FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof.

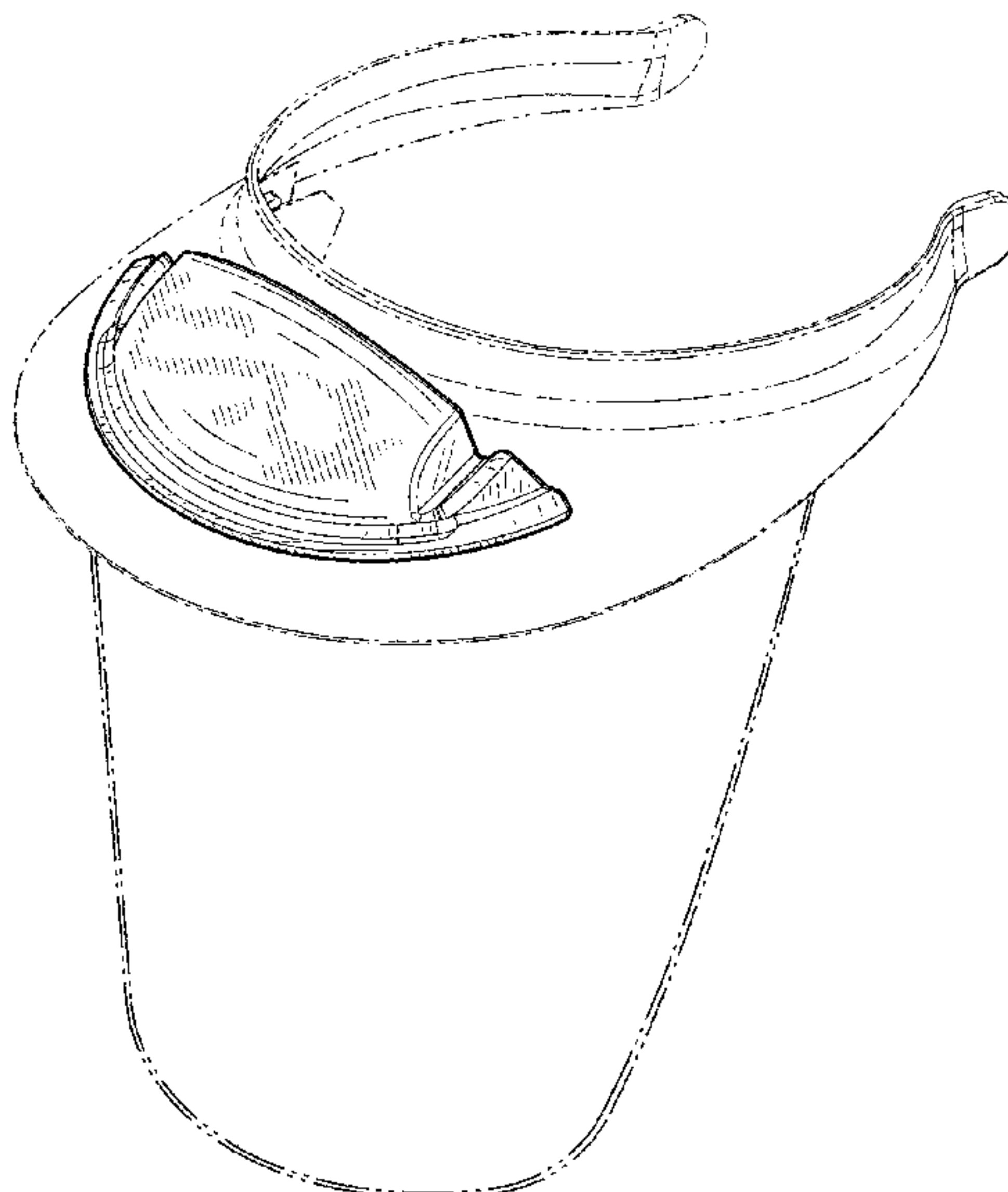
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof, the right side being a mirror image.

