FIG. 6 is a right side elevational view thereof;

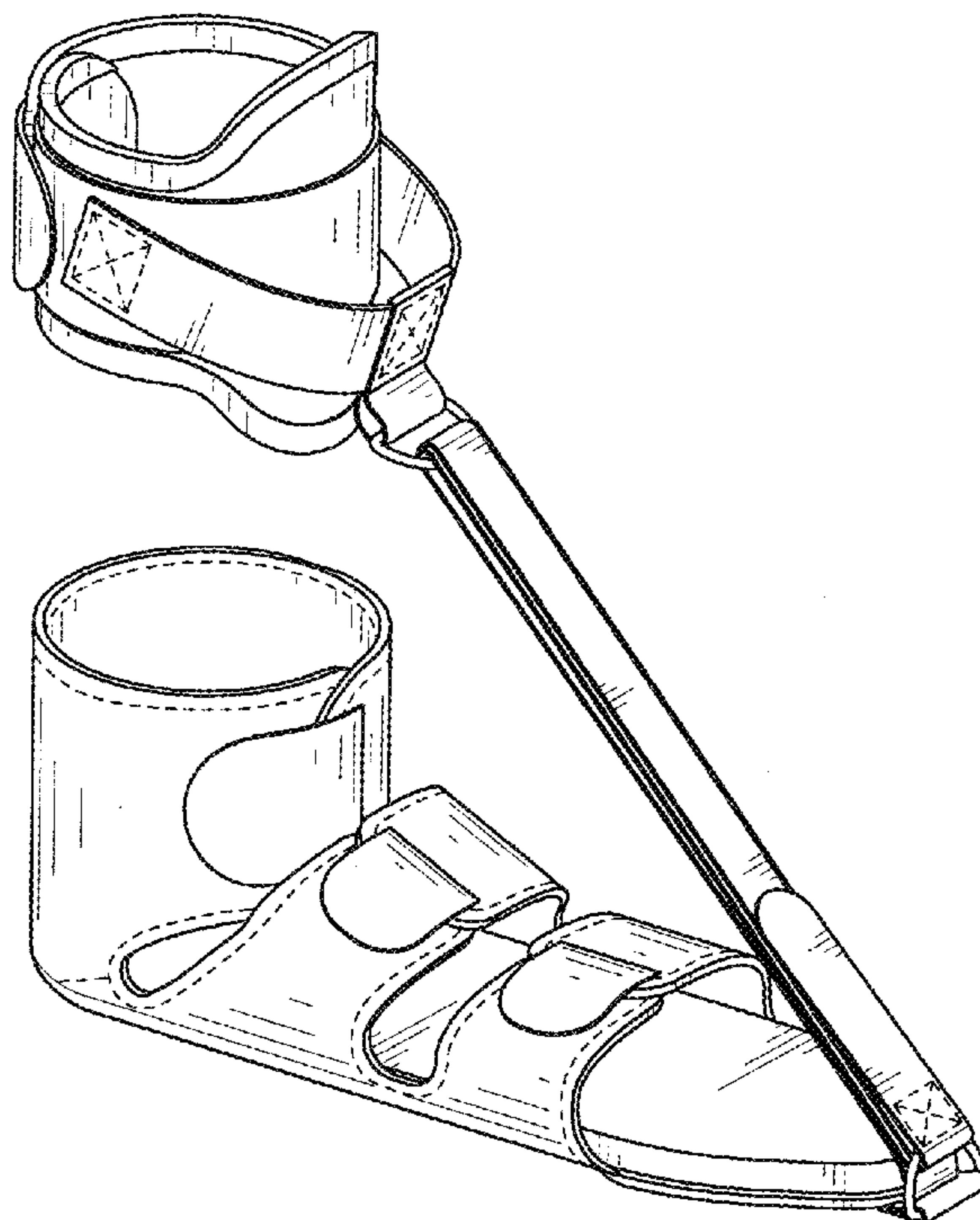
FIG. 7 is a top plan view thereof;

