described.

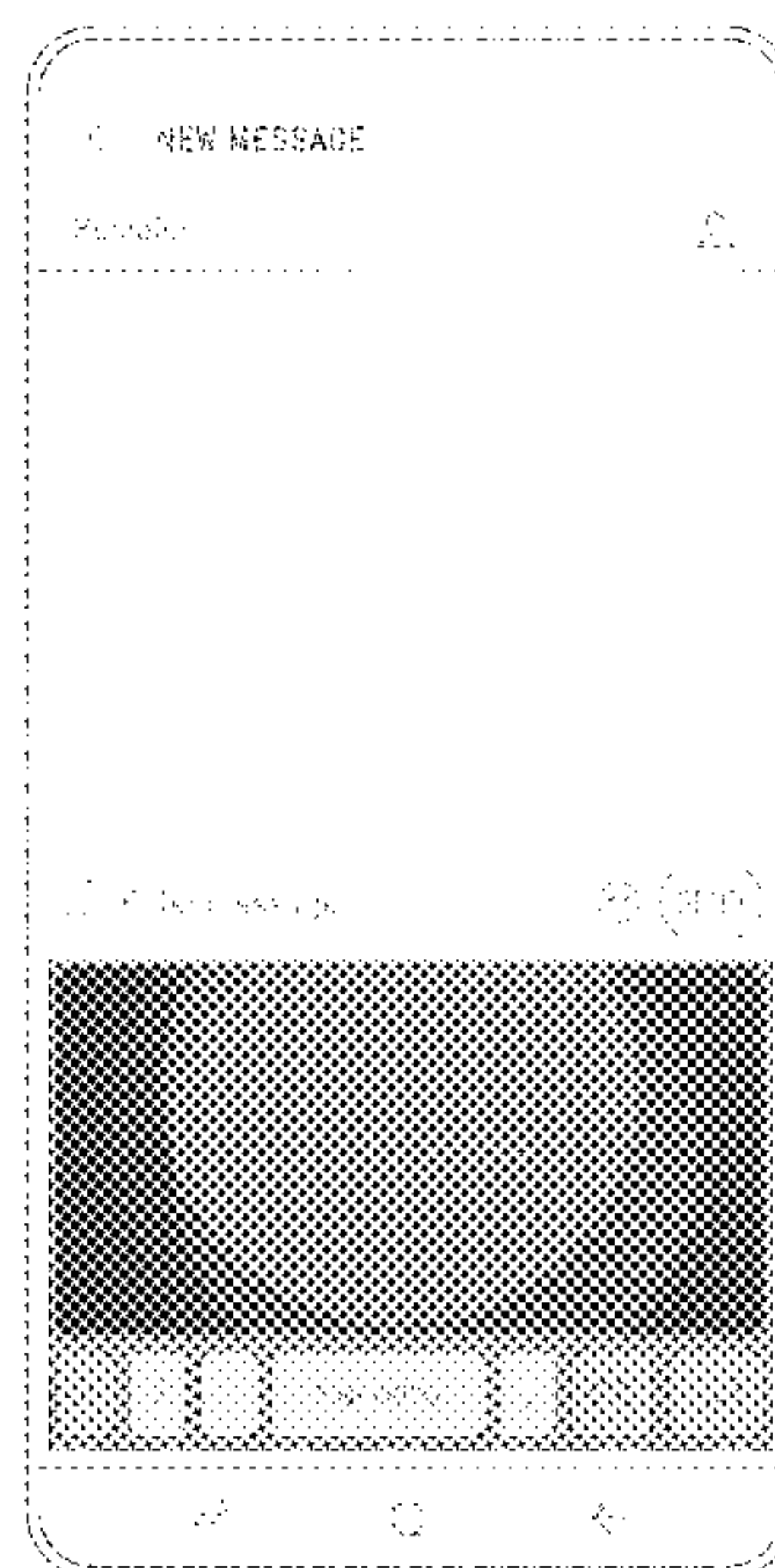
DESCRIPTION
