The ornamental design for a grip for an operating lever, as shown and described.

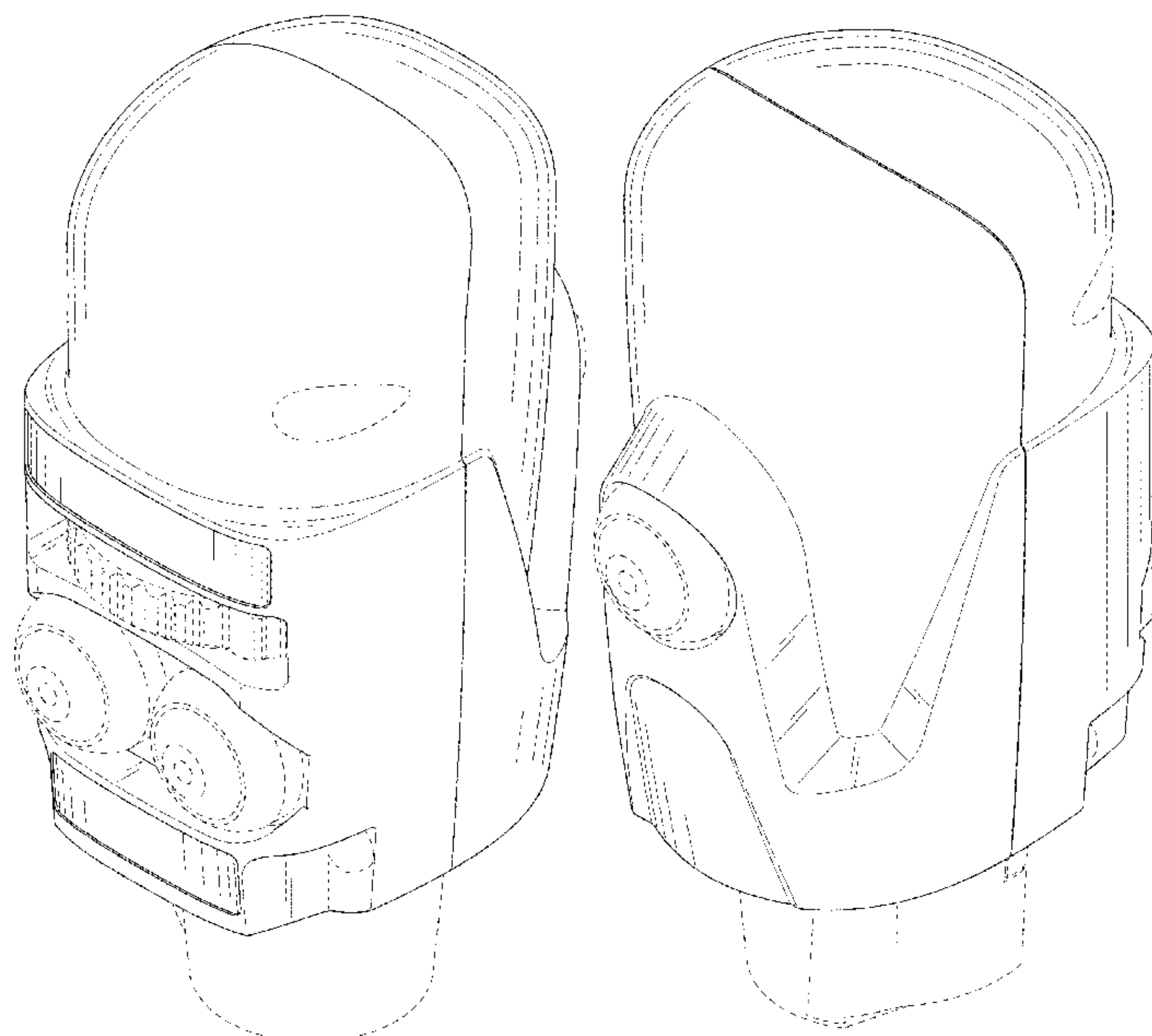
