embodiment of my new design;

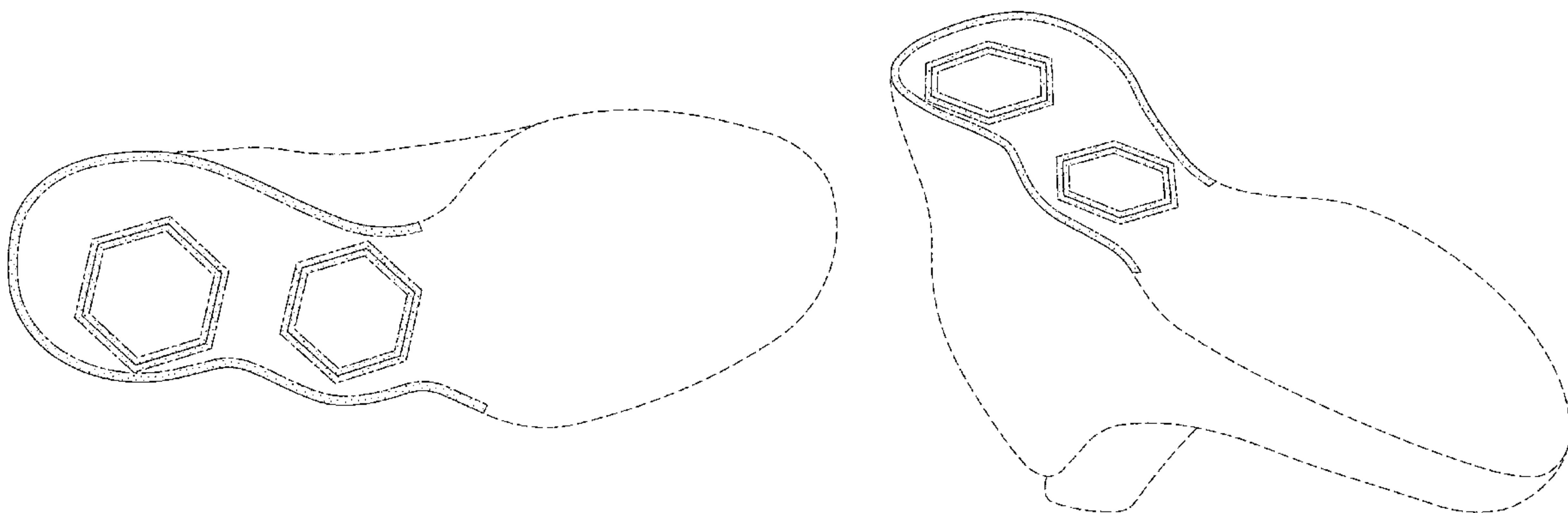
