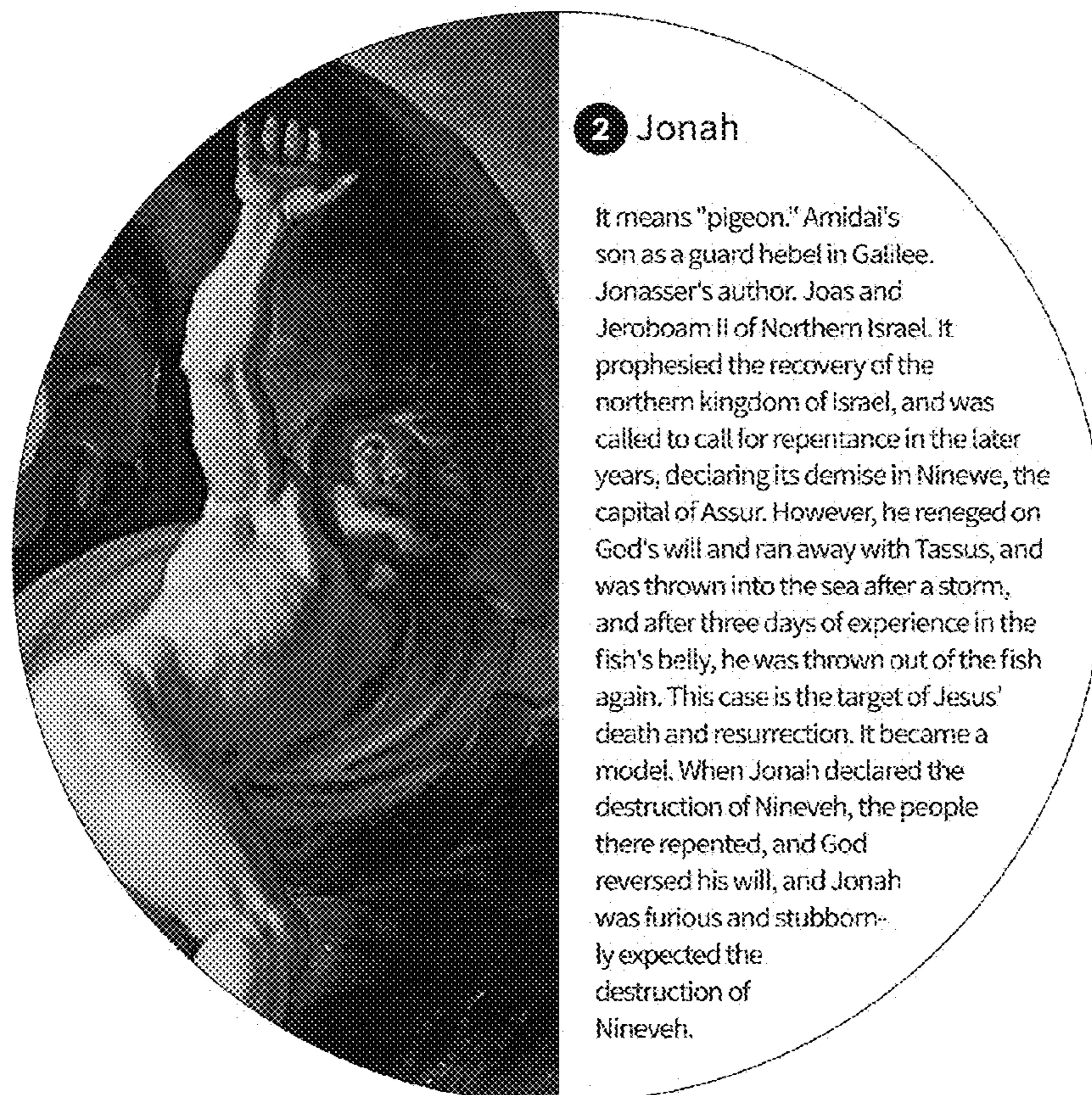

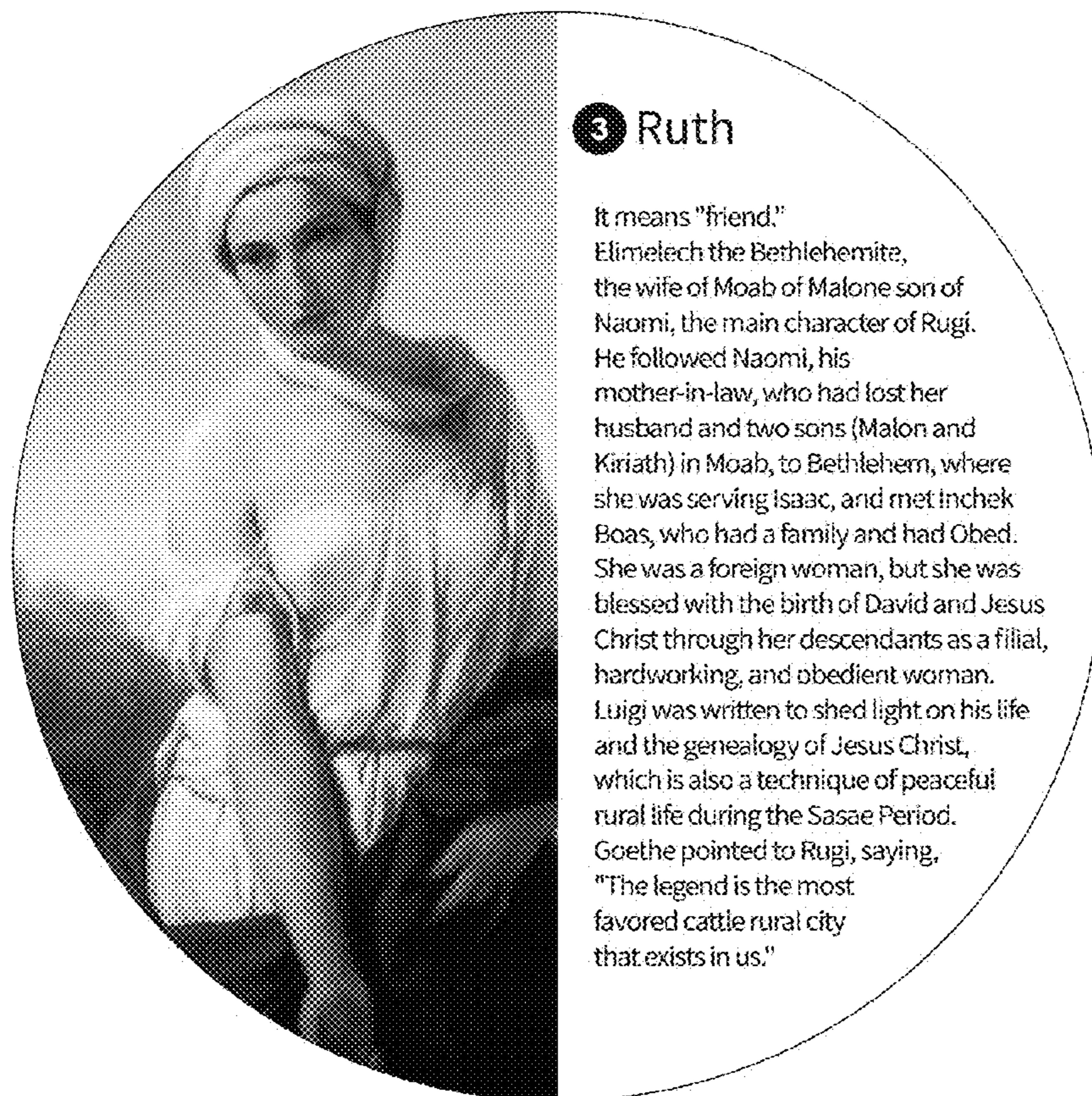

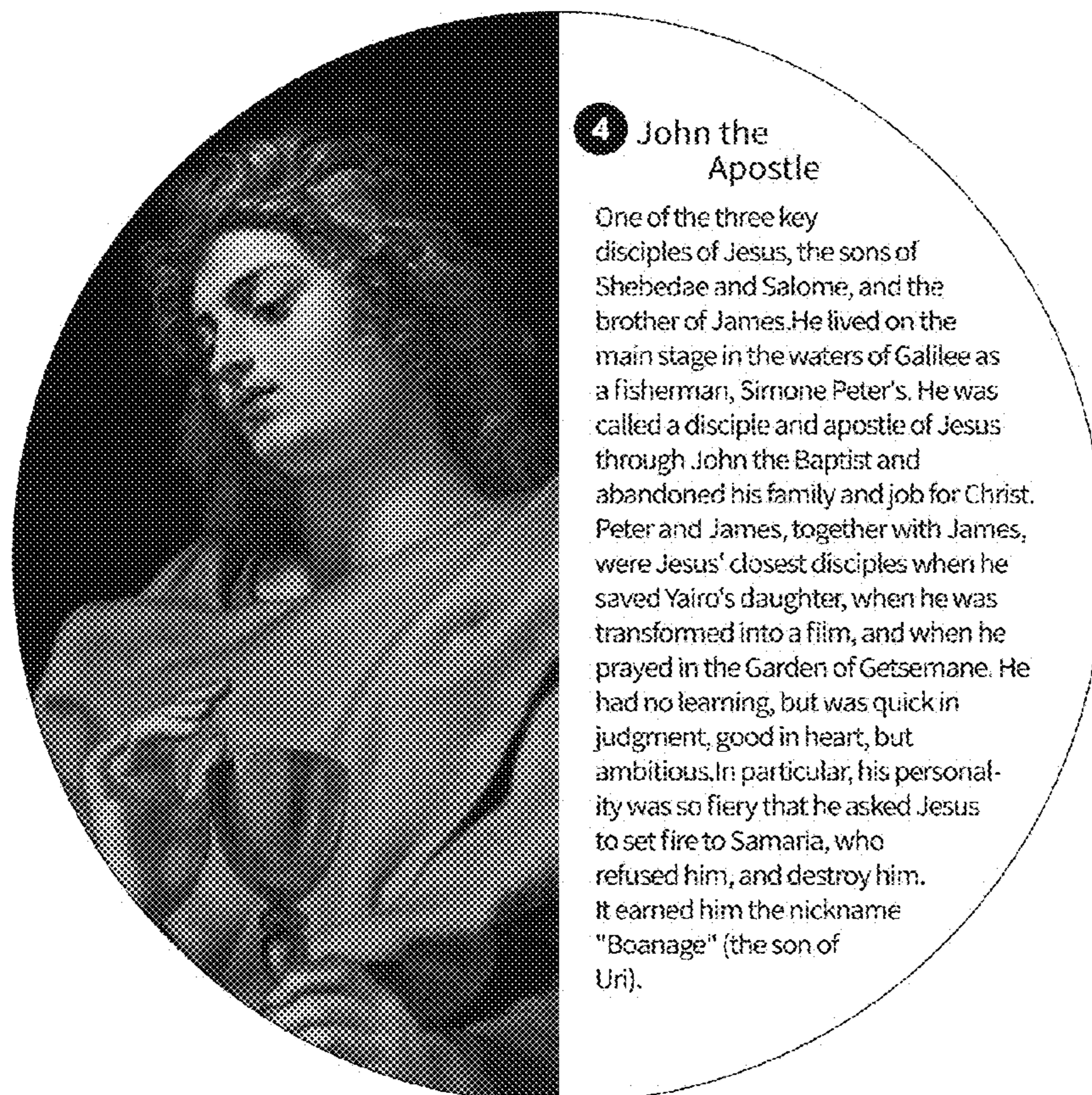

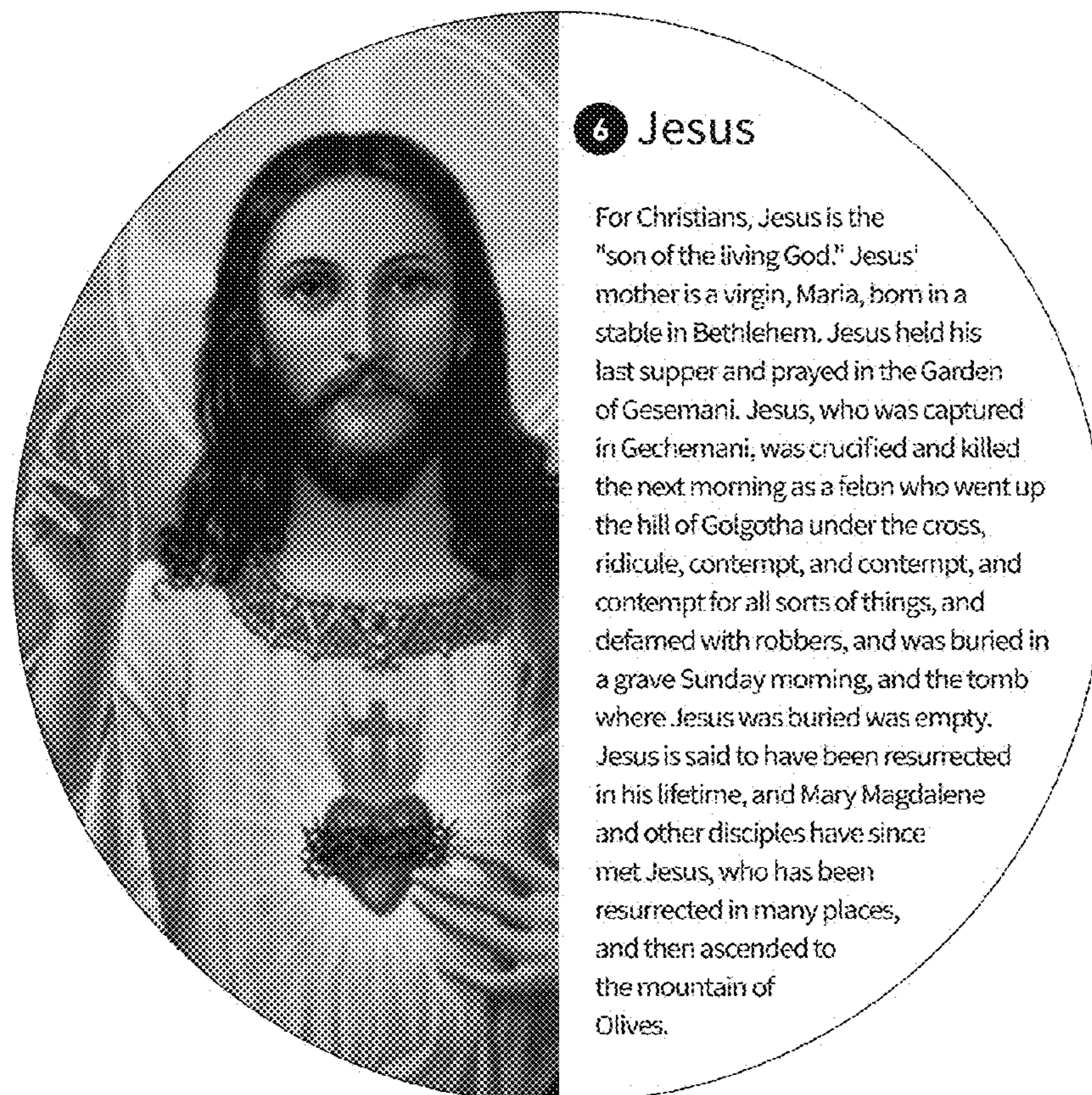

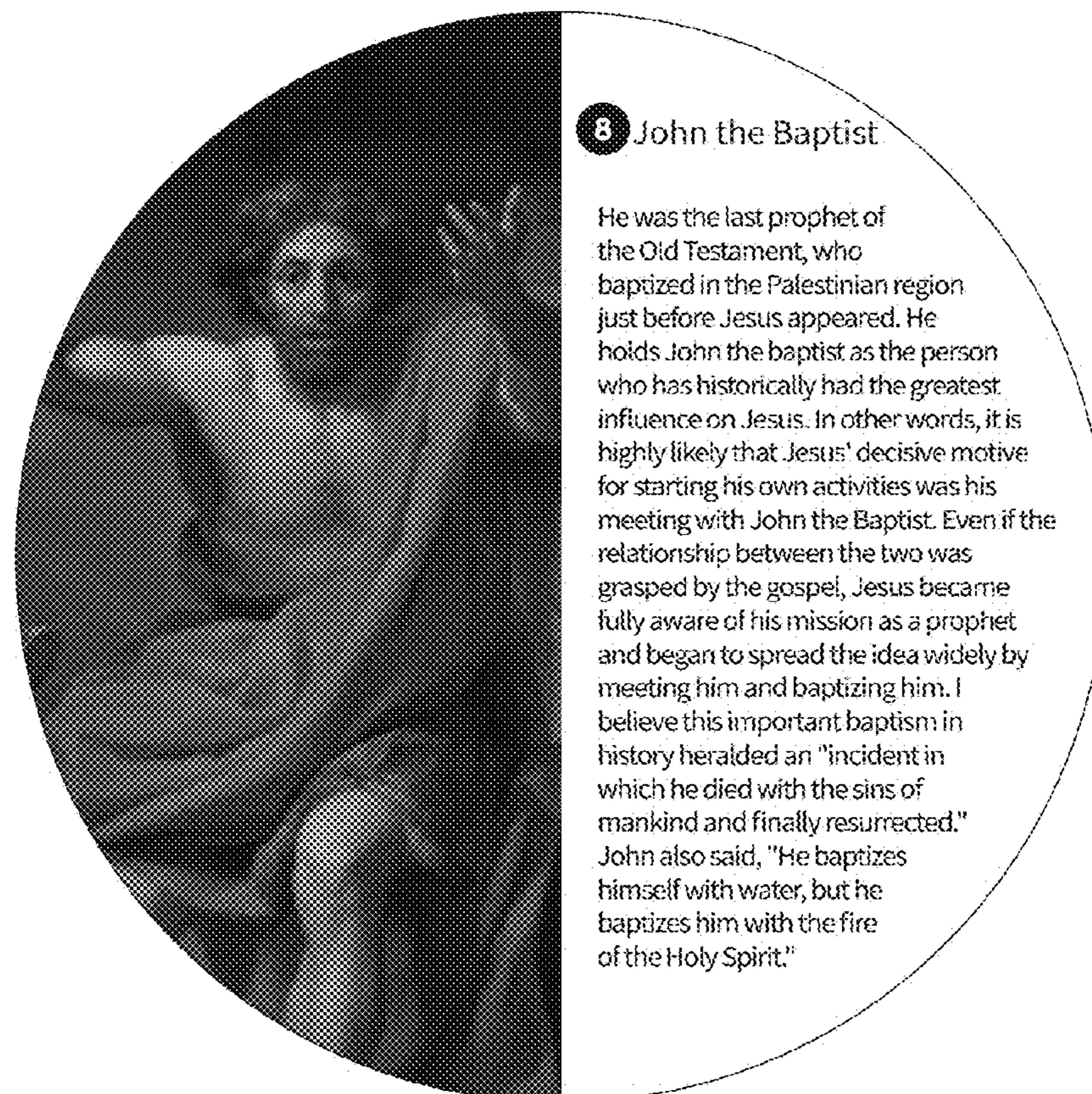


Along with James, he was the leader of the Church of Jerusalem and the author of Judas. At the time of Jesus' ministry, he did not believe in his Messiah, but he became religious after witnessing Jesus' cross and resurrection, and was at the scene during the Pentecost Holy Spirit's fall. The Bible tells little about Judas, but in the 1700s Judas became a "guardian of failed ideology." He was "a pearl buried in the dirt" because no one paid attention to the unknown saint and did not pray. The Catholic Church has set Oct. 28 as the anniversary of Simone and Judah. The Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates June 19 as the birthday of Judas, the "Lord Apostle and Brother." The name of St. Judas remained the name of St. Judah Children's Hospital, which was built from donations from former celebrity Danny Thomas.