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a first perspective view of a grip for an operating lever showing my new design;

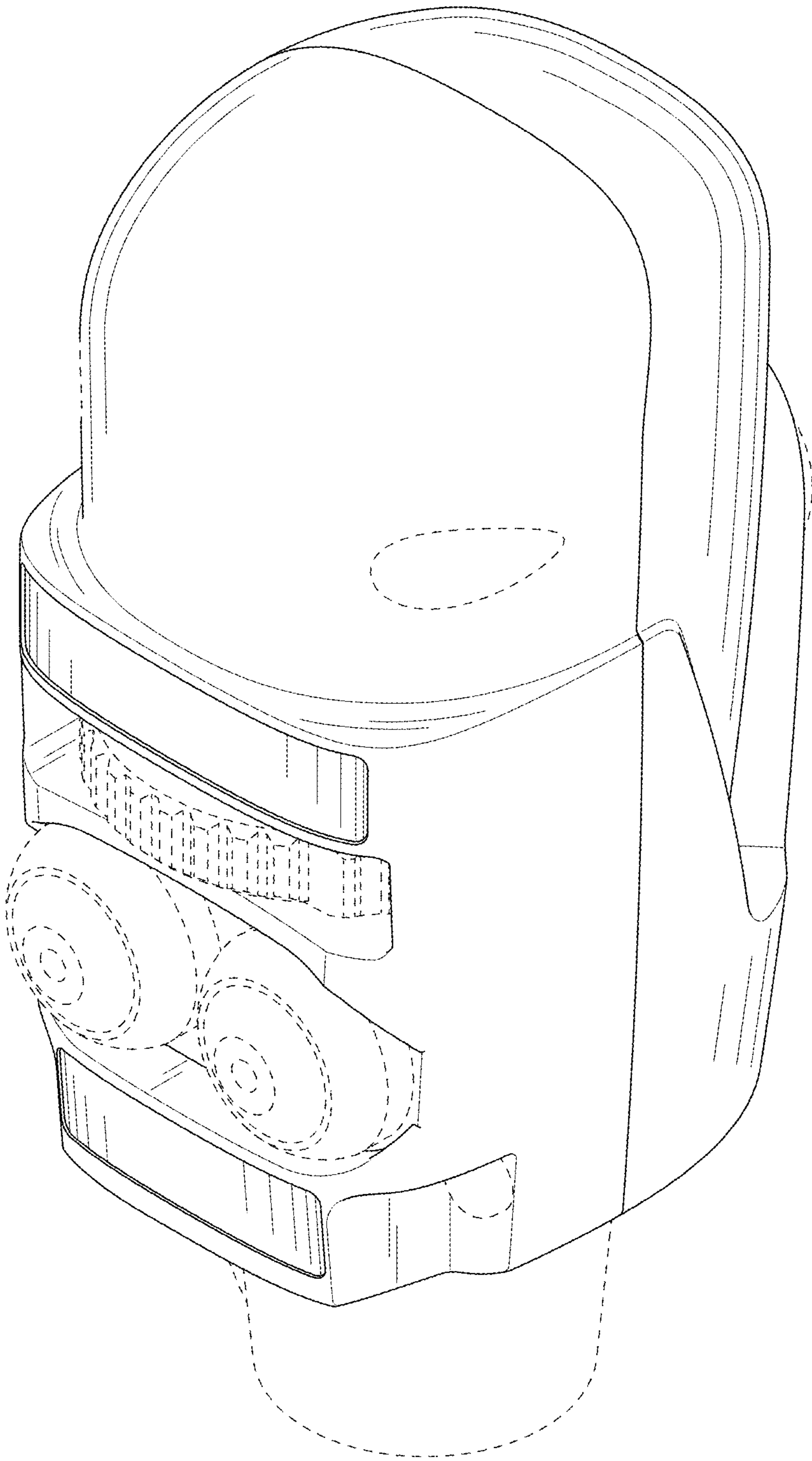