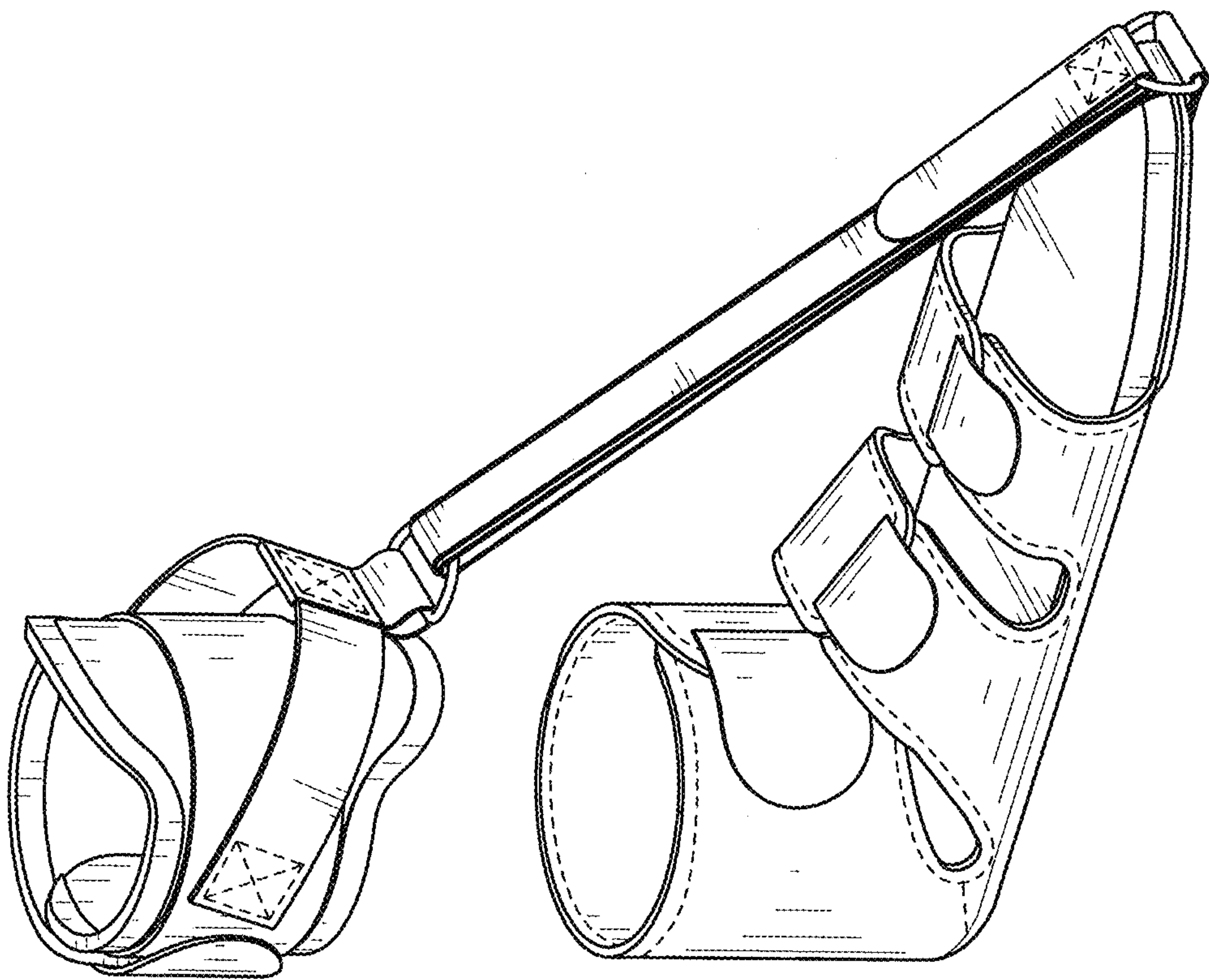

