FIG. 2 is a left side view in elevation thereof;

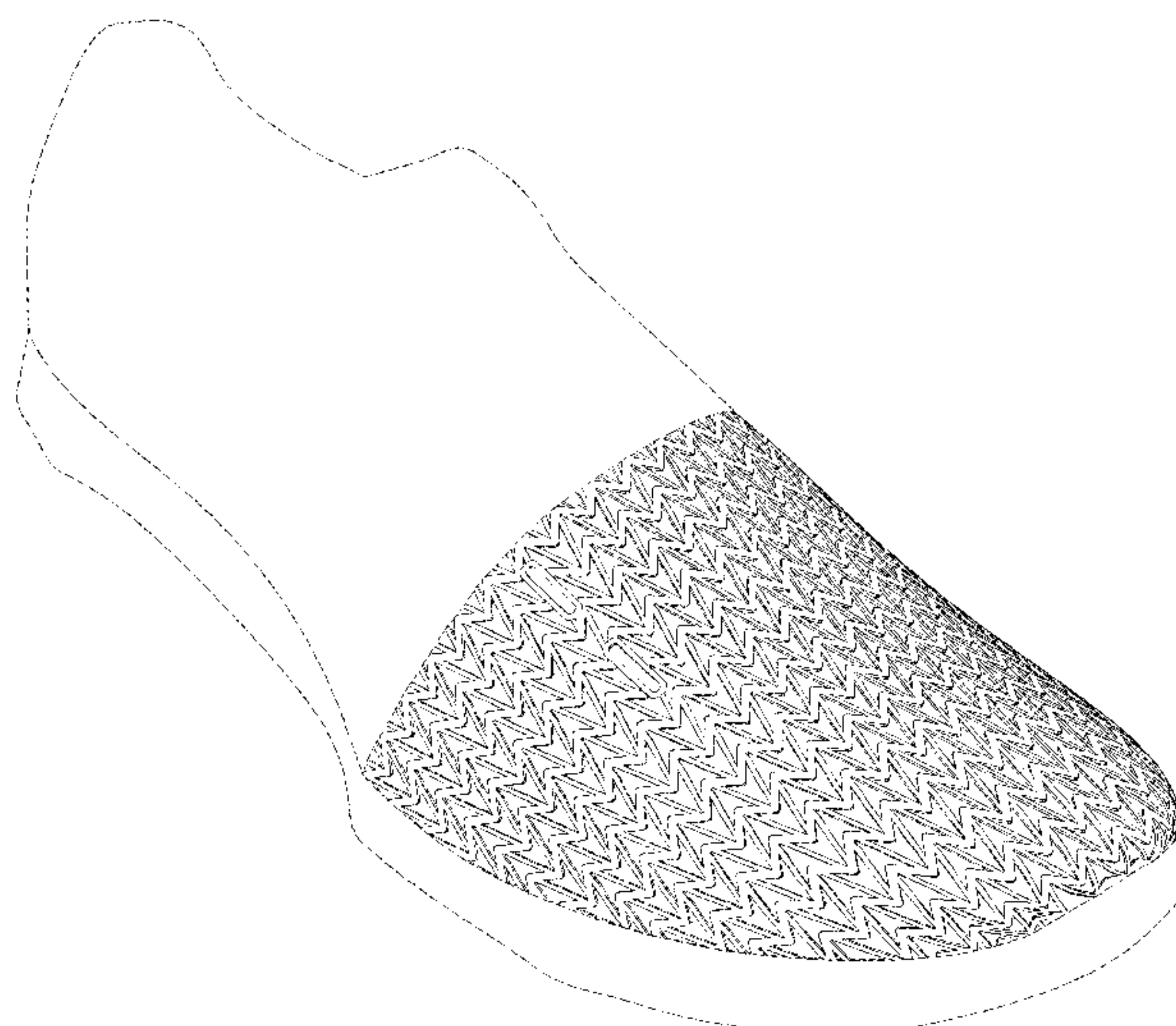
FIG. 3 is a right side view in elevation thereof;

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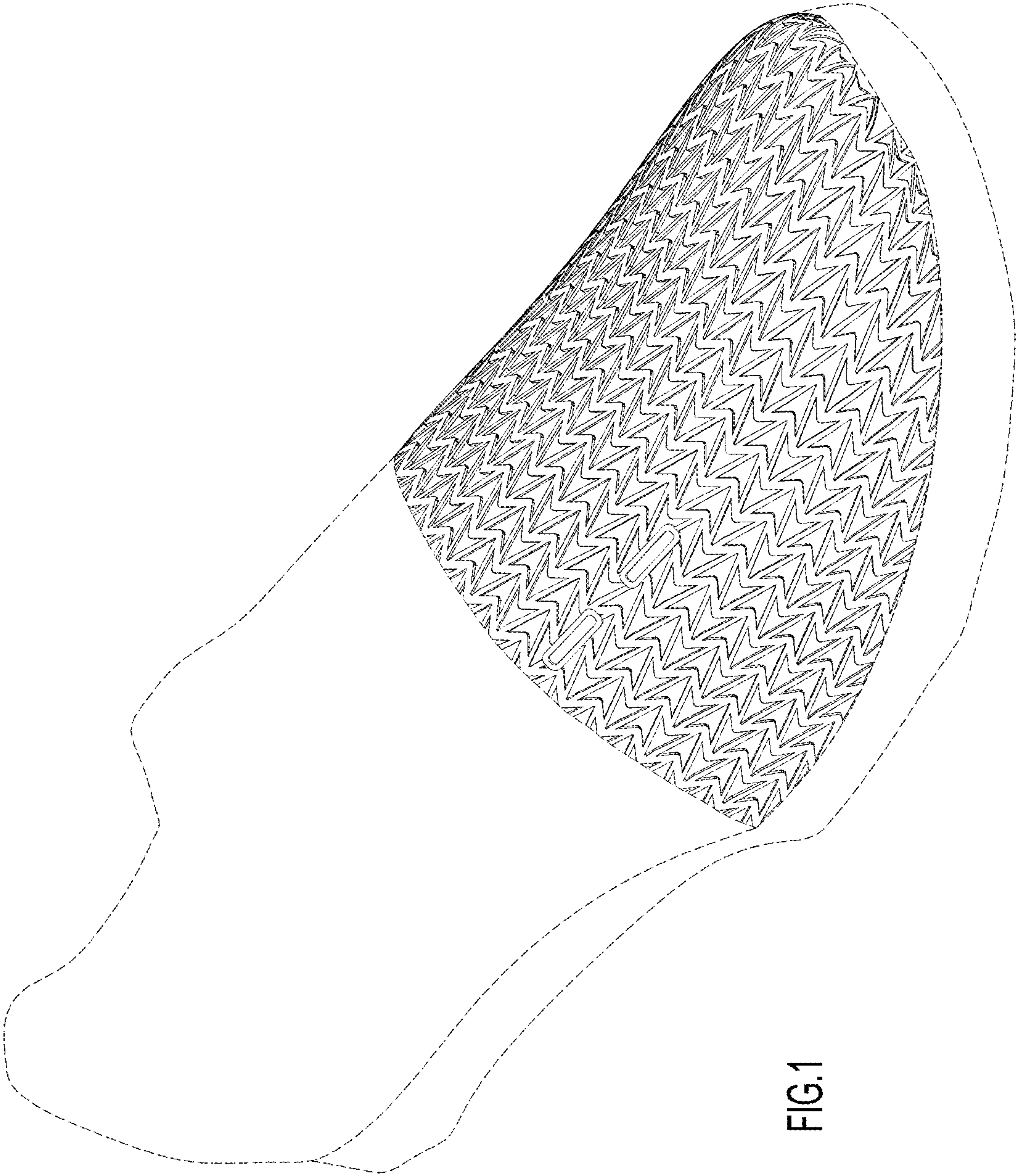