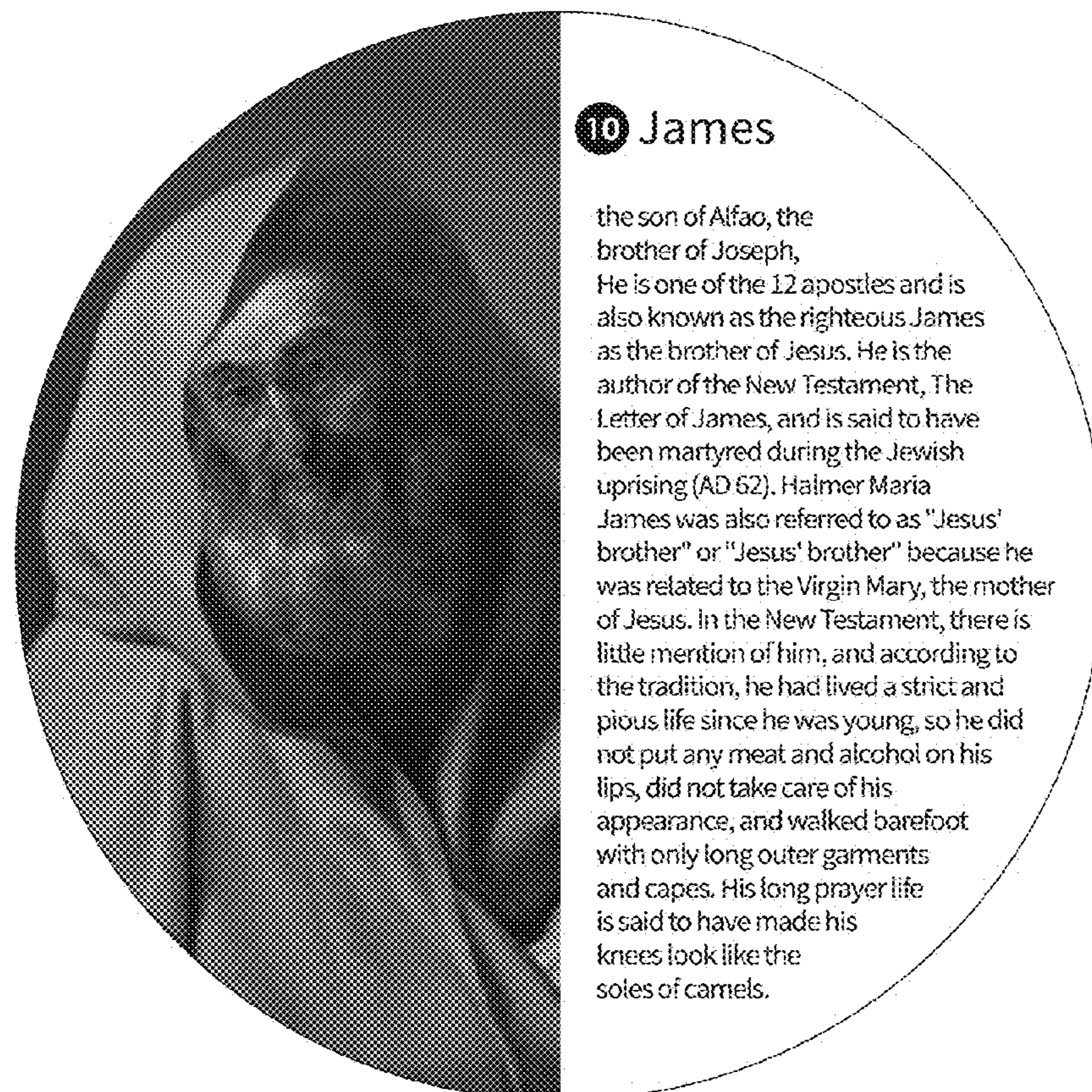

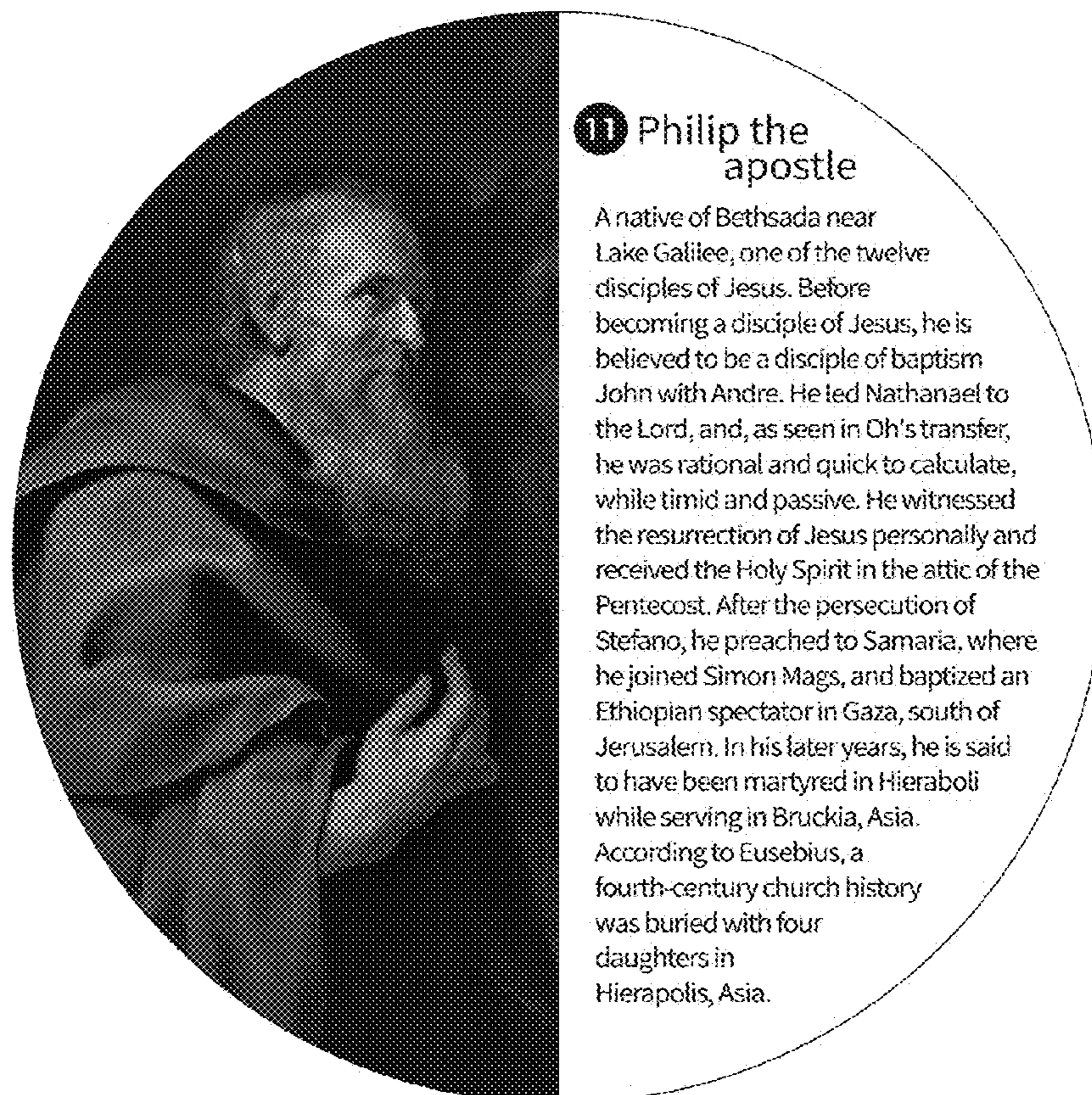

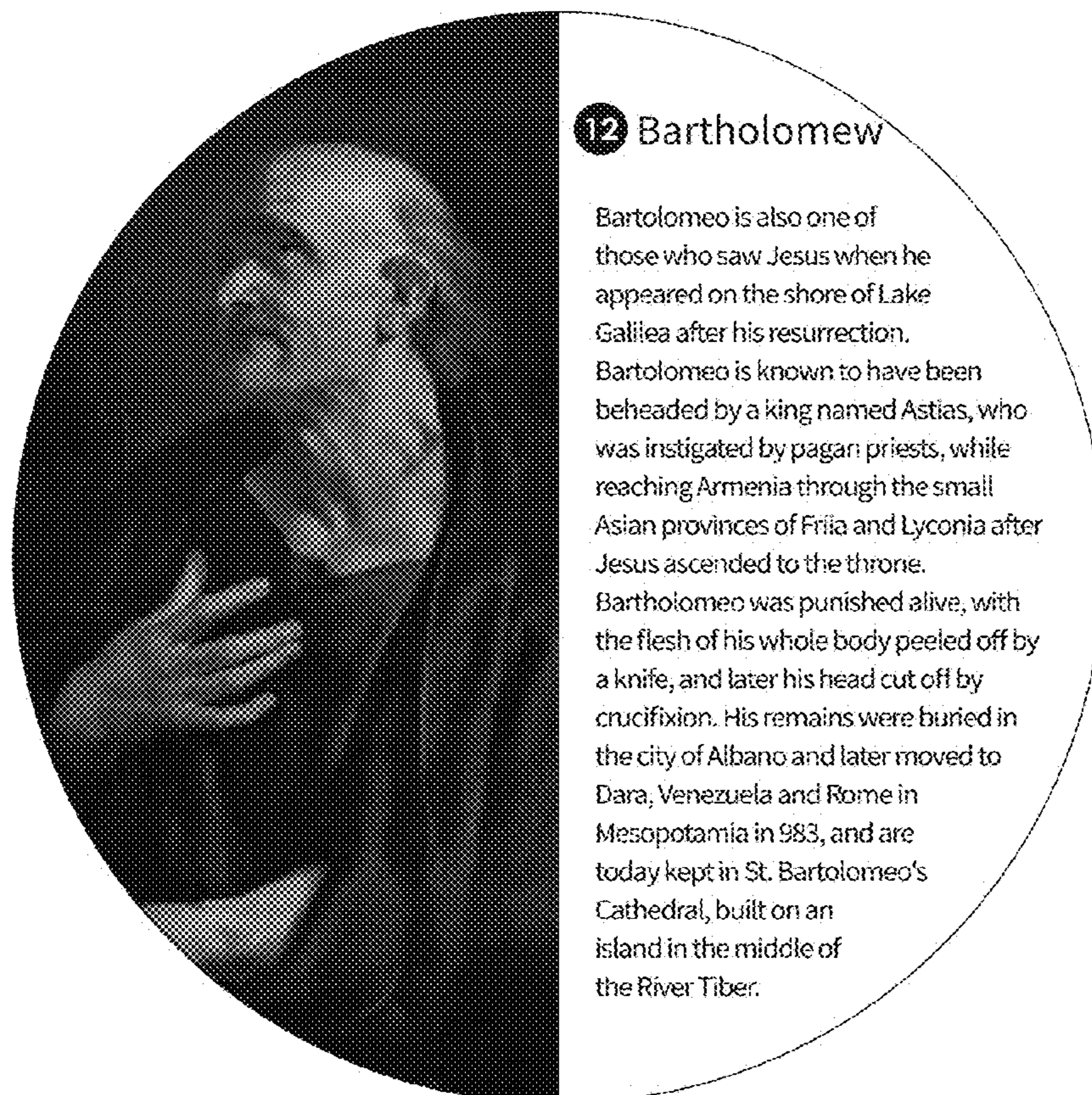