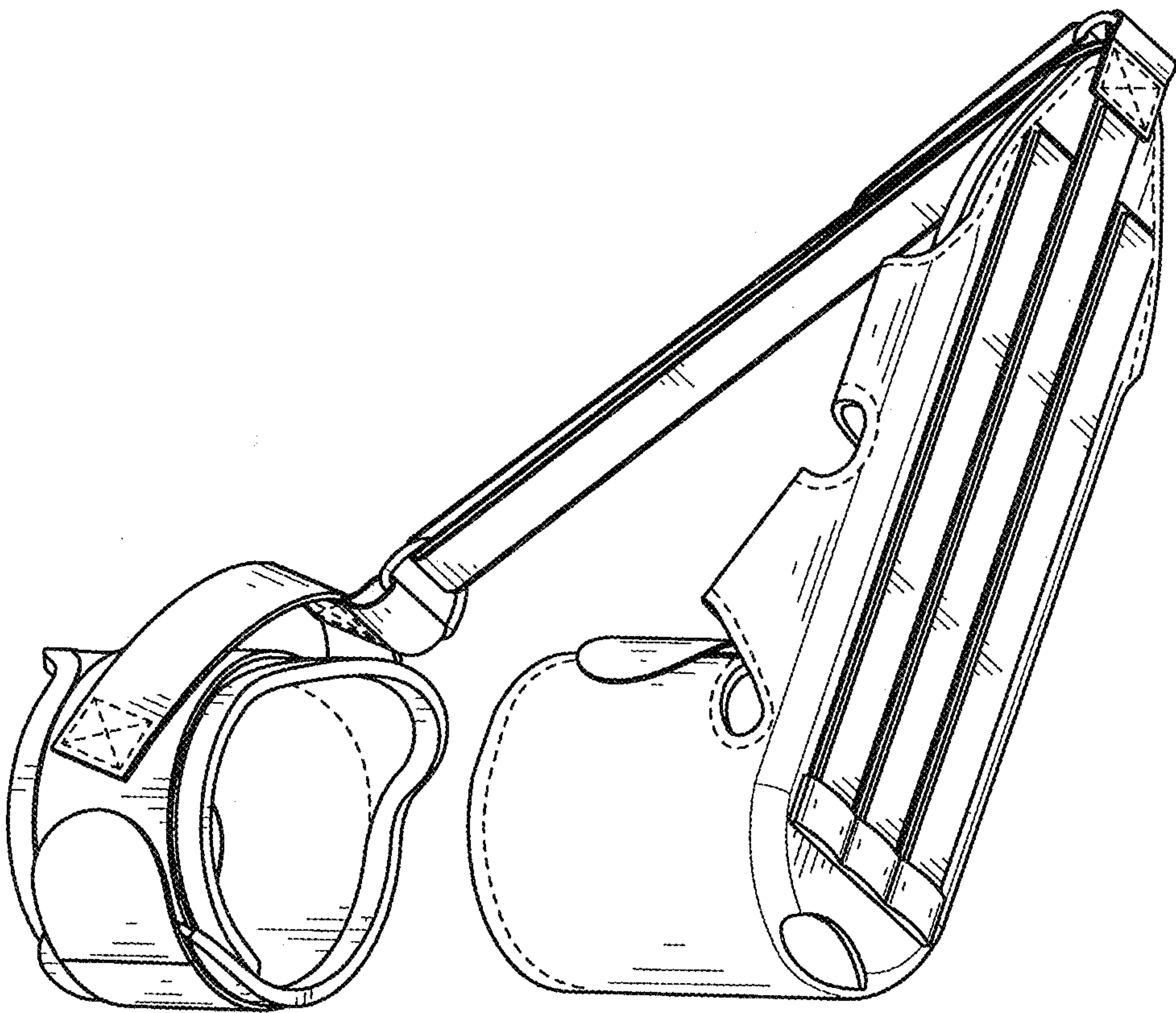

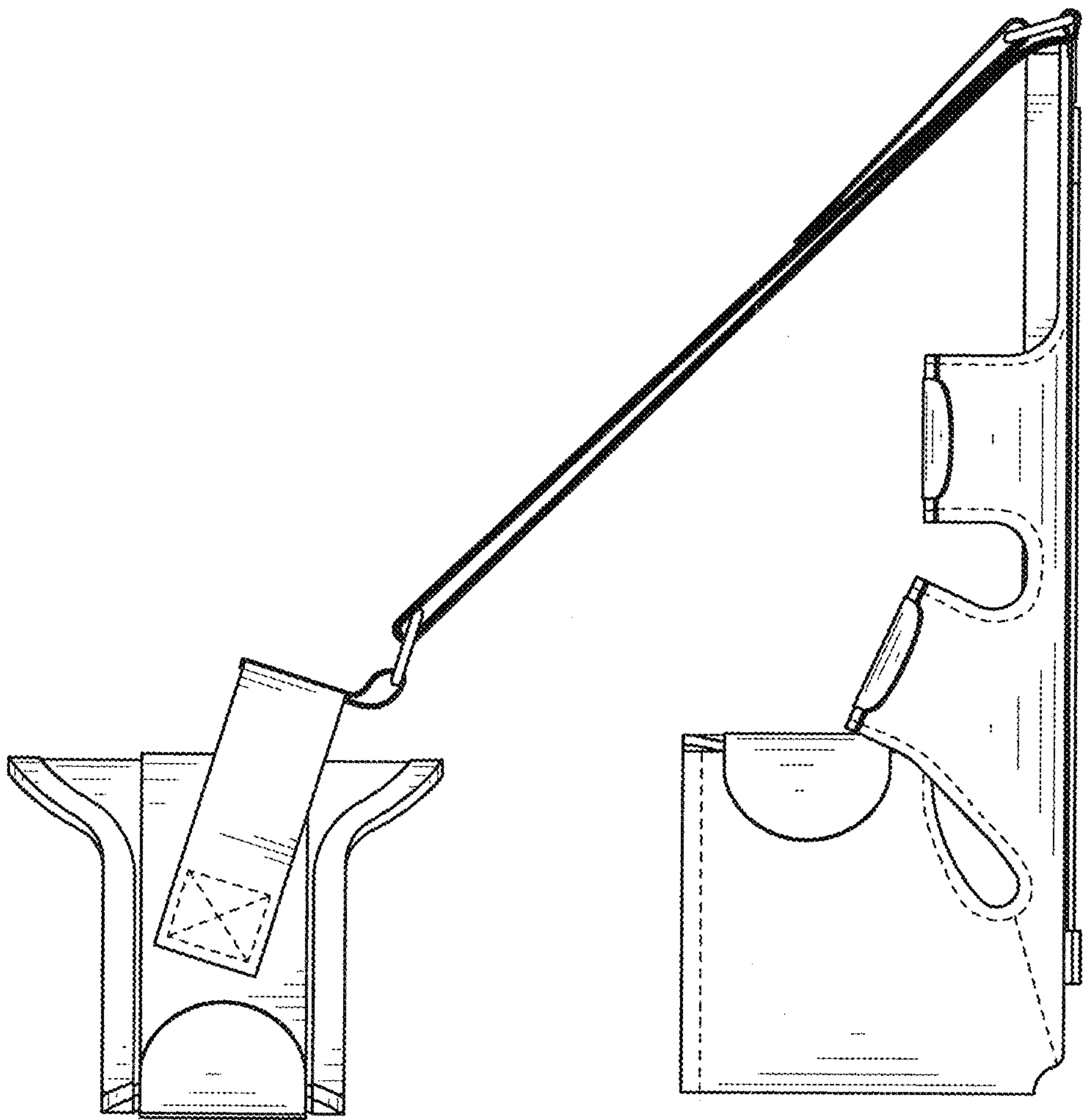

