FIG. 1 is an upper perspective view of a craft platform;
FIG. 2 is a lower perspective view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a front elevation view thereof, with the rear, left, and right views being identical;
FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof;
FIG. 6 is an enlarged upper perspective view of the flower stem portion of the craft platform, shown separately for ease of disclosure;
FIG. 7 is an enlarged lower perspective view thereof;
FIG. 8 is another enlarged lower perspective view thereof, shown with the middle unclaimed section removed for ease of disclosure;
FIG. 9 is an enlarged side elevation view thereof, with all other side views being identical;

FIG. 11 is an enlarged bottom plan view thereof.

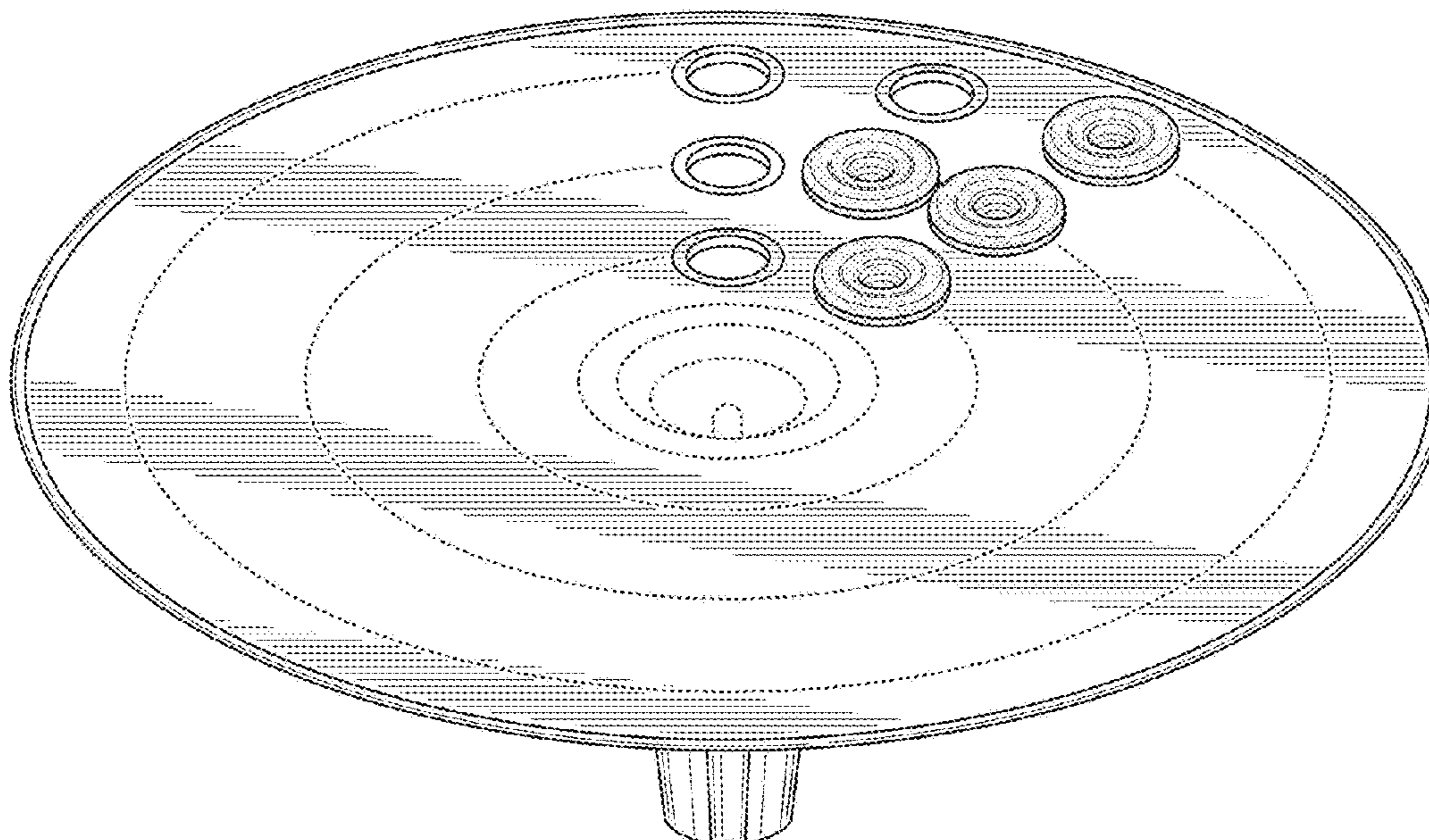

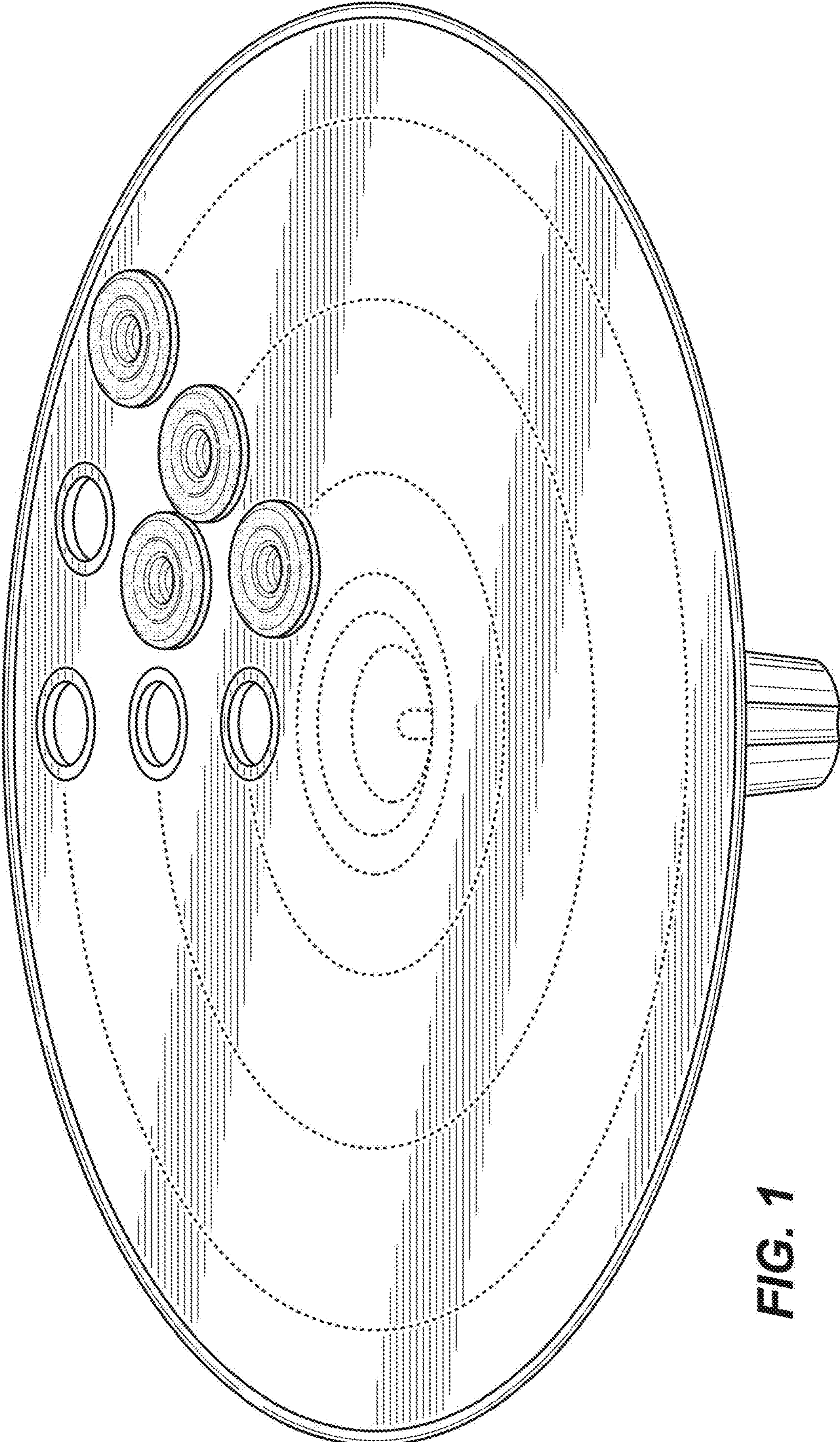

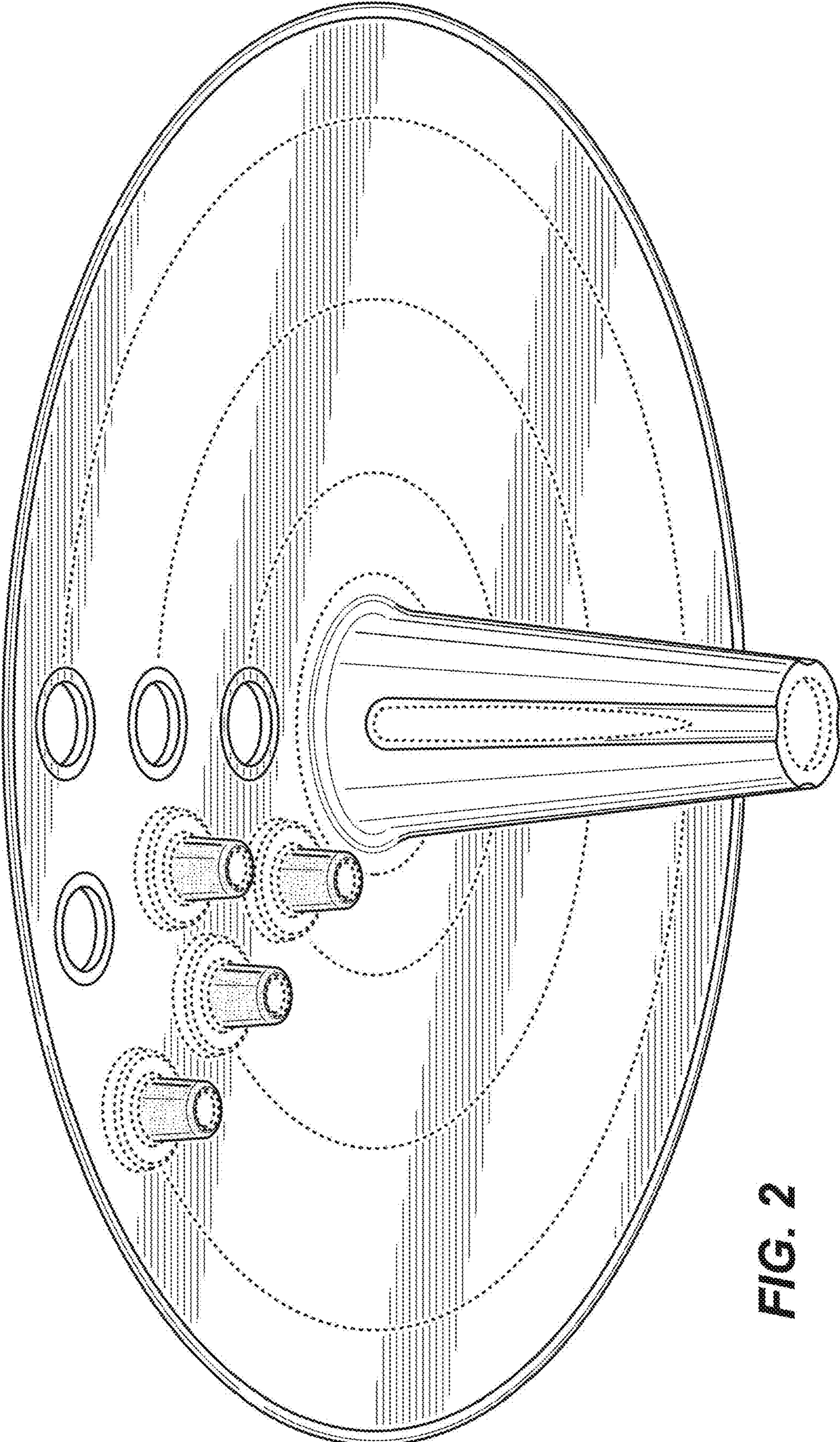

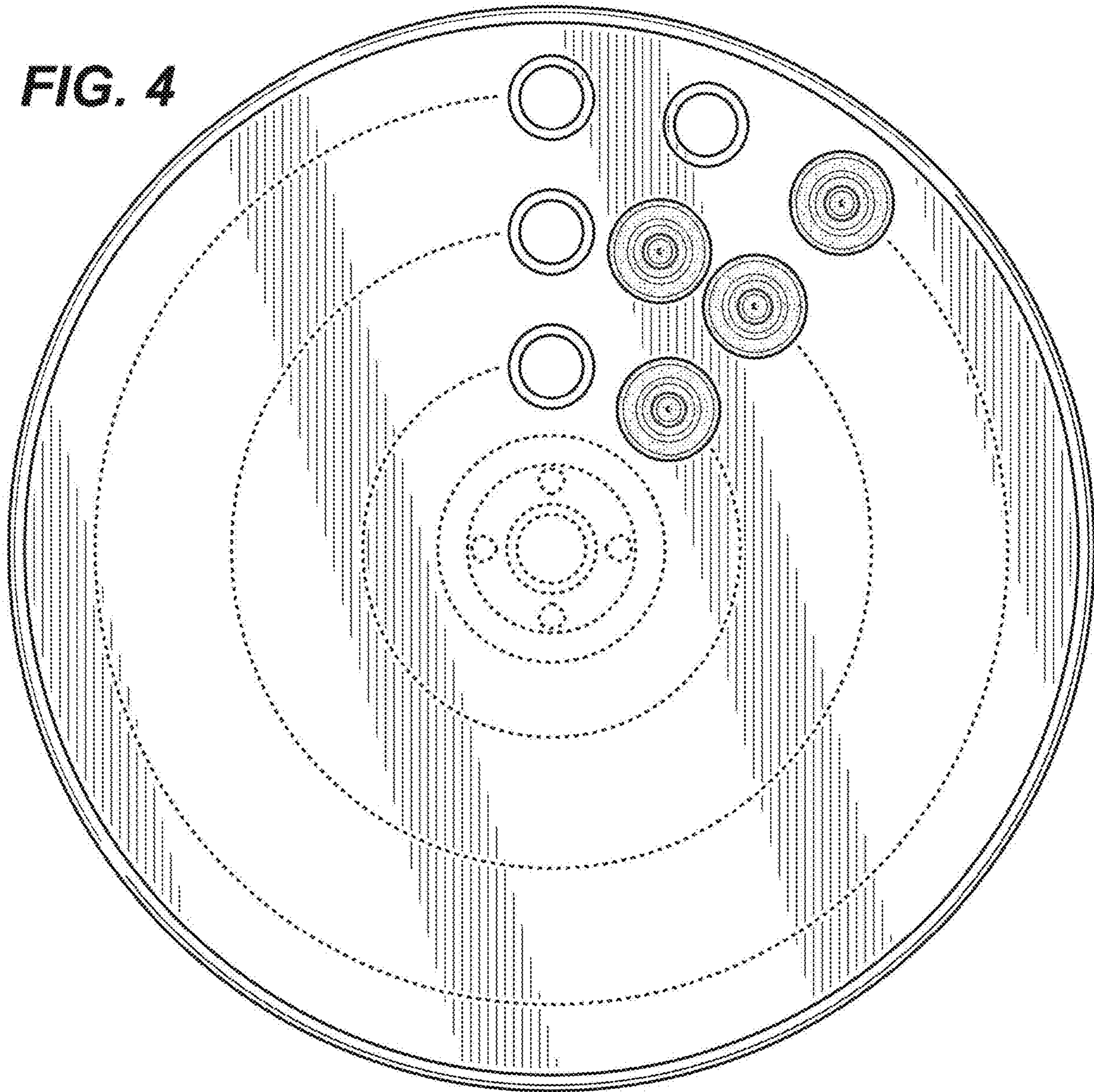