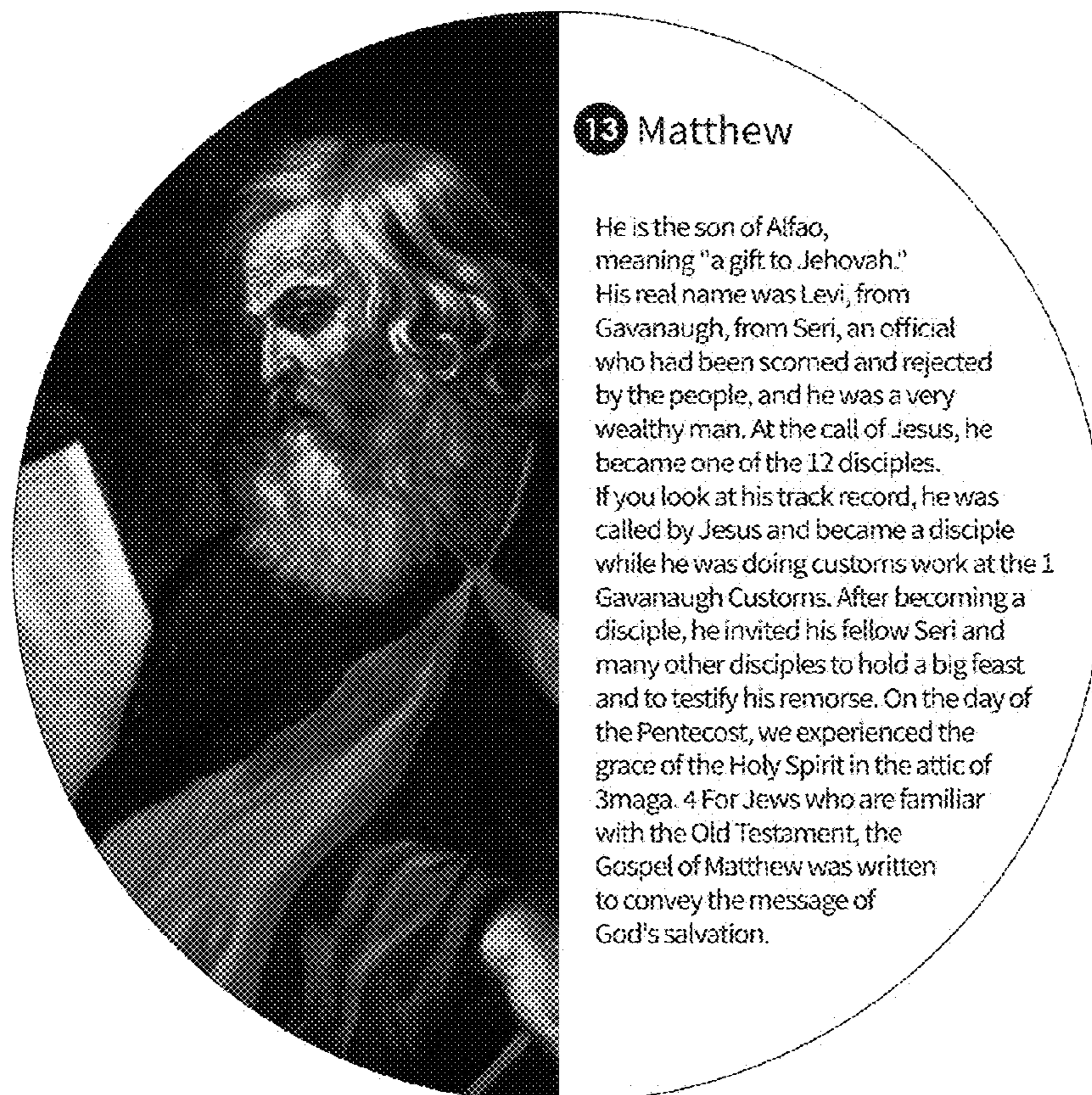

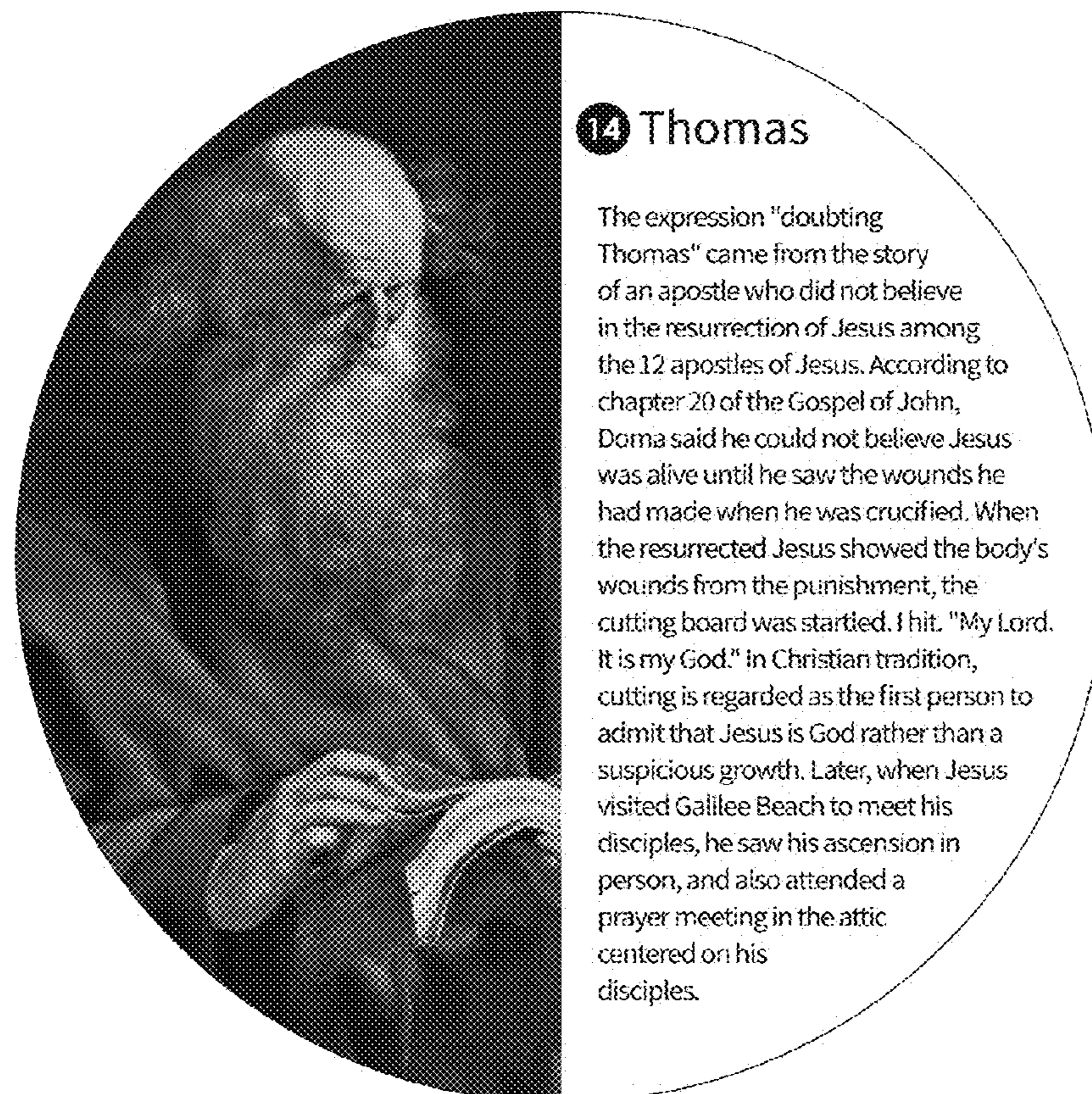

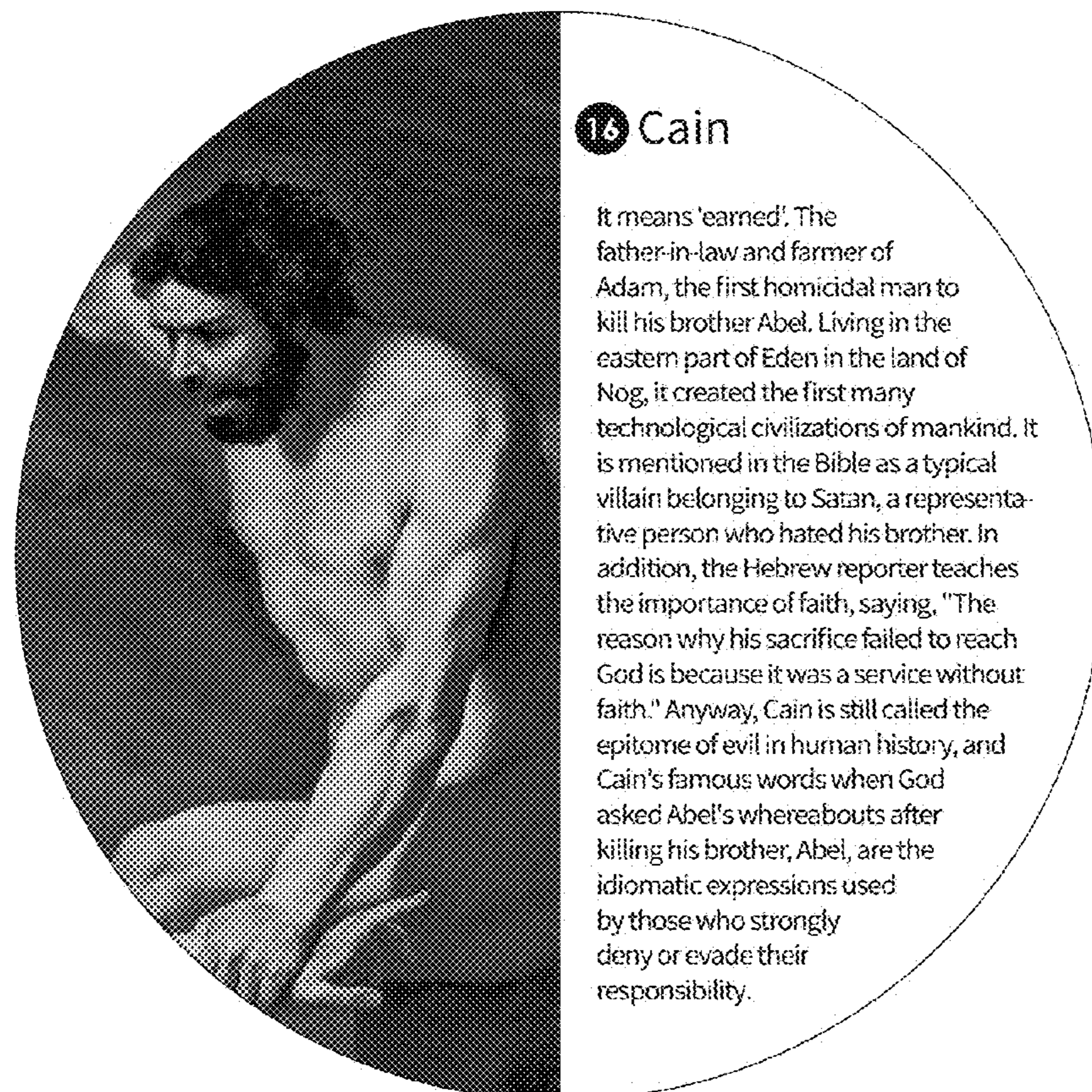

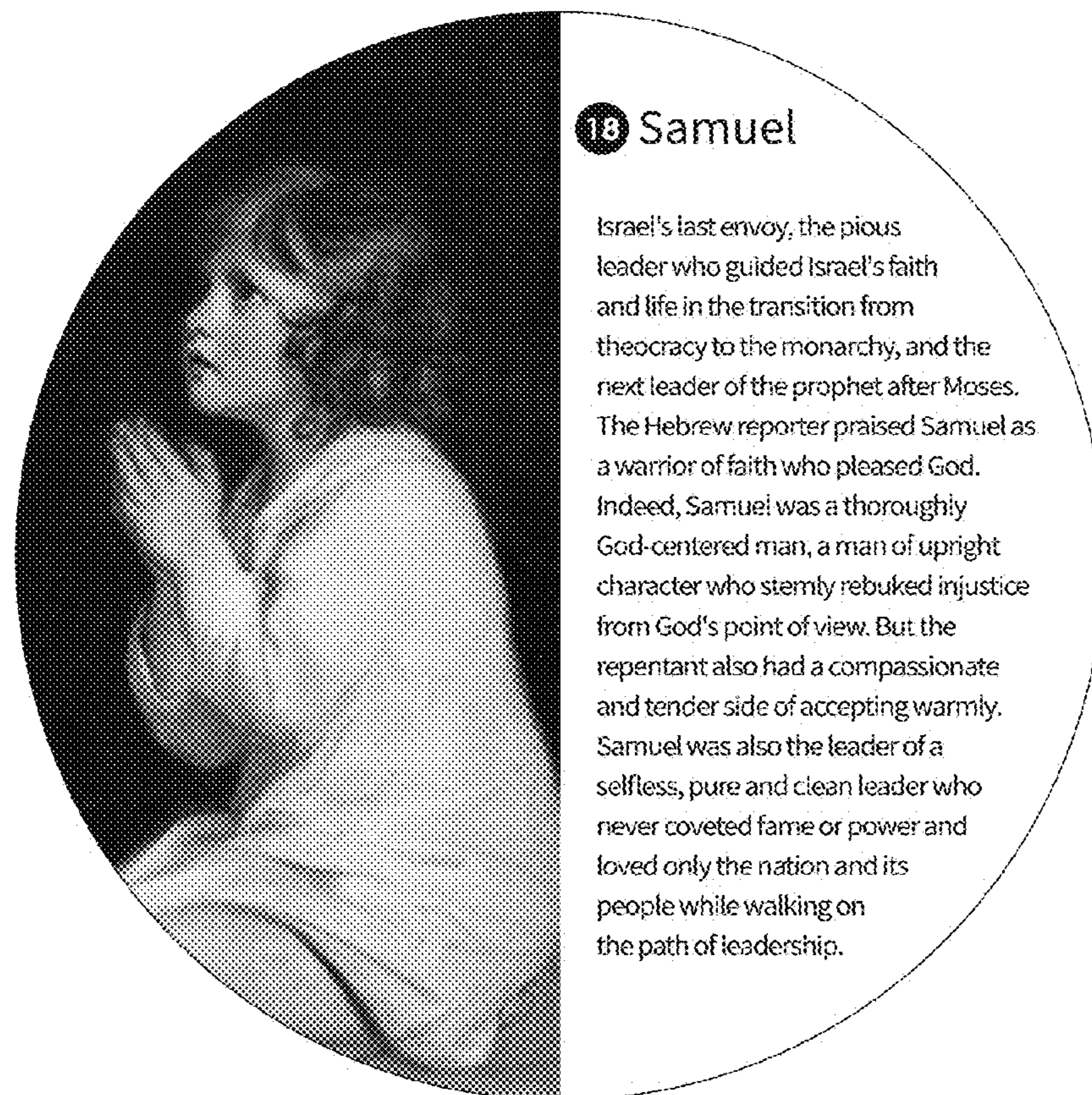

