DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a handlebar;

FIG. 2 is a front elevation view of the handlebar illustrated in FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevation view of the handlebar illustrated in FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a left side elevation view of the handlebar illustrated in FIG. 1;

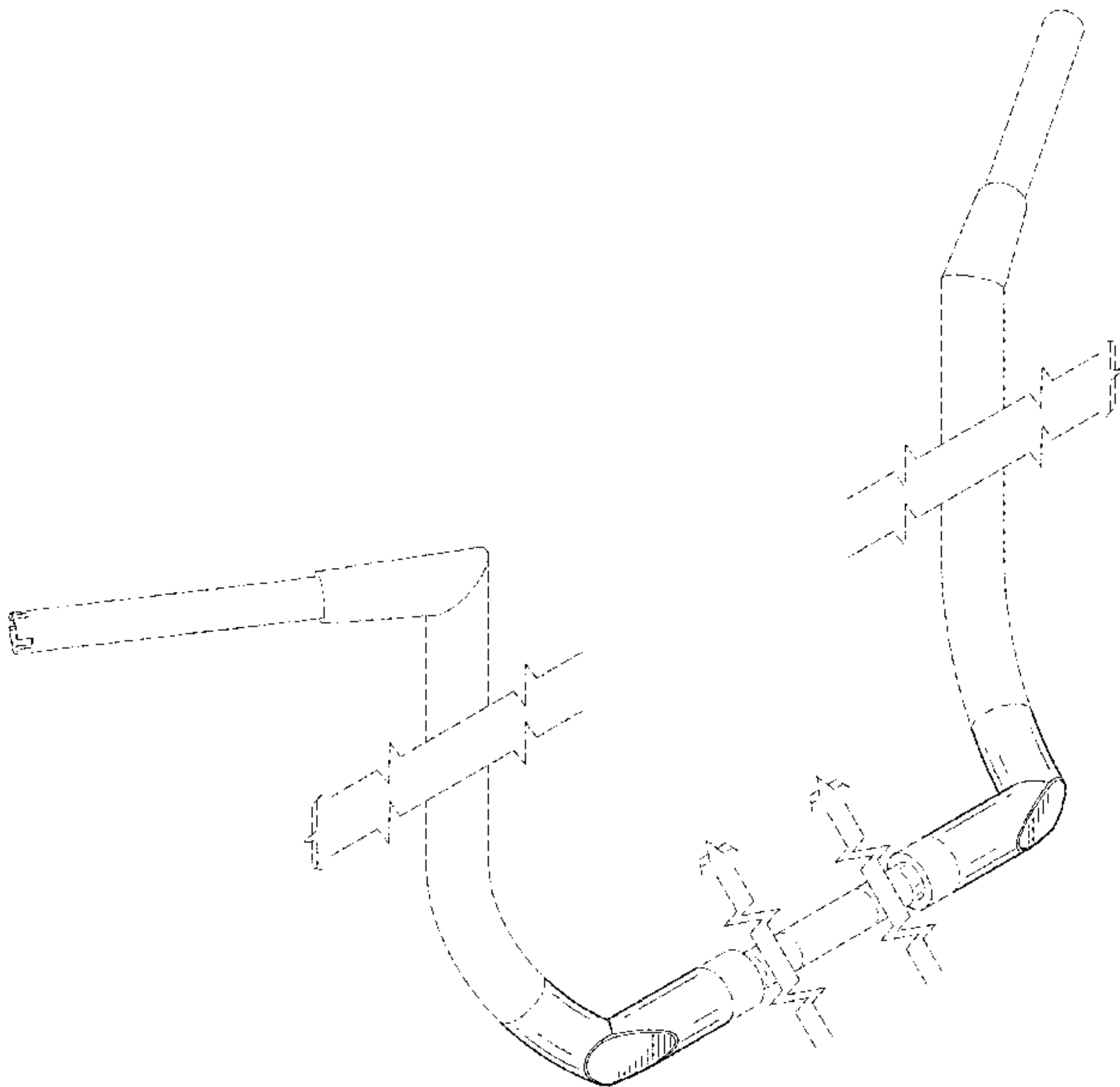
