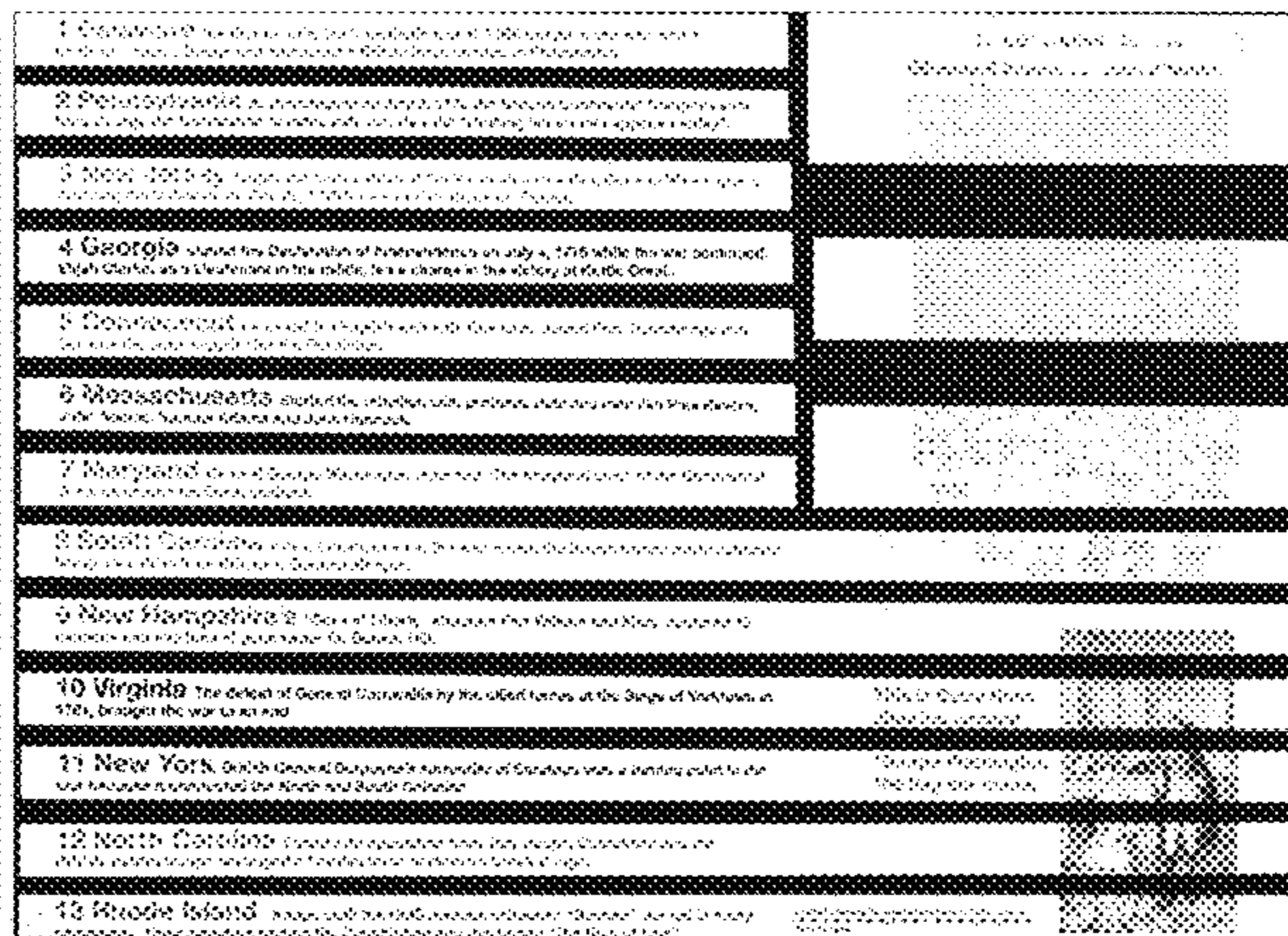
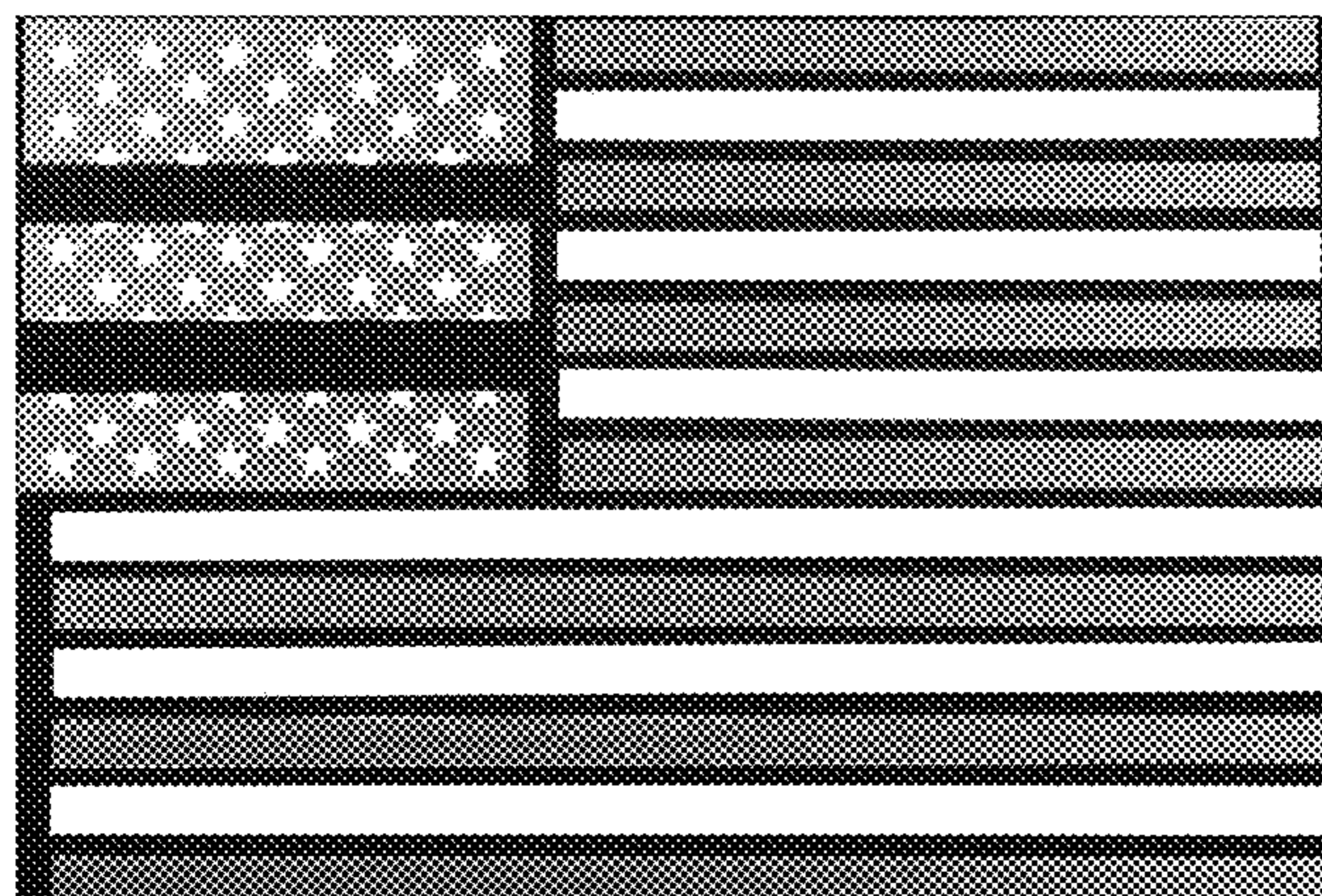
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for the flag puzzle, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top view of a flag puzzle showing my new design with its pieces in an assembled state;
FIG. 2 is a top view showing the design with its pieces in a separate state;
FIG. 3 is a bottom view of FIG. 1; and,
FIG. 4 is a bottom view of FIG. 2.