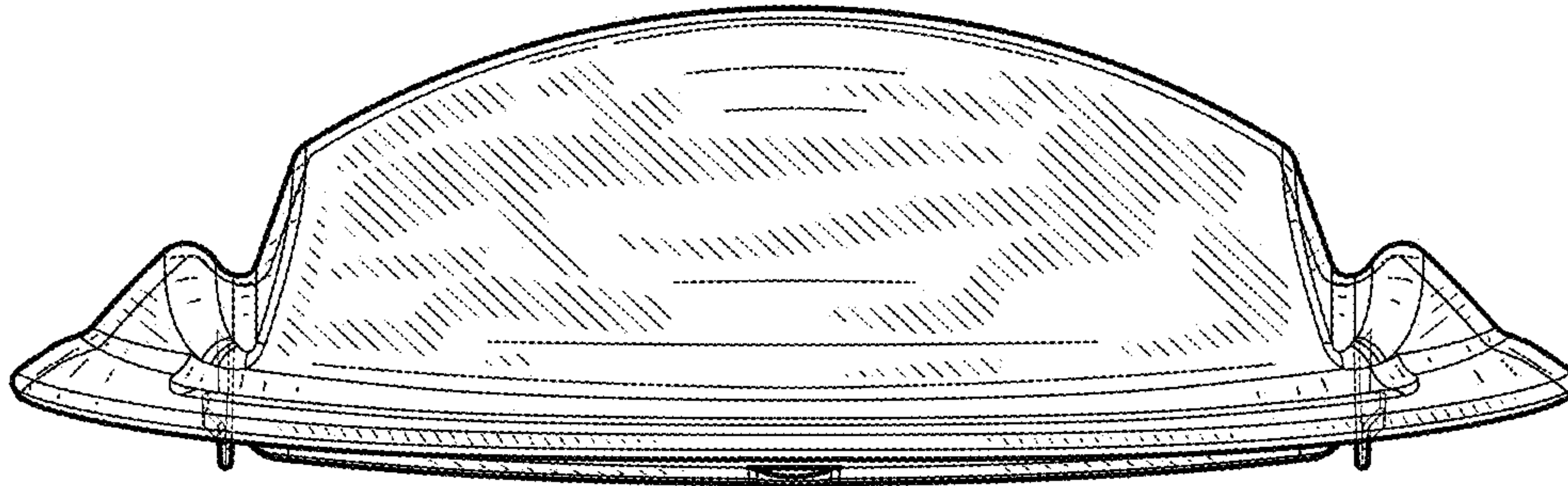