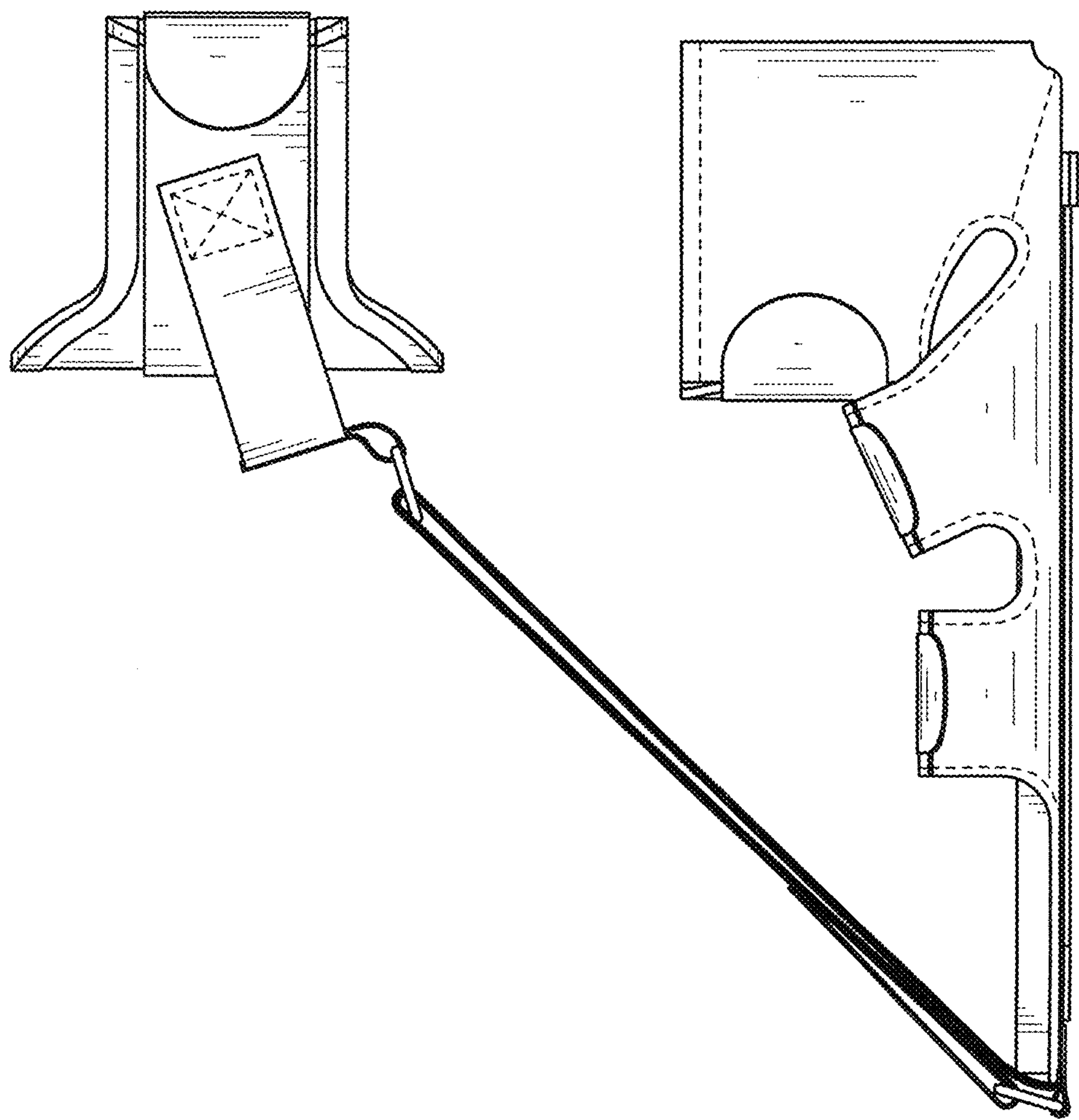