The black background is for the purpose of visibility of the puzzle and forms no part of the claimed design.

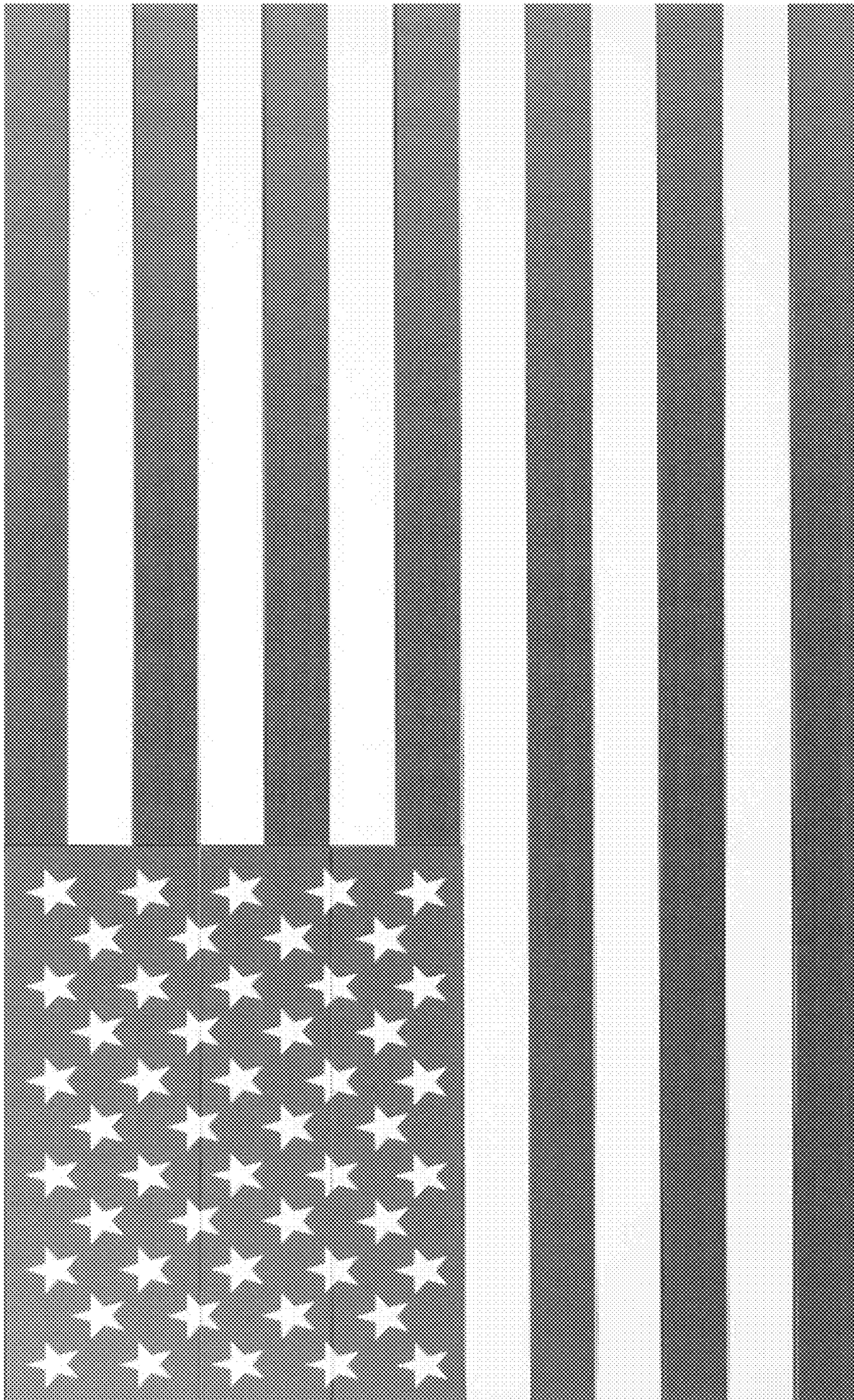