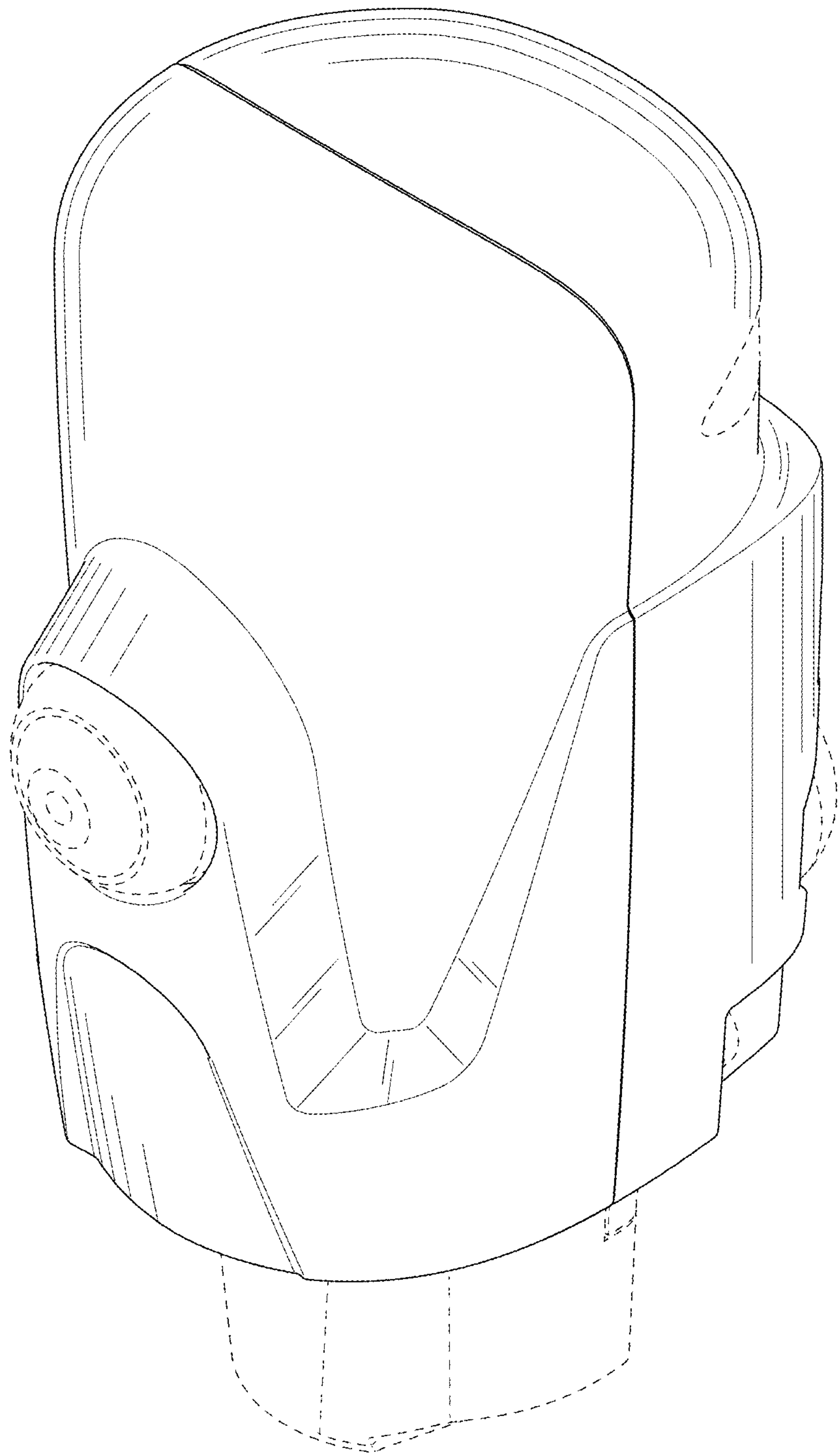

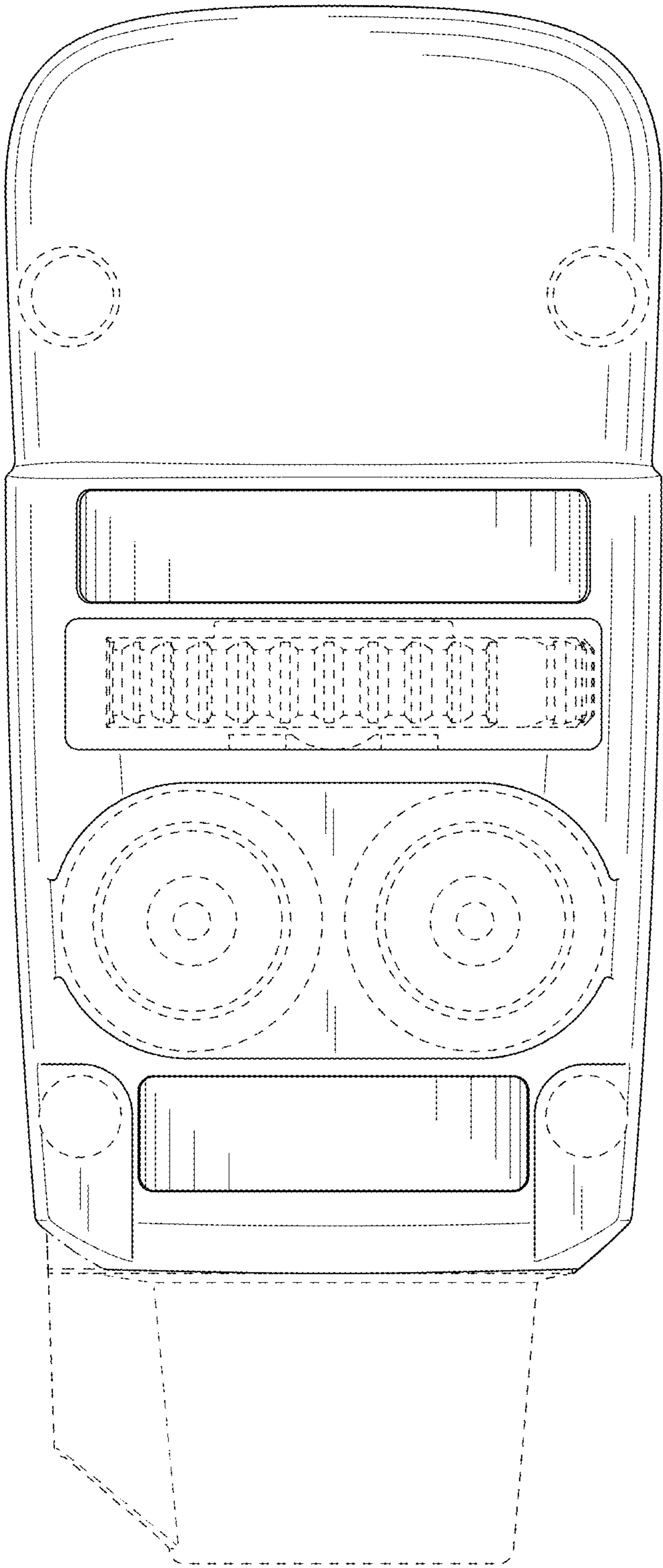

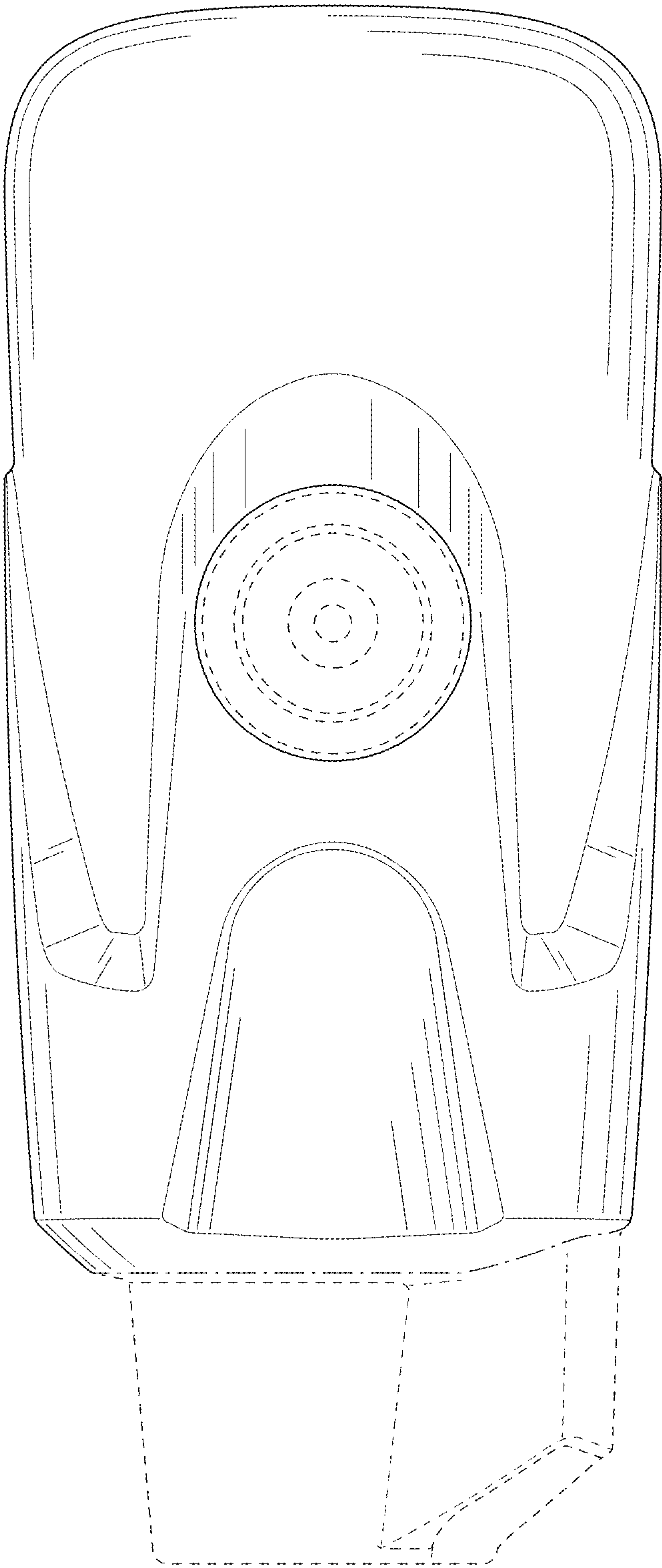

