(57)CLAIM

The ornamental design for a shoe, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION


FIG. 1 is a side view of a shoe showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front perspective view thereof; and,

FIG. 3 is a rear perspective view thereof.

The uneven-length broken lines immediately adjacent to the shaded area define the bounds of the claimed design and form no part thereof. The even-length broken lines within the shaded area represent stitching which forms no part of the claimed design. The uneven-length broken line figureeight shaped region within the shaded area represents a lacing element which forms no part of the claimed design. The unshaded areas within the five circular eyelet elements form no part of the claimed design. The uneven-length broken lines depicting the remainder of the shoe show features that form no part of the claimed design.