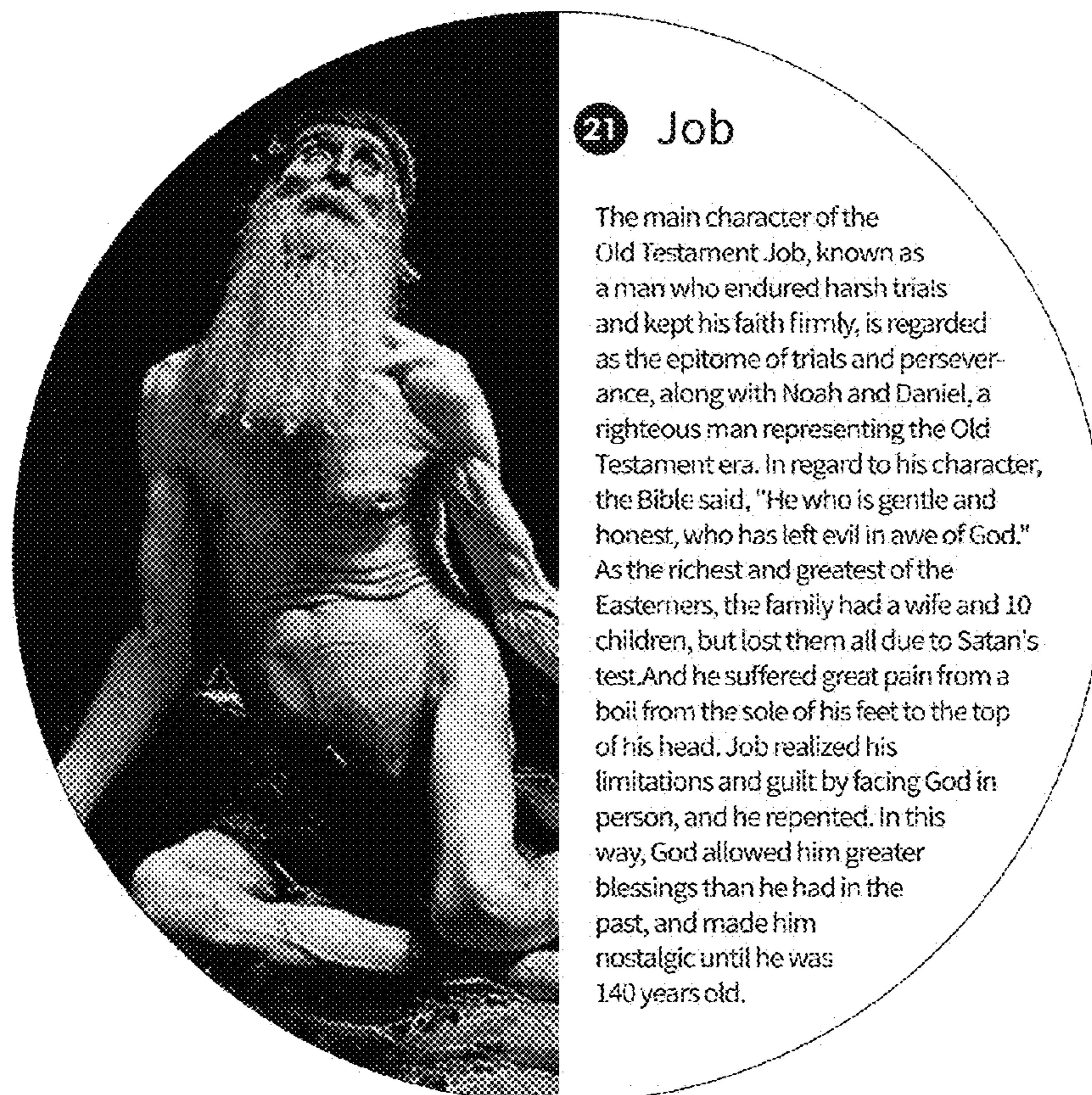

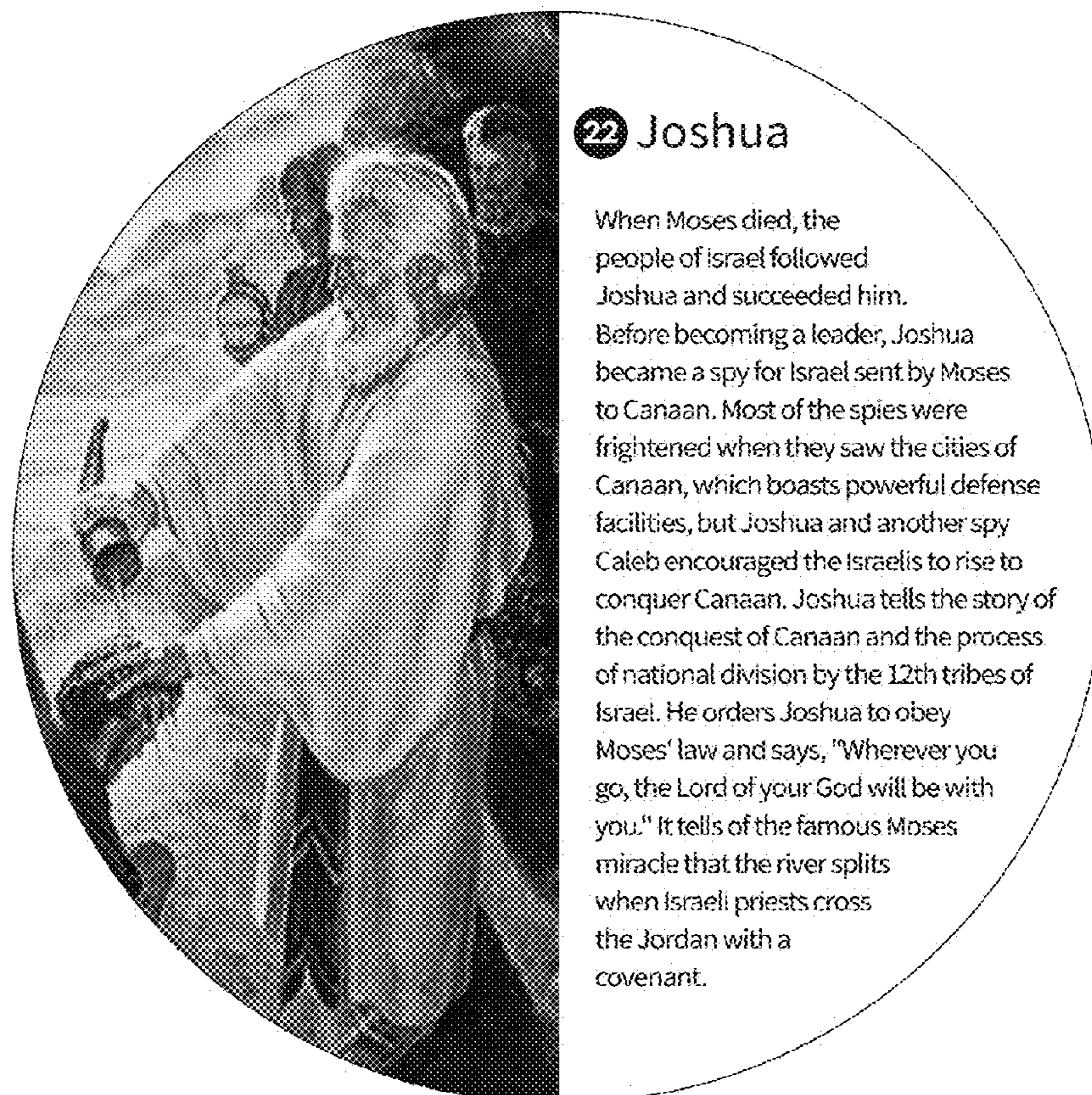

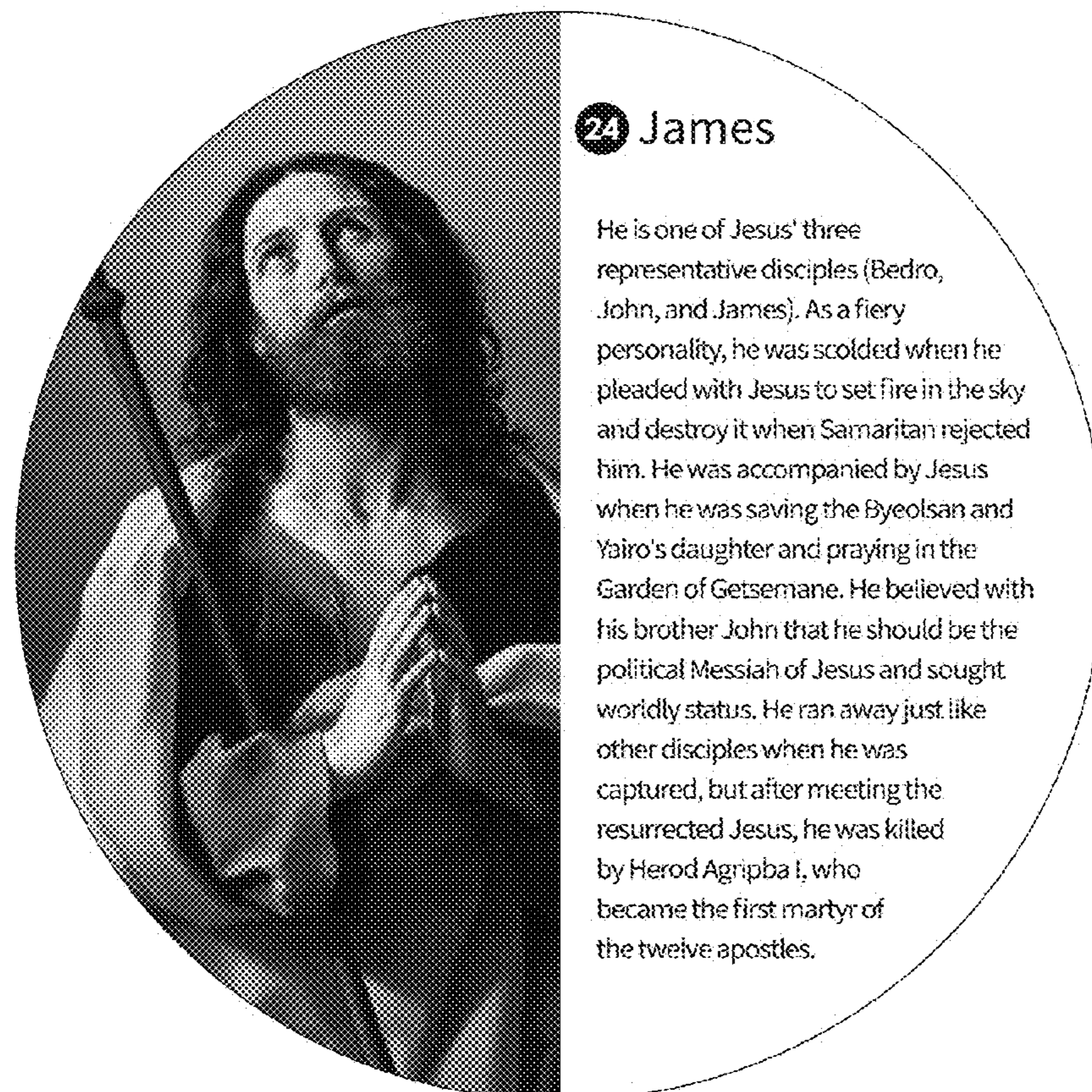