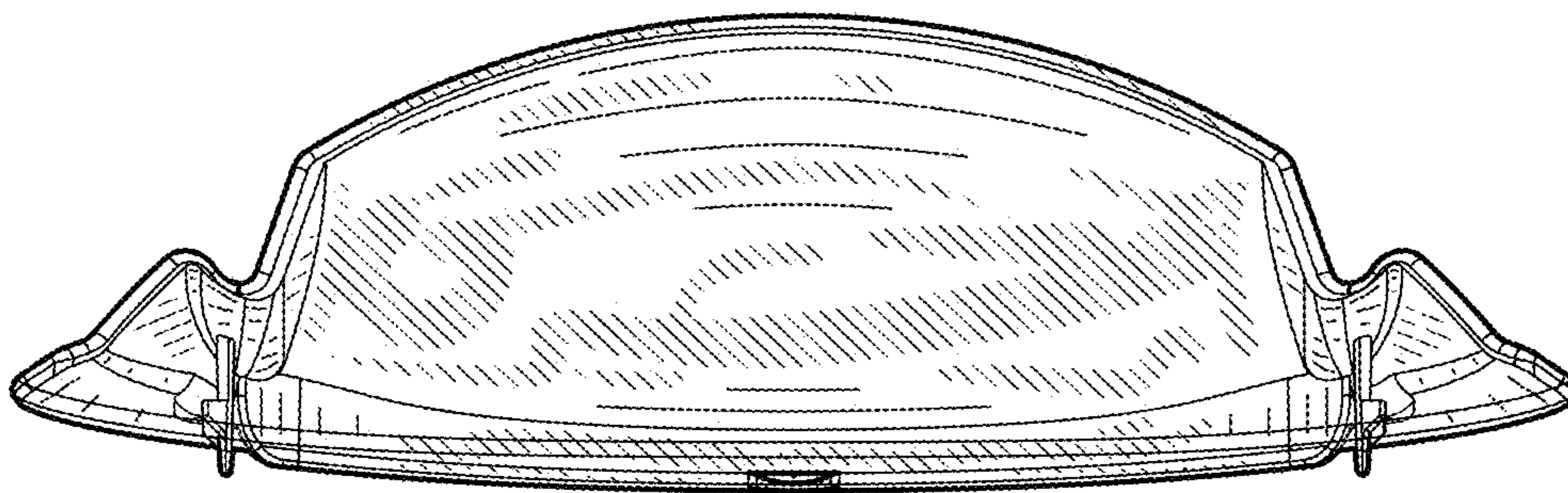

