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(54) PETUNIA PLANT NAMED 'A-32'

(50) Latin Name: *Petunia hybrida*Varietal Denomination: **A-32**

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(57) ABSTRACT

A new cultivar of *Petunia* plant named 'A-32' that is characterized by large numbers of pink flowers, good cold temperature tolerance, a prostrate, spreading habit, a short crop time, and the absence of pollen.

BACKGROUND OF THE INVENTION

The present invention relates to a new and distinct cultivar of *Petunia* plant botanically known as *Petunia hybrida* and hereinafter referred to by the cultivar name 'A-32'.

The new *Petunia* is the product of a planned breeding program conducted by the inventor in Sarno, Italy. The objective of the breeding program is to create new *Petunia* cultivars with attractive colors that are male sterile.

'A-32' is a hybrid that originated from a crossing in 2008 of the female or seed parent a proprietary *Petunia* identified as AS203-2 (not patented) and the male or pollen parent a proprietary *Petunia* identified as 2004PK9 (not patented). The 15 resulting seeds were subsequently planted and grown. The cultivar 'A-32' was selected by the inventor in 2008 as a single plant within the progeny of the stated cross in Sarno, Italy.

Asexual reproduction of the new cultivar 'A-32' first occurred by terminal cuttings in 2008 in Sarno, Italy. Since 20 that time, under careful observation, the unique characteristics of the new cultivar have been uniform, stable and reproduced true to type in successive generations of asexual reproduction.

SUMMARY OF THE INVENTION

The following represent the distinguishing characteristics of the new *Petunia* cultivar 'A-32'. These traits in combination distinguish 'A-32' as a new and distinct cultivar apart from other existing known varieties of *Petunia*.

- 1. Petunia 'A-32' exhibits a large number of pink flowers.
- 2. Petunia 'A-32' exhibits a short crop time even under short day length conditions.
- 3. Petunia 'A-32' exhibits a prostate, spreading habit.
- 4. Petunia 'A-32' exhibits good cold temperature tolerance. 35
- 5. Petunia 'A-32' is male sterile and produces no pollen.

The closest comparison cultivars are *Petunia* 'Conchita Evening Glow' (not patented) and *Petunia* 'Conchita Morning Haze' (not patented).

'A-32' is distinguishable from 'Conchita Evening Glow' by 40 the following characteristics:

1. 'A-32' has smaller pink flowers. The flowers of 'Conchita Evening Glow' are purple.

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- 2. 'A-32' has smaller green leaves. The leaves of 'Conchita Evening Glow' are yellow green.
- 3. 'A-32' has a shorter crop time.
- 4. 'A-32' exhibits better cold temperature tolerance than 'Conchita Evening Glow'.
- 5. 'A-32' exhibits a larger number of flowers.
- 6. 'A-32' is male sterile and produces no pollen.
- 'A-32' is distinguishable from 'Conchita Morning Haze' by the following characteristics:
 - 1. 'A-32' has smaller flowers.
 - 2. 'A-32' has smaller leaves.
 - 3. 'A-32' exhibits a larger number of flowers.
 - 4. 'A-32' is male sterile and produces no pollen.
- 'A-32' is distinguishable from the female or seed parent AS203-2 by the following characteristics:
- 1. 'A-32' has pink flowers. The flowers of AS203-2 are darker pink.
 - 2. 'A-32' has smaller flowers.
 - 3. 'A-32' has a larger quantity of flowers.
- 4. 'A-32' has a larger overall size.
- 5. 'A-32' exhibits more vigorous growth.
- 'A-32' is distinguishable from the male or pollen parent 2004PK9 by the following characteristics:
 - 1. 'A-32' is male sterile. 2004PK9 produces fertile pollen.
 - 2. 'A-32' has a larger number of flowers.
- 3. 'A-32' exhibits more vigorous growth.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DRAWING

The accompanying photograph illustrates the distinguishing traits of *Petunia* 'A-32'. The plant in the photograph shows an overall view of 7 month old plants. The photograph was taken using conventional techniques and although colors may appear different from actual colors due to light reflectance it is as accurate as possible by conventional photographic techniques.

BOTANICAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PLANT

The following is a detailed description of the new *Petunia* cultivar named 'A-32'. Data was collected in Sarno, Italy from 7 month old plastic greenhouse grown plants in 12 cm. diameter containers. The time of year was winter and the temperature range was 15-18 degrees Centigrade during the day and 5-8 degrees Centigrade at night. The light level was

natural light. No photoperiodic treatments or growth retardants were used. Color determinations are in accordance with The Royal Horticultural Society Colour Chart 2007 edition, except where general color terms of ordinary dictionary significance are used. The growing requirements are similar to 5 Flower: the species. 'A-32' has not been tested under all possible conditions and phenotypic differences may be observed with variations in environmental, climatic, and cultural conditions, however, without any variance in genotype.

Botanical classification: *Petunia hybrida* 'A-32'.

Annual or perennial: Annual.

Parentage: 'A-32' is the product of the female or seed parent identified as Petunia AS203-2 and the male or pollen parent identified as *Petunia* 2004PK9.

Vigor: Moderate.

Growth habit: Prostrate, bushy. Plant shape: Prostate, trailing.

Suitable container size: 12 cm. pots.

Height: 5 cm. in height. Width: 80 cm. in width.

Low temperature tolerance: -6° Centigrade.