FIG. 5 is a right side elevation view of the handlebar illustrated in FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the handlebar illustrated in FIG. 1; and,

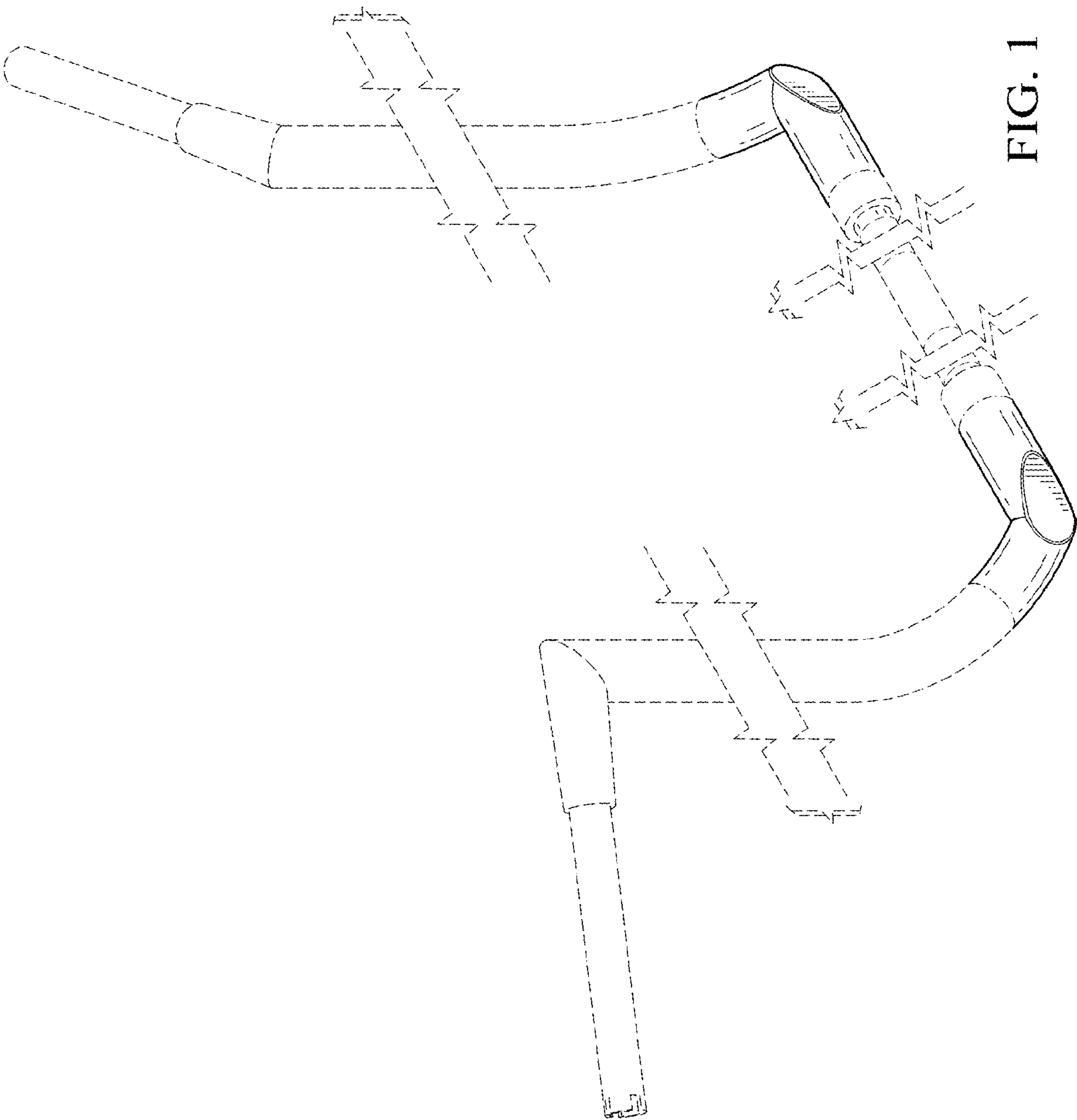
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