DESCRIPTION

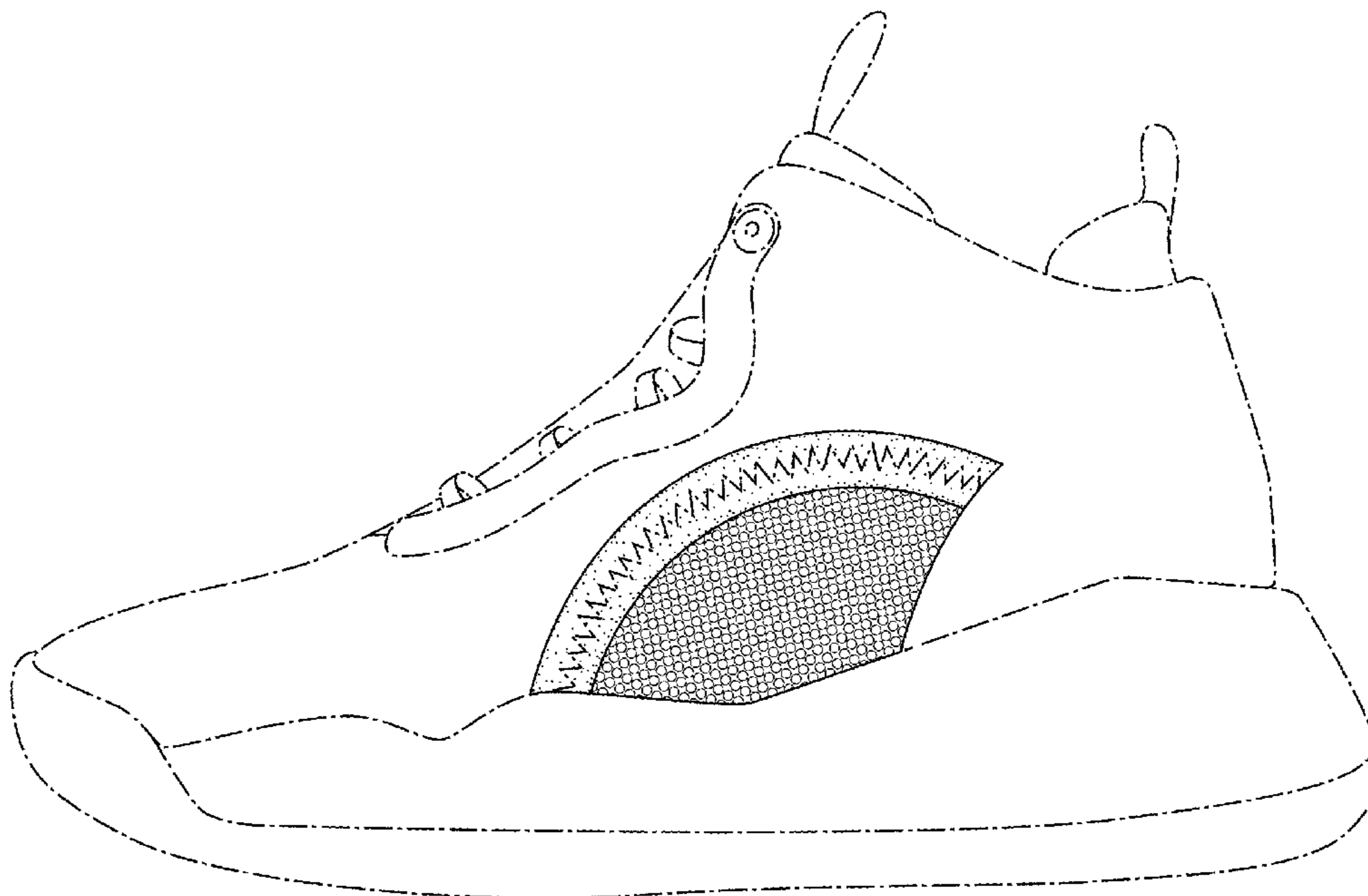
FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a shoe showing my new design;

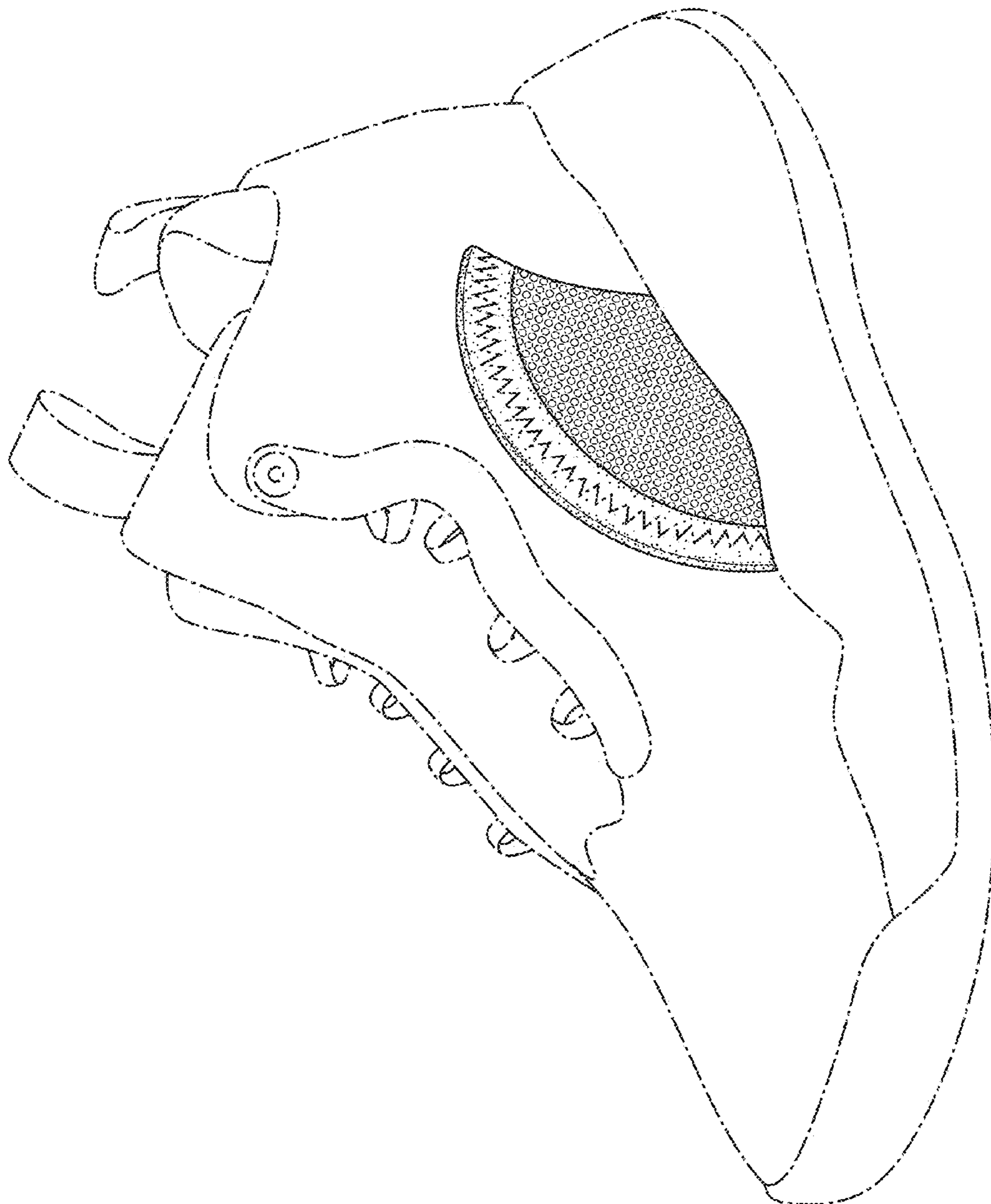