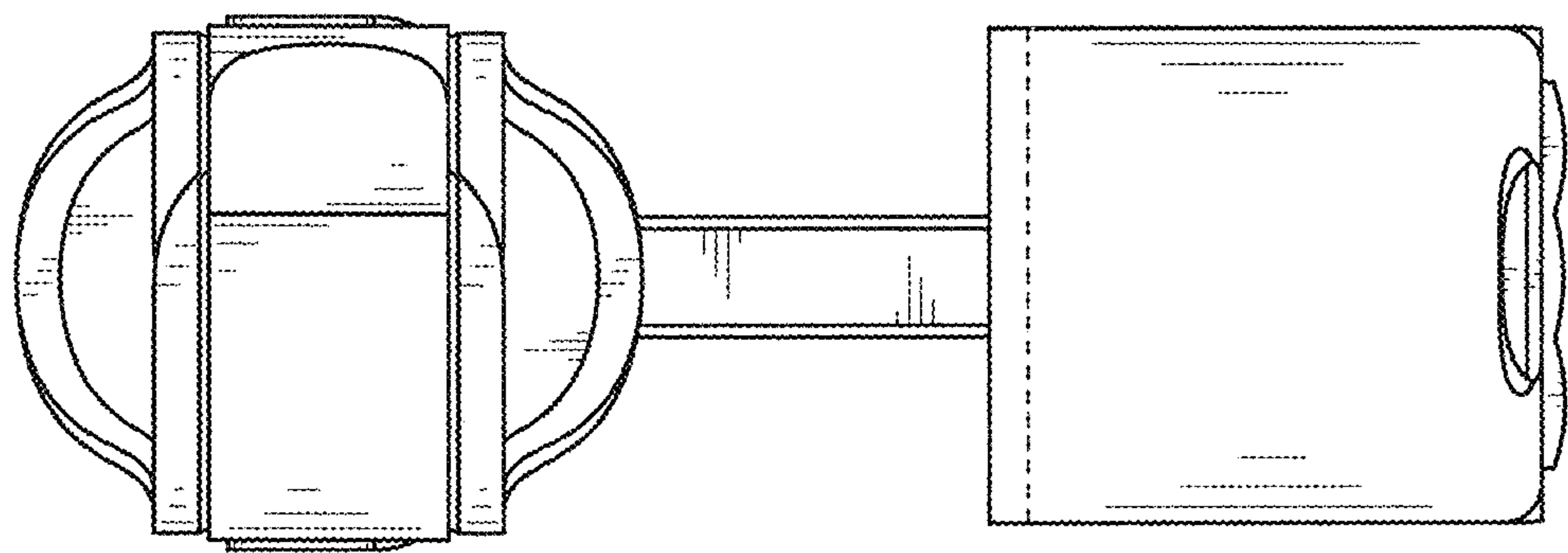

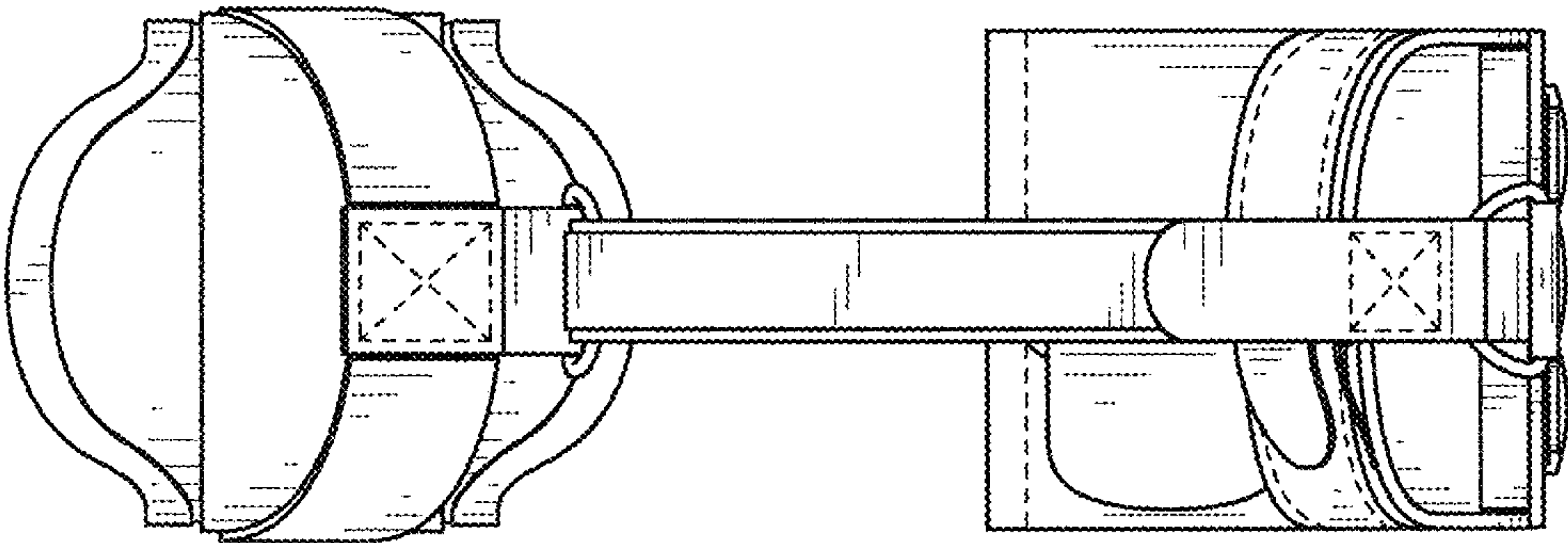