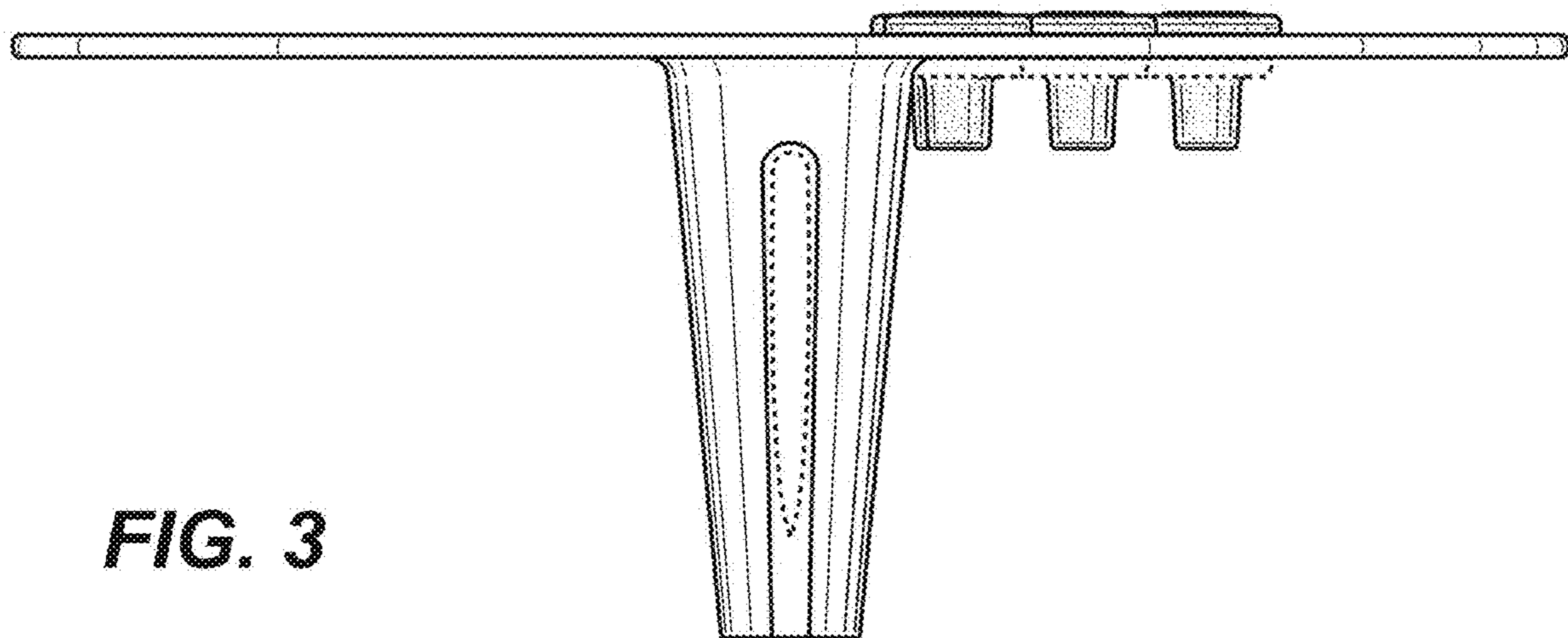

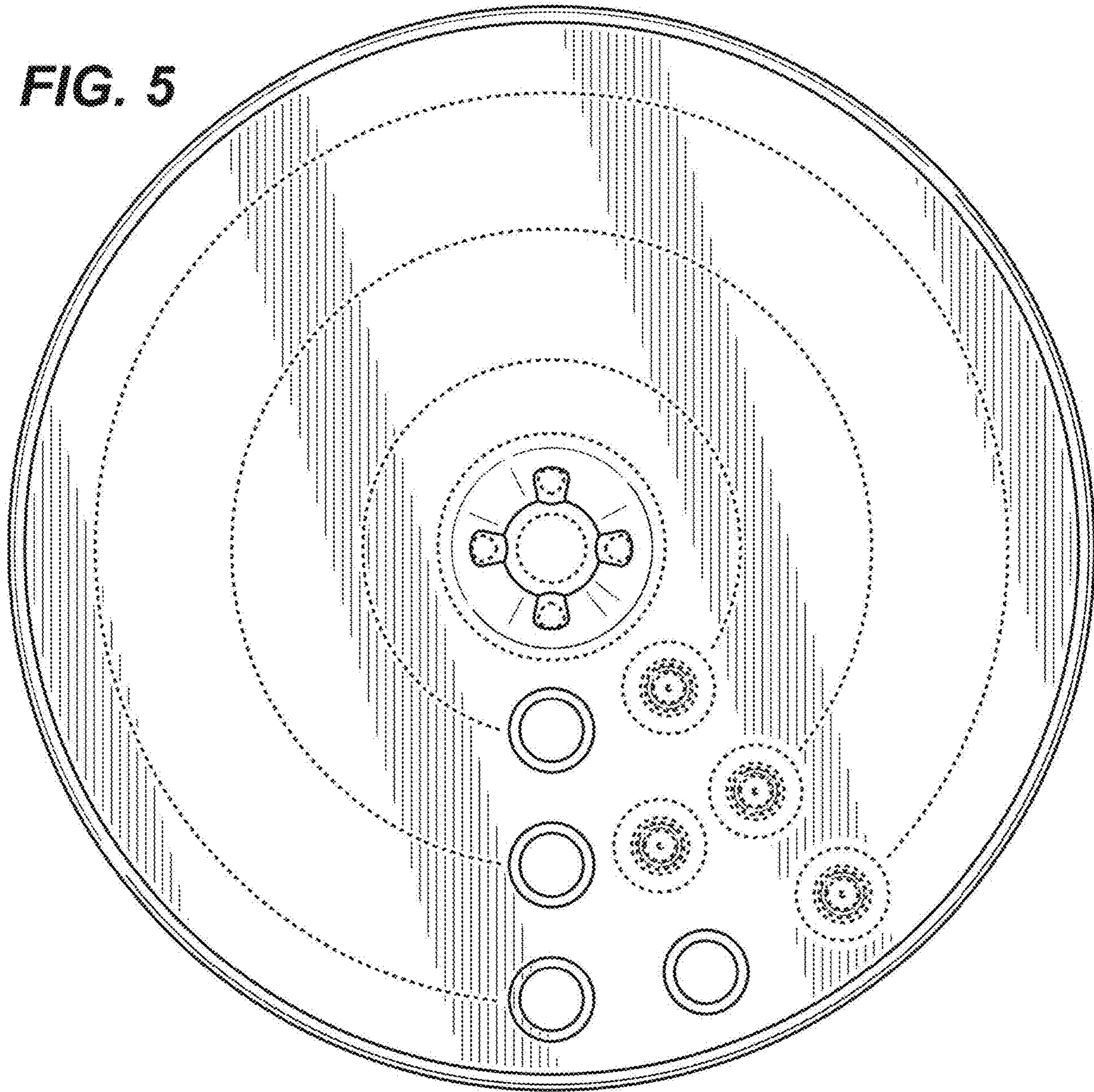

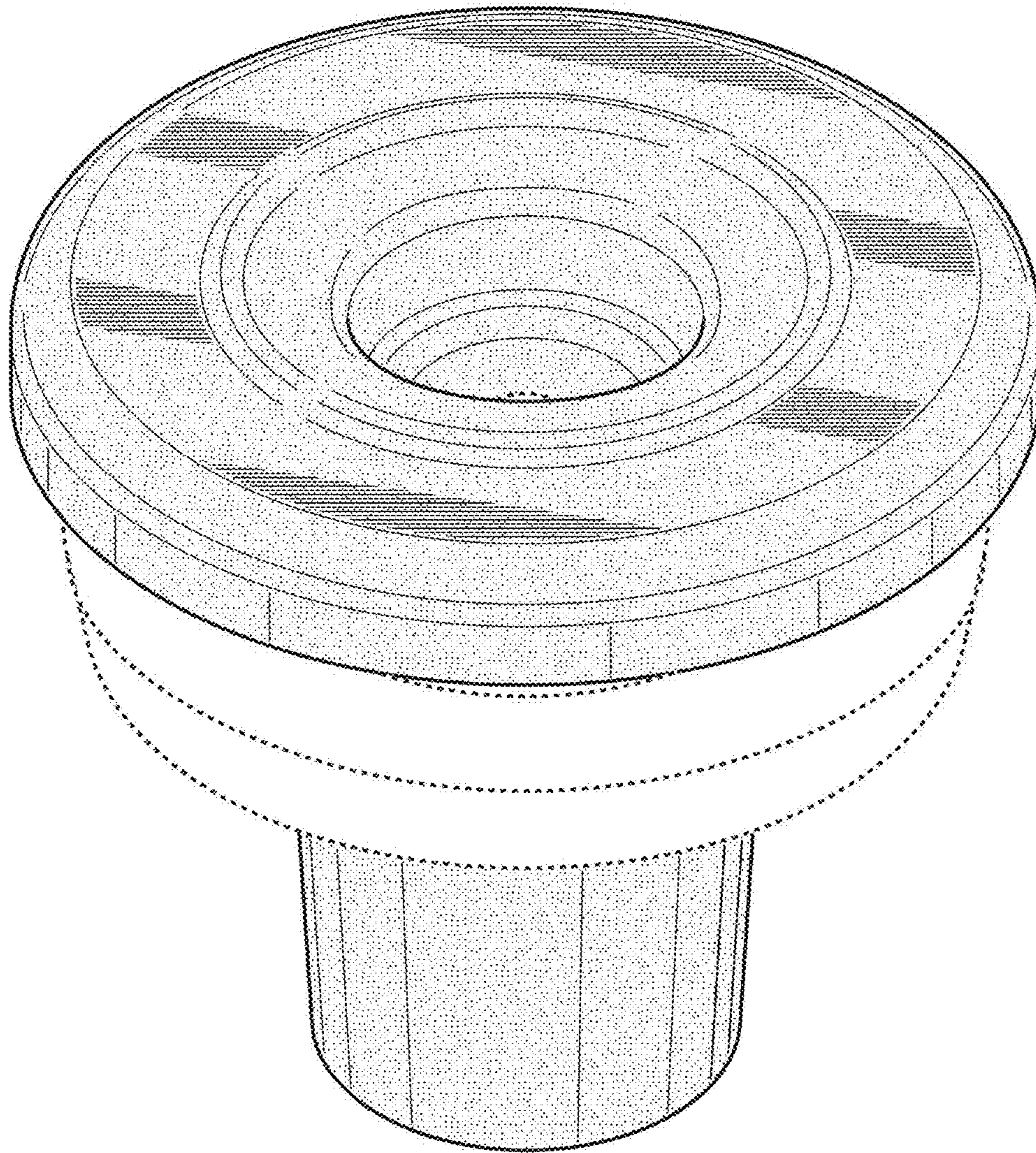