FIG. 2 is a first perspective view thereof; and,

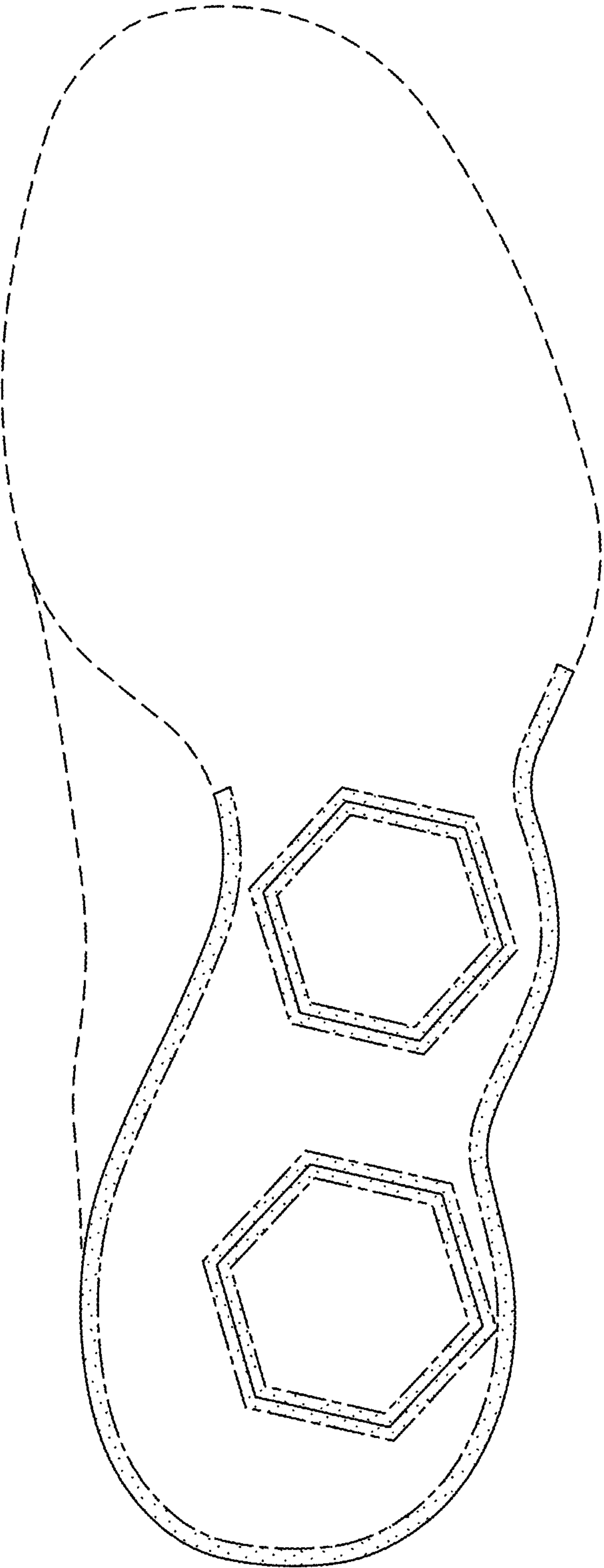