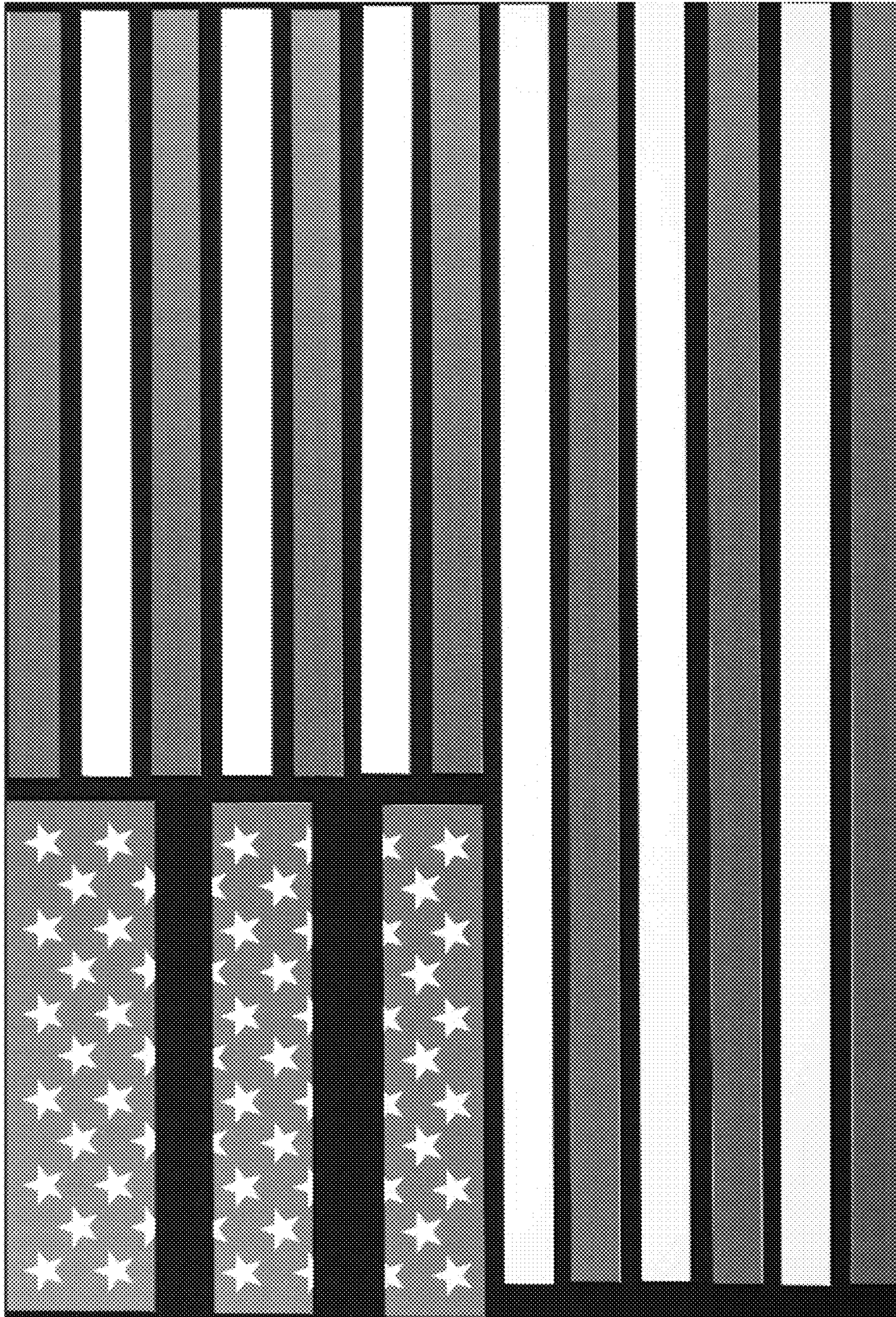
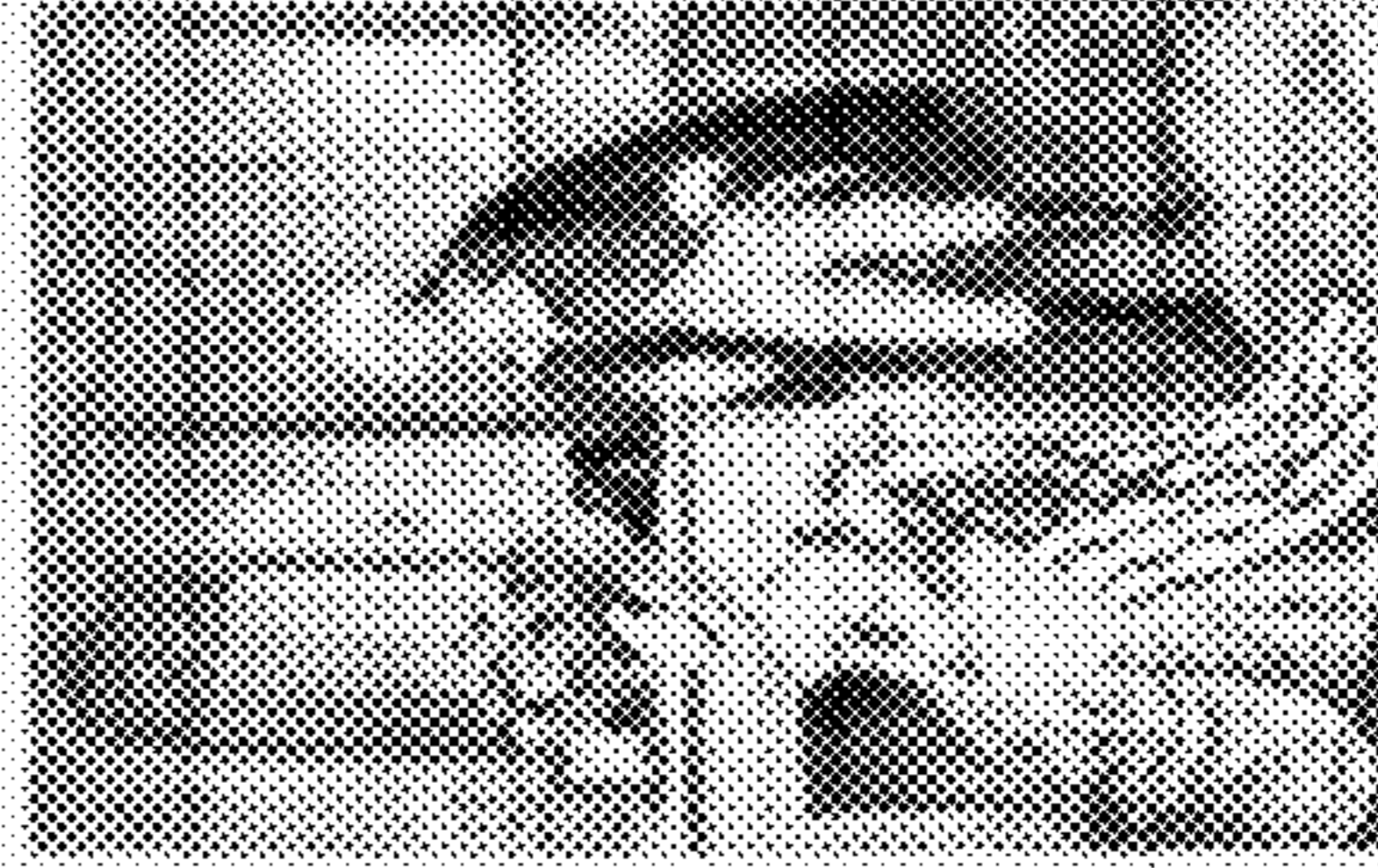