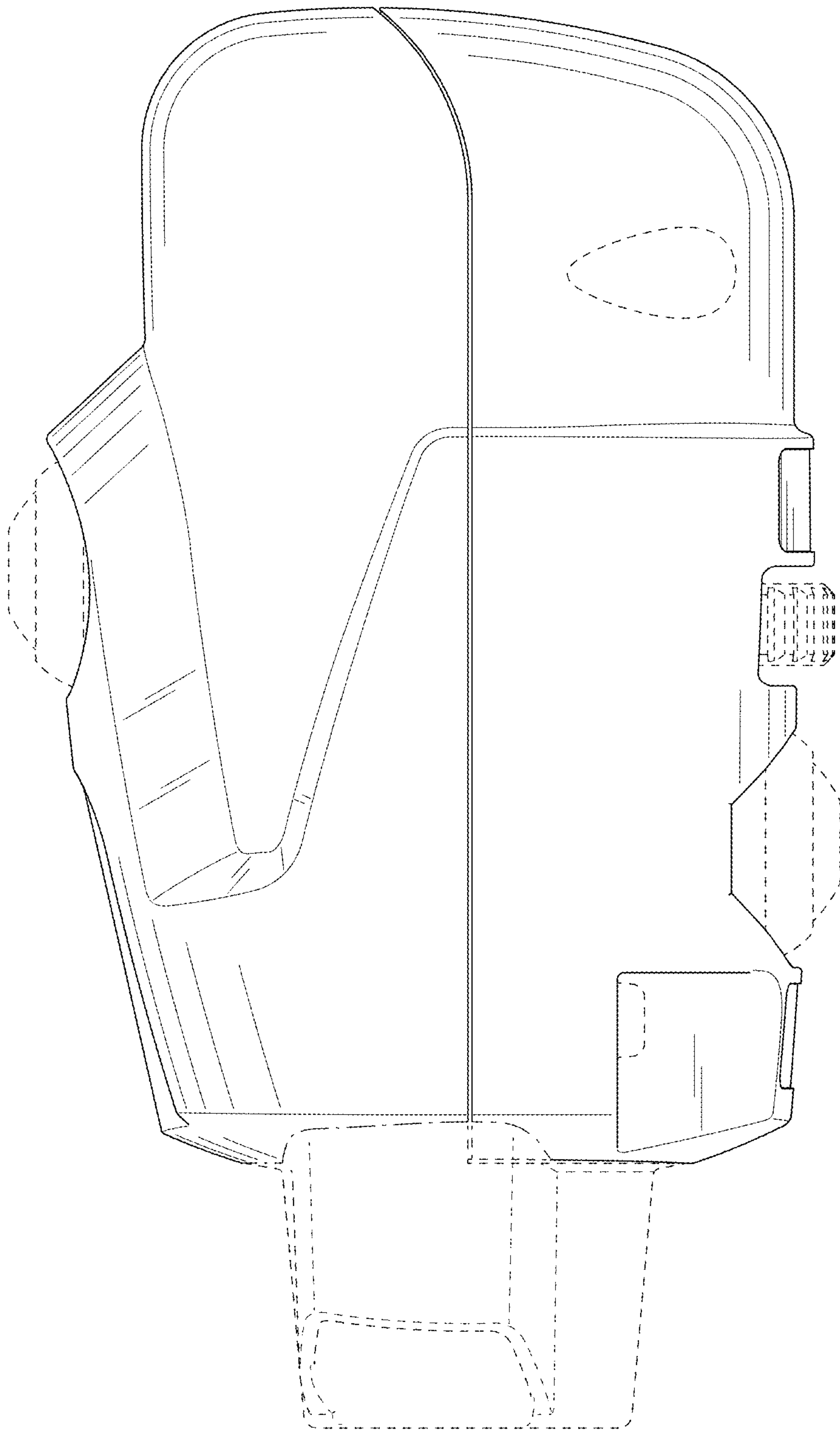

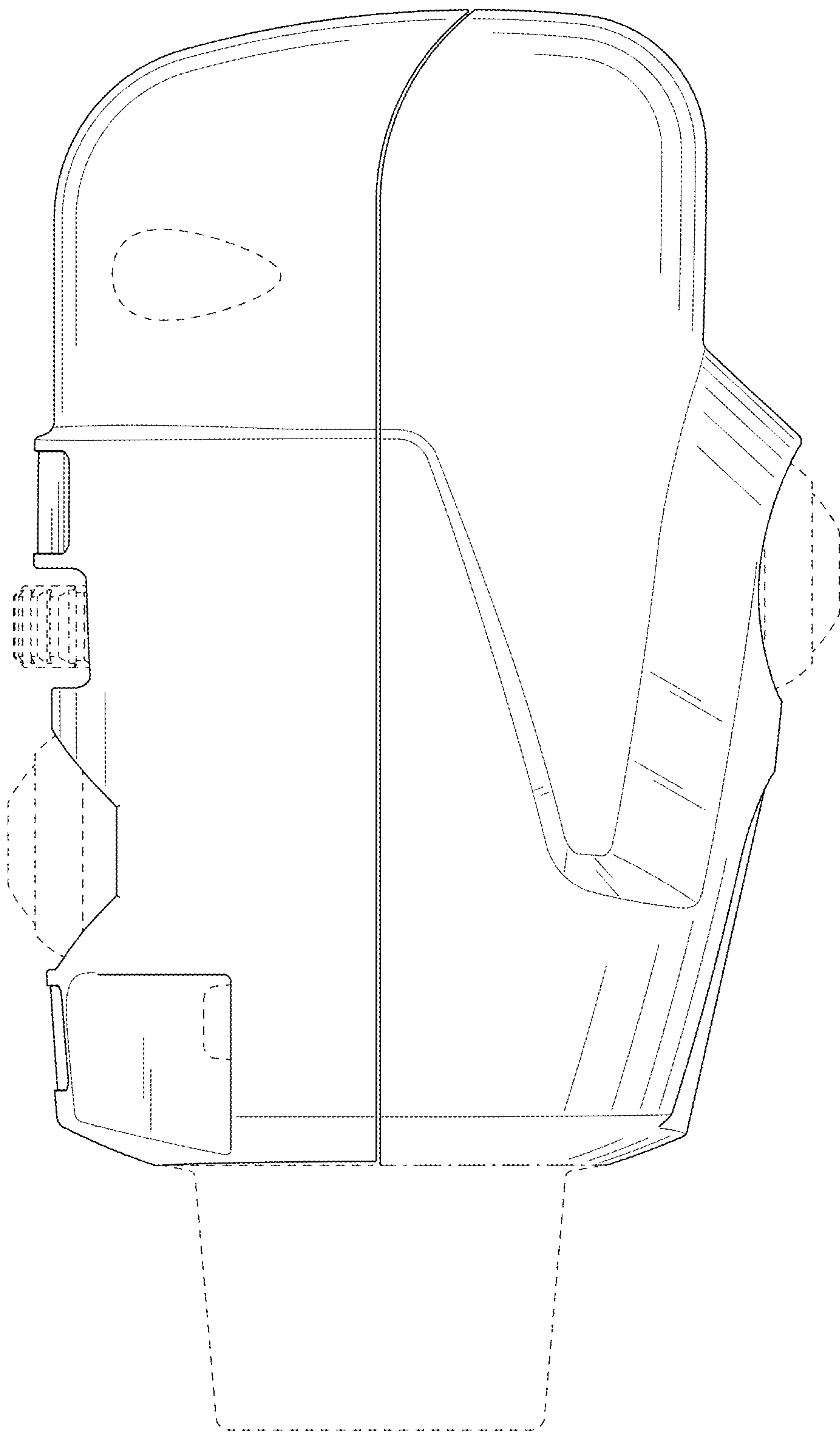