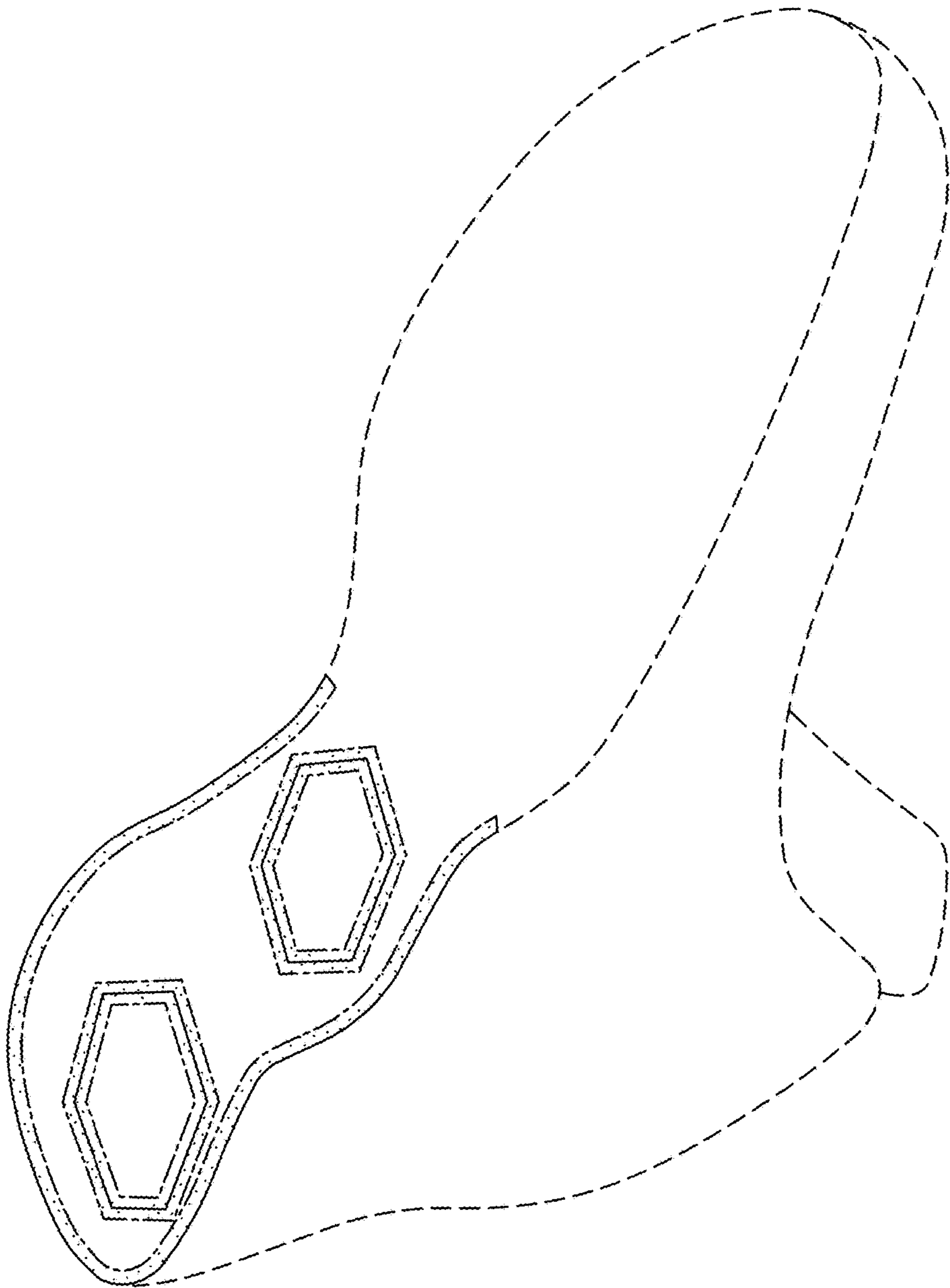

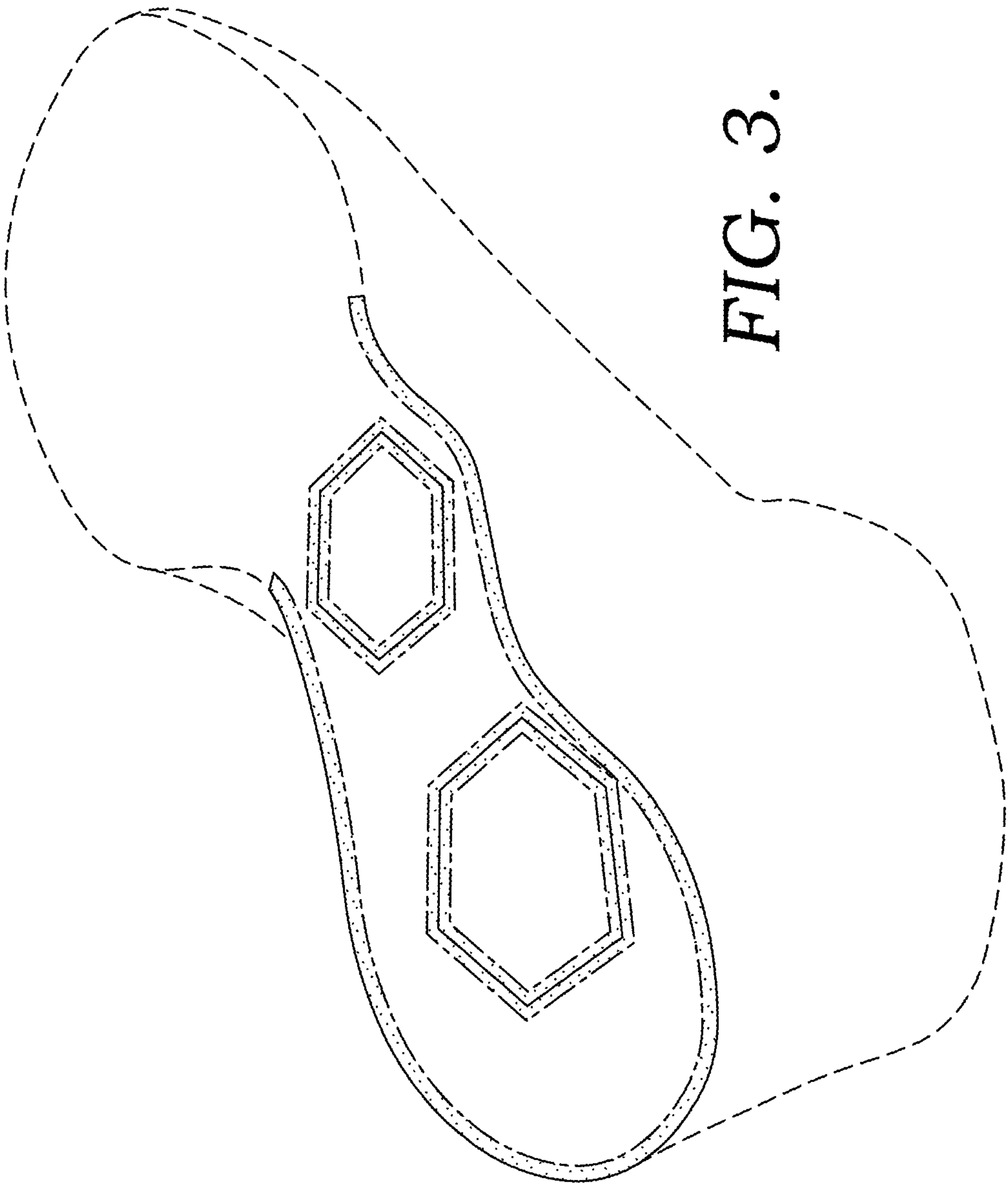
