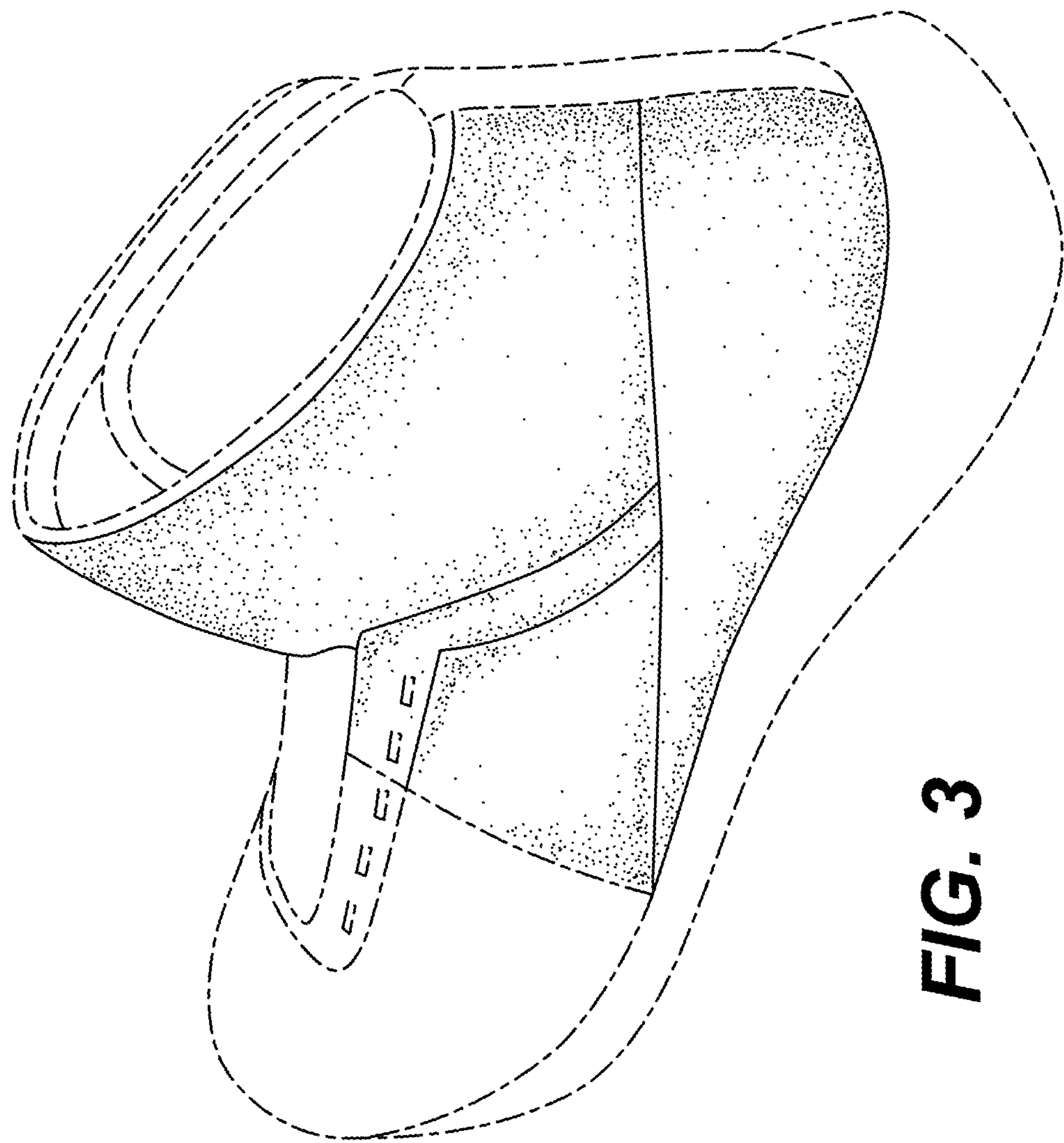