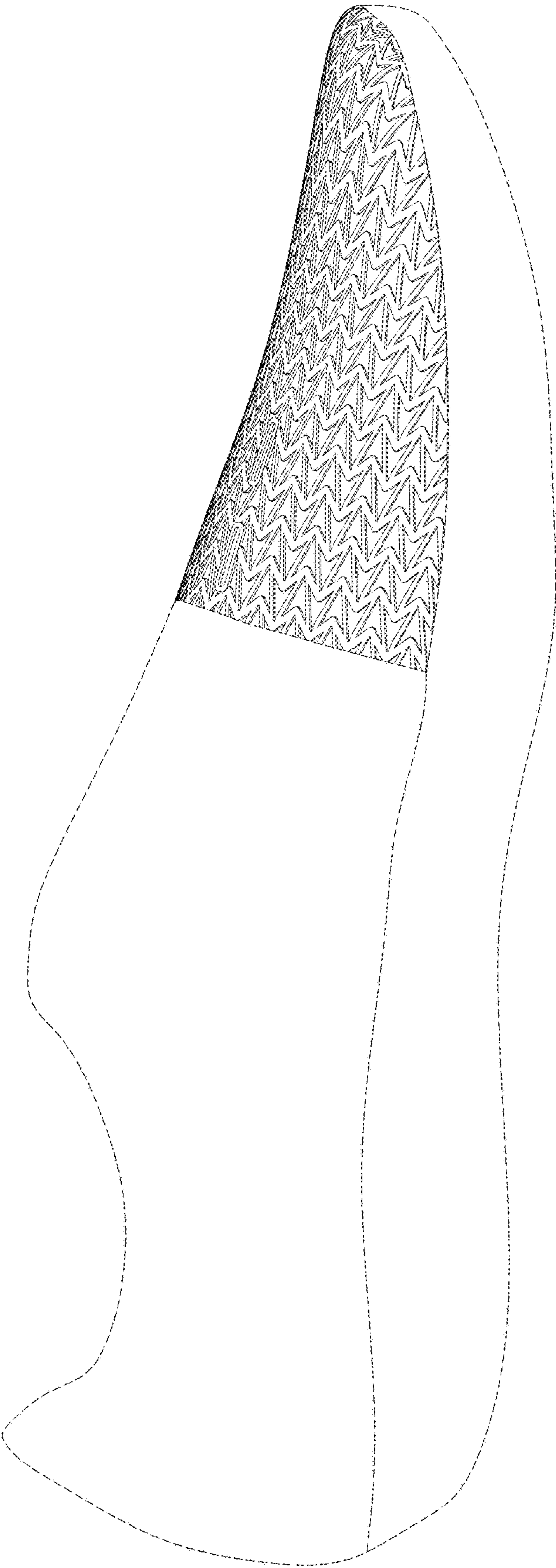

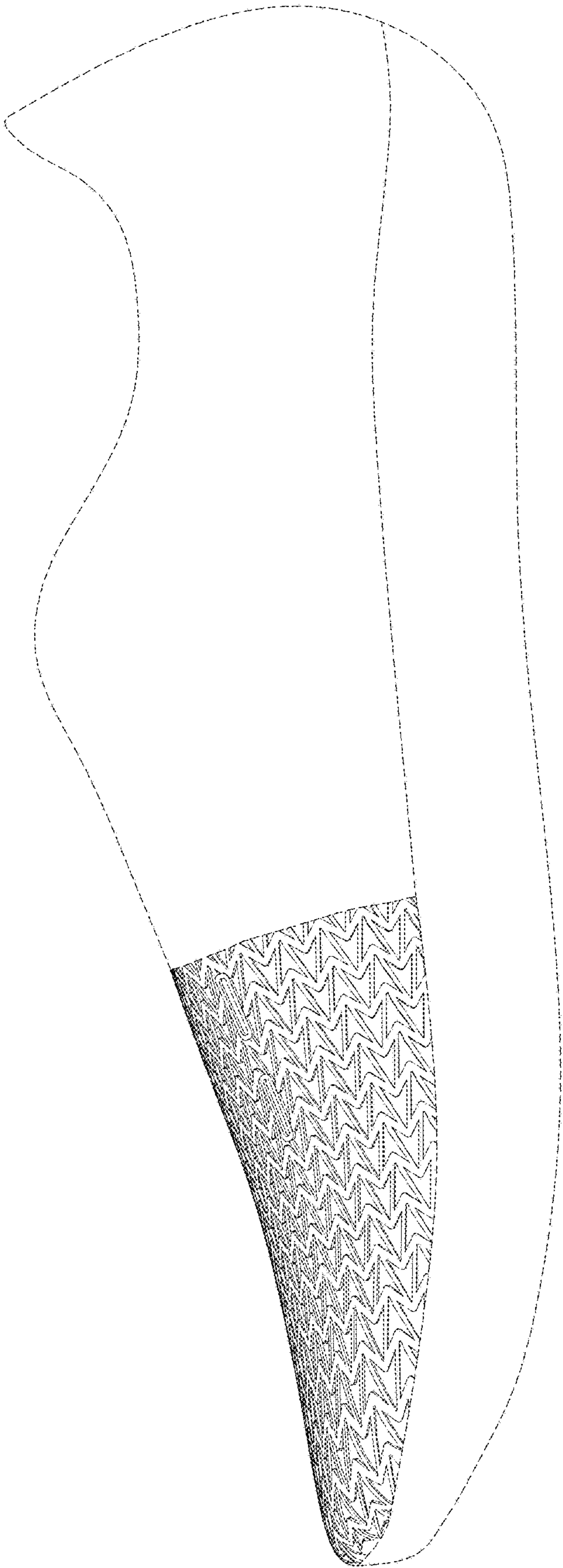