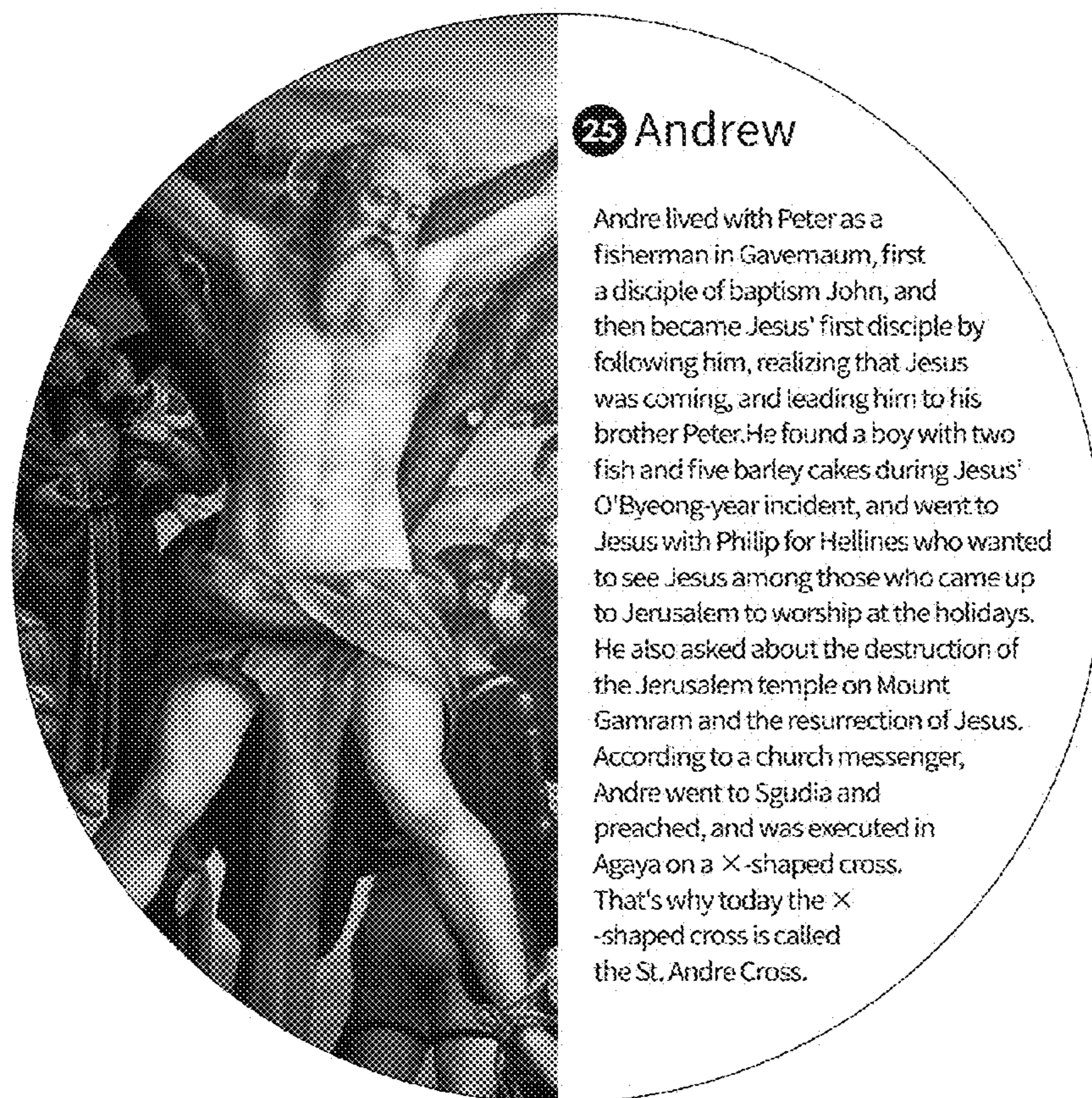

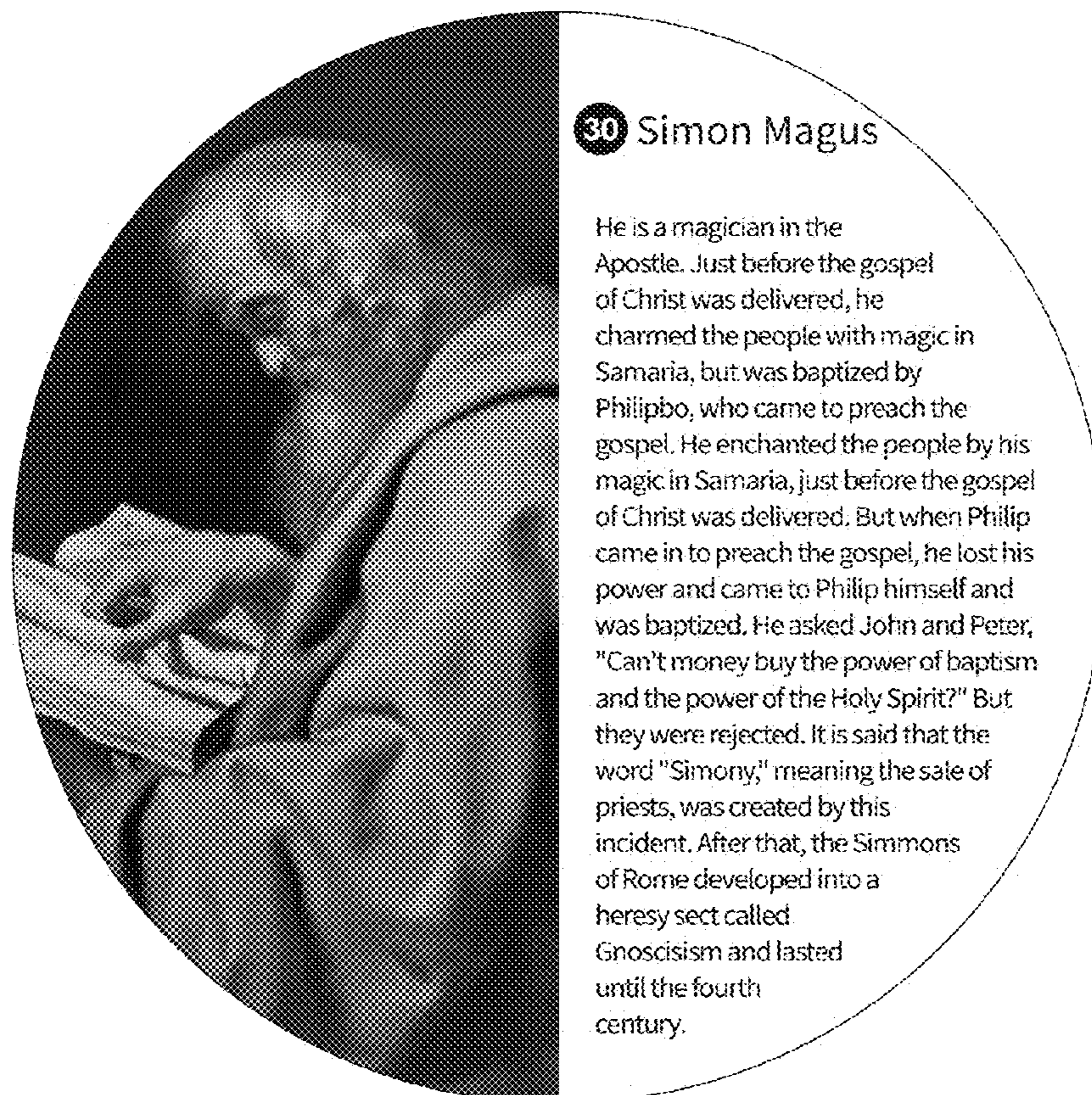

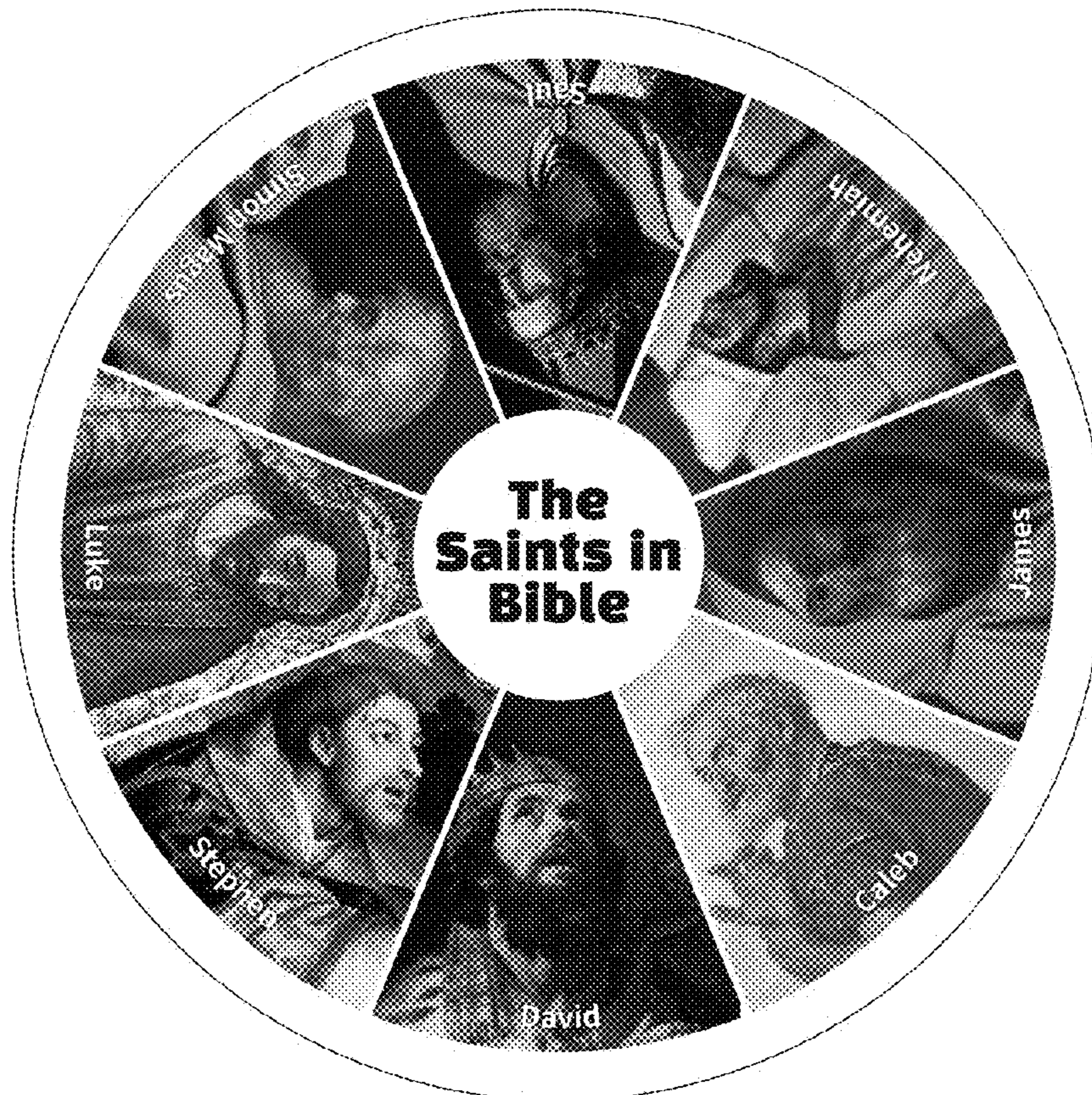

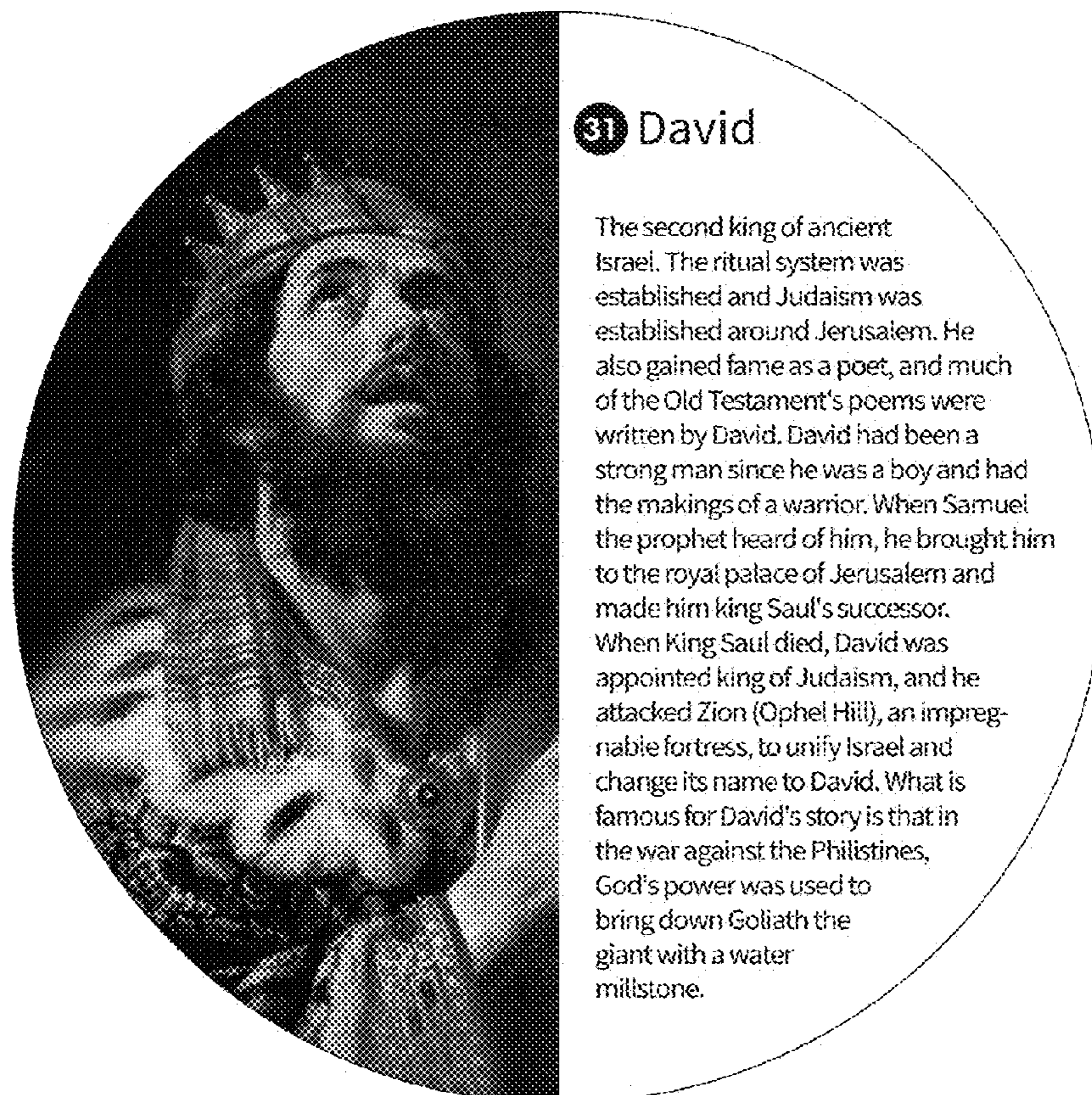