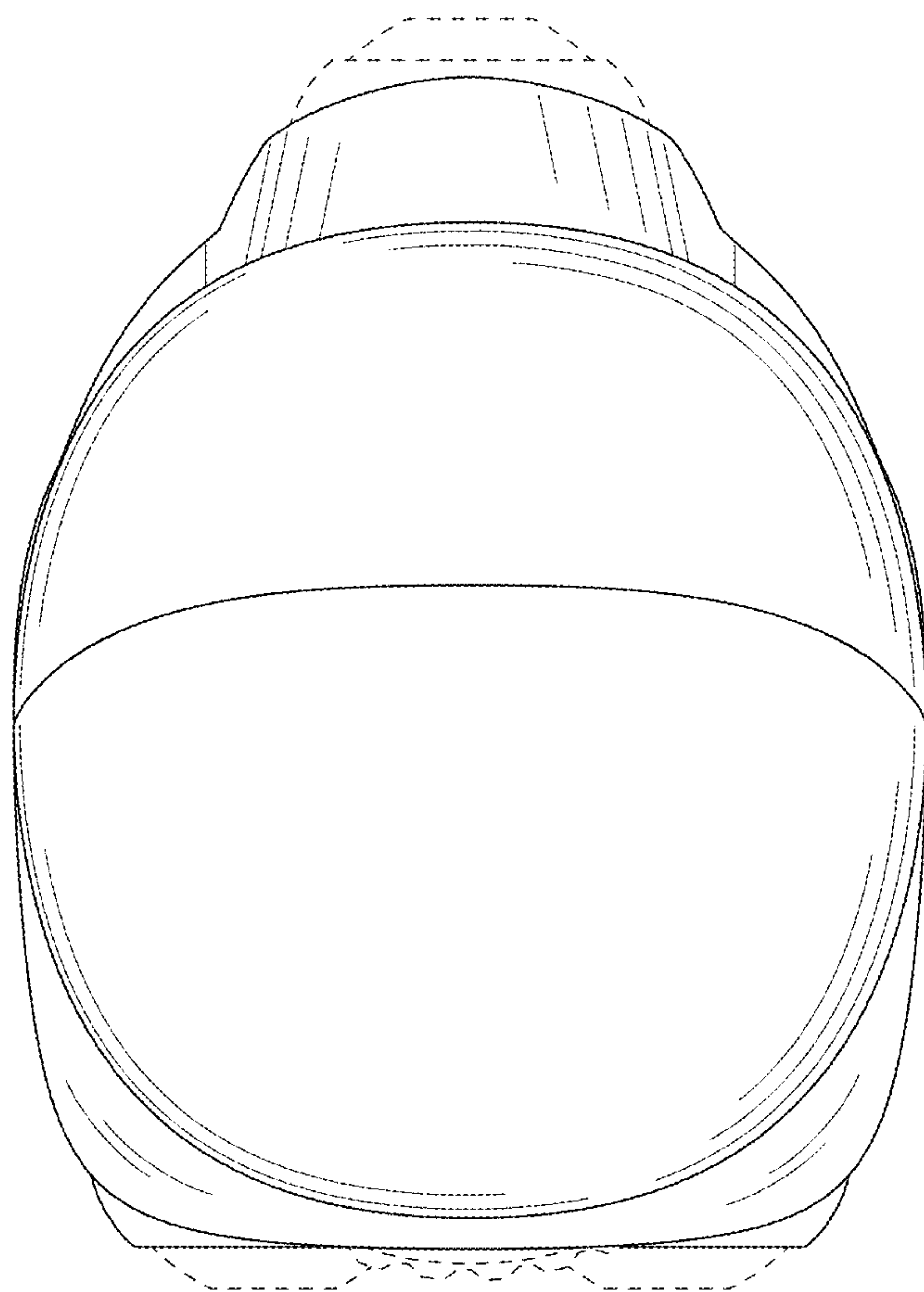

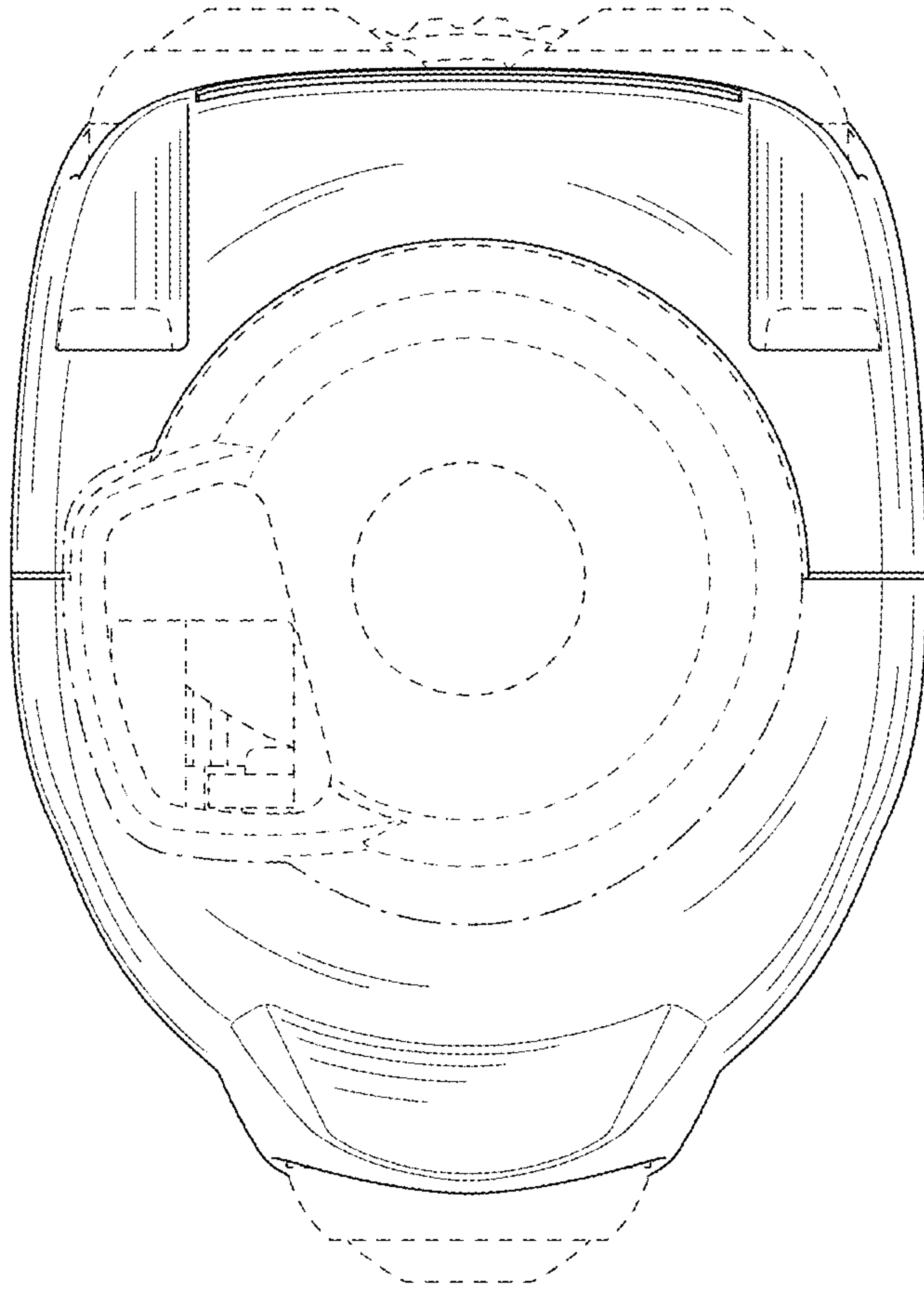