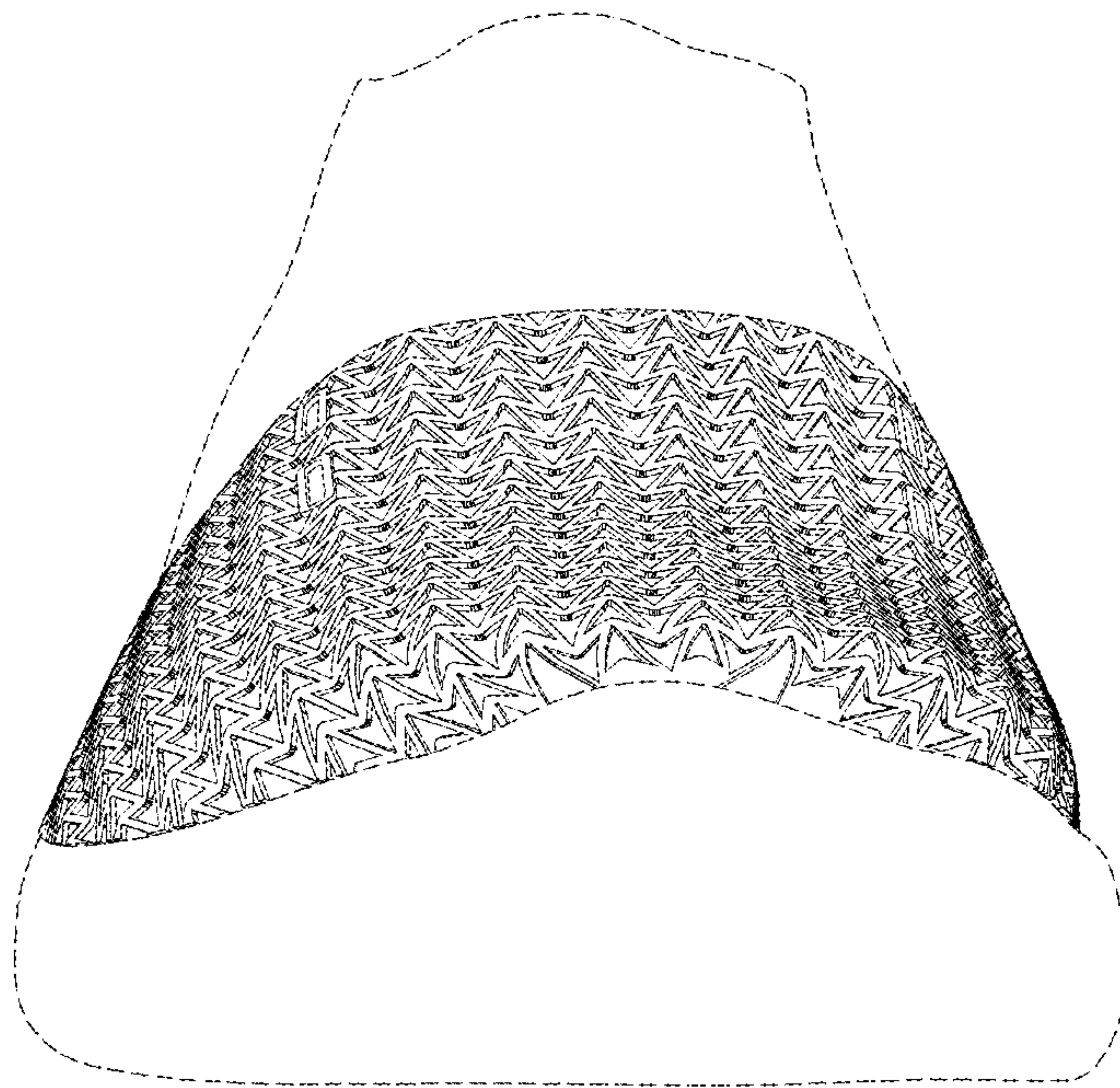

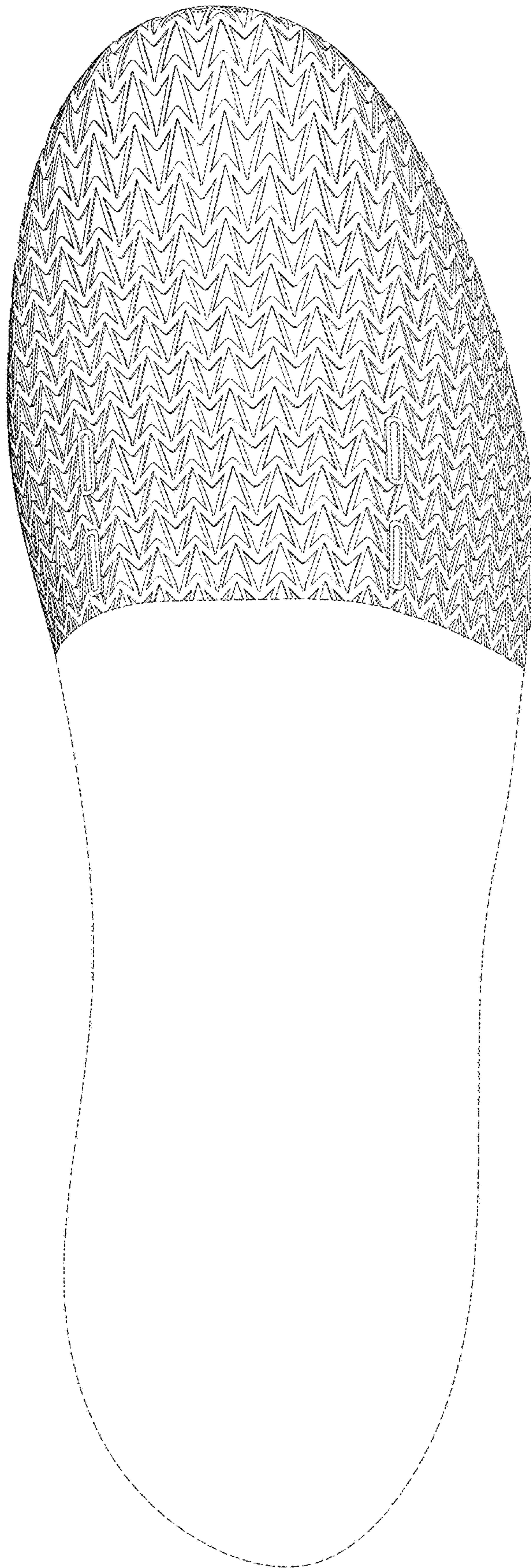