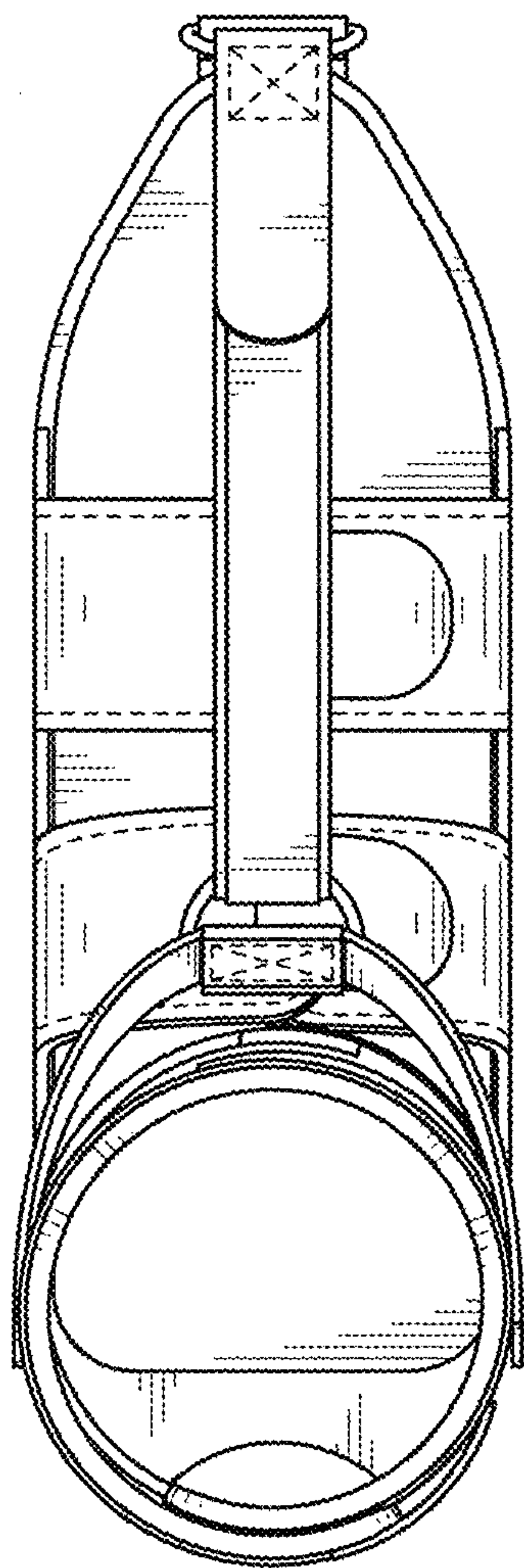