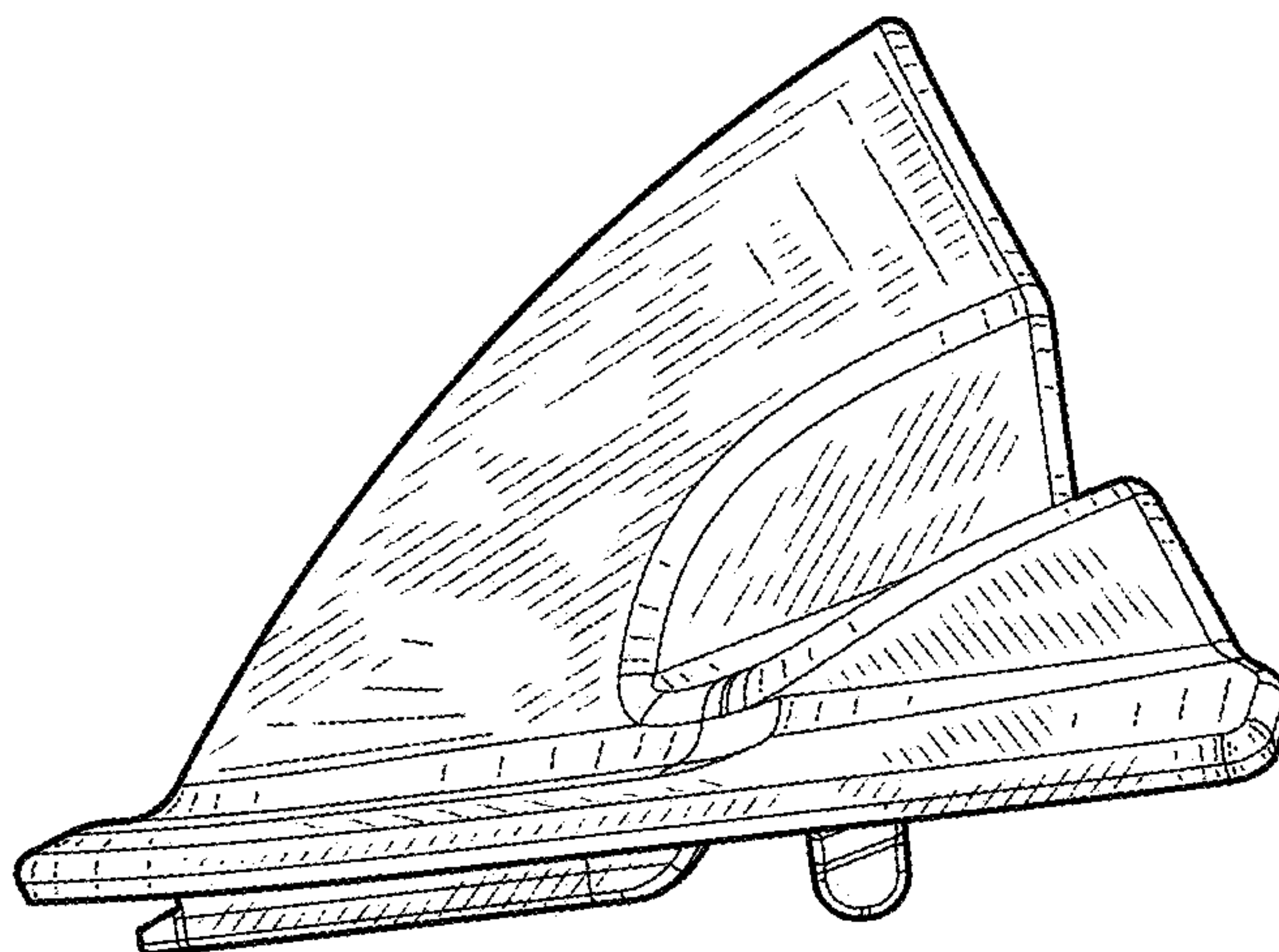

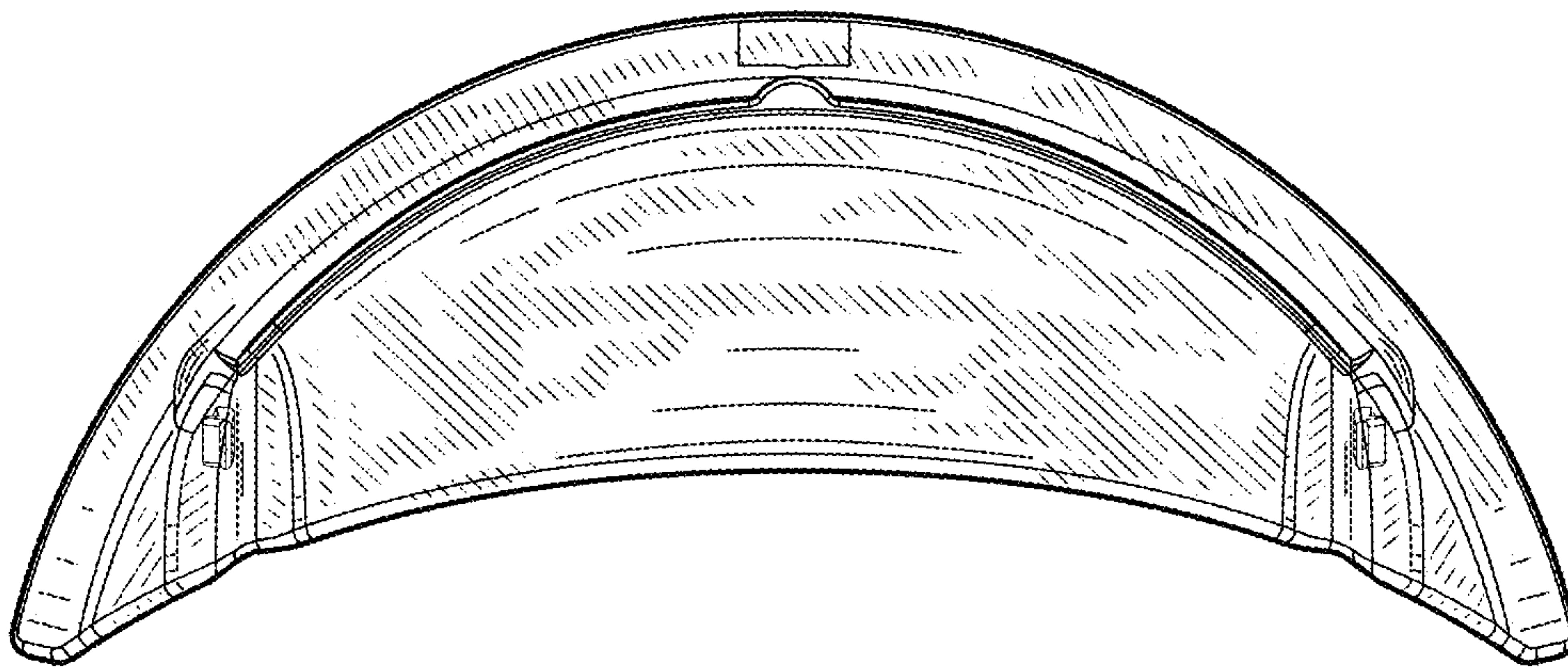