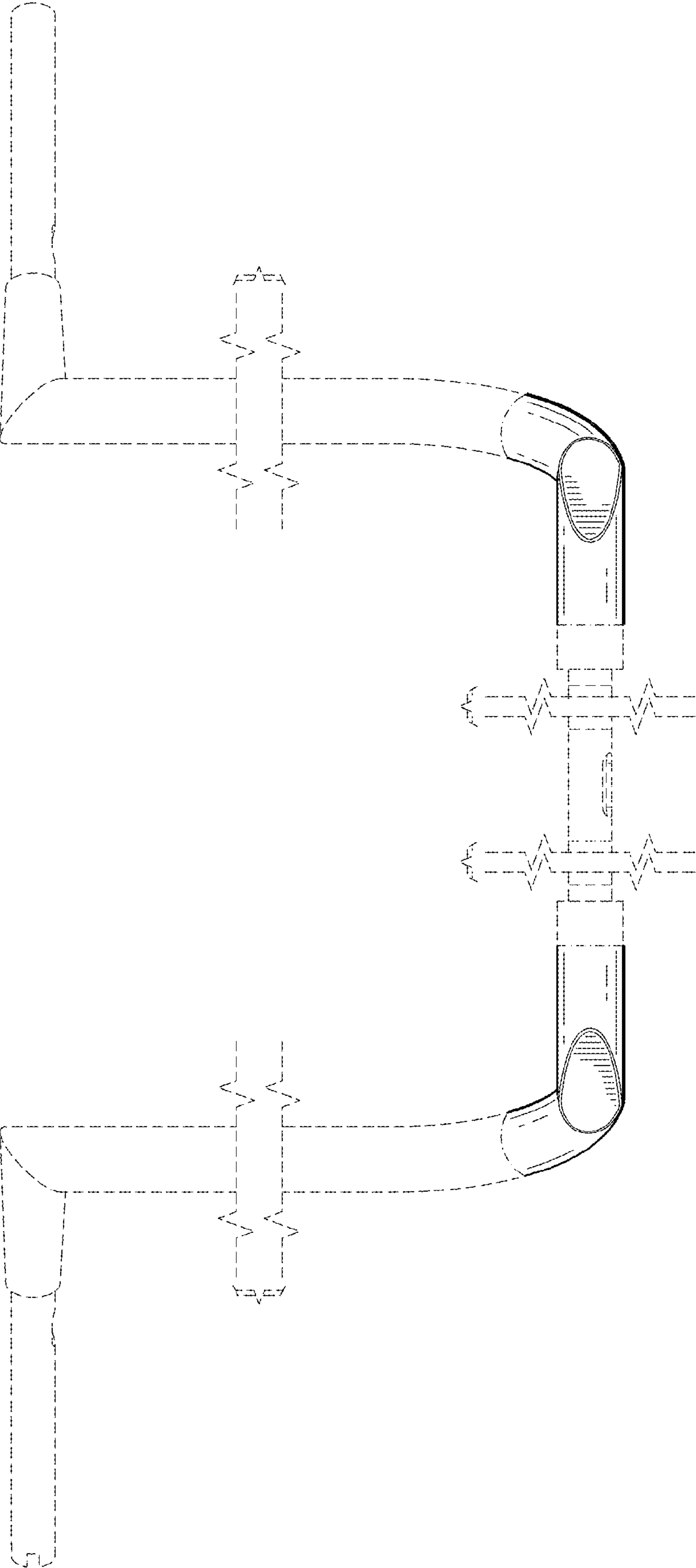

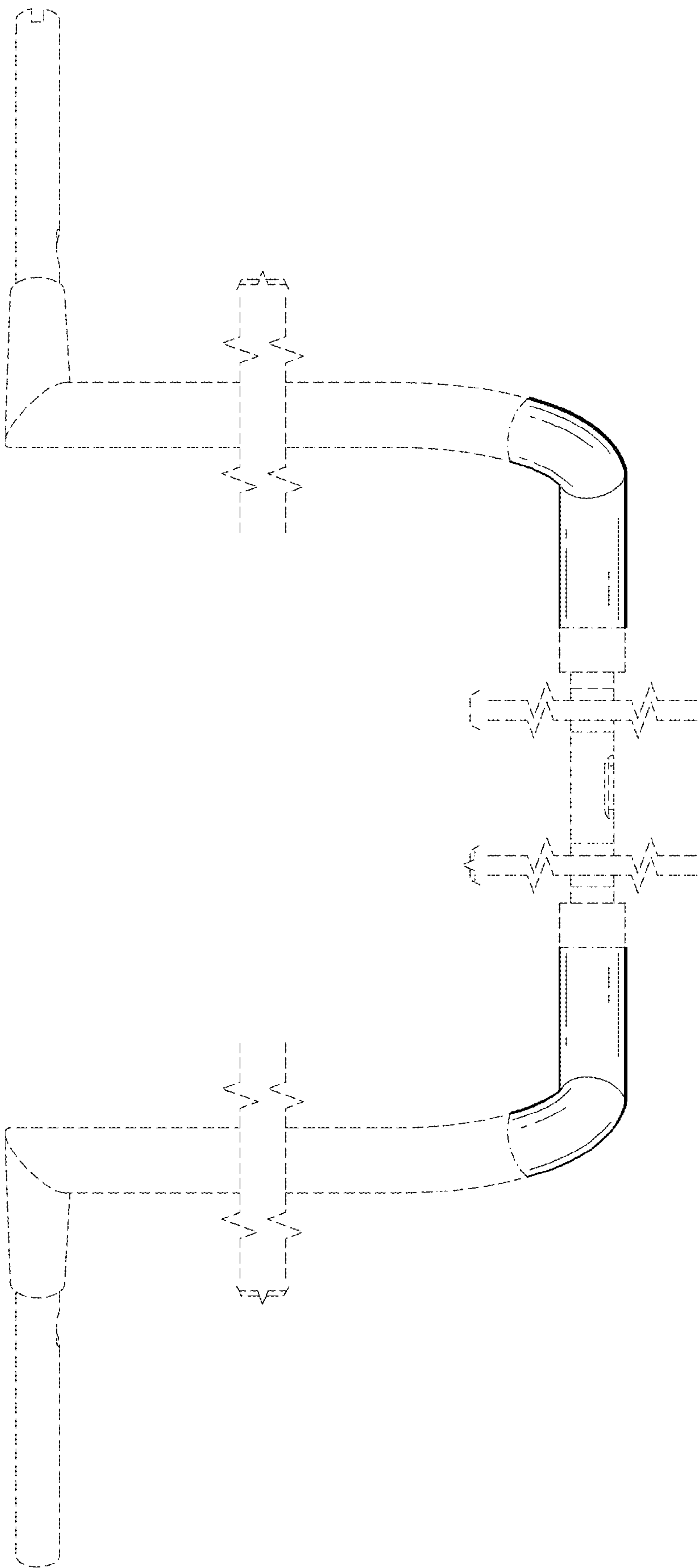

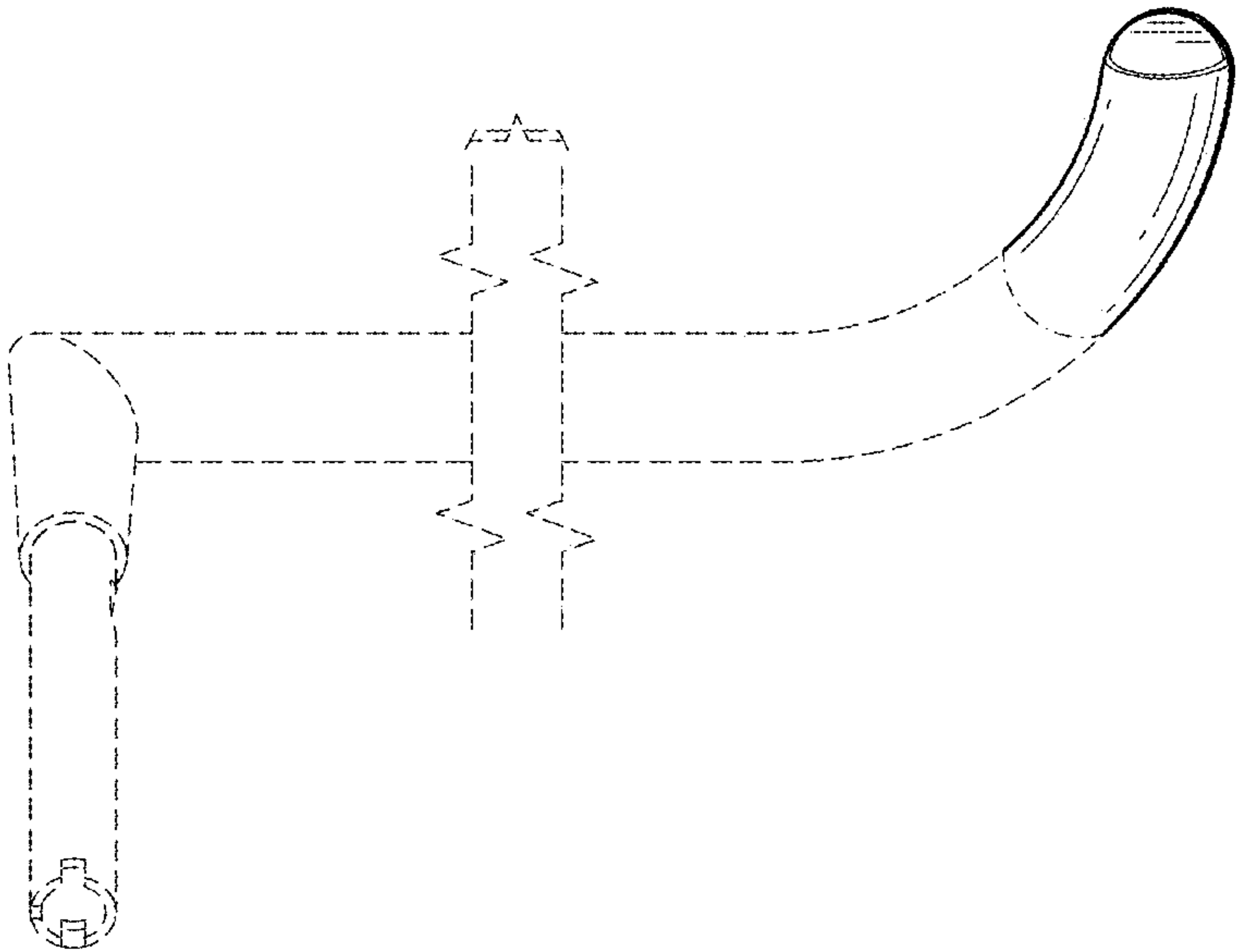