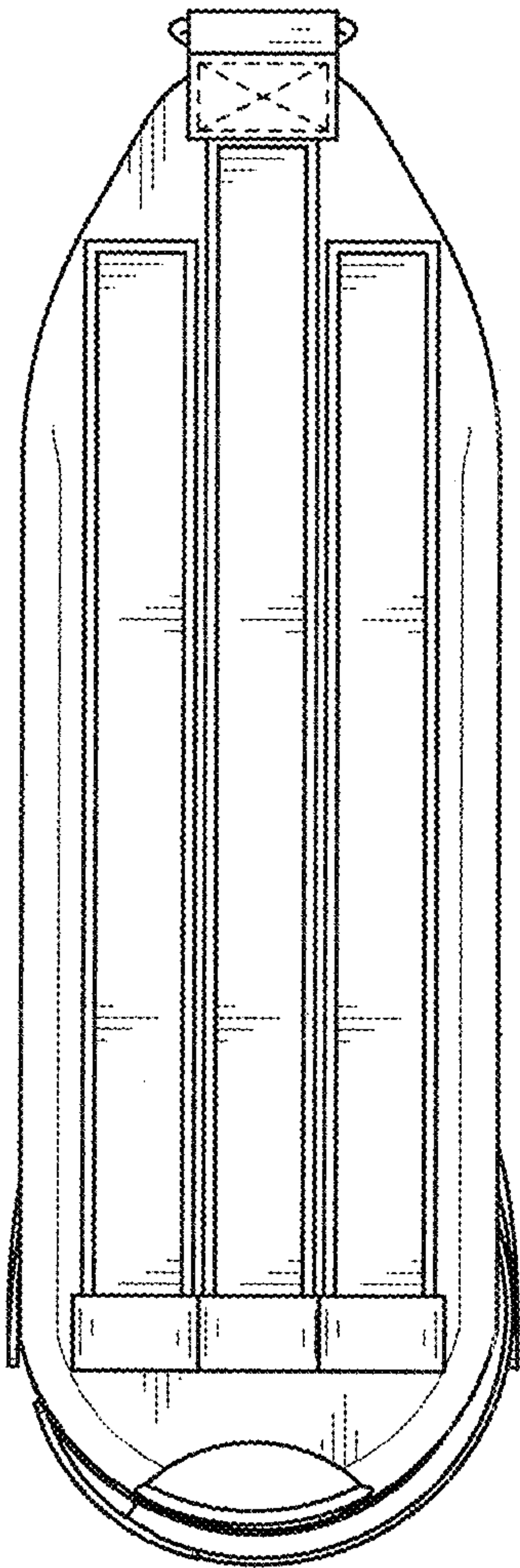

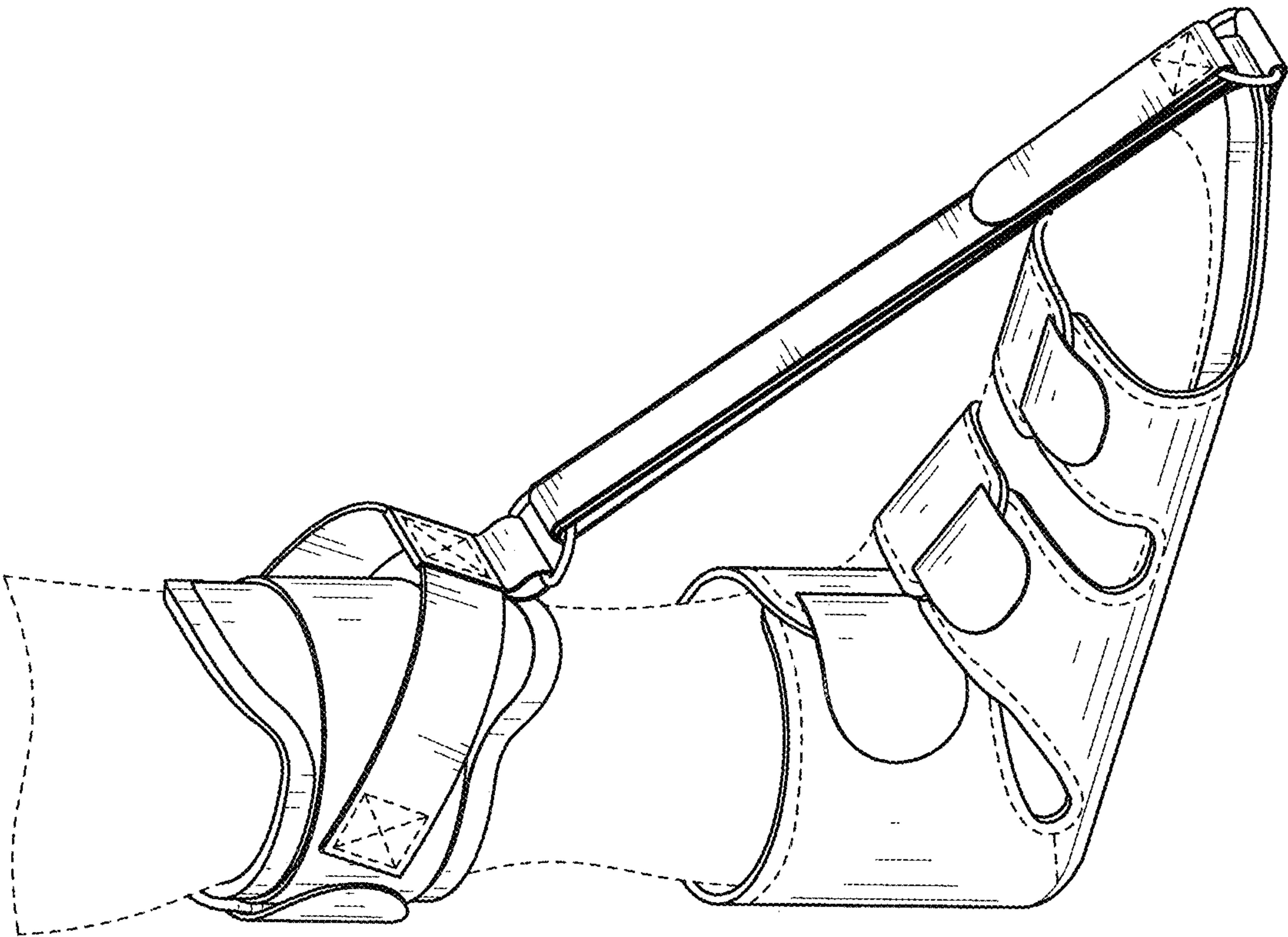