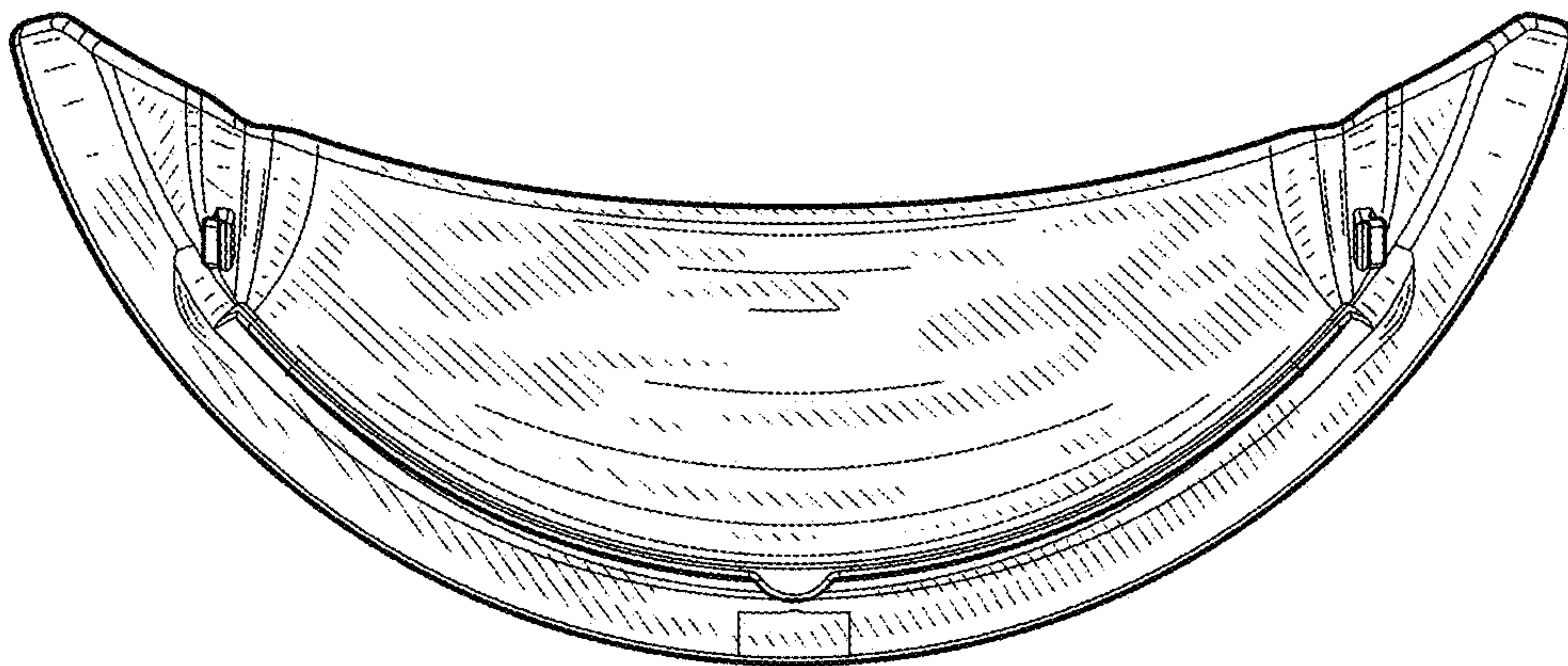