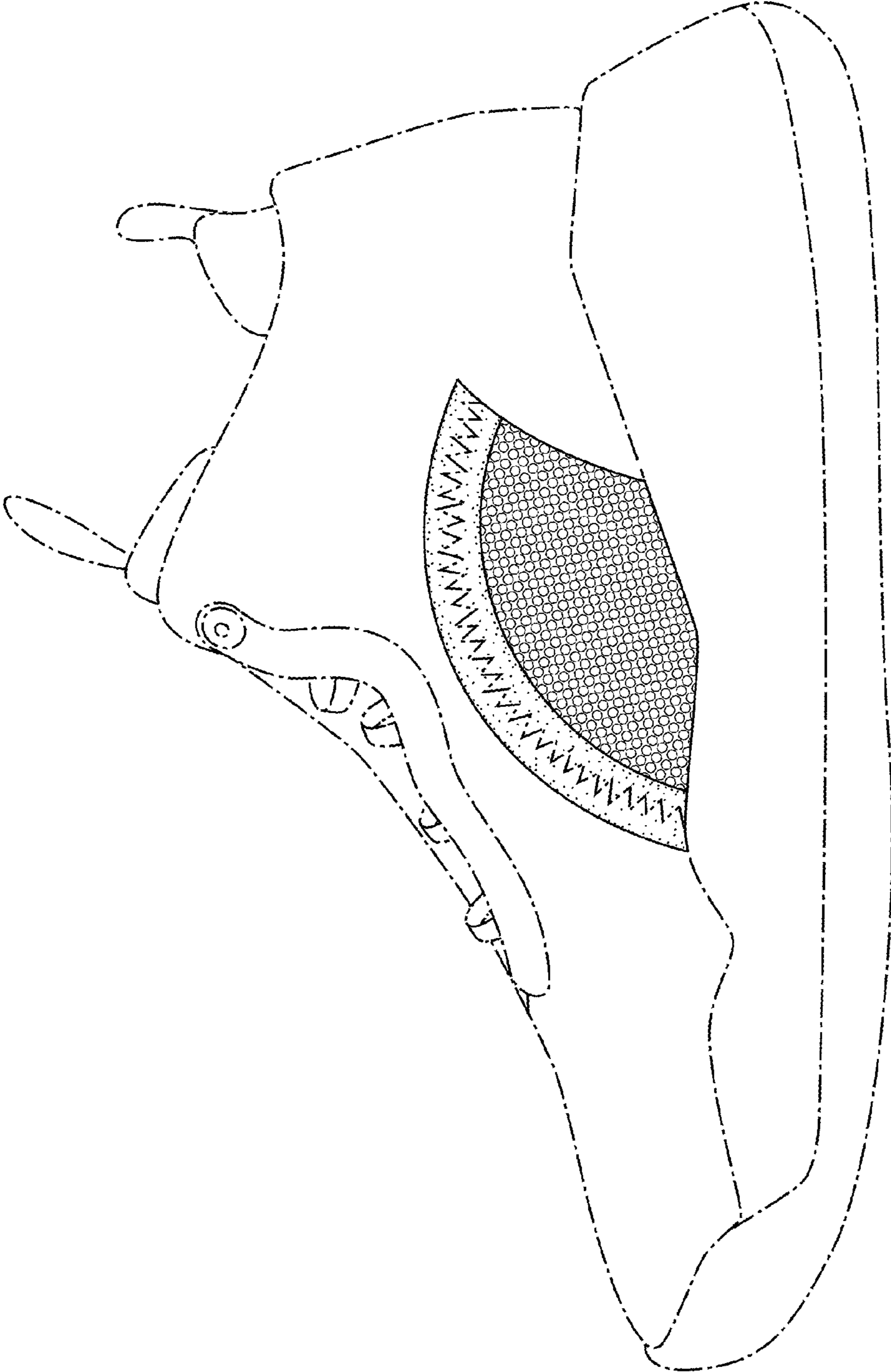

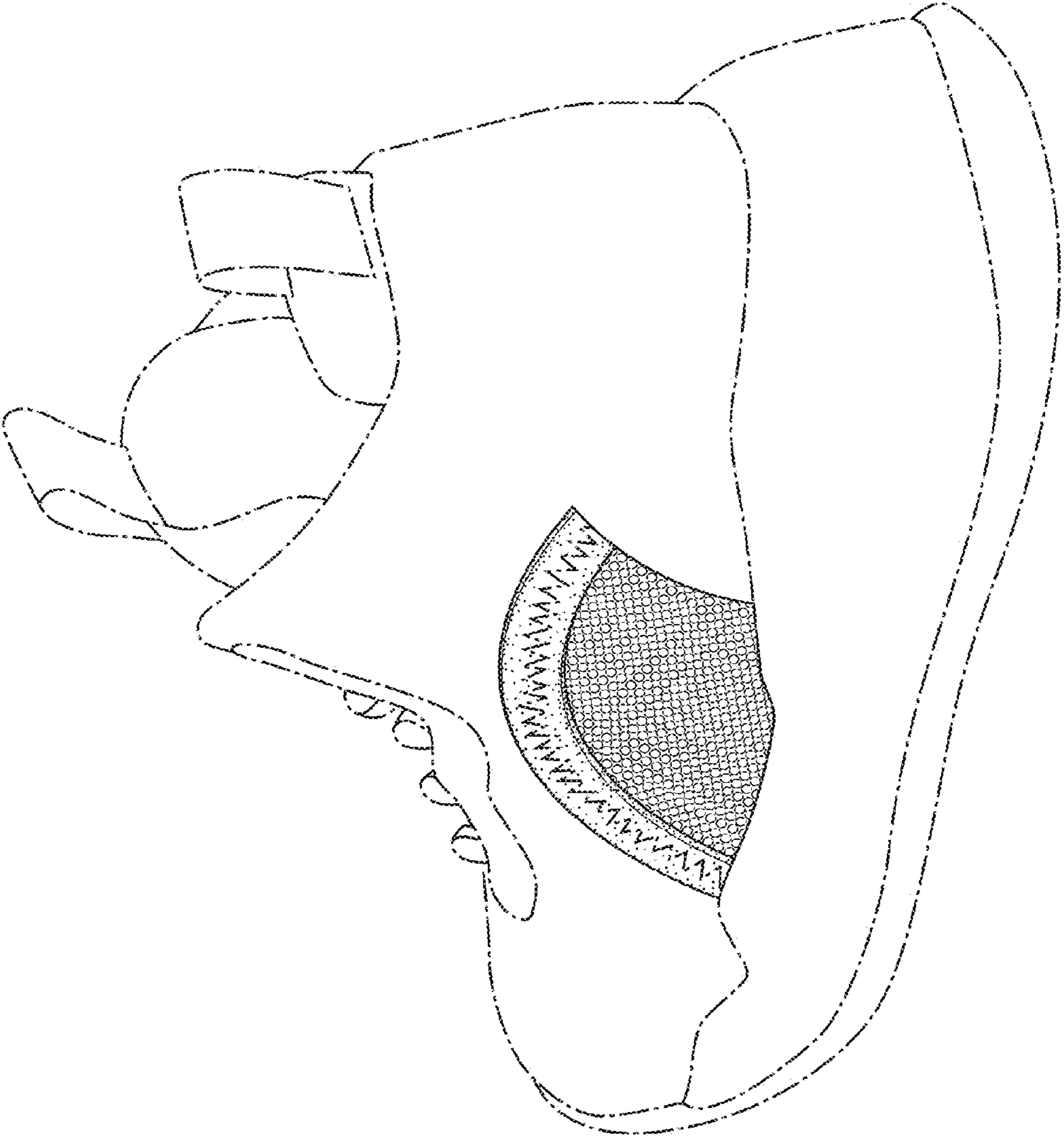
