A new *Gypsophila* plant particularly distinguished by very large, double flowers and an upright growth habit, is disclosed.

**CROSS-REFERENCE TO RELATED APPLICATIONS**

An application with the Community Plant Variety Rights Office was filed on Apr. 4, 2017. 'Pearls Grandtastic' has not been made publicly available or sold more than one year prior to the filing date of the instant application.

**BACKGROUND OF THE NEW PLANT**

The present invention comprises a new and distinct variety of *Gypsophila*, botanically known as *Gypsophila paniculata* L., and hereinafter referred to by the variety name 'Pearls Grandtastic'. 'Pearls Grandtastic' originated from an open-pollination conducted in Negev, Israel in April 2010 between the proprietary female *Gypsophila* variety 'BL-MD-F-56' (unpatented) and an unnamed and unpatented male *Gypsophila* variety.

The seeds from the cross were sown and plants were grown for evaluation, where an individual plant designated 'Pearls Grandtastic' was selected from the group of plants in Negev, Israel in August 2010.

In September 2010, 'Pearls Grandtastic' was first vegetatively propagated by side branch cuttings. 'Pearls Grandtastic' was found to reproduce true to type in successive generations of asexual propagation via side branch cuttings.

**SUMMARY**

The following are the most outstanding and distinguishing characteristics of this new variety when grown under normal horticultural practices in Negev, Israel.

1. Very large, double flowers; and
2. An upright growth habit.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE PHOTOGRAPH**

This new *Gypsophila* plant is illustrated by the accompanying photograph which shows the plant's overall plant

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habit including form and flowers. The photograph is of a 22-week-old plant grown outdoors in Colombia in April 2016. The colors shown are as true as can be reasonably obtained by conventional photographic procedures.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE NEW VARIETY**

The following detailed descriptions set forth the distinctive characteristics of 'Pearls Grandtastic'. The data which define these characteristics were collected from asexual reproductions carried out in Juja, Kenya. Data was collected on 20-week-old plants grown outdoors in Juja, Kenya in September 2016. Color references are to The R.H.S. Colour Chart of The Royal Horticultural Society of London (R.H.S.) 2007.

*Sepals.*—Arrangement: Like a cup. Quantity per flower: 5 to 7. Shape: Lanceolate. Apex: Acute. Base: Cuneate. Margin: Entire. Length: 0.35 cm. Width: 0.1 cm. Color (both upper and lower surfaces): RHS 147C (Yellow-Green). Surface texture (both upper and lower surfaces): Glabrous.  
*Reproductive organs:*

*Stamens.*—None observed.  
*Pistils.*—Quantity per flower: 1. Pistil length: 1.0 cm to 1.2 cm. Style length: 0.5 cm to 0.7 cm. Style color: RHS 181D. Stigma color: RHS 75D. Ovary color: RHS 137C.

Fruit and seed set: None observed.

Disease and pest/insect resistance: None observed.

#### COMPARISON WITH PARENTAL LINE AND KNOWN VARIETY

'Pearls Grandtastic' is distinguished from the female parent and the commercial comparison variety 'Million Star' (patent status unknown) as described in Table 1.