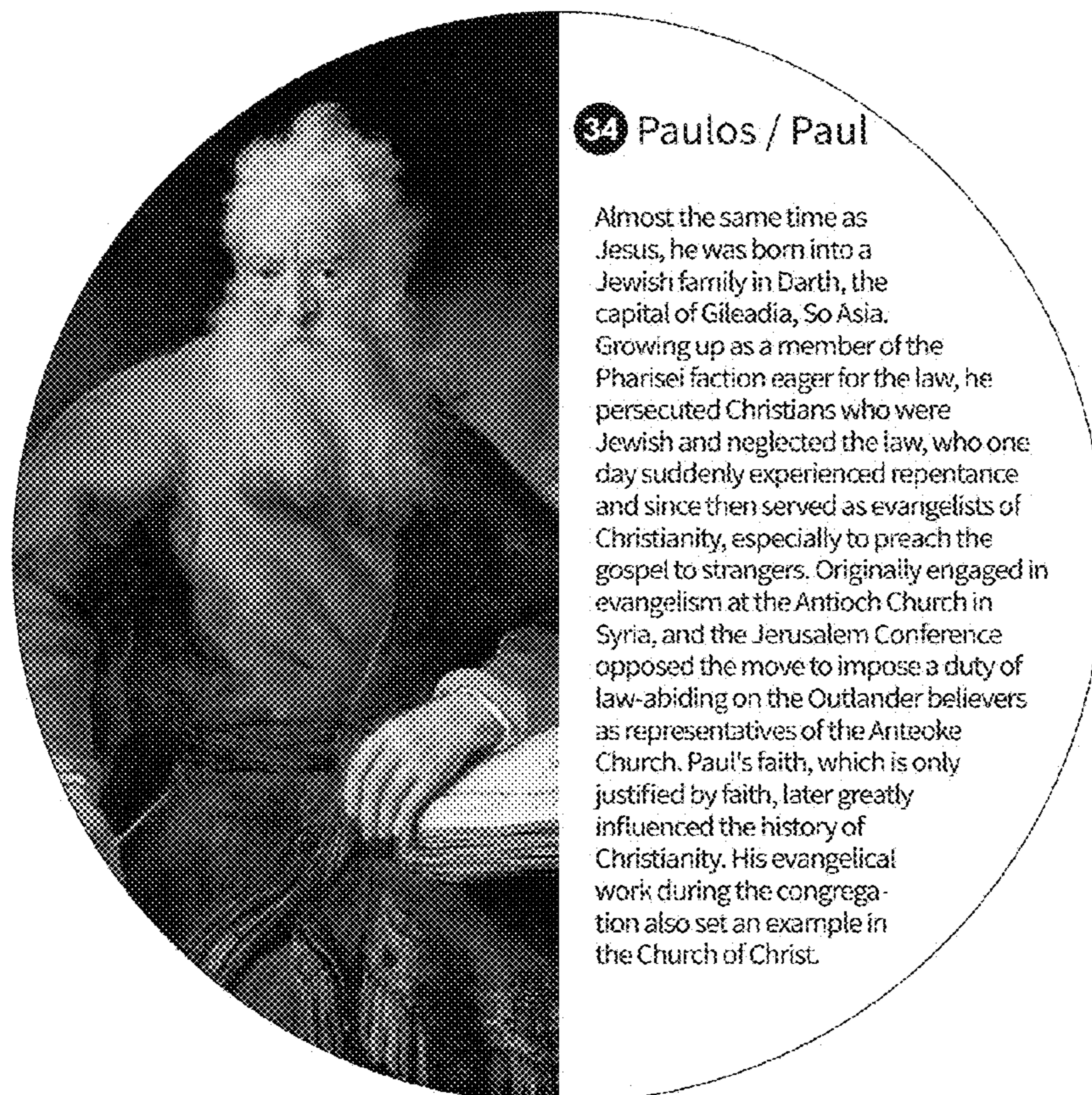

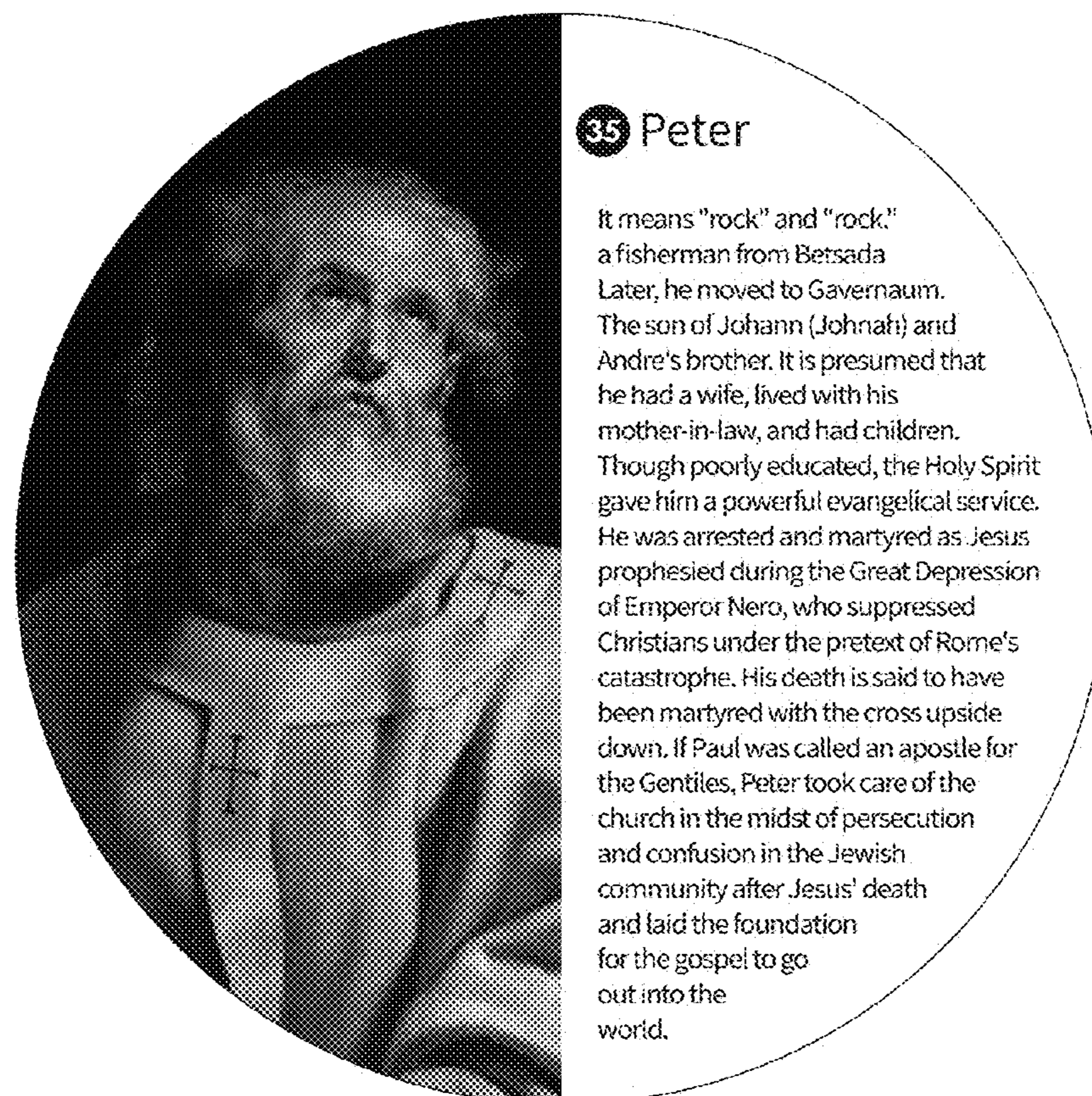

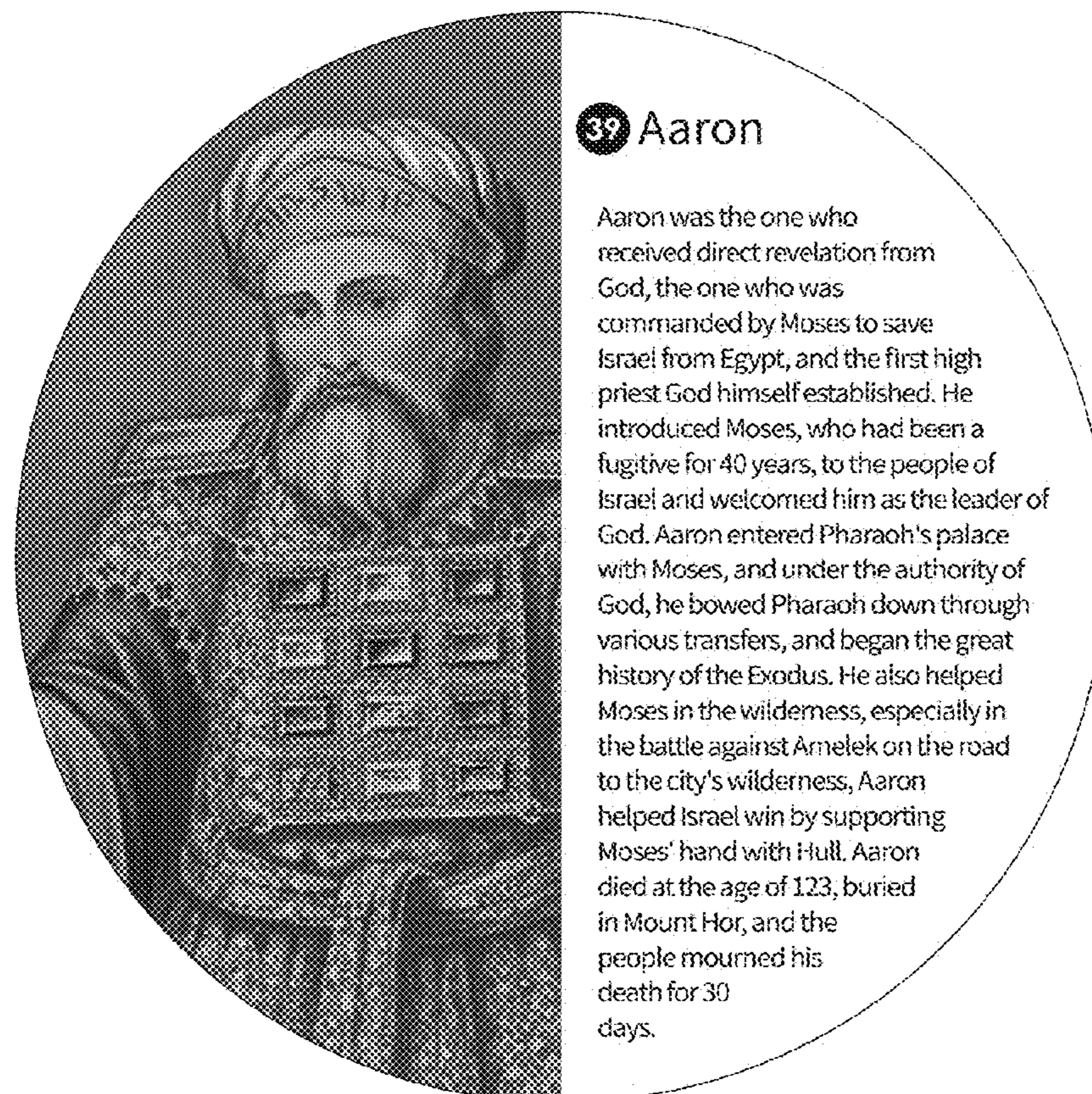