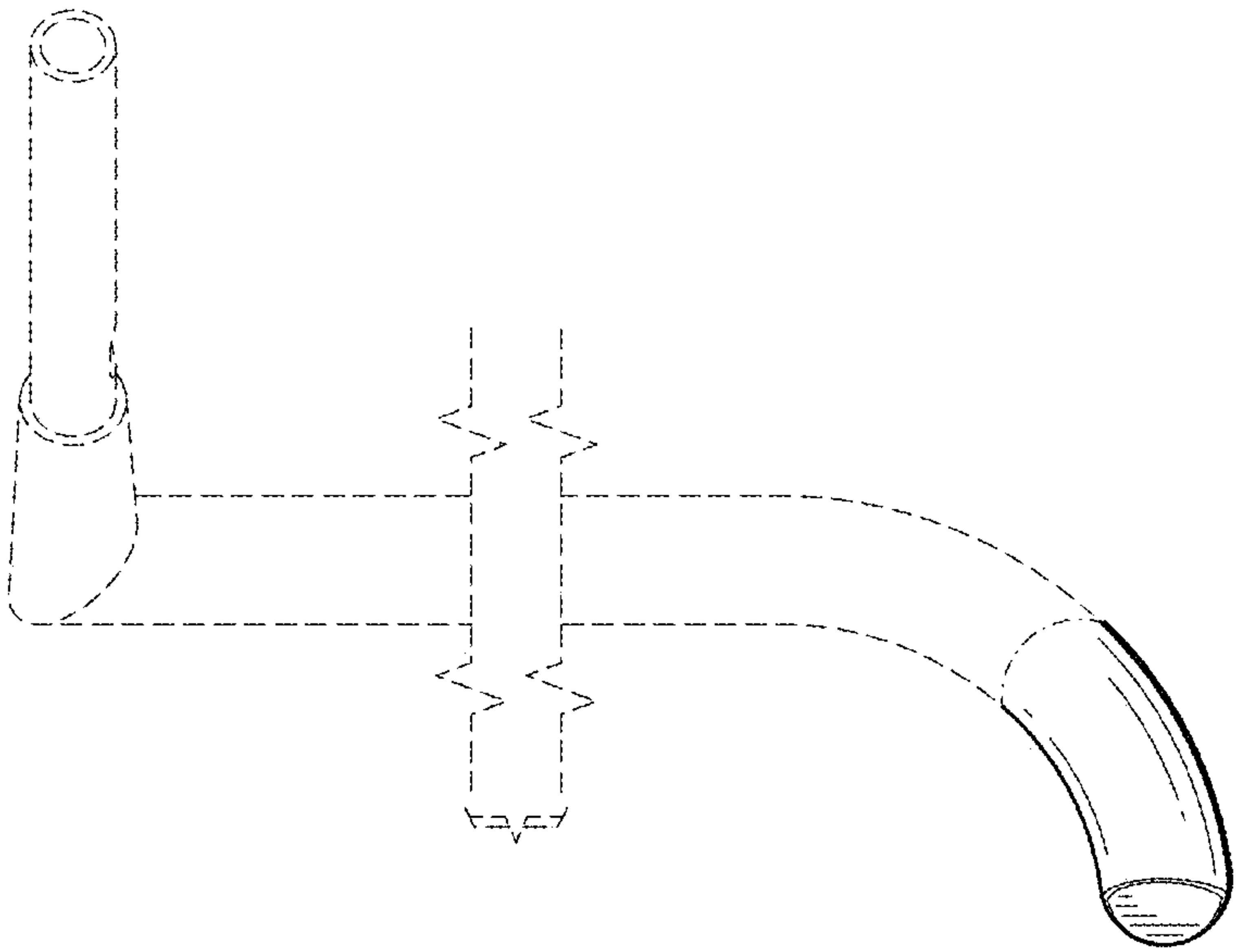

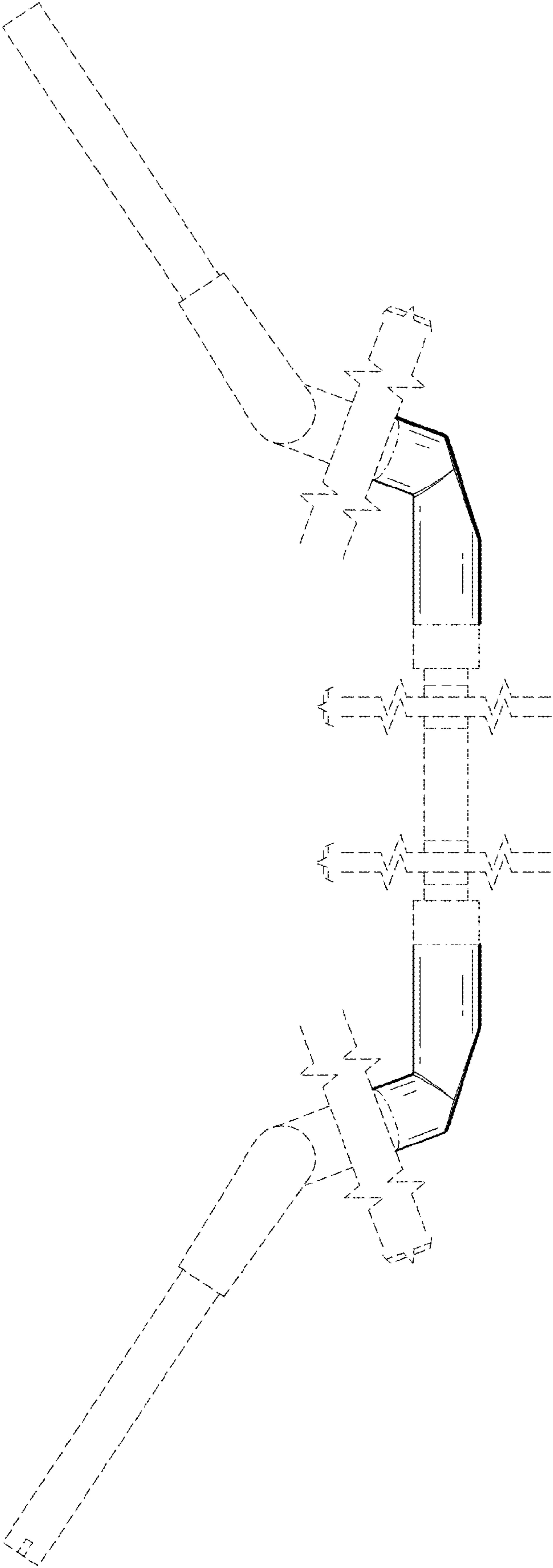

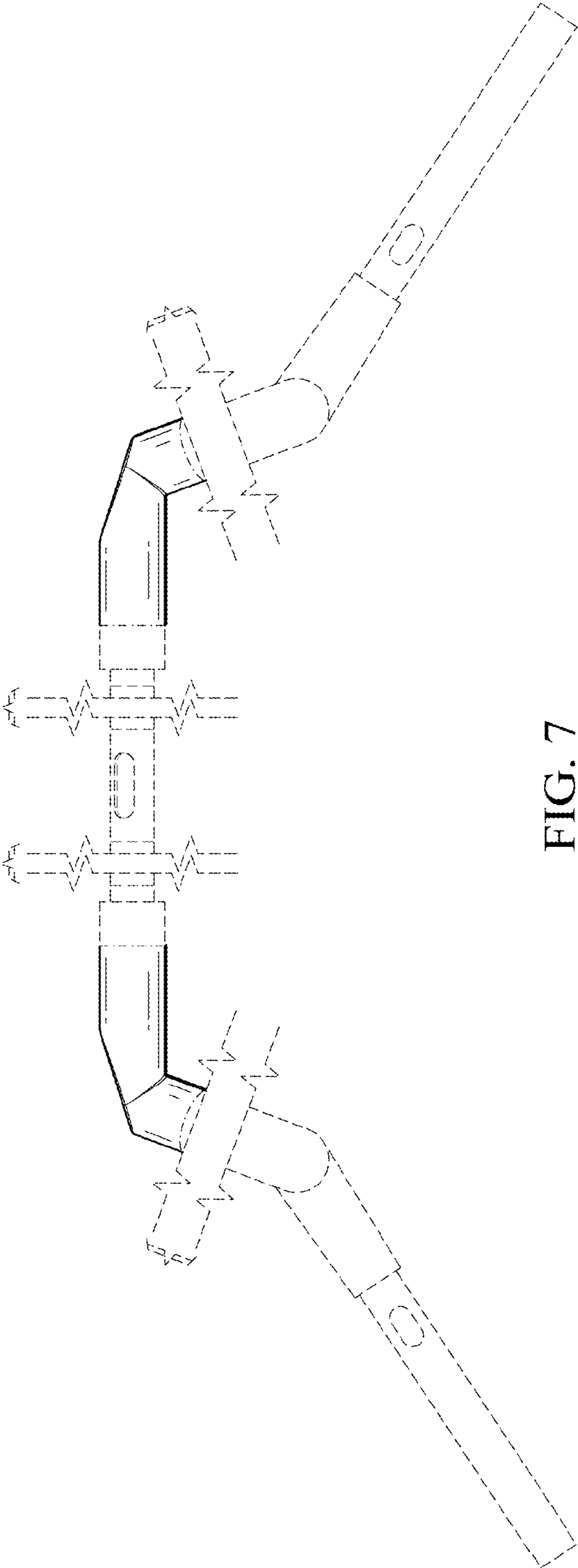