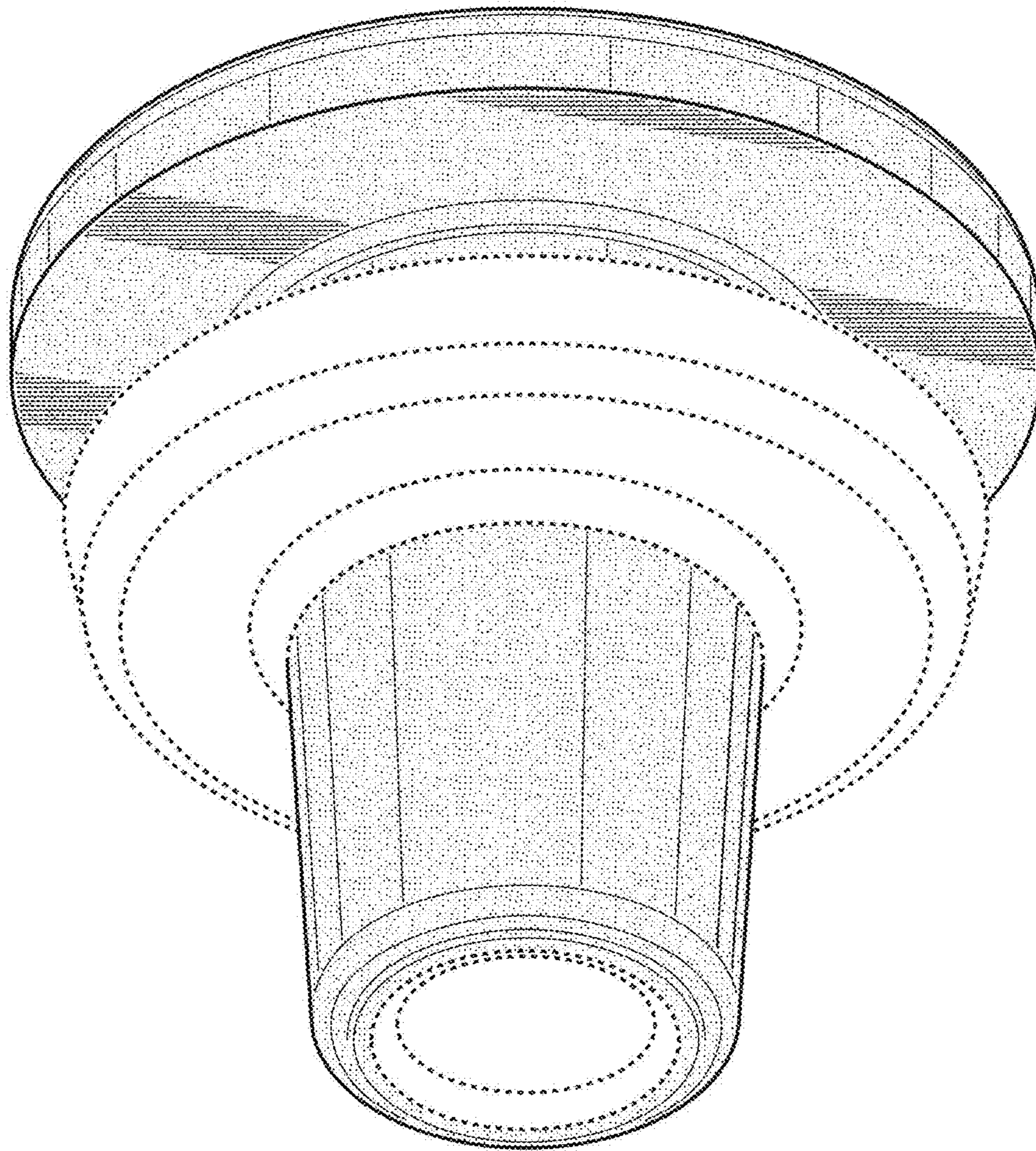
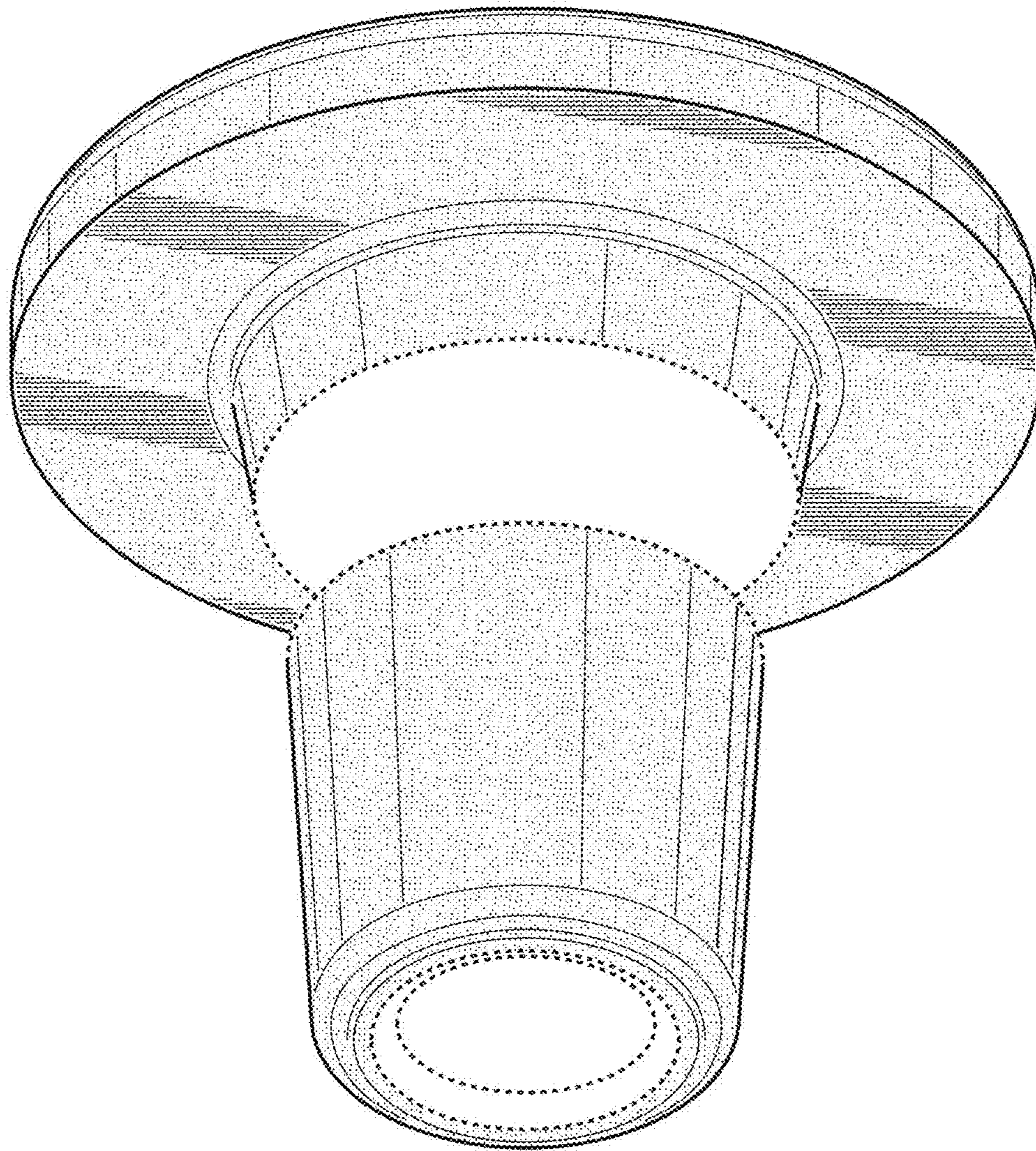

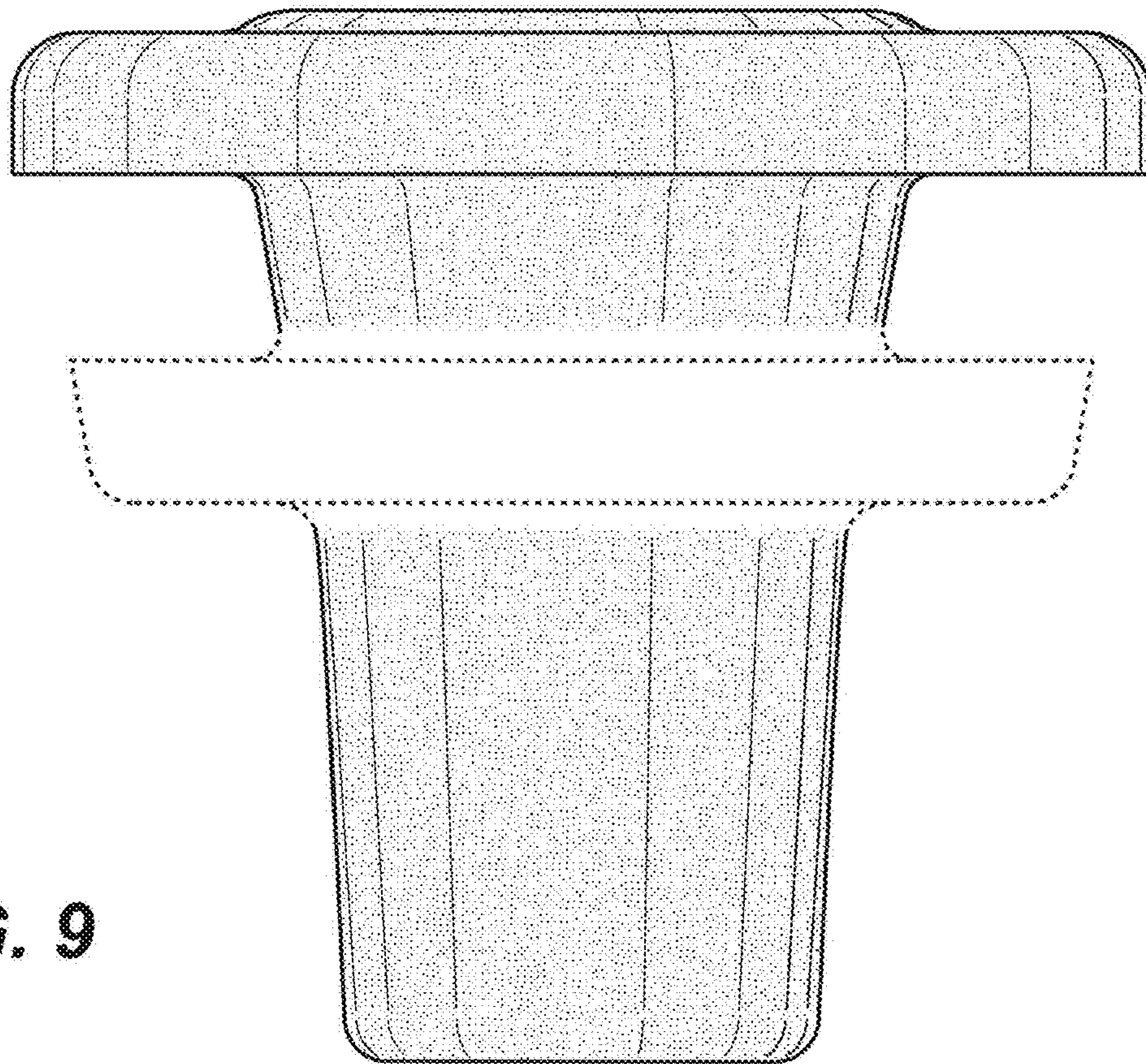

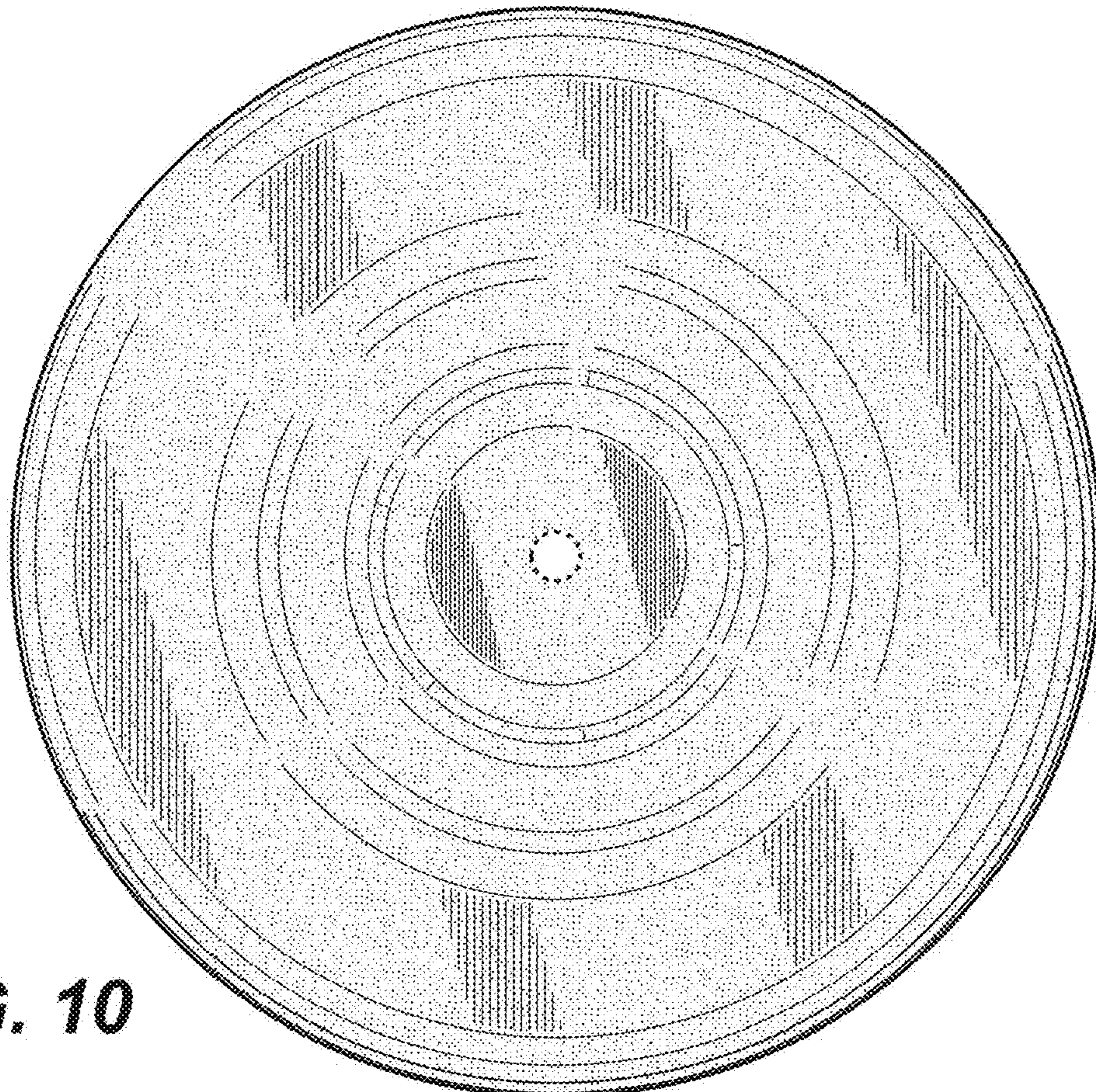