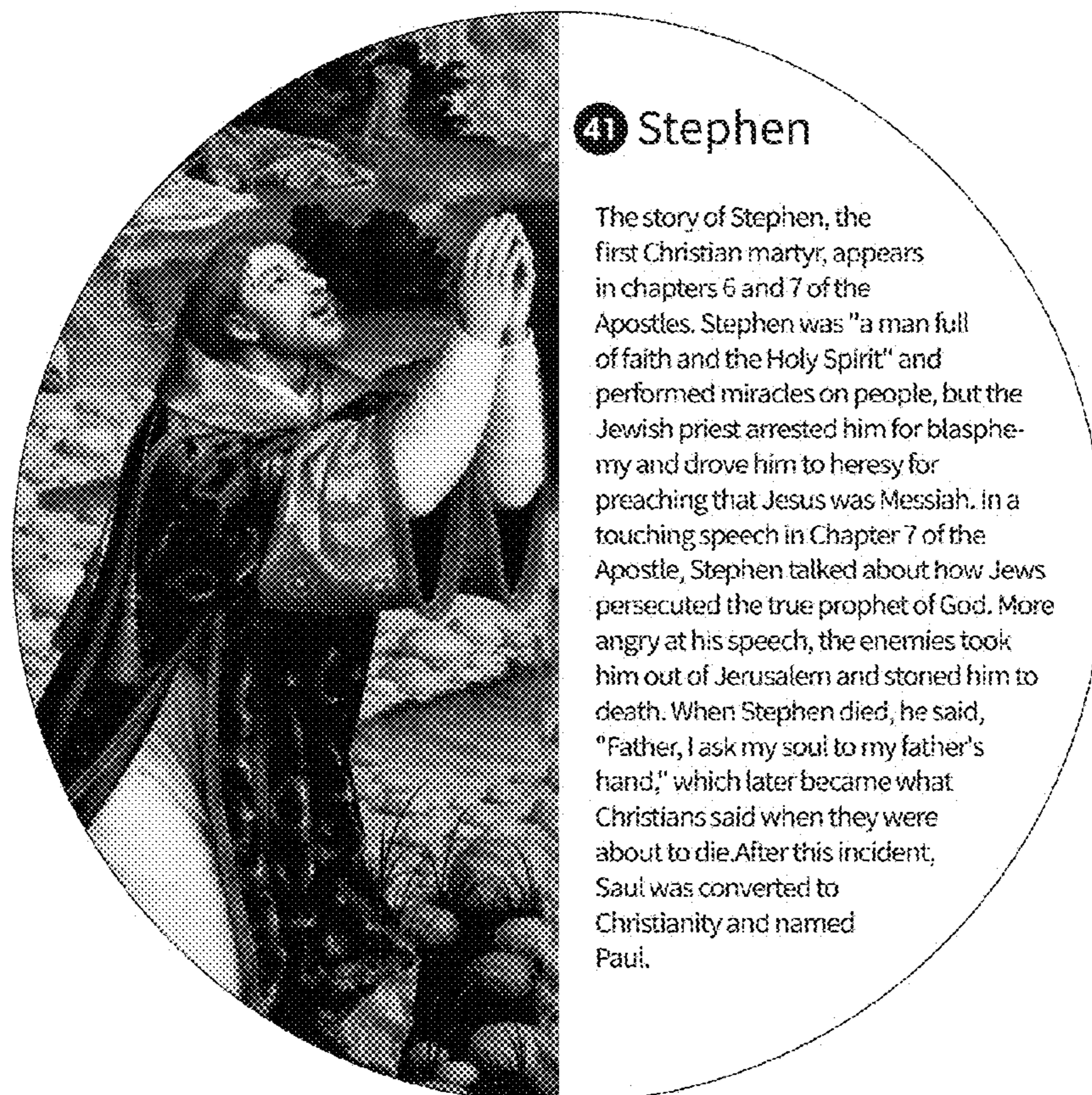

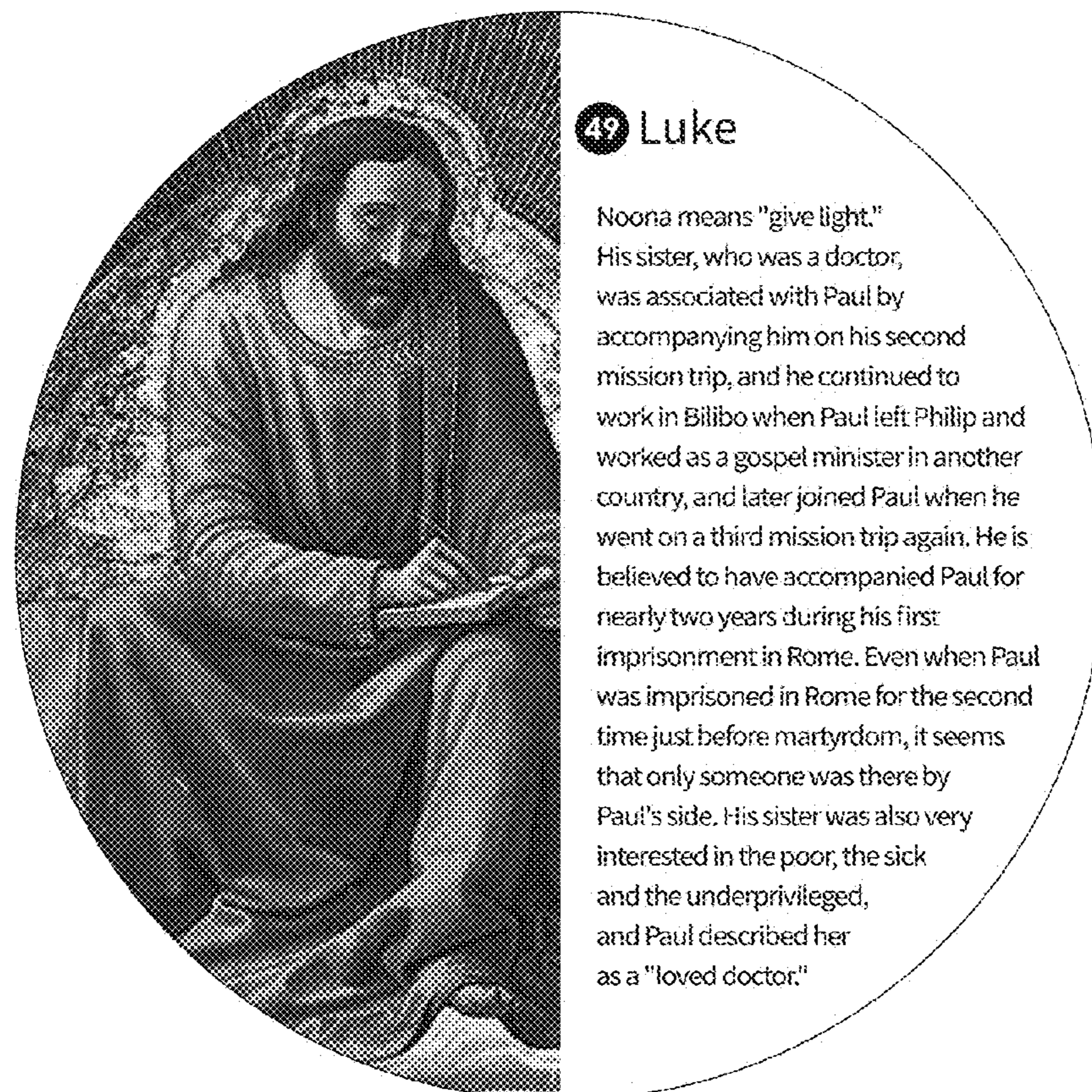

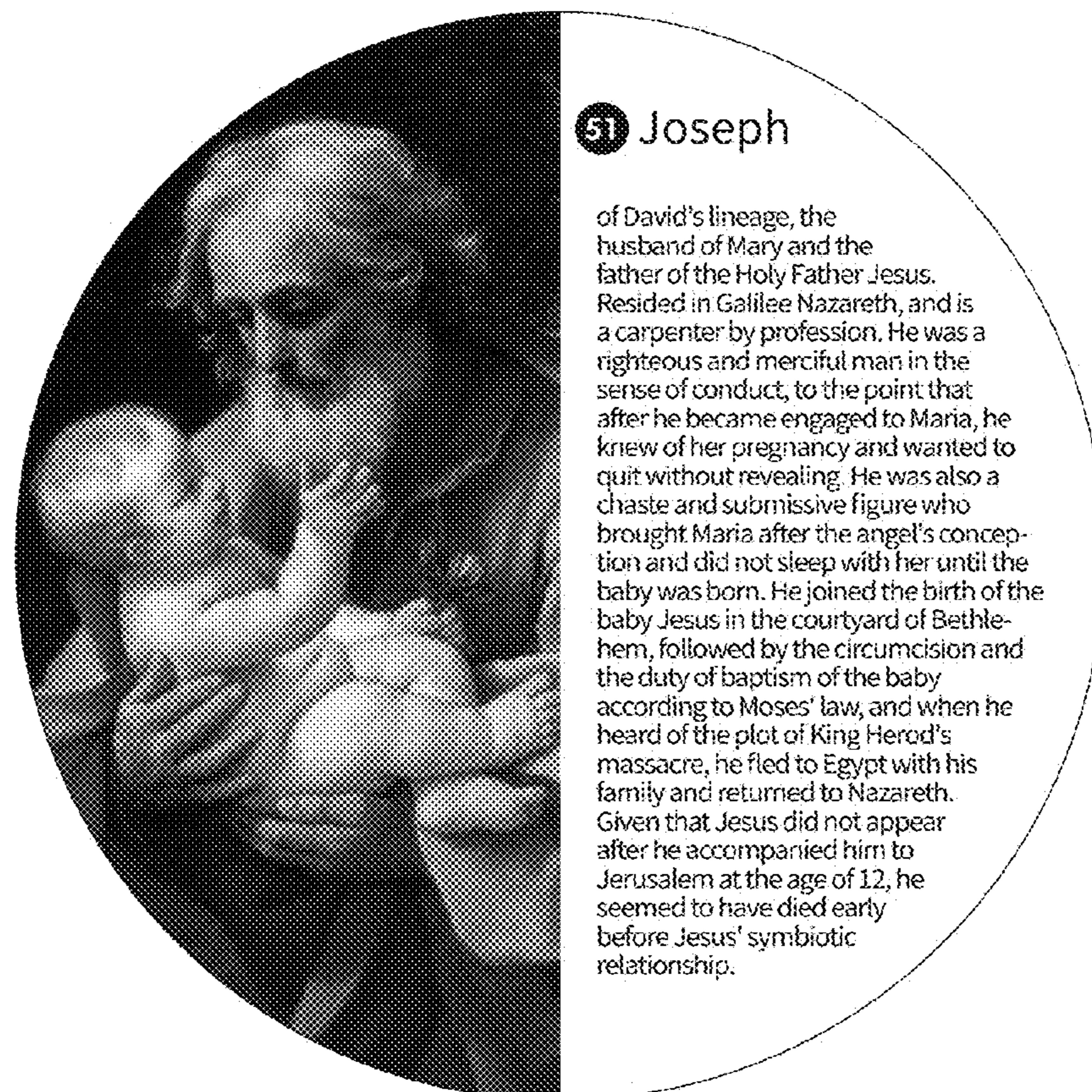

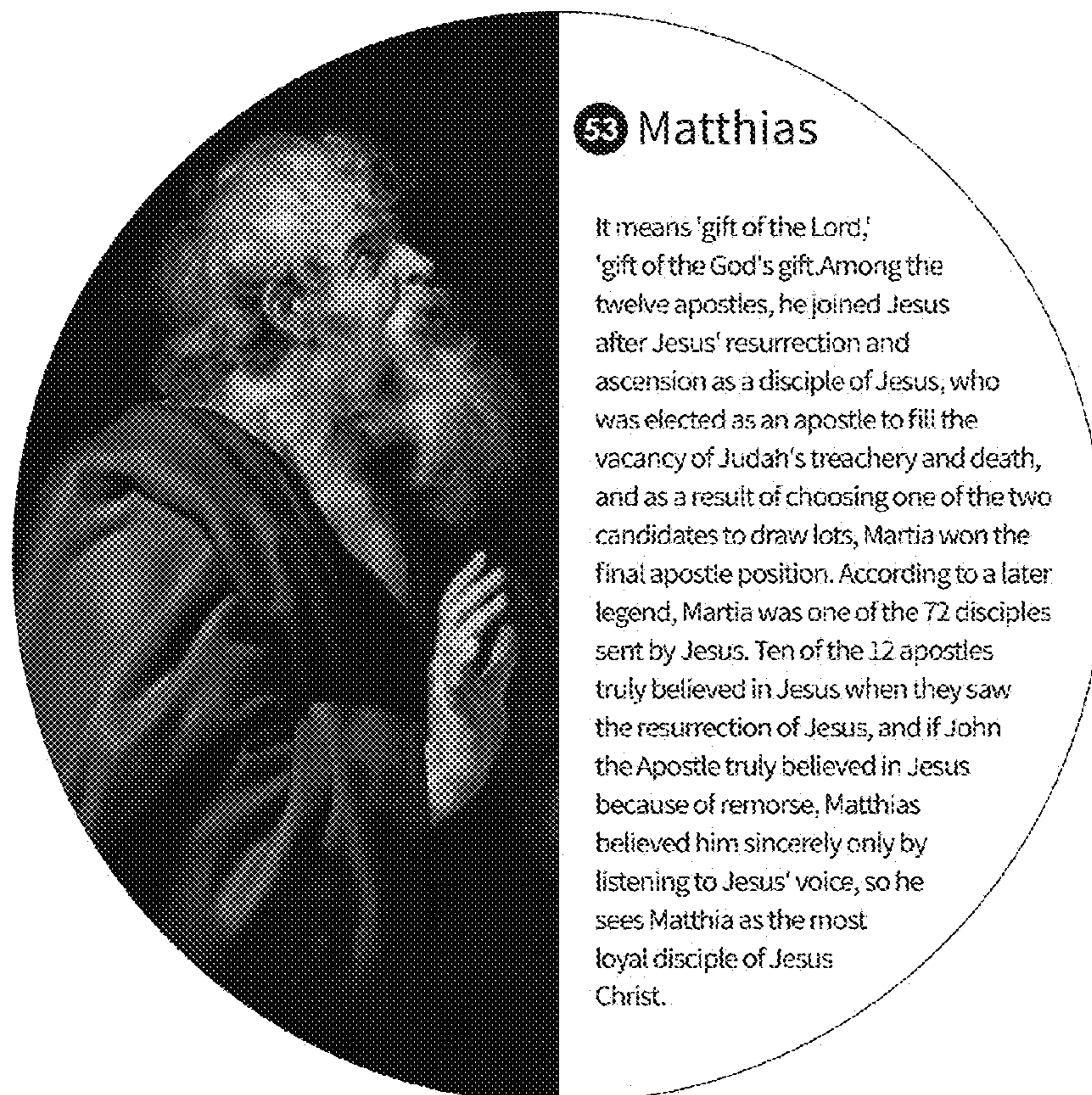

