This invention relates to a new variety of Ligustrum japonicum which was discovered by me as a sport on an ordinary L. japonicum. I have propagated my new variety by cuttings, and the propagations retain the novel characteristics of the parent mutation.

The new variety, which I have named "Silver Tint Wax-leaf," is readily distinguished by its generally white leaf margin. The amount of margin is not uniform throughout 15 the plant, as a few leaves are completely white and others

exhibit only a washing-out of the normal, dark green

color.

The illustration shows the full range of emargination of

mature foliage.

Not only is the new variety distinct from the parent species, it is also readily distinguishable from all other variegated varieties of Ligustrum of which I am aware. Except for the novel leaf markings, the plant is similar to its parent.

I claim:

1. A new and distinct variety of Ligustrum japonicum characterized by its white leaf margins.