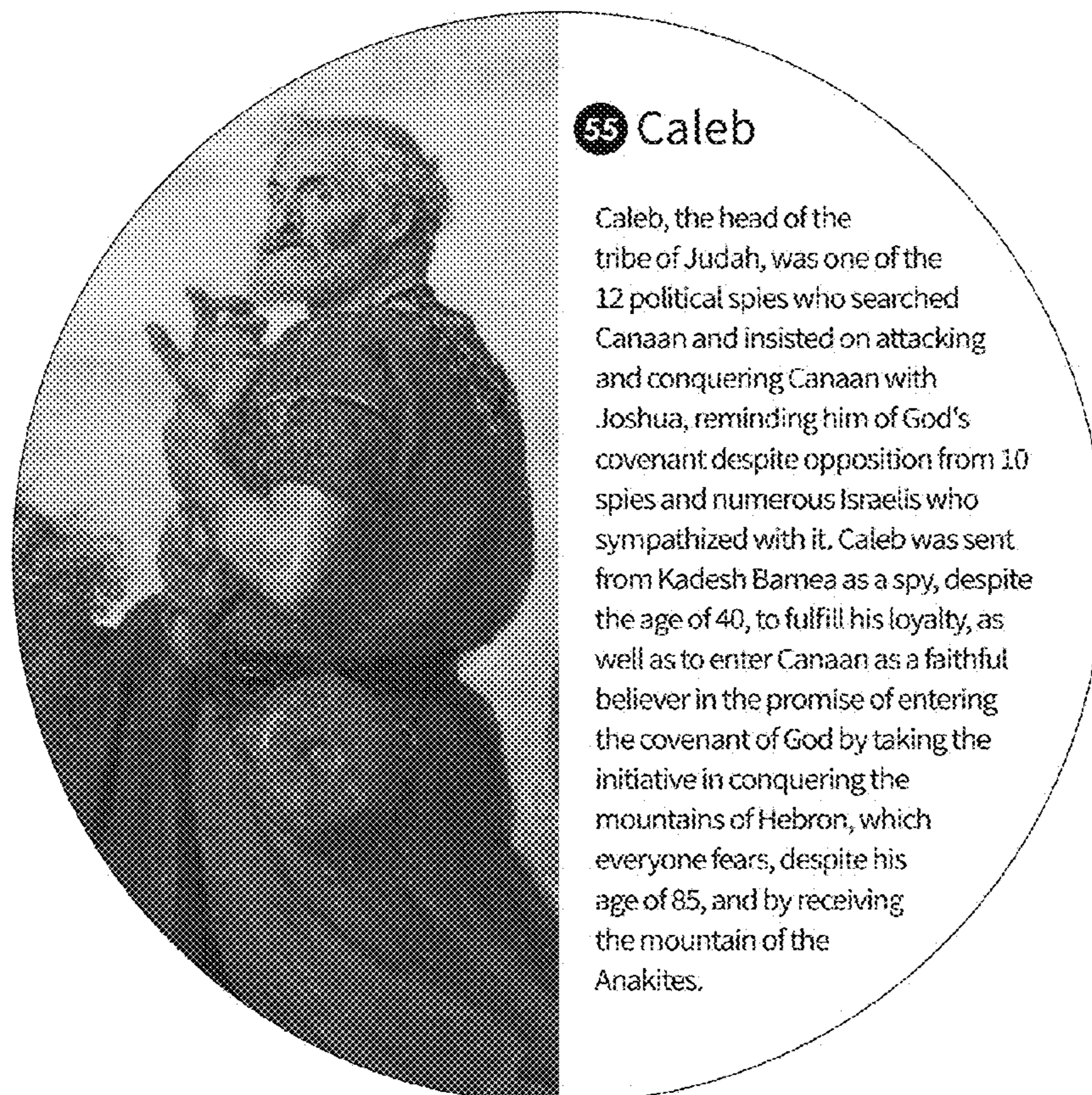

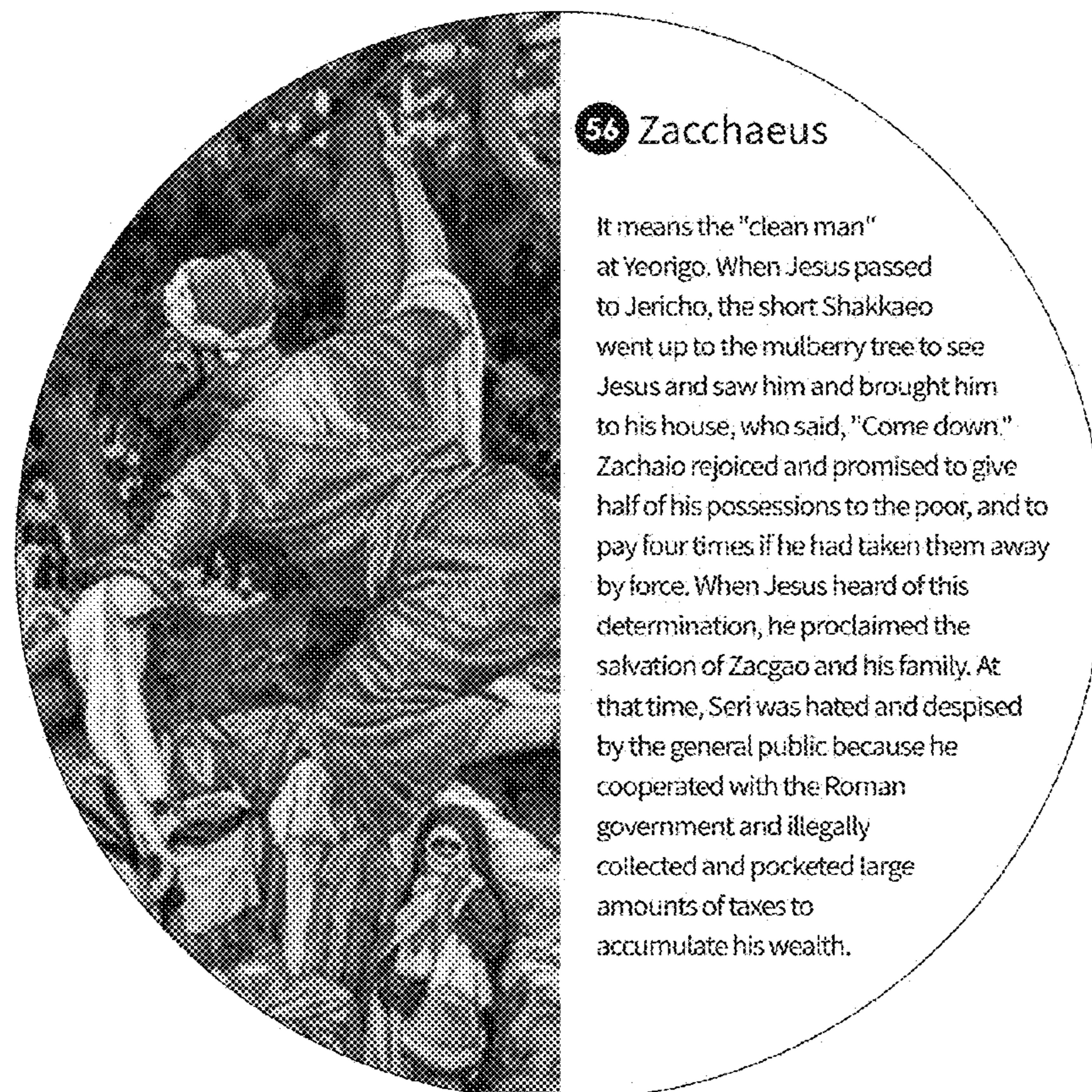

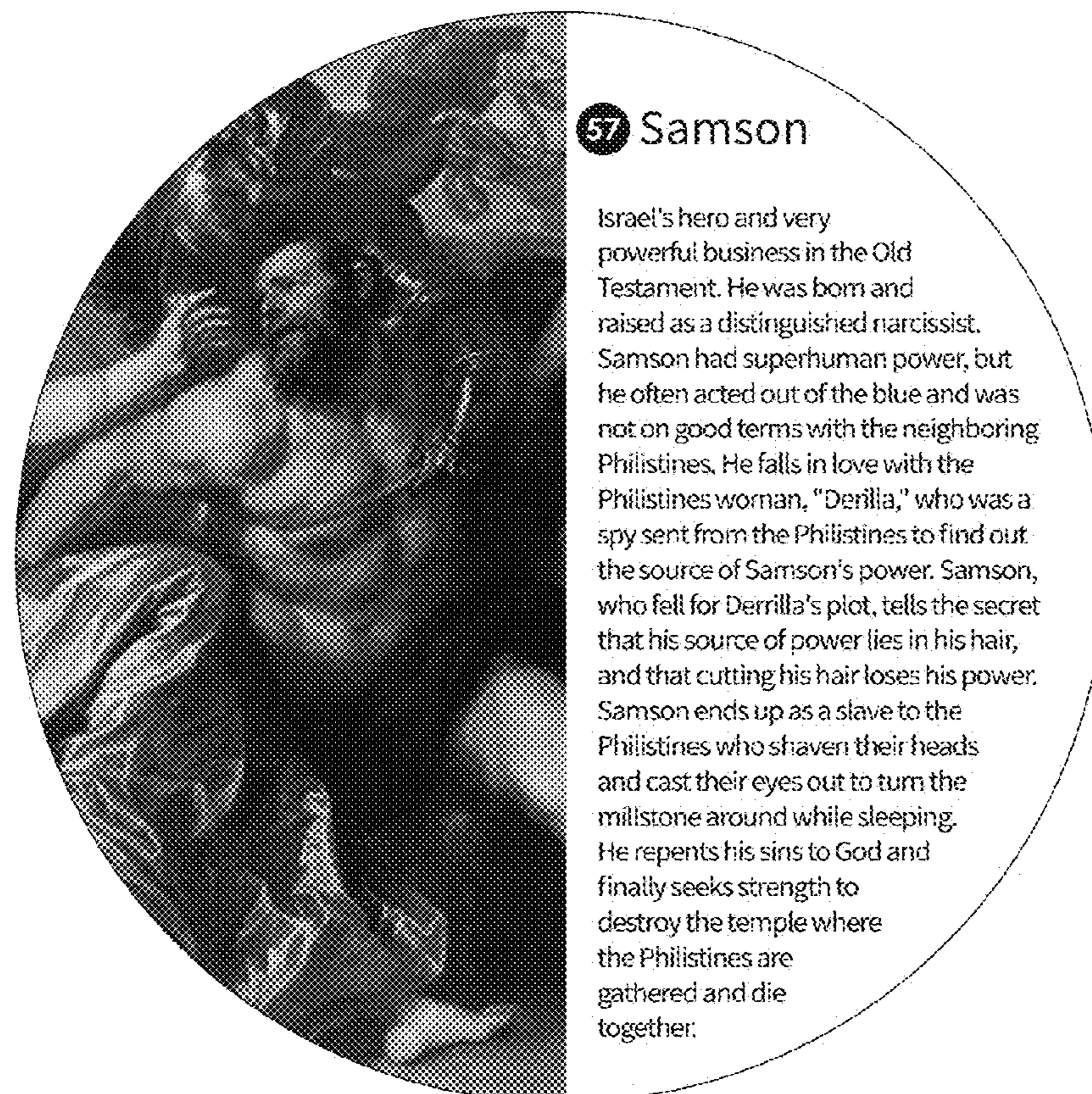
